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## CORONA EXCLUSIVE! SEX MURDERS ?

Accused mass murderer Juan Corona's lawyer, Mr. Richard Hawk, in an exclusive taped interview for B.A.R. with Reverend Raymond Broshears, charged that the Mexican Catholic church has perverted many Mexican men into becoming murderers because of frustrated sexual drives. He continued by accusing the Sutter County Sheriff's office and prosecutor Teja of knowing the real murderer and of botching up the evidence. Mr. Hawk also expressed outrage at the yellow journalistic style of misleading press coverage concerning his statements about homosexuality in this case.

Homosexuality was first introduced into this mass murder case by the Prosecutor's office when they released to the press that a homosexual was responsible for this horror because all bodies they had found had their penises exposed from their clothes. This press release was issued before the Juan Corona trial started. Juan Corona and his brother Nativido Corona, were accused of being homosexual by assistant prosecutor Williams.

"Juan Corona is hopeless heterosexual," retorted Mr. Hawk to these charges.

In attempting to develop their homosexual theory, the Sutter County Sheriff's office, took swabs of all rectal areas of the victims to test for semen. None was found. No tests were made of any penises for semen.

This was just one of many mistakes in handling of the investigation charges Mr. Hawk. The cold hard facts as pointed out by Mr. Hawk are that no

victim had his rectal area exposed from their clothing. It is on these facts that Mr. Hawk has started to build his defense case of frustrated sex caused by Mexican Catholic conditioning that turns into male to male violence. Lawyer Hawk contends that frustrated homosexual sex drives are the overwhelming cause of murders in Central Mexico. These "Pasivo" homosexuals who are created through fear and sin by the Mexican Catholic priests, have been thoroughly investigated and written about in a thesis by an American psychologist whose name, Mr. Hawk, would not release as yet. This psychologist will be introduced as an expert witness to establish motivation for these mass murders. In a year of study in Guadalajara, Doctor "X" has documented this perverted Catholic conditioning that is peculiar to this area of Mexico. Many Mexican homosexuals are driven into a passive role of acting out the part of the female in the sex act, contends this thesis. These "passivo" homosexuals are readily accepted as a sex release by heterosexual Mexican males who are controlled by strict sexual mores of the Catholic church. The teachings of the Catholic church insist that a woman must remain virgin before marriage and true to her mate after marriage. Sex is for procreation and not for pleasure.

The ultimate act of degradation for a Mexican male is to act out the role of the female in the sex act. These socially created "passivo" homosexuals who are forced into the female sex role, strongly feel that their

masculinity has been taken from them and that they must go to great lengths to reassert their masculinity after engaging in the sexually passive role. Their reaction becomes one of vicious hatred for the "activo" sex partner immediately after sex. Mr. Hawk and

Doctor "X" said that they will establish in court that this is the motivation for these mass murders with which Juan Corona has been charged.

Mr. Hawk contended that he will enter evidence which will establish who the real murderer is.

While relating these facts to Rev. Ray Broshears, both men assured him that an attack on American homosexuals was not even implied. The defense has stressed that the blame for this outrageous state of affairs lies on the altar of the Mexican Catholic churches and their bigoted anti-sexual dogmas.

Mr. Hawk reiterated again and again that he was sympathetic to the Gay Liberation movement in the United States. We quote Mr. Hawk verbatim.

"Did you advise that I was a crusader against homosexuality? No. No. Nothing could be further from the truth. As far as I am concerned, a man, or a woman has a perfect right to sleep with whomever they want to and their sex life is their business. I could care less what other people do (sexually.) The only way that it came up here was that

it fits peculiarly into this cultural situation. This is not an attack on homosexuality. I am not a crusader. I never got involved with homosexuality before, except in this case."

The American psychologist wanted to assure the homosexual community that he was definitely a concerned friend and not an enemy to American homosexuals. This will also be stressed in the defense.

Delegates in attendance from the Corona family also agreed that there was no attack on homosexuals implied in their defense of Juan Corona.

