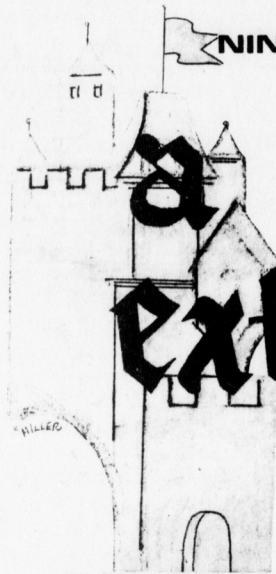

DIANNE

**ASTROLOGICAL
PROFILE
BY EL SCORP**



"In twenty years as a broadcaster and journalist, I have never met a more brilliant, honest or competent person than Dianne Feinstein."

So says San Franciscan Fred Goerner who is one of the hundreds of people from every walk of life in San Francisco who are giving unstintingly of time and effort to help Dianne Feinstein to election.

"She has a complete grasp of this city's problems," continues Goerner, "and she has the programs and the great leadership qualities necessary to solve those problems. Her strength and dedication are a marvel, and she has a business and management ability that would be the envy of any corporation president. She can be totally strong, even tough, when the occasion demands it. But she always tempers that strength and toughness with the willingness to listen and with a genuine sensitivity to the needs of all San Franciscans."

"Most important to me as a journalist," concludes Goerner, "she tells all of the truth all of the time."

Goerner's estimate of Dianne

Feinstein is shared by tens-of-thousands of San Franciscans who believe in human freedom and dignity and the possibility of honest government in City Hall.

While only 38 years old, Dianne Feinstein has a tremendously impressive record in government and in legislative accomplishment.

As President of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, she has fought hard for police reform, better housing, controls on high-rise buildings, pollution

and noise abatement measures, better public transportation.

It was Mrs. Feinstein's leadership which produced majority support of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors for Assemblyman Willie Brown's California Assembly Bill 437 to legalize private sexual activity between consenting adults.

The Police Charter Amendment which will be on the November 2nd ballot is the work of Mrs. Feinstein.

The product of hundreds of hours

of work, the proposition will remove "juice" or patronage from the Police Department by increasing merit promotions which will be based upon exams designed to test skills, experience and expertise of the applicant. It will increase police effectiveness to deter violent crime and apprehend criminals, concentrating on violent and economic crimes rather than on the non-victim crimes.

A native San Franciscan and a graduate of Stanford University, Dianne is married to distinguished neurosurgeon Dr. Bert Feinstein and she has one daughter, Kathy, who is now 14.

In addition to her post as President of the S.F. Board of Supervisors, Dianne is Chairman of the Board's Rules Committee, a member of the Board of Directors, Bay Area Air Pollution Control District, member Board of Directors, County Supervisors Association of California, member Executive Committee Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) and a member of the City's State Legislation Committee.

She is the former Chairman of the San Francisco City and County Advisory Committee for Adult Detention

and former member of the California Women's Board of Terms and Parole.

She is a member of S.P.U.R., California Tomorrow, Friends of the Earth, Sierra Club, Bay Area Urban League, Planning and Conservation League and a former member of the Board of Directors, San Francisco League of Women Voters.

Mrs. Feinstein promises to clean house at City Hall after November 2nd.

"For too long," she says, "the same old power brokers, using the Mayor's Office and crony appointees, have carved up our city, giving way to vested interests and abominable high-rises with utter disregard for the well-being and the will of the people."

"San Francisco can't stand four more years of that," she adds. "When I am Mayor, appointments are going to be made strictly on the basis of ability and merit. The day of the political hack is finished. We're going to start seeing to the needs of the people who live in San Francisco. We're going to concentrate on improving the quality of life in every part of our city."

Dianne's programs call for strict regulation of the height of buildings in every part of town, along with the regulation of the bulk, density and color of those buildings.

"We must explode once and for all the myth that high rises are a necessary prerequisite for employment," says Dianne.

"Most of the people who work in them are not San Franciscans, and we would be better off employing the construction trades in rebuilding the deteriorated parts of our City."

"How does the working man profit," Dianne questions, "when the fruits of his labor are Manhattanization—the creation of a City in which he cannot sustain a decent standard of living?"

Census figures show that San Francisco has more than 65,000 substandard housing units in the City and that more than two-thirds of our residents live in rented housing with a vacancy factor approaching zero. This means higher rents, bad maintenance, arbitrary evictions.

Dianne plans to tackle those problems head on.

"The right to decent, safe and sanitary housing is one which is going to be

respected in San Francisco," says Dianne.

