Tim Rice became the second preliminary winner in the Mr. San Francisco Contest staged at the On The Q. T., Monday, July 5th.





GAY Epidemic

To the Editor:

"Polk Strasse".

Using your paper as a platform, I would like to address myself with sincerity to the respective managements of the numerous bars newly opened in "Castro Village" which has been my immediate neighborhood for nearly four years.

Your apparent abundant success pleases me very much and I do indeed enjoy patronizing your establishments. Standing in line to enter your busy businesses is pleasantly reminiscent of "Hide-away Days", though such is completely out of character on Castro Street.

Of deep concern to me is the tremendous influx of persons you have attracted to this very tiny area and the adverse consequences which may result from this situation of saturation. In the past, our minority in this area has experienced several incidents of harassment, violence, and physical injury inflicted by a jealous and juvenile element which is also indigenous to this family oriented neighborhood, a neighborhood very different from either the "miracle mile" or

It is my fear that the congregation of so many of us on the streets in this area traveling from one bar to the next, standing in line to enter a crowded bar, and most of all the hordes which are disgorged onto the street and loiter there at 2:00 AM each morning is tempting fate and inviting what may be akin to disaster should the same alien element of troublemakers decide to "reclaim their territory."

Especially distasteful to me and also a potential source of contention and trouble are the teeney-boppers and patrons who have followed your flag to this area and loiter at your doorways, particularly at the Midnight Sun.

A number of my friends have already registered their fears as well as their untoward experiences and have elected to remain away from "Castro Village." As a resident of the area, such a choice is not so easily available to me.

Castrating ... State Assailed

The press has avoided exploiting castration as a punishment in California. The practice of the courts is to destroy their records, ostensibly to protect the victims, however, one San Diego Superior Court Judge boasts of ordering 60 castrations. An L.A. County Superior Court Judge claims credit for 41.

Judges, knowing that the parole board never releases sex offenders, use the threat of life imprisonment to force homosexuals, peeping toms, cunt eaters, masturbators, and other sex criminals to "voluntarily" sign papers to have themselves emasculated.

Section 645 of the California Penal Code provides that an operation "for the prevention of procreation" may be involuntarily performed on a "mentally disordered sex offender" or anyone who is convicted of a sex crime. The State Department of Mental Hygiene reports that 19,042 involuntary "sterilizations" have been ordered by judges, but does not report what percentage of these operations were vasectomies and what percentage were castrations. Newsmen consistently refer to castration by the term, "sterilization."

Former San Quentin Warden Clinton Duffy, in the chapter on castration of prisoners in his book,

"Sex and Crime", expresses that sex is sinful and castration "helps" men to overcome sinful desire. In one Duffy case history, a man who "fondled" an eight year old girl while she was sleeping at a public camp ground, was asked "Do you want probation or castration?" The man later said: "I just heard him (the judge) say probation and I said yes. When I woke up in the hospital, they had taken 75% of my pleasures away from me." The judge then changed his mind about probation and sentenced the man to San Quentin.

A psychiatrist boasts of his ability to coerce men to sign the legal papers authorizing castration by injecting them with a hypnotic drug.

The many types of men forced to submit to castration include plain, ordinary homosexuals who have the misfortune of coming before a rural judge. Urban judges, a bit more selective, reserve castration as a punishment for other sexual deviation such as peeping toms, pedophiles, rapists, fondlers, and exhibitionists. A boy who got his kicks by watching ladies through their bathroom windows was arrested, charged with "Disturbing the Peace", a misdemeanor, but was threatened

Dear Mr. Littlejohn:

I thought you would be interested to know that I have received a complaint of alleged racial discrimination which is said to have taken place June 26 at The Village, at a competition for female impersonators. Two persons who were present at this event called me this week saying that the one black amateur performer who wished to participate was not permitted to do so.

The persons who called me said that the June 26 event was sponsored by an organization called The Coits, but I have written you because I have been to the Human Rights Commission in behalf of nondiscrimination in the past, and I was told your organization was represented also in the Coits.

