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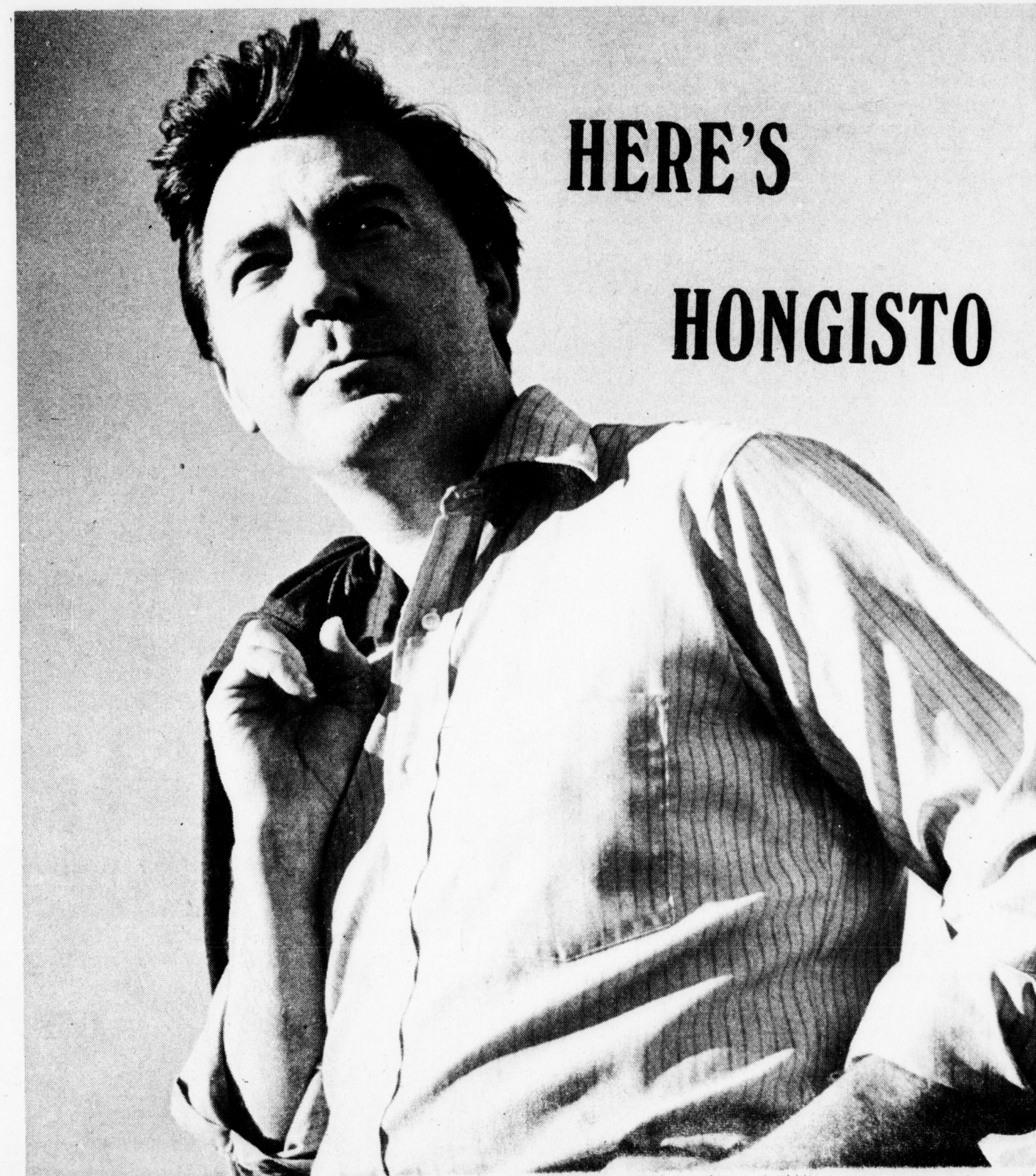

THE RICHARD HONGISTO STORY

Seven years ago when the Society For Individual Rights and the Tavern Guild were in the process of formation, Dick Hongisto was an officer on the San Francisco Police Force. Dick Hongisto was also one of the best friends those fledgling organizations had in city government. The help and encouragement we received from Dick significantly altered the atmosphere, brought us many new friends and made it possible for both organizations to experience the growth it enjoys today. I think it is well for us to keep in mind that Dick's work in our behalf was done at a time when it was hardly wise or fashionable for anyone in city government, let alone the police department, to encourage homosexuals in pursuit of their civil liberties. Many individuals in our community will attest to the personal help he extended to them for their own problems with that criminal element that preys upon homosexuals.

Dick's record as a policeman is unimpeachable. During his ten years on the force he received eleven captain's citations and he holds the coveted Medal of Valor. He also graduated from the Marine Corps training program at

the top of his class. Dick is as tough as the law and as human as the law. He believes that the law should be enforced to protect lives and property and not move in a futile attempt to enforce an unenforceable morality. He has promised as sheriff of San Francisco to testify before the California legislature in favor of Willie Brown's bill and to do everything that the power of his office can do to see that the bill is passed. Seven years of knowing what Dick Hongisto has done for our community leads me to state that he is not making idle campaign promises. Dick has a proven track record in our behalf.