Sensationalized press coverage was blamed for linking American homosexuality, per se, with their presentation of a peculiar cultural aberration found in men from Central Mexico. This line of defense will be developed fully by Mr. Hawk as he presents his case.

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# GAY VOTERS GUIDE

Although the presidency is an increasingly important office, media coverage, in presidential election years, tends to overemphasize the importance of the presidential election to the neglect of the equally important Congressional and legislative elections.

In the presidential election, Gays are given the choice between "McCop-Out," as he is called by several out-of-town Gay publications, and "Nixswine," as these same publications call the opposition candidate.

I can't endorse McG. because his apparent retraction of his position on Gay rights is unforgivable. But I'll still vote for him because there is no choice. I could never vote for the man who is responsible for creating much of the oppression Gays suffer. McG. is the lesser of two evils, even if his wishy-washy position is disappointing.

Jim Foster claims that McG is really still for us, but his political advisors have ordered him not to discuss Gay rights because of possible back-lash from puritanical voters. I'll vote for McG in hopes Foster is right.

Below, I evaluate all of the Bay Area Candidates solely on the basis of their positions and actions on Gay rights.

Following is a list of the Bay Area Assemblymen who voted for the Brown Bill, and who have publicly committed themselves to Gay rights; John Dunlap (D. Napa), William Bagley (R. Sonoma), John Knox (D. Contra Costa), Robert

Crown (D. Alameda), March Fong (D. Alameda), John Miller (D. Alameda), Willie Brown (D. San Francisco), John Burton (D. San Francisco), John Vasconcellos (D. Santa Clara.)

All of the above incumbent Assemblymen have spoken up for you and voted for your rights. They deserve our support in their re-election campaigns.

Another Good Guy running for the assembly is Barry Keen (D. Sonoma). Keen is an advocate of equal employment opportunity for Gays and legalization of homosexual acts.

Women tend to be more pro-Gay than men candidates, perhaps because women don't have such a great fear of homosexuality in males. And there are three fine female Gay rights advocates running for the assembly. Rhoda Frier (D. Santa Clara) is attempting to unseat incumbent Gay-hater Assemblyman Ronald Hayden. Beth Labson (D. San Mateo) is attempting to route Brown Bill foe Assemblyman Dixon Arnett. Another very pro-Gay woman candidate is Suzanne Paizis (D. Monterey) who is trying to oust arch-anti-homosexual Senator Donald Grunsky. Grunsky has introduced a bill that will make even asking someone to have sex with you a felony punishable by a mandatory prison term.

In the San Francisco Senate Race, Senator Milton Marks, who has promised to introduce a bill to amend

the State Fair Employment Practices Act to prohibit employment discrimination against Gays, if re-elected is having a tough fight with Board of Supervisors Chairman Ronald Pelosi. Pelosi has some Gay support, and is moderately pro-Gay, but it doesn't make much sense to vote out an incumbent who is willing to take positive action on our behalf. I urge a vote for Milton Marks, the Republican candidate for the S.F. Senate seat.

Incumbent Congressmen Philip Burton (D. San Francisco), William Mailliard (R. San Francisco), Ronald Dellums (D. Alameda) and Paul McCloskey (R. San Mateo) have all publicly advocated equal rights for Gays. They deserve our support as does Fortney Stark (D. Alameda) who defeated 28 year veteran Congressman George Miller in the June primary. The 85 year old Congressman Miller didn't even know what the word Gay meant. Stark faces a tough fight against his anti-Gay Republican opponent.

Tom Bates, running in the Alameda County Board of Supervisors run-off election is a strong pro-Gay candidate who has indicated that if elected, he will introduce a resolution guaranteeing equal employment opportunity for Alameda County Gays.