"I propose to increase housing production through subsidies and tax abatement and the utilization of public property. Rehabilitation of existing properties is going to be encouraged through rehabilitation assistance programs and improved code-compliance mechanisms."

Dianne also proposes the establishment of a city-wide municipal Landlord-Tenant Grievance Panel. The Panel would handle disputes regarding such matters as rents, security deposits and maintenance.

Dianne vows that the public transportation system of San Francisco is going to be greatly improved. She believes the first step toward better transit is improved planning and administration of the transportation system.

"The people have a right to an ef-

ficient transportation system that meets their needs with reasonable cost and with dignity," Dianne concludes.

"Our Senior Citizens should have their special 5-cent bus fare extended to all hours of the day instead of forcing the elderly to ride public transportation during off-hours."

Dianne's programs all of the important problems that San Francisco faces, and they are all uniformly well thought out and all are possible of accomplishment with her leadership.

When questioned by B.A.R. with respect to her well publicized stand on pornography, Dianne smiled and replied, "For months and months I tried to interest reporters in my work in areas of police charter reform, tax relief and summer jobs for minority youth. The response was almost nil. And then I made a statement on pornography and it was front page news. It's easy to see

Dear Editor:

The Oct. 15 issue of B.A.R. carried a political advertisement as invidious as any that has appeared this campaign. This ad states that Mrs. Feinstein talks "doubletalk" and only "pretends to nurture gay causes." The writers of the ad go so far as to make up an anti-gay statement which they fantasize—on no basis whatever—that Mrs. Feinstein might make after election. They put this

statement in quotation marks.

The ethics of this technique are questionable. Beyond that, the substance of the charge is false. To cite only two examples, Mrs. Feinstein introduced the amendment to extend the anti-discrimination ordinance to cover sexual orientation. Also, she endorsed Willie Brown's bill AB 437. This is not doubletalk, nor is it pretense. This is actual support of homosexual rights.

The ad further says, "Don't rock the boat... Stick with Alioto." There is a joke about two political prisoners about to be executed by a firing squad. One asks for a blindfold. The other turns to him and says, "Shh... don't make trouble." This cringing attitude and the attitude of the ad are the same.

Alioto at first said he would endorse the Willie Brown bill. Then, because he said the phrase "sex in private" was ambiguous, he vetoed the Supervisors' support of the bill. If THIS is not pretense, if THIS is not doubletalk, what is?

Dear Editor:

The concern within the Gay Community over the upcoming election is gratifying. Never before has there been so much active campaigning for candidates and maybe that is a sign that we are finally coming alive.

But, we also seem to be approaching a dangerous rift within our bloc between the

Feinstein supporters and the Feinstein haters—the Alioto supporters and the Alioto haters.

My personal preference does not lie with either Alioto or Feinstein—it is with another candidate. But my 'preference' does not have a chance to win this election and my vote for him would be wasted.

Even in the absence of Mrs. Feinstein, Mayor Alioto should have never been a serious contender for our support. Those who are arguing that we have never had it so good have a short memory, forgetting the raids/harassment/entrapment/arrests on Folsom Street, Polk Street, Castro Street and the downtown stores, Lands End, etc. Granted they were small incidents and affected only selected targets and a few people, but they were politically designed in just that way. The uncertainty of the power of the Gay, and Gay sympathizers', vote keeps him and most other politicians from conducting an all out crack-down, but we, along with other minority groups, are used by him/them as an example of their abilities as officials of this city (i.e. arresting 'queers'=fighting crime). Fighting crime is one of the big points of Mayor Alioto's campaign, so he doesn't deserve the vote of criminals (read 'us').

There is no reason to expect any change if he is returned to office. We will see the continuation of these small snipings; he will go on, as before, pretend that we are not there, while at the same time trying not to alienate too many of us; and hoping that we are a divided, minimal force for him to contend with. He has been the most noticeable, consistently absent candidate from any of the Gay organizations' candidates nights and that should give you an indication of what he does (or doesn't) think of us. (Rumor has it now that he will attend the Beaux Arts Ball—an obvious last-minute attempt to swing enough votes his way to keep Mrs. Feinstein from defeating him. At this point though, we would only be dividing ourselves and should not take this too-late, convert attempt seriously. But he also wouldn't do it if he weren't becoming worried about the possibility that we are a faction to contend with.)

Few candidates have ever openly solicited, received and—even more important—ACKNOWLEDGED Gay support in their bids for office. Our display of strength, which even in a negative way has been considerable, has been confined to throwing our vote away from anyone who is against us, and giving it to someone who, if nothing else, at least didn't attack us.