Is Dick qualified to be sheriff?

Let the record speak for itself.

What does the sheriff do anyway?

For the past fifteen years we have been lulled into the belief that the office of sheriff is pretty inconsequential. We have been lulled into this belief because for the past fifteen years we have had a sheriff who has done nothing with that office. It's time for a close look.

1. The Sheriff is responsible for our four county jails.

Aside from the reports of San Francisco Crime Commission, several State of California investigations and a Board of Supervisors investigation, all of which have labeled the incumbent Sheriff's Department as "an utterly incompetent administration" and further stated that

1. As a policeman for ten years he knows crime.

2. As a criminologist nearing completion of his doctorate he knows the causes of crime. For the past seven years, as a student of criminology he has studied at first hand new approaches to fighting crime and rehabilitating criminals.

3. As a police science instructor he is an authority on the methods of criminals and the causes and prevention of crime.

4. As a television reporter he knows how to communicate his ideas to the public.

the jails under the Sheriff's care were "shocking, disgraceful and appalling." There are all too many members of our community who could testify to these shocking, inhuman conditions from first hand experience.

Dick Hongisto will change all that. He has already brought together a team of seasoned professionals—lawyers and criminologists who will work with him to end the negative, punitive thinking that has failed completely and has led many investigations to describe our jail system as a "school for crime."

2. Under Government Code Section 26600 the sheriff is given urgent crime

prevention duties.

Federal funds ARE available for crime prevention but the incumbent sheriff has NO program that earns their use.

Dick Hongisto will end that shocking waste of available Federal funds. Prisoners who demonstrate ability to learn a trade while in jail will be trained to sue that trade to support their families AND make restitution to the victims of their crimes. He will use all of his training and the professional training of his staff to create programs that will earn Federal funds.

3. The Sheriff supplies bailiffs for the Court System.

The increasing disturbances in our Court rooms must stop. They will not be stopped by men who have little or no loyalty to their chief. Dick Hongisto can create that loyalty through his program to upgrade and professionalize his deputies. Dick has said that he would not hesitate to employ qualified members of our community.

4. The Sheriff is a key member of the Parole Commission and other boards.

The Parole Commission is one of the most sensitive areas of Crime prevention. In the past we have seen men prematurely released who have quickly returned to crime. We have also seen many instances of a deserved release delayed too long causing men to become embittered and making the job of rehabilitation harder. Dick Hongisto will bring his experience and education to bear on the solutions of these problems.

5. The Sheriff, as an expert in law enforcement and crime prevention is asked to testify before legislative committees, the Board of Supervisors and other bodies that determine policy. The Sheriff sits on the Mayor's Council for Criminal Justice. When was the last time you heard the incumbent sheriff testify in our behalf on AB437. For that matter when have you heard Mr. O'Connor or Mr. Bigarani offer to testify on our behalf?

A word About the Opposition.

Mr. Carberry—the incumbent for the past fifteen years. The man responsible for all the ills and shocking conditions of the system as presently administered.

Mr. O'Connor—presently Northern California Area Supervisor for the

Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement, State of California, an office he has held since 1958. The dramatic rise in heroin addiction throughout Northern California, and the generally unenlightened approach to drug education and control speaks far more eloquently than I could about Matt O'Connor's effectiveness.

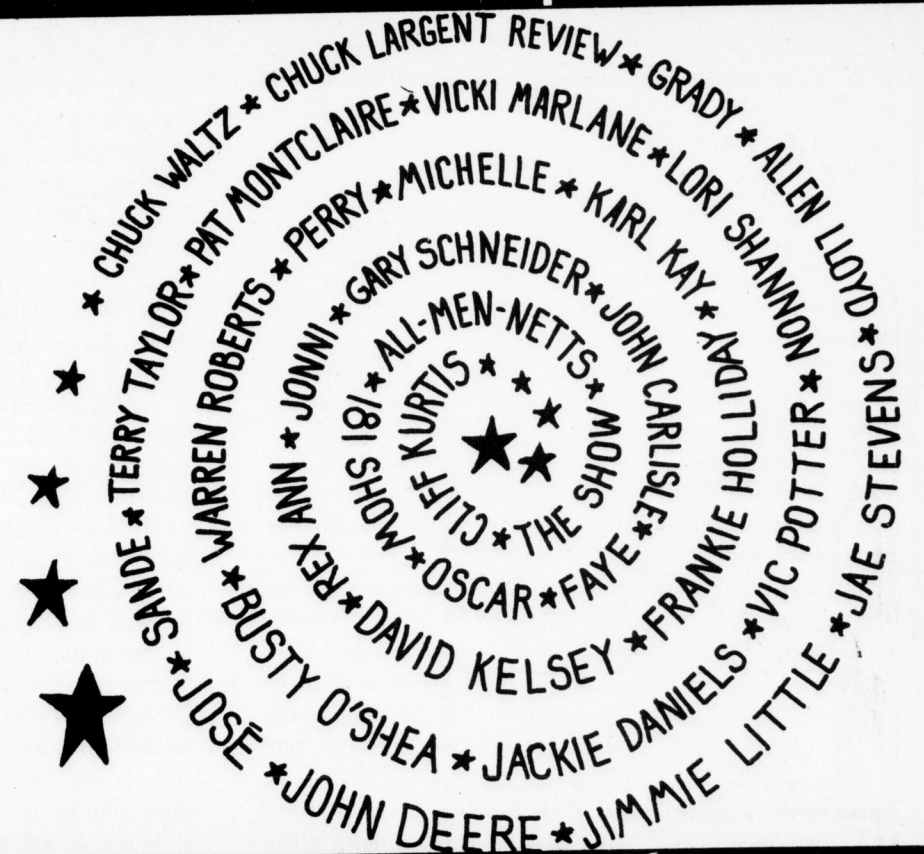
Mr. Bigarani—presently an inspector on the San Francisco Police Force. Under close questioning at the S.I.R. Candidate Night, Inspector Bigarani admitted that he and his partner, Inspector Castro (Remember him?) were assigned to help Macy's find a solution to their "homosexual problem." The arrest of scores of people on felony charges resulted. We could expect no help from him.