There are three fine candidates I cannot endorse. Joan Irwin, Willie Brown's Republican challenger is a fine pro-Gay candidate. But Brown has done so-much for the Gay Community, it seems unwise to replace him with a woman who would be a freshman

The Congressional and Legislative elections are particularly important this time. If Nixon is re-elected, which seems more than likely, the Gay cause will suffer an unmitigated disaster. Not only will progress for the next four years be foredoomed, but we may be set back a hundred years. Already the Nixon Supreme Court has ruled that states may have laws excluding Gays from all employment. Nixswine has searched far and wide to find the most sexually repressed, puritanical judges in the nation to appoint to the Supreme Court. The remaining three liberal justices are all aged and in poor health. Probably they will die or retire within the next four years, and will be replaced by very young, sex-hating, Nixon appointees. This means the Supreme Court will be controlled by the forces of darkness for the next fifty years.

Under the circumstances it is all the more important that Gays vote in legislators who are more moderate. The Executive and Judicial branches of government will no doubt remain under control of reactionaries, but the can't take over completely unless they control the legislative branch as well.

I have omitted taking any position on several races, such as those involving Assemblyman Foran and McCarthy of San Francisco. The reason is because Foran and McCarthy have refused to discuss Gay issues, and both went out for a powder when the Brown bill was voted on — they just got up and walked out of Assembly chamber because they didn't want to take a stand. Their opponents, likewise, have refused to discuss Gay rights, so in these and a few other races, I don't know who to vote for.

Assemblyman without committee posts. In the legislature, as in Congress, power is based on the number of chairmanships and posts held, and these are based on seniority. The longer a member has been in Congress or the Legislature, the greater their power. Brown is a senior member of the assembly and holds many important committee posts, including the Criminal Justice Committee, a committee that can do much for Gays. Irwin, if elected would be a freshman member with little power to influence legislation. The same goes for Ronald Pelosi's campaign against Milton Marks and Roger Boas' campaign against veteran Congressman William Mailliard, who has 28 years seniority and is moderately pro-Gay. Other Gay writers will be endorsing Boas on the basis of his position on the war and other issues, but here, I judge candidates solely on the basis of their positions on Gay rights, and I think Mailliard is the better man because he is in a better position to help us than would be Boas.

Now, a list of the Bad Guys — those who Gay Republicans for McGovern President Bill Plath calls "the forces of darkness." The following incumbent Assemblymen are up for re-election. They all voted against the Brown Bill and have publicly expressed their hate of homosexuals: Carlos Bee (D. Alameda), Dixon Arnett (R. San Mateo), Frank Murphy (R. Santa Cruz), Richard Hayden (R. Santa Clara), Bob Wood (R. Monterey).

You can add to that list former Assemblyman, currently Congressman Leo Ryan (D. San Mateo). Also add State Senator Donald Grunsky (R. Monterey), arch-enemy of Gays.

WHO IS THE VICTIM OF THE VICTIMLESS CRIMES? by Robie Robillard

A young man grows up at home, has a Gay experience at the age of 15, joins the service at 17. At 18, he finds himself in the Philippines, already with two Gay encounters. Fear is now within him that

he may be homosexual. Having no place to turn for counsel, he turns to drugs. Failing to understand the deep homosexual need from within himself, he seeks more and more satisfaction until he's now mainlining heroin. Who is the victim of the victimless crime?

Guy Wright takes his ten-year old son into the Tenderloin, his son sees a man dressed in women's clothes prostituting. Guy Wright says his son is the victim of the victimless crime. Let's investigate further. Talking to the person on the corner, we find he has an XX chromosome, which means he is genetically female. Here is a happening by nature. At the Olympics now, all women are checked for chromosome count. If it is XY, they are not allowed to compete since they are genetically male. This is caused by a lack of the correct food by the mother in the fifth week of pregnancy. Checking further with the young man on the corner, we find at the age of 17 his parents rejected him from his home in the Midwest. His schooling could not be completed. So he came to San Francisco to find understanding, but couldn't. He could not get a job, not could he get funds to continue his schooling. Why, may I ask, is the victim of the victimless crime? Mr. Guy Wright's son is the victim of Mr. Wright's lack of understanding of what is happening to the people around him.