And now, in this election, candidates for important city offices have received our support, and that fact is well known. These candidates have received endorsements from the two largest Gay organizations in the city as well as a broad base of support from individual members of Our Community.

In *practical politics* it does not much matter who the candidate is so long as a show of strength can be affected with a given figurehead. We could have accomplished one of our goals with almost any other candidate

on the slate. But, none of the major candidates for office solicited our vote, and those who might have otherwise received our support do not have the broad base of support necessary to make an impressive showing in this race. So we are now presented with an unwanted dilemma—Feinstein vs. Alioto—a dilemma which is causing a good deal of concern within our ranks.

The most common reaction to Mrs. Feinstein is the fear that she will turn on us once she is in office. It is not an ungrounded fear—she has done little to give us much confidence that she will not decide to crack-down on us along with pornography and other such things. The fear is not ungrounded—but an examination of *practical politics* will show that few politicians turn on their political base, and we are a key faction to Mrs. Feinstein's possibilities. All politicians spin like a weather vane in political winds. We need only look at Mayor Alioto's TV campaign commercial—the one where he is riding in the front of a boat on the Bay explaining to someone what he is doing to preserve San Francisco and the Bay—to see his about face maneuver on the U.S. Steel building project. A year ago he was for it, now he IMPLIES that he would be against it in the interest of preservation of the waterfront. IMPLIES, without ever saying that he is against it, leaving an open-ended possibility that U.S. Steel would be just what San Francisco needed to preserve its waterfront.

Labor Unions, Business Associations, Big Money. All are powerful political blocs. All are recognized by politicians. Most are courted for their support. They are all handled gently by those in office—few officials are going to fly in their faces. That is what we are now trying to accomplish in this race: to establish the Gay, and Gay-sympathizers', vote as influential enough to be considered, more seriously than ever before, by politicians. As a key factor in Mrs. Feinstein's ambitions to Mayoralty, it is not likely that she, as any other politician, will turn on us. Political suicide is not common among such people.

So now we have gone beyond individual preferences in candidates. We have to coldly examine what will be best for us—not who we would like to see in office. And the best thing for us is a heavy show of power which we can accomplish only by *not* splitting our votes between Alioto and Feinstein—by *not* throwing away our vote on another candidate, however strong our personal liking. While the 'unknown' power of the Gay vote has led to a relaxing of conditions here, only a "power play" such as we are attempting now will lead any further. And, it has become a "power play".

Feinstein/Mendelsohn/Hongisto have received and acknowledged our support. You may be sure that other politicians are keeping a close eye on this trio and will be watching carefully to see how they fare at the polls. For that reason, and that reason alone, bar-

ring unforeseen developments, my vote will go to Mrs. Feinstein. For our collective good we cannot throw away a vote on a personal preference. For our collective good we cannot waste a vote on a man who has never acknowledged that we *do* vote—a vote that would go unthanked and unrecognized. Even should we ultimately lose in backing Mrs. Feinstein, a precedent will have been set: we will have become a bloc to be reckoned with by any and all candidates.

Most of us have never committed any crime more serious than a parking or speeding ticket. It is time for us to move to take away the label 'criminal' from our lives—a label that we acquire through no doing of our own. It is time to stop the Bible-thumping, pulp-pounding politicians such as those that defeated AB 437 in Sacramento, and the only way to accomplish this is to become a force to be reckoned with. This is a start right here. When you go to the polls, think of your vote not in the light of personal preference, but in the context given here.

Ultimately what you do at the polls is between you, your conscience and the little booth. But do think of this context.

But, whatever you decide . . . VOTE! dammit!

A person's past criminal record is not the primary concern; it is, rather, whether or not he has reformed as a result of his incarceration. And in this specific case, it is obvious that he has not.

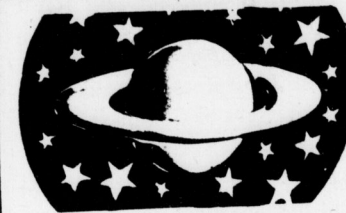

The Feinstein & S.F. Charts

With Labor Day well past, and this being Hallowe'en weekend, the Fall Season is in full swing. Social festivities have already gotten off to a running start, and there is more than enough for everyone to do on every level of human participation. Social activities, however, will take a back seat to the local elections which, unfortunately, take place exactly at Full Moon. With the Sun and the Moon opposite each other, the results of our local election are going to be disappointing to the City as a whole.