Dick Hongisto will be the next Sheriff of San Francisco. He has a better than even chance to win. He has been endorsed by Assemblyman Willie Brown, Congressman Phillip Burton and former U.S. Attorney General Ramsey Clark. Dave Jenkins of the Alioto Campaign and Bruce Kennedy of the Dianne Feinstein Campaign have endorsed him because they realize that of all the candidates, Dick Hongisto is the best qualified and has the best chance to win.

With Dick Hongisto Sheriff, this city will experience a new growth in all the areas of the Criminal Justice system. A growth that our community and the city as a whole will benefit from. This is surely a goal that we could all work for.

T.C. JONES: GONE WITH THE WIND

T.C. Jones, born Thomas Craig, died of Cancer on September 25th at the City of Hope Medical Center in Duarte, California, at age 50.

An extraordinarily famous female impersonator, he was perhaps most famous for his emcee role in *New Faces of 1956*, the cast album of which is still extremely popular.

During the 50s and 60s, he toured the World in his highly successful one-man show, *Mask and Gown*, which played on Broadway in 1957 and later toured the summer stock circuit.

He graduated from Pittsburgh's exceptional *Carnegie Tech* drama department, served in the U.S. Navy and made his Broadway debut in the chorus of *My Dear Public*. After dancing in *Sadie Thompson*, he began his career as a female impersonator and toured in *Polonaise* with Imogene Coca. After *Polonaise* closed, he began playing night clubs and quickly worked his way to the top clubs, such as Las Vegas' *New Frontier*. Shortly afterwards came *New Faces of 1956*.

He had appeared on many television shows, among them the Ed Sullivan, Jackie Gleason and Steve Allen shows, and in many films, *The President's Analyst*, *Unlocked Window* and *The Name of the Game is Kill* among them.

His wife, Connie, survives him, but she is only one of the many of us who will miss his fine comedic talents.

a letter from You

Dear Editor:

The article "Gay Coup in Castro Village" (B.A.R. 1, Oct 71) while correctly indicating that I am indeed a "conservative gay" (I support my local police; voted for Reagan, Rafferty, Murphy and Nixon; will vote for Dobbs, Bigarani, and Rourke) also implied that I stepped down from the Chairmanship of the Eureka Valley Police Community Relations Council due to criticism over my role in the recent Castro Village-Police-Gay-Confrontation. Nothing could be farther from the truth.

The term of Office for the Chair is one year, upon the completion of which I was "drafted" by civilians (gay and straight) and those Police Officers directly involved, for one more year. Due to three deaths in my immediate family and my election to the Secretariat of the Executive Board of Police Community Relations, I chose to shorten my term by two months, and I submitted, at the August Meeting, the name of a person whom I considered qualified to act as my successor. The fact that he was the manager of a gay bar so upset the up-tight-straight, represented by the St. Amant-Crotty bigotry, that a move was made, which I allowed for nominations for the coming year, and an election to be held as soon after as was practical. Hence, the Pettingill vs. St. Amant spectacular (my candidate withdrew in favour of the former.)

I supported Mr. Pettingill and shall continue to do so; however he has pledged himself to favouring no side, no faction, no philosophy nor moral attitude at the expense of any other like body. He must, to be effective, remain neutral and represent all persons in their quest for a lawful and orderly District.

In conclusion, we have had excellent working relationships with Mission Station and all echelons of the Police Department. As Immediate Past Chairman, as Secretary of the City-wide Executive Board, PCR, and as a private citizen, I shall work for the continuance of such, and I ask all responsible gay persons to join me. We have nothing to lose and everything to gain.