A young man is brought up in an all male orphanage. The only love he receives in his youth is from his fellow orphans. At seventeen, he joins the

service. He is constantly fighting this drive from within. When he turns 21, he marries, thinking this will change everything. It doesn't so he turns to alcohol and four years later is divorced. He stays on the alcohol and is constantly fighting this battle from within. After 12 years in the Air Force, two of those in Viet Nam, with the Bronze Star, he has a breakdown and is turned in. He gets discharged, comes to San Francisco, has nowhere to go and contemplates suicide. Who, SIR, may I ask is the victim of the victimless crime?

All three cases are true. Case one came to S.I.R. two weeks later and for the past two years, no more drugs. Case two is now on his way to school. He also found out about S.I.R. Case three I AM.

## GAY ALLIANCE

TENDERLOIN GAY ALLIANCE ORGANIZE

The GAY ALLIANCE of San Francisco, whose main strength has come from the Tenderloin, now has a steering committee comprised of nothing but T.L. people now. Ray Dewey, Roosevelt, Jimmie King, John Vroman have replaced four non-TLers, and along with GA co-ordinator, Reverend Ray Broshears, have set forth a series of projects for TL people.

First and most serious problem facing the new committee is the problem of police-sweeps of Mason Street in the late hours on the weekend. Second is the exploitation of Gays in the Tenderloin by those "other-type" Gays who own businesses in the TL area and/or work in the area, and sexually abuse TL Gays for money. Some of these sexploitors attempt to "extort" continued sexual affairs of TL Gays after once having "made it" with them. Some using the "ruse" that something was taken from their home "and if you don't return it, I'll have the cops on you." Of course nothing was taken but, as most sexploitors know, seldom does the police take the word of a TLER. But, things are changing in that respect, points out Rev. Ray Broshears. For now, the judges are listening to the cases out of court and things are not the way they used to be, and the day of the sexploiter-extorter is drawing to an end. Should anyone be blackmailed by these "dirty-ole-men", they are urged to contact GA for action-plus.

The new committee is exploring ways and means to open up a Gay Drop In Center in the Tenderloin, which will have an extremely wide range of services, one of these being, free medical examinations and possibly treatment on a low scale. The GA has several doctors who have volunteered some time each week to help staff the medical portion. The GA is seeking additional funding to keep the SF Neighborhood Legal

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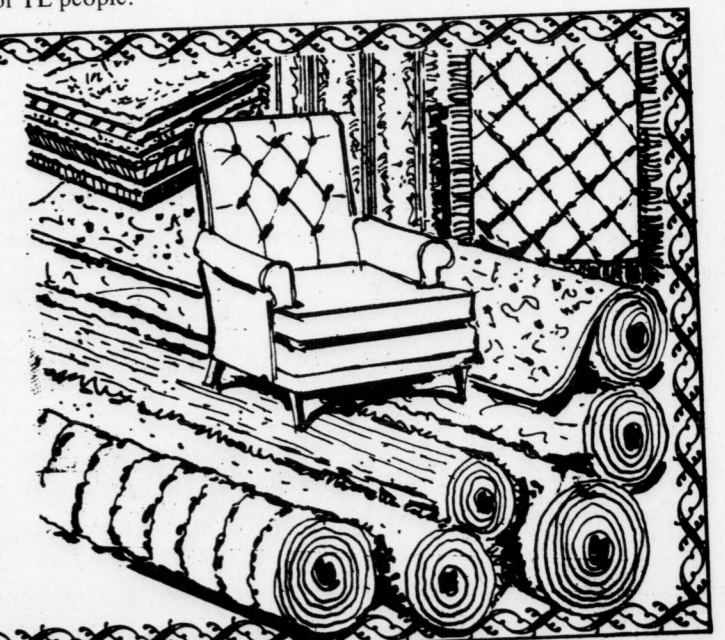
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Assistance Foundation's Welfare Advocate program, which is now ending, due to lack of funding. This program is one of the most vital programs to the poor of the entire City, not just to Gays in the TL.