Some attempts were made to obtain the birth data of the candidates. These attempts were made too close to the election and too close to column deadline. The only exact data we could obtain was for Mrs. Dianne Feinstein. We also were able to do a chart for the

City of San Francisco, the chart being based on the moment of the adoption of the first City charter.

The chart for the City of San Francisco has Gemini rising with Gemini

Moon and Aries Sun. There is a fine Aries stellium in the eleventh house which makes this a very friendly city. It is an aggressive and enterprising city, easily able to adapt to circumstances; in fact, rather changeable.

Mrs. Feinstein's chart has several points in common with the City's chart. Her Moon is conjunct to the City's Ascendant, and her Jupiter is also conjunct to that of the City. Her Venus is conjunct to the City's Mars. The Jupiter conjunction shows that there is a similarity, if not complete agreement, of

ideals and concepts. Mrs. Feinstein and the City would certainly be good for each other. The relationship between Mrs. Feinstein and the City should be very good and very beneficial.

The Venus-Mars conjunction is also excellent. Whatever the City wants, Mrs. Feinstein would give. Moreover, her chart is one of creative service, devotion to home and to civic responsibilities. She is enterprising, adaptable, practical, but she is also quite emotional, much more of a worker than an executive. She will work steadily for the City, and she will work hard, and the City's chart shows that the City desires service rather than giving it.

Anyone can see how interesting it would be to have had the birth data of other candidates both as individual charts and for comparison to the chart of the City. Several special charts were made regarding the coming election. These charts show that a tremendous voting block will be split between Mayor Alioto and Mrs. Feinstein, and the beneficiary will probably be Scott Newhall. Historically, voting splits have

seldom produced other than second-best results for the citizenry and long-range lessons too often forgotten the second time around. Four years is a long time to pay for disappointment, especially in executive and governmental areas.

In the meantime, of course, Mrs. Feinstein, as President of the Board of Supervisors, will be able to continue giving of her best for the benefit of the City of San Francisco. It is strange that Mrs. Feinstein should be so much in the public eye, for she has a real need for seclusion and isolation. She must beware of giving too much attention to details which can bog her down and keep her from seeing the over-all scheme of things. The stellium in Virgo serves to balance out the position of Saturn and the Pisces Ascendant. Hers is certainly a chart which holds much sustaining strength.

The planetary positions for this weekend show the Sun on Saturday and Sunday in six and seven degrees of Scorpio. The Moon will be in Pisces Friday and most of Saturday, going into Aries Saturday evening. Mercury will be

in 20 and 21 degrees of Scorpio, and Venus in 23 and 24 degrees of Scorpio. Mars will be in 26 degrees of Aquarius. Saturn, in five degrees of Gemini (sitting heavily on the Moon in San Francisco's Chart). Neptune will be in one degree and Jupiter in eight degrees of Sagittarius. Pluto will be in zero degrees and Uranus in 15 degrees of Libra. Lilith, the planet of disappointments will be in three degrees of Capricorn on Saturday.

For Election Day, the quicker planets will have advanced a degree a day, except the Moon which will, by mid-day of Tuesday, be in Taurus (thus making the Full Moon), and Lilith will be in fifteen degrees of Capricorn, making a Grand Square with Saturn, Mars and Jupiter in San Francisco's Chart. The fast planets, other than the Moon and Lilith, are the Sun, Mercury and Venus. Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune and Pluto are slower in the order mentioned. Place these planetary positions around your own chart and watch those touching planetary positions in your own chart for clues to the closeness of incidents in your own daily life. If I may be permitted a personal remark, I look with especial care to the coming week, particularly to the aspects formed on Election Day to my own chart since, on the following day, I shall be celebrating a birthday under, what you will have gathered, are not the most auspicious of planetary influences and transits.

For those of you who were waiting for a Scorpio analysis in this issue, it will be given in the next issue, since there was so much of special interest to take up the commentary section of this article. Here, sign by sign, is what to expect of this weekend. Remember to read for your Ascending sign rather than for your Sun sign.

you will do best to seek seclusion and recharge your batteries for the week ahead.

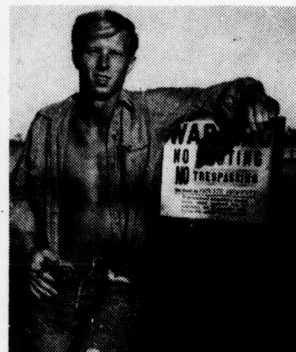
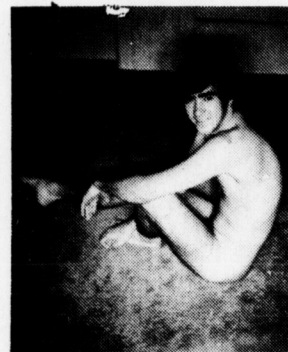

The bar owner has a great deal to lose when he becomes involved in poli-

tics. The mechanics of operating a bar, whether Gay or straight can be most interesting.