Ever since a “model” in one agency he was running in another city was thrown out a window and had his legs broken on the sidewalk below, this man has shut up about what businesses he is running and where he gets his

money. But he is supporting Alioto and putting hundreds of dollars into it. This man is trying to divide the Gay Com-

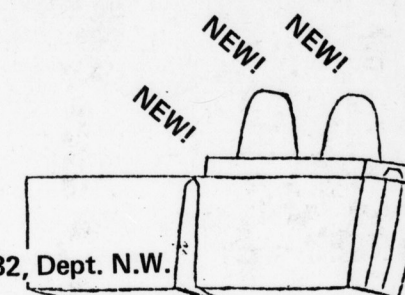
munity and keep all homosexuals classified as outlaws in our society because he makes money that way. And that is where this election is at.

Many good persons have been hood winked that San Francisco is moving ahead under the last three, establishment controlled, administrations. But look around you. Look at the sterile high rise buildings of the last 15 years, look at the 1984 plaza on the Embarc-

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adepo with the Villancourt Fountain, look at the dehumanizing of persons through redevelopment, look at the cattle to market concept of mass public transportation, look at the careful fostering of organized crime in San Francisco. The examples go on and on. If we have a sick heterosexual society in San Francisco, we can never have a healthy homosexual society in San Francisco. We, as homosexuals, must work with the politicians who are most responsive to all minority groups, who have concern for all persons as human beings, who have dedication to San Francisco's unique historical position for creative leadership, and who have the political know how to win elections and bring constructive projects to realization.

Many individuals in the homosexual community have forgotten party affiliations and political bigotries, have dropped their conservative or liberal labels and joined together with work and money in this political campaign to bring about a unified effort to better all San Francisco and all homosexuals. This has been the most active political campaign for homosexuals in San

Francisco's history. Some contemplated projects were bigger than the committee could handle, but the overall effort has been a smashing success. These political activities have included persons with the most conservative political persuasions to the most radical Gay Activists. We all have reached an accord on three candidates and here's why.

DIANNE FEINSTEIN FOR MAYOR

The Mayor's race is a complicated enigma. What Joe Alioto is counting on is discord amongst all political active minority groups with a scattering of political loyalties. Only Dianne Feinstein approaches creative political activities with the unifying winning ability necessary in politics.

A typical example of Alioto political activities was the harassment raids which included the Big Basket. Alioto sanctioned those illegal raids on all after-hours places one year ago. One city civil service employee, ordered to participate in these raids, had verified to me that these orders came from the Mayor's office. He called the raids "illegal harassment motivated politically."

He said he was ashamed to take part in the raids. The police and health departments were specifically ordered by Alioto to engage in this questionable illegal activity to make Alioto look as if he were meeting the problem of rising crime in San Francisco. There are many examples that Mr. Alioto has forced police activities against minority groups who he felt would not fight back, while he has allowed to flourish, organized crime that has large financial and organizational backing from outside of San Francisco. From such questionable activities as the above the Alioto administration has brought nothing but disrespect for law to San Francisco and no police department, no matter how good, can operate with justice in the present atmosphere.

The only candidate that has a possibility of winning the election and stemming the growth of this syndicated crime in San Francisco is Dianne Feinstein. The committee is well aware of Mrs. Feinstein's stand on pornography and prostitution. But, the fact remains that she has taken other political positions that she has qualified when all the facts were openly presented. Her mind can be changed. She does listen to all sides of each question before she reaches a decision. Her decisions try to reflect the greatest good for all San Franciscans. And she does listen to all minority groups including homosexuals.

The practical choice for homosexuals is either Alioto or Feinstein for Mayor. The record shows police entrapment and beatings of homosexuals, illegal raids on gay establishments, and an increasing flow of syndicate money into gay establishments in San Francisco since Alioto has been in office. Alioto has consistently refused to engage in any dialogue with any part of the homosexual leadership. The choice is obvious; Dianne Feinstein for Mayor.

BOB MENDELSON FOR SUPERVISOR

The committee wanted to pick one outstanding candidate for supervisor that could be elected President of the Board of Supervisors by gaining the most votes of all candidates. While we find many creative politicians running for the Supervisorial positions (notably Francois, Griffin and Duskin), Mendel-

sohn's record stands head and shoulders above the others. His record was well reviewed in the last issue of B.A.R. and needs no repetition here. What must be pointed out is that there are candidates for Supervisor that have questionable, unproductive attitudes towards San Francisco and the homosexual community. We would suggest that homosexuals look closely at the statements and records of all candidates and do not vote for those candidates who are against homosexuals. VOTE MENDELSON FOR SUPERVISOR first and foremost. Cast only the one vote for the greatest effect if your conscience so desires.

DICK HONGISTO FOR SHERIFF

We have a Sheriff who must be replaced because of serious personal problems.

The practical choice left for San Francisco is Hongisto or Bigarani. After checking around, it appears that neither man is a homosexual, though I have heard such rumors in reference to both men. The "queer" charges against Bigarani stem from his unusual procedures he has used in the past to entrap homosexuals. Bigarani's past record of police activities make it impossible to think of voting for him.

Hongisto has been called everything in the book because he has worked in San Francisco Police Community Relations. He has tried to respond to minorities on a person to person basis. His particular work has been with black police officers. Such a position is considered radical although the Gay Community who know Dick Hongisto consider him a middle-of-the-road good cop who tried to better race relations. He does respond constructively to minorities so we suggest Dick Hongisto for Sheriff.