The GA Newsletter, the Lavender Letter has begun publication on every other week basis, as it is done in mimeo. Earl Allen is the editor of the Lavender Letter, which in it's first edition gave a "stamp of approval" to only two TL area bars, the KOKPIT, and the ALLEY CAT, and one in the Mission, KELLY'S SALOON. GA is pushing the issue with the SFPD on rapes in City Prison. SFPD officials have met with GAers on the subject and have taken the matter under consideration, and will meet with Alliances again. In the matter of the Alliance picketing of TAVERN GUILD events as in the past, Reverend Broshears asked that the Alliance hold off any further picketing on SFTG events, as it appears that the SFTG has become aware that "that bunch South of Market on Sixth" are not the only gay voices in the city, and are becoming aware of the need to give a helping hand to Gays in the TL. But, the Alliance

voted to continue to keep pressure on the non-TAVERN GUILD trip, the Emperorites, and explore possible picketing of members of that committee on their jobs in an effort to "raise their consciousness of Gay Liberation and what it really is." Disruptions at a Gay "olympics" being planned by Marcus has been discussed. Without any dissent, the FFAers were denounced an anti-Gay Liberation as well as were the "suck & fuck" shops that are operating in the City. The Alliance voted a censure of Rev. Broshear's endorsement of Richard Nixon for re-election, and wants the world to know that that is his personal choice and not the Alliance. The Alliance will support none of the four mistakes running for the Presidency.

OFFICE BUSTED BY NARCS**

SFPD Officer Elliot Blackstone maintains an office in the Tenderloin to assist transsexuals, at 243 Turk Street. The office is funded by the Erickson Foundation in Louisiana, is called the PCR (Police Community Relations) &

National Transsexual Counselling Unit,

On Monday afternoon, shortly before they were to appear before a police officers recruit group, Jan Maxwell (Dennis Crain) and Sue Cook (Charles N. Cooke), were arrested by SFPD Narcs headed by Inspector Art Gerrans at the PCR office on 243 Turk. They were charged with selling illegal drugs to undercover narcs for the past six weeks. They were booked on a myriad of charges running from, sales of "pot," dangerous drugs, possession of "pot" to selling cocaine, possession of a 22-caliber pistol, and narcotics paraphernalia. Officer Blackstone, when contacted by the GNS, was asked concerning the situation. To the question, "Do you think that this was an "attack" upon you and your work with the transsexuals and Gays in the Tenderloin?" To which Blackstone replied, "It's entirely possible and I wouldn't be surprised!" It was pointed out that the majority of police officers don't know the difference between a Gay person and a transsexual, and as a result just lump them all together. Inspector Gerrans has had "run-ins" with Gays on numerous occasions, with reports of "door kicking in" by Gerrans in the making of an "without warrant" arrests in the Tenderloin. Gerrans has had confrontations with Gay militants over the years, not only in the Tenderloin, but in the Haight-Ashbury. Most Gay leaders consider Gerrans typical of the not - wanting - to understand type of a cop.

Officer Blackstone, stated that, "The work of the two arrested was absolutely outstanding, of that there is no doubt," but, "I do fault their sidelines". Officer Blackstone told GNS that he had replaced the two with new persons who do not "have sidelines," and are also competent counsellors and that the office is open for transsexual business as usual. Lynn and Leslie are the two new counsellors.

It also appears that to be elected to any Gay position automatically includes the right to have the entire Gay community hurl mud and insults. Remember those who are elected are the workers, so stop criticising and get to work.

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# ELOQUI

Well men, we now have a further factionalization in our community.

With the office of Emperor we have again begun to further separate another minority in a minority. Bring unity to the Gay Community? Not on a throne with crown and scepter.