I am only reporting to you about this complaint, as it came by telephone to me. We are concerned, of course, about any instance of racial discrimination in any form, in this community.

Can you let me know if S.I.R. has any knowledge of the alleged racial discrimination and what steps you might take to prevent it occurring again?

Dear Mr. Casford:

Mr. William Plath, President of Society for Individual Rights (SIR) has asked me to respond to your letter of July 7, 1971, regarding an alleged incident of racial discrimination at the Fifth Annual Coittillion. I was present at this year's event along with many other SIR members, however, I must point out that SIR and the Coits are two completely separate organizations.

It is ironic to hear a charge of racial discrimination against the Coits. Of the four previous winners only one was Caucasian. The others were a Chinese, a Black, and a Mexican. This year's Miss Coittillion selected on June 26th is of mixed racial background and was escorted by a black gentleman.

To the best of my knowledge, members of minority races have always had a fair and equal opportunity to participate in any Coits' event. It is categorically not true that anyone was refused the opportunity to participate this year (or any other year). All forty debutantes who registered were presented in the order that they checked in. I cannot tell you how many were black. The Coits obviously do not ask an applicant to state his race on the registration form. (I personally noted at least three black contestants and some other

Five runners-up were selected by an impartial panel of judges who are prominent in the gay community--most of whom, by the way, are not members of the Coits. Finalists are rated on a point system which takes into consideration the hair-style, the beauty of the traditional white gown and over-all poise. I know for a fact that one contestant who did not become a finalist-who happens to be black-and who happens to have a club and mace dispenser as part of her evening wear--made a deliberate, premeditated and nearly successful attempt to sabotage the event. The contestant (though beautifully gowned and coiffed) made an awkward entrance-stumbling down the staircase, executed a deep split instead of a courtesy, and had obvious difficulty pulling herself back to her feet. I dare say she rated low in the over-all poise category. 

Sneak previews set for the near future include "Been Down So Long It Looks Up To Me" at the Vogue on Friday, July 16 and "To Find A Man" at the Alexandria on the same day. The first has an unknown cast and is about the zany exploits of Gnoosias Pappadopoulos, a college dropout who returns to the campus to spread joy and confusion (drugs).

"To Find A Man" is about two wealthy New York City teenagers who find themselves caught up with the problem of abortion. Neither preview sounds very exciting, but with the latter you have a good opportunity to see "Anderson Tapes" if you haven't already.

On Thurs., July 22, at the Vogue, "Unman, Wittering, & Zigo" with David Hemmings will be previewed. He is a young instructor who replaces a veteran school teacher in a boy's school. The students threaten to kill him if he insists on classroom discipline. I haven't seen it yet, but assume it can be compared to "If" which I enjoyed.

In the last edition, I failed to mention "Le Mans", the opening of which was advanced a week at the Warfield. Anyway, I haven't seen it and don't intend to. If either Steven McQueen or auto racing is your bag, you've probably already seen it or read enough about it to know whether or

not you want to see a documentary on auto racing.

"Cleopatra" returns this week for a brief engagement at the UA Cinema Stonestown.

Taking a busman's holiday, I caught "The Conformist" at the Vogue. As you've read in the other reviews, it is an exceptionally beautiful picture in many aspects. Regrettably, as is so often the case, the story is told with flashbacks which makes it hard to follow. Further, the message Bertolucci tries to get across is frequently unclear and ambiguous. As usual Trintignant is excellent. The consequences of his homosexual encounter as a youth is not fully explained but his confession of it to the priest is classic and worth the price of admission. The film is especially heavy but I recommend it seriously with the belief you will find it a rewarding experience.