The Ad Hoc Gay Citizens Committee urges all homosexuals to vote for the above three candidates. But, if you find other reasons override our arguments, we still strongly urge all homosexuals to vote awarely. It is the most effective way each and every homosexual can better the life for all San Francisco citizens, including gay persons.

Sheriff—Richard Hongisto.

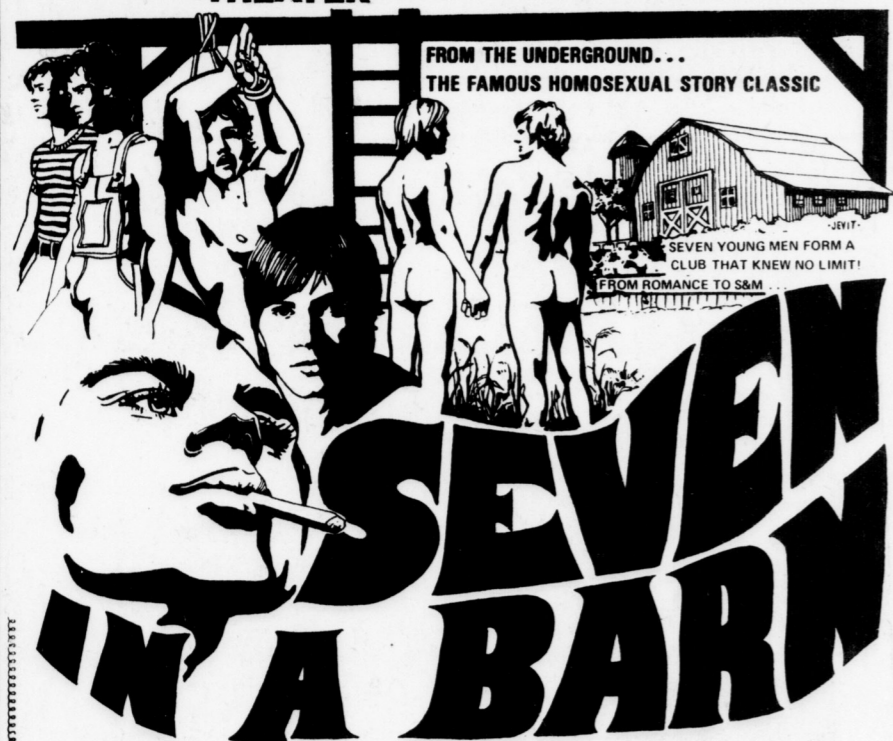
A majority also voted to endorse Yvonne Westbrook for Supervisor.

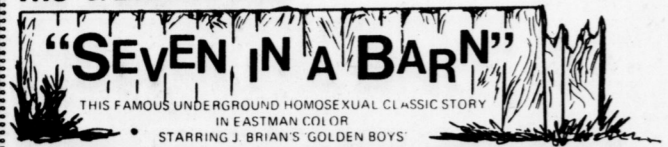
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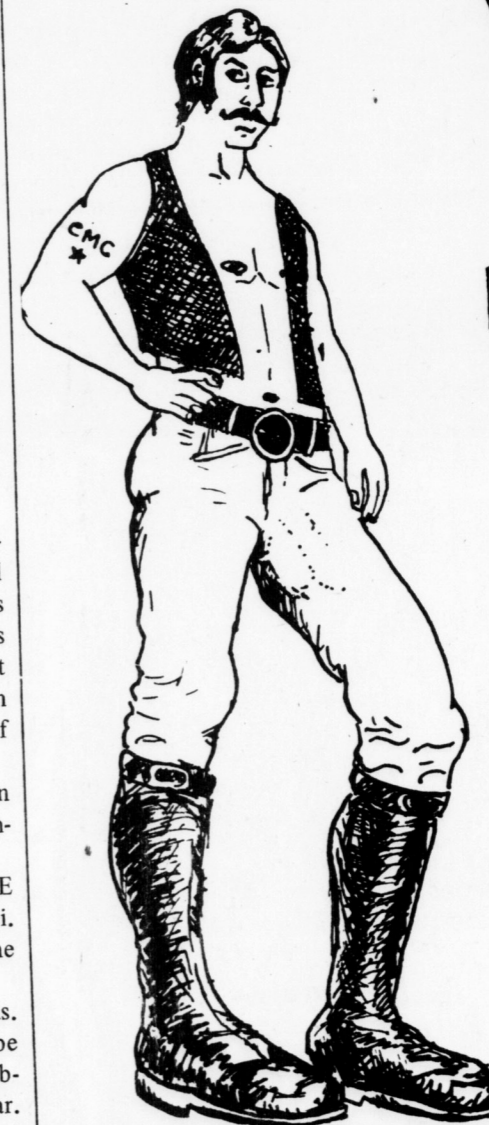
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GOURMET CAPERS

I hope you will bear with me. Until after the Election, when we shall go back to the quiet task of reviewing restaurants, I am going to bring you comments on the "political arena".