If you are lucky enough to pass the investigation by the Alcoholic Beverage Control, your problems some-

times are just about to begin. If you wish game machines, (pool tables, pin-balls, etc.) you must apply to the Police Dept., if you wish a dance permit or Cabaret License you must apply to the Police Dept. After an investigation you then go before the Permit Board and the Chief and/or the Deputy Chief and their assistants grant or deny you your permits. Then of course there is the Fire Department that places a limit on your establishment according to the "square footage" and last but not least the Health Dept. Without the cooperation or blessing of anyone of these departments the bar owners lot can be very difficult, especially if he is just getting started. Most of these departments work very closely together. On the surface it would seem that their job would be number one to enforce the law as it is written, the only problem here at times becomes one of interpretation, and of course their most important function is to keep undesirables from getting on a license where they could get into the area of crime such as gambling, using "B" girls or boys etc. I wonder—if this be true, how some people who are of questionable character do get on a license. Now then the average man who decides to go into the food and beverage business usually has placed anywhere from \$10,000 to \$50,000 and up on the line. So it stands to reason that he must work for total cooperation from all the departments that will in a way govern his business. There are a few brave people that have committed themselves to certain candidates for public office, we wish to commend them and if you should in any way start receiving any pressure that is not normal we would like to know. It will be kept in confidence, but we must know right away so we can with the help of the different organizations, protect you courageous people. However I would remind you that if you have any auctions, benefits etc. during the next few weeks, for goodness sake make sure everything is to the letter of the law, if you should be stopped for any reason whatsoever, inform your customers that it will be investigated and to remain calm and peaceful. We cannot afford any scenes right now that could be used against our candidates. And I for one am convinced that the other side is laying and waiting

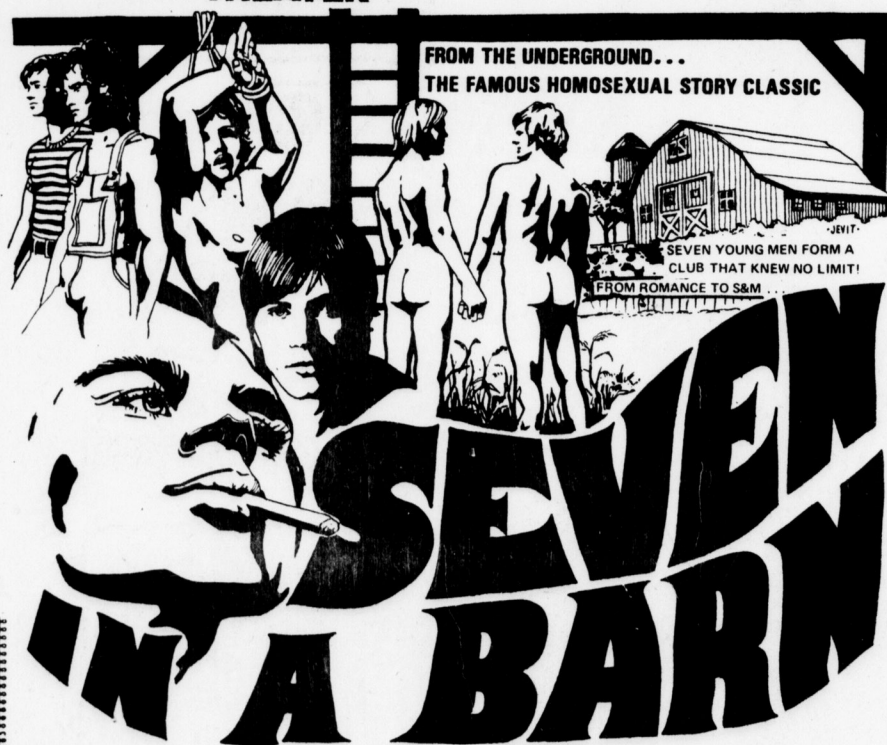
are helping to make those beautiful waves, the object is not always to win, but how you play the game. And should those waves, as some people say, turn on us, we shall weather that storm too.