Opening at the Loews this week is a completely stupid movie, "The Hunting Party", obviously filmed in Spain, very possibly without a director though Don Medford is listed as such. It borrows all of Peckinpah's over-used tricks (splashes of blood, slow motion deaths, etc.) and even adds more offensive violence, blood, gore, and rape than even "Soldier Blue" could accomplish. Gene Hackman, a

very wealthy southwestermer during the end of the last century, organizes a hunting party for sport, furnishing his guests with a private railroad train, whores, and telescopic rifles. Oliver Reed is the leader of a rather large gang of jailbirds hired to do some job never defined. He kidnaps Candice Bergen, Hackman's wife, and she becomes a part of the motley band falling in love with Reed after he rapes her. He wants her to teach him to read. Hackman learns of the kidnapping and his party pursues Reed, etc, gunning and mutilating everyone from afar with their telescopes leaving only Reed and Bergen who being alone attempt to get to Calif. across the desert on foot. Hackman, also on foot across the endless sand, catches them and cold-bloodedly shoots both and dies himself, evidently of a broken heart. There is some music for which Riz Ortolani is credited. Pictures like this one compound my dislike for westerns. I hope that by telling you the story I've ruined the picture sufficiently so that you won't waste your time seeing it.

CHICKEN IN THE SACK

Having a hen party? Give them something special. A nice tender young lovely chicken. This will serve 5 or 6 depending upon how hungry the hens are.

- 1 roasting chicken (5 lbs.)
- 1/4 tsp fresh ground pepper, blk.
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp grey or 1/2 tsp dried rosemary
- 1/2 tsp ground cumiseed
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1 garlic finely minced.

1. Select a nice sweet tender chicken. Be sure to smell it cuz you don't know where it's been before you picked it up.
2. Truss it up.
3. Combine the above spices with

the oil and let stand 30 minutes.
 4. Massage the entire chicken thoroughly with the seasoned mixture in oil. This will give even the most faded chicken a healthy glow and sexy aroma.
 5. Now, throw the chicken in the sack (a paper bag will do as well) and place in a roasting pan.
 6. Stick your bird in a moderate (325°) oven. The one in the sack, dummy, and bake for 2 1/2 hours-3 hours or until tender.

If you really rush, your entree and your face should be done approximately the same time. Note, if you like your chicken browned, you can remove the bag for the last 1/2 hour of baking time. Now, all that's left to do is pop the chicken from the oven and give the bird to your guests. Bye, Bye now. I'm off to brown some chicken.

he manages to get terrific characterizations from his performers even if they are terribly overdone most of the time. Kim Darby, Connie Stevens, and Irene Daillare all excellent, but Scott Wilson (of ACT) as a half-wit Slim Grissom steals the show. The picture is certainly not a "Bonnie and Clyde" though it is a step above the AIP depression-era mobster-gang pictures. The story follows the formula (kidnapping-ransom-hostage) line but has a Romeo and Juliet (suicidal) ending. I don't know if the Ma Grissom kidnapping of Barbara Blandish is factual or if the story is taken from a book as the credits indicate. Anyway, the picture is fairly diverting.

The Richelieu is playing "Beyond Love and Evil", a French film mostly dubbed. It has the most superb photography I've ever seen. It is so fantastic that the picture is almost incidental. I don't understand why this picture has not been more favorably received. The "Dolce Vita" scenes out-do Fellini by far. Story: a cult of sexual libertines who believe everyone should do as he pleases sexually be it with men, women, or beast inhabit a palace. We are treated to a series of exhibitions of their sexual fantasies and fetishes too numerous and unbelievable to mention including one girl who digs fish which is sort of unforgettable.

I recommend it as light entertainment.

Next week, the Richelieu will follow with "The Love Goddesses". This documentary-history of sex in the cinema is anything but sexy, but is rather a thoroughly fascinating series of film clips showing 35 or more sexy actresses from Theda Bara to Brigitte Bardot, Mae West, Bette Davis, Ruby Keeler, and Marilyn Monroe all stand out particularly. You other ardent cinema buffs will love it.

I have not seen "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory" which is strictly children's fare anyway.

"Who Is Harry Kellerman... etc" opening July 21 at the Cinema 21 is screening today (July 15) which makes it too late for this edition.