I am excited! May I share it with you? Being in the bar and restaurant business, we are exposed to about 1,000 people a week and sometimes more. We have several candidates for office who are courting the Gay vote and we are getting a lot of "feedback" from within the ranks (such as, "Don't get involved in politics" or "After they get your vote, they will turn on you" or "She is

Jewish and she will never be able to accept Gays" or "Why change? We never had it so good."). There hasn't been any heat or pressure, business is good and—even if they are not doing anything—at least they are listening. I am not one who has ever believed much in guarantees. Any contract, no matter what its contents, is only as good as the people who are involved. When you vote for someone, in a very wonderful American way, you become involved in a contract. You, the citizen, the taxpayer have "hired" (elected) an individual to represent you, protect you and build a safe,

clean, not overly-taxed city and state for you to live in. In a debate with one of our older Gay citizens, he insisted we were crazy for getting involved in politics because we are a minority. It is our only hope. Time is of the essence. I know how I feel. My mind, by no stretch of the imagination, is made up. I shall continue to listen and watch. And speaking of listening, the 1,000 people a week that we are exposed to are talking and arguing and debating and, never before, to my knowledge, has there been so much intelligent, sophisticated, far-sighted interest. We must, if we have the courage of our convictions, try to influence everyone we can to vote—*No. 1*. And, if it's not asking too much, on Election Day, after they have given consideration to all the candidates, we hope that, because of our personal influence, if they are on the fence, they will vote for our candidate.

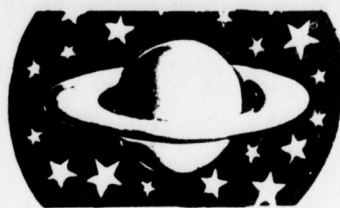

Mid-Month Slump

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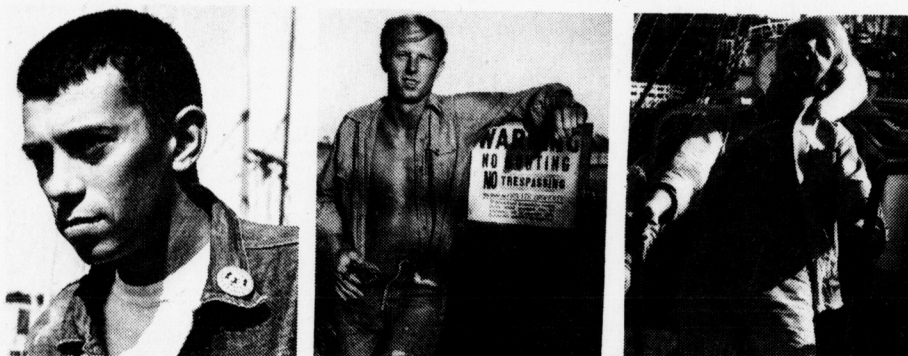

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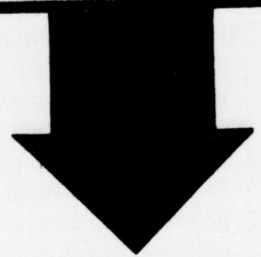

S&M By Any Other Name...

THE PLEDGEMASTERS, with Bruce Gregory, David Knapp, Michael Tremor, James Palmer, Trevor Tiffany and Larry Kennedy, concept and execution by Messrs. Gregory and Knapp, produced and directed by David C. Parrish, released by Signature Films, Inc., in Metrocolor, at the NOB HILL THEATRE, 729 Bush (near Powell), running time: 87 minutes.

THE PLEDGEMASTERS is not a homosexual film in any physical or overtly mental way. It is a documentary

of a college hazing, practiced by—and on—the "normal" all-American college boy.

Amidst reports of deaths during these rituals, and many states' subsequent reactions to this by enacting legislation making hazings illegal (in California, it is a misdemeanor), THE PLEDGEMASTERS is not a particularly rough film. The hazing documented here would appear, under the circumstances, to be rather "normal" (if such a term is applicable in this case). Most of the film's hazing is gastronomical: milk and tabasco sauce, raw eggs, raw oysters, raw onions, mustard and molasses, Lydia Pinkum (yes, you read it right and two bottles-full among four pledges) and paper napkins—the result being, like the ancient Romans who gorged themselves for its own sake, regurgitation.

To a lesser degree, the film deals with the sado/masochistic area of hazing—the area in which college hazings take on their social meaning—and it is here in which the film makes its all-

too-valid (if all-too-brief) point. In documented reports, it has been learned that most fraternities have discovered a subliminal passion for masochism—perhaps all the more common in the so-called "super-straight" male—to the point where *nude* paddlings have all but been totally dispensed with, due to the quite common existence of penile erection during the practice. By the same token, the makers of THE PLEDGEMASTERS were worried that one or more of the volunteer "pledges" would storm out in the middle of the filming when confronted with the necessity to submit. But consulted psychologists were convinced otherwise and they were proven right.