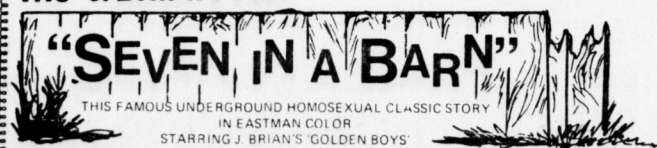

Brian, presented in Eastman Color by Vitruvian Productions, at the LAUREL THEATRE, 2111 Polk Street (between Broadway and Vallejo), rated "H-C".

J. Brian has done it again! Another break-through in "hard-action" filmmaking: sync sound. Now you can hear the "ooh"s and "aah"s, moans and groans at the precise time you see the writhings in ecstasy.

SEVEN IN A BARN is a feature-length film based on the best-selling book of the same title. For the uninitiate, it concerns seven boys in a country town who form a Saturday Sex Club, the meetings of which take place in an out-of-the-way barn. The libertarian right has completely split with the authoritarian right. Libertarians created this nation, and ran it for 150 years. 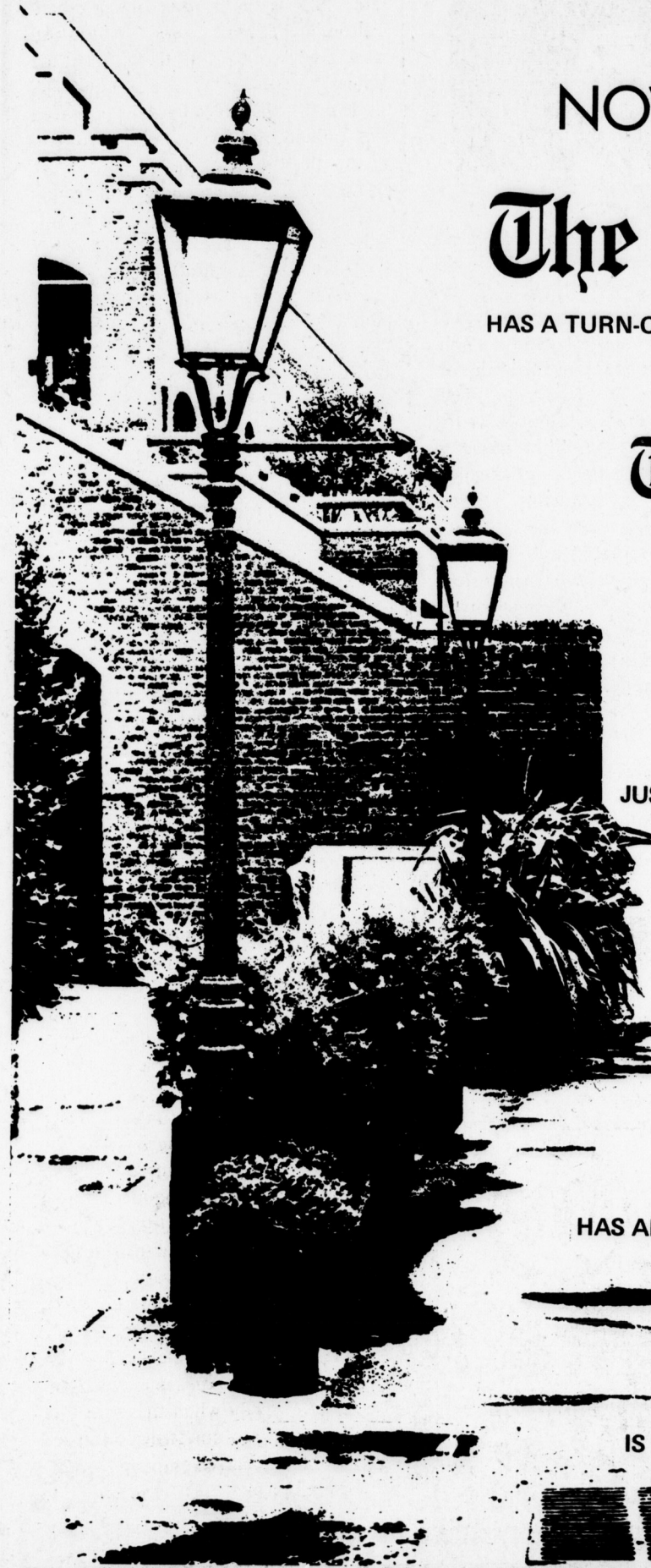

LEGISLATURE ABOLISHES CASTRATION PUNISHMENT

The State Senate abolished castration of prisoners, by a 47 to 11 vote, recently. The bill had previously been passed by the assembly and now goes to Reagan for signature. Reagan's signature is a mere formality since it passed by more than 2/3 majority.