The masochism in this film begins with mental demasculation: each pledge strips another and then their penises are measured, after which they recite a chant taught by rote: "mine is number one in size", "mine is number two, etc." until the fourth—caught with the short end of the ruler—must announce that his "is number four in size" in a falsetto voice. They are constantly referred to by THE PLEDGEMASTERS in terms of women's genitalia, told they are not man enough and beaten (both mentally and physically) into submission to their fellow man. Appropriately, these scenes are inter-cut with brief flashes of R.O.T.C. training (the one, truly inspired bit of creativity in the film). Submitting to other men in such a maso-

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chistic manner, for the sole reason of acceptance by these men, implies a great deal more than casual latent-homosexual tendencies (not only in my jaundiced eye, but in the reports on the subject by many qualified psychologists).

To gain acceptance, they *submit* to the Christian principle of receiving another pledge's punishment—in addition to their own—by "volunteering", "I will stand up for him; he is my brother; I love my brother!" But these are the *same* men who fight because it is manly and hate homosexuality because it is not. This paradox begins to make sense in light of the psychiatrists' reports that the masochism will most likely do a turn-about into equal-strength sadism at next year's hazing when these pledges become THE PLEDGEMASTERS. And this, too, is a point reiterated throughout the film by statements both literal and implied.

The final scene in the film, the beating of one of the pledges with a razor strap—after he has sat, naked, on a block of ice and while being held down by the other pledges—is beautifully done and quite powerful. It succeeds in

making its point where most of the rest of the film has failed in its wishy-washy-ness. It is presaged by the question, "Is belonging to our fraternity the most important thing in the world to you?" He answers... "No." Aha! True strength emerges! Character! Individuality! "What?!", scream THE PLEDGEMASTERS, "Let us ask you again. Are you *man* enough to let us do anything—*anything*—to you in order to join our fraternity?" Hesitatingly, on the brink of tears, fighting within himself, he replies, "Sir, yes, sir!" The beating begins... he lapses into unconsciousness. This massive boy/man has surrendered his manhood at the cost of proving he still has it the rest of his life.

Thank God there *are*—here and there—young men with strength enough to say, "I will stand up for him; he is my brother; I love my brother!" and mean not just within the exclusiveness of a fraternity, but throughout the brotherhood of man.

(ED. NOTE: As a footnote to the film, Larry Kennedy, pledge No. 4 and the only one with a sense of humor about

the hazing and moments of anger because of it—a beautiful man with genuine charm—in short, with a spark of individuality, was killed shortly after the filming while attempting to hitch-hike on a freeway.)

Here's a cheery little item where every character is on the brink of suicide, wallowing in depression and communicating it all in purple prose-soap opera rhetoric that makes SEARCH FOR TOMORROW play like HAMLET in comparison. THE BOYS IN THE BAND is an orgy of optimism next to this self-destructive quickie. As an example, the last scene has two of the so-called "straight" bartenders preparing to drive home after locking up the bar for the night. "We forgot something!", one says. "What?", says the other. "We left one of the faggots asleep under a table." "Don't worry about it", is the reply, "He'll be there tomorrow. Where else does a faggot have to go?"

The acting is fairly consistent in its good quality, the cast consisting of experienced theatre people—some well-known, some not. The writing is amateurish except on one level—that of homosexual bitch-wit. And it doesn't take talent to write good bitch-wit, just experience in living by your wits in a Gay society. But it is, for what it's worth, damn good bitch-wit.

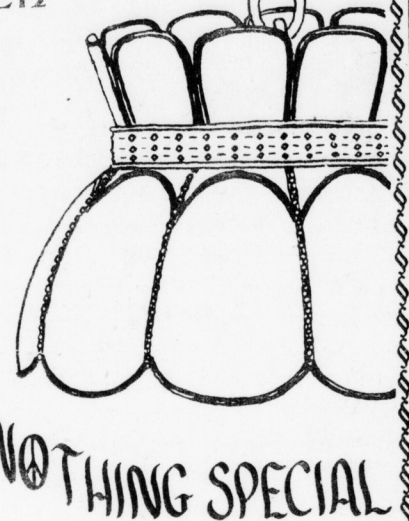
The total result of the film is one of lengthy tedium, punctuated by brief moments of hilarity—not the least of which are unintentional: a mother storming into the Gay bar and screaming at her son, who is dancing with another boy (horrors!), "Where did I go wrong?"

Ah, well. If you feel like seeing THE GAY DECEIVERS again (I did), I suppose the double-bill is worth the \$2.50.