The Bill (SB 1146) was introduced by Senator George Moscone (D-San Francisco) after outraged complaints about the castrations from human rights groups all over the world.

The Bill repeals Sec. 2670 of the California Penal Code. Sec. 2670 provided for castration as "an additional punishment" for three classes of prisoners: those who have been twice convicted of a sex offense; those who have been convicted "at least three times for any other crime or crimes"; and those serving life sentences, even if it is a first offense, and regardless of the crime.

The law said that the castration punishment could be imposed on these types of prisoners whenever the prison authorities felt that the prisoners "physical, mental or moral health" would benefit from the operation.

California's castration punishment is well known all over the world (except in California), and is often cited as proof that California is a barbaric society a thousand years behind the rest of the world.

The castration punishment, although widely used, was never mentioned in the establishment press, no did any daily paper in California mention the recent repeal of Sec. 2670.

Although the bill will abolish the castration of prisoners in State prisons, many regard it as a sop to quell the raising tide of protest against the savagery of the State of California. Unfortunately, most of the castrations were not performed under Sec. 2670, but result from the immense discretionary powers granted judges under indeterminate sentencing. Several judges, including former L.A. County Superior Court Judge Collier and San Diego County Superior Court Judge Turrentine, habitually give sex offenders the choice between castration and probation, or life imprisonment.

Since sodomy and many other sex offenses carry a penalty of "one year to life", judges are given what amounts to almost the power of life and death over a defendant. The judge can even substitute probation for the one year minimum penalty.

Castration is perhaps the most insidious outrage against humanity practiced by the State of California, although this barbaric State turns some of its prisoners into vegetables with electroconvulsive shocks, and gasses others to death in its gas chamber. The last two punishments are kinder, since the pain of the victims is quickly ended by death of the body or destruction of the mind.

California has at least had the decency and shame to conceal the castrations. The victims have joined the authorities and the press in a conspiracy of silence. Even the victims don't care to discuss castration—their main concern seems to be keeping their tragedy a secret.

The repeal of Sec. 2670 is a significant, albeit small, move toward penal reform. But California must make drastic penal reforms if it is ever to catch up with the rest of the world. The evil of

castration will remain until the excesses of judicial discretion and indeterminate sentencing are abolished. The evils of electroconvulsive shock and the gas chamber remain. Even if these were abolished, California's prisoners would suffer from the inhumanities of improper diet, inadequate medical care, sexual deprivation and the denial of basic human rights.

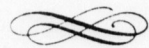

earth," he said, in one of the most scintillating and satisfying demonstrations of organ virtuosity this city has ever witnessed. He then proceeded to weave a magic spell using the transcendental music of J.S. Bach.

For those who missed it, and for those organ buffs who were occupied with other things, I can only offer my sincere regrets that you didn't make it. For sheer bombast and technical perfection, the Virgil Fox style is unparalleled. Many of his life-long devotees are familiar with his genius and his psychic connection with the so-called supernatural. Mr. Fox had us groveling at his rhinestone-studded feet.

The Heavy Organ trip has been going on now for almost 11 months. Fox commissioned the Rogers Organ Company to build a huge, three-manual electronic instrument designed for classic music so that this series of concerts

could be made possible. And the addition of a complete light show with each appearance has provided the necessary sweetener for a project of such mammoth scale. Beginning with a packed house of 3000 at Fillmore East in December of last year (1000 were unable to get in), the grand Fox entourage made its way to Winterland, and there will be many more appearances in other parts of the U.S. and the rest of the world.

Fox's smashing success with an all-Bach program lies in his technique of bringing Bach's music to the masses. The Leipzig Master of counterpoint is reincarnated in Virgil Fox. He gently lifts old workhorses down from the shelf, blows off the dust of centuries and transforms them into living, breathing fire-and-brimstone testimonies to the eternal greatness of the old church mouse of St. Thomaskirche. For three hours, the phenomenon of musical communication in its highest form turned on a truly surprised and thrilled audience. He played all the old favorites (from memory, of course), while at the same time giving cosmic injections to the brain.

Probably the biggest umph of the evening was the flamboyant Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor. Beginning with the very simple inversion of the C minor scale (Fox's "key of the earth"), the 21 variations rose to mini-climaxes and major orgasms again and again, until at the end we didn't know whether to shut up or shout as the Fugue came to a crashing conclusion with all stops and couplers of the organ on, and Pablo Lights treating our eyes to colors, strobe lights and mirror balls. There were five encores before the exhausted artist was permitted to leave the stage.

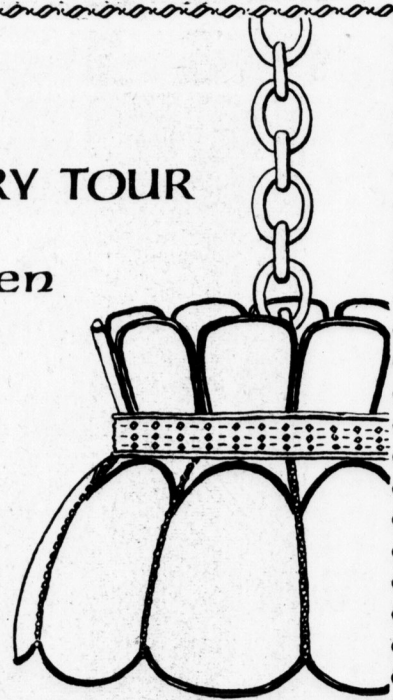
Group therapy takes many forms, it's true. This particular medium of group communication is fast becoming popular among growing numbers of people who always hated organ music. It's obvious that Virgil Fox is the only person alive who has had the guts and the talent to debunk those organists and clergymen who have been so selfish with Bach in the past. He claims that this is only the first step. If he can expand this experience to all five of the senses as he says he will do, the world just might not be ready.

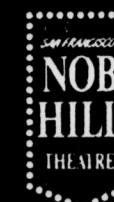

BEFORE the LENS

Have you been reading and heeding some of my modeling tips as discussed in previous issues? If you have, then we can begin discussing the various types of specialized modeling agents and the work you will be doing. Last issue, I covered the selection of an agent. With this column, we will talk about the fashion modeling field.

Fashion models employed by apparel designers, wholesalers and manufacturers are called showroom or wholesale models. Prospective buyers are shown accessories and garments quickly and effectively by these models. Their ability to wear clothing and accessories with an air of distinction is a talent every male fashion model strives for. MASCULINITY is what is displayed in men's clothing. As the model walks, pivots and turns to the side, he reveals the highlights of each garment for the prospective buyers.

"Modeling sounds fun," you may be saying to yourself. It is, and you can very easily become a part of it. Good posture and carriage, acquiring and maintaining a good physique, and the ability to project a magnetic personality are pre-requisites to success in this field. The fine points of posing, the techniques required for showroom and fashion modeling, cannot be perfected overnight. But the training period is brief when compared to that required for other careers.

The successful male model brings his unique qualities of individuality to every assignment, whether he is showing the new Ah Men fashions or the new Levi Strauss clothing for Esquire magazine. He reinforces the masculinity of the product. He conveys THE LOOK art directors, photographers and illustrators want.

Because the need for a variety of dif-

ferent types is so great, it is folly to run yourself inside out to copy a "popular" male model. The best thing you can do is learn how to emphasize your own unique qualities. The best assignments go to the skilled model who has been well-trained and has developed his own style and look.

How old are you? That's a question an accomplished fashion model almost never hears. The age at which a guy appears to be determines his age range for modeling. A teenager might model as an older type, despite the fact that he is young in years. Likewise, many "teen" types are over 20.

By the way, beware of the person who wants to prepare your photo portfolio. One of the most difficult tasks in becoming a successful model is putting together an effective portfolio of your pictures. It took almost three years for one model to assemble his portfolio, comprised of 15-30 photos. Since a fashion model is initially judged by his portfolio, it is important to choose a representative selection of photographs. They should be of uniform size, 11 by 14 inches. A good portfolio includes a full-face shot, a full-length photo and a variety of photos showing your qualities in a number of different poses. The portfolio should reflect the model's personality. If, however, your chief interest is modeling in fashion showrooms, retail stores or trade shows, you may not need a portfolio.

There are many modeling agencies in the San Francisco area. Check the yellow pages of the directory to find those agencies using male models. The agencies listed are licensed and safe for you to assume they are reputable.

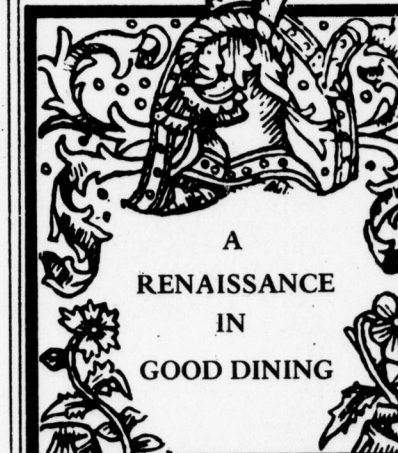