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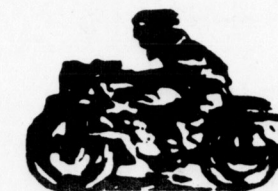

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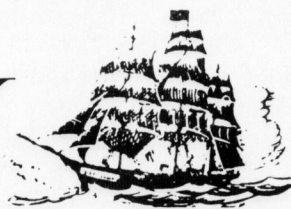
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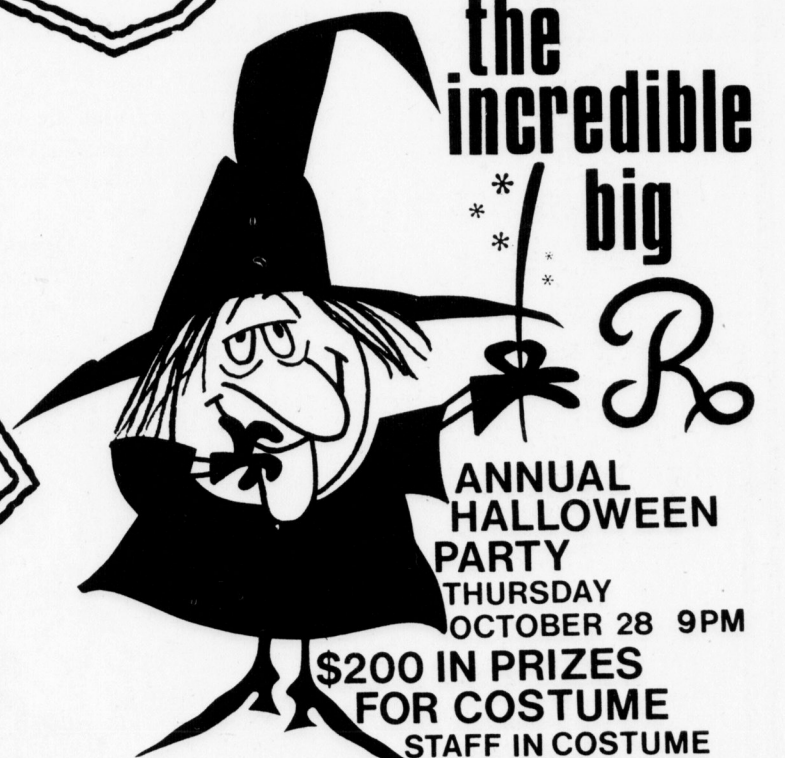


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GAY PRISONERS TORTURED WITH ELECTRODE ATTACHED TO PENIS

Prisoners at Vacaville State Prison and Atascadero State Hospital are being "treated" for homosexuality with a high-voltage electric shock administered to the penis.

Denver Roberts, who was recently released from Atascadero, tells what happened to him: "They attach an electrode to your dick. Then they turn on a projector and show you pornographic pictures. Every time you get a hard-on, they give you a strong electric shock."

Officials at the institutions claim that the "treatment" cures homosexuality. Inmates disagree. "It doesn't work," Denver says, "but you have to pretend it works if you ever want to get out."

The State of California has an official doctrine holding that homosexuality is a disease, so Atascadero is

called a "hospital". Everywhere else in the world, such institutions are called "prisons".

The inmates are sent there to be cured of homosexuality. California law permits commitment to mental hospitals in instances where the judge feels the person may be "a sexual deviate". The inmate need not be convicted, nor even accused of a crime. Once there, the inmate stays until the staff feels he is cured. A social worker with no medical training has the absolute power to decide when an inmate is cured.

Charlie Barnes, a sixty year old homosexual from Bakersfield, was punished for lying to an attendant by being incarcerated two extra years. The social worker told him that was his punishment for lying.

Wm. J. Chambliss, a sociology professor at U.C. Santa Barbara, visited Atascadero with his class. Professor Chambliss commented later: "I would feel a great deal more secure about the world if the inmates went home and the staff stayed locked up."

Dr. Paul F. Bramwell, a Doctor of

Philosophy and Associate Director of Atascadero, is in charge of the tortures. Bramwell is a psychologist with no medical training. When Professor Chambliss asked about the legality of the "treatments", Bramwell replied: "These men have no rights; if we can learn something by using them, then that is small compensation for the trouble they have caused society."

After an expose' of Atascadero appeared in the Underground press last fall, the State Department of Mental Hygiene announced that the use of the torture drug, succinylcholine, had been discontinued.

Now, both Chambliss and the inmates say that the drug injections have been resumed. The drug totally paralyzes the victim. He cannot speak, move a muscle or breathe, but he remains conscious. While the patient is lying completely nude and paralyzed on the floor, the "doctor", who is really just a social worker, tells the patient he has been given the drug because his behavior is "unacceptable".

The patient gets the sensation of dying and completely believes he is dying. The treatment is supposed to scare patients who do not obey the ward rules quickly and thoroughly.

Dr. Kay Thomas, who was employed as a staff psychiatrist at Vacaville Prison, said that the drug can cause permanent brain damage because it cuts off the oxygen supply to the brain. Thomas played no part in the tortures, which he says are "illegal, immoral, inhumane and unethical". Dr. Thomas quit.

The current issue of the *Humanist* features an expose of Atascadero. The *Humanist* editorially asks: "Where is the enemy in this tragedy? Is it the ill-trained and amoral psychologist? The University professors who gave him a Ph.D.? The head of the hospital? If it were any of these, the cure might be simple, for we could remove the offenders and replace them with better men. The enemy, unfortunately, would still remain. For the enemy is the bureaucracy, and the bureaucracy is the only solution possible within this structure of government. Ultimately then, the enemy is the government and the groups that control it. The solution must get to that, if it is to be a real one."