How can a unified situation become solidified when again we have another quasi title representing not the whole but rather a part of the whole, from a definite "South of Market" perspective.

By no means is this perspective wrong. It is another side of our many faceted community. One cannot unify a whole with one slice of the pie ruling. It takes many outlooks to give a unified power.

It seems as though the Gay Movement is becoming more and more factionalized in our city. Therefore we have the bitchery: "If you can't go along with my group, I don't want you in it."

Factionalization means only one thing "Together we stand and divided they will pick us up one by one." I bring this to your attention because during the early days in San Francisco, one Jose' Sarria began the title of Empress. It seems that during this time there was much controversy also. However since that time it has now become an accepted office. Whether or not we can agree on the office itself is of no consequence because of its existence.

During those days it seems that we were all up tight (especially our drag element.) Since the acceptance of the office by the community, it seems the drag element has better adjusted to themselves and to the community at large.

The Empress office in no way can represent the entire community, but neither can the office of Emperor. Both of these "stations" however seem to satisfy a need for both elements of the whole.

It seems to me that some of our South of Market people, "leather set" have felt left out and feel they are not represented properly. Perhaps an Emperor representing their segment of societal differences can have an effective office for that group, but again, not for the complete whole. I cannot accept that an Emperor will bring San Francisco together. This is simply undignified, audacious pomposity.

We have begun to see a change in our city from what was many years ago. We all have much more freedom, more acceptability and have begun an intense political search for a unified "vote block" to give us a strong political voice. But now we are titeling ourselves out of a gay power that is at our footsteps.

In the early days of organizational effort all factions were represented without flaunting their differences and everyone worked together quite

beautifully, because there was one common goal, that being homosexual rights first and foremost, sans personal bigotries. Many of us feel that since that time we have achieved freedom in San Francisco. Others feel that our community is in pieces and we "must get it together."

There still is much work at hand but I surmise that San Francisco can be together providing it is let to happen.

The TAVERN GUILD works very effectively as a group effort. It is made up of all contingents from our Community and all get along well with each other. This is because basically there is only one thought and that is the business of a solidified group of GAY bars.

In the beginning, even S.I.R. was effective and had all factions of our Community working well together on grounds of a common goal, that was the goal of homosexual rights alone.

One may also take a look at the present Women's Liberation Movement. In the beginning, many of our lesbian sisters usurped the homosexual ethic to turn toward the rights of women - gay and straight. Since that time even this movement has factionalized out of power. Now the lesbians are gaining control and the heterosexual women want nothing to do with them. I cite New York City Women's Liberation as an example.

Gay people as a whole can accomplish a great deal. But it must present an image to the straight community of a rational cohesiveness with communication and education into our lifestyle. One cannot do this with scepter or crown, or camp and frivolity. It must be done with a communication on a heterosexual level, because this is

the only level they understand.

I can cite example after example of individuals in our community who put other issues foremost in their mind rather than remembering they are first of all Gay. Yes, we are all individuals and we all have different lifestyles, thoughts and education but the only thing that commonly binds us together is our homosexuality and before effective law changes can take effect we must get back our our binding goal.

Congratulations to Marcus on his new title. I am sure he will be a responsive and competent representative from the South of Market Community. I sincerely hope he can get that portion together as well as the Empress contingents have theirs together.

Please remember that communication and education is our prime weapon.

Frivolity and pomposity is a weapon that can be turned against us.

## SUPREME COURT WON'T HEAR HOMOSEXUAL PLEA

An appeal that was designed to sanciton homosexual marriages was dismissed by the Supreme Court "for want of a substantial federal question."

The case was from Minneapolis and was brought by the Minnesota Civil Liberties Union for two homosexuals, Jack Baker and James McConnell. Their request for a license was turned down in 1970 by the county clerk but last year they obtained a license in Blue Earth county and were married by a United Methodist minister.

The court acted unanimously. The Minnesota Supreme Court ruled against Baker's and McConnell's constitutional argument last October

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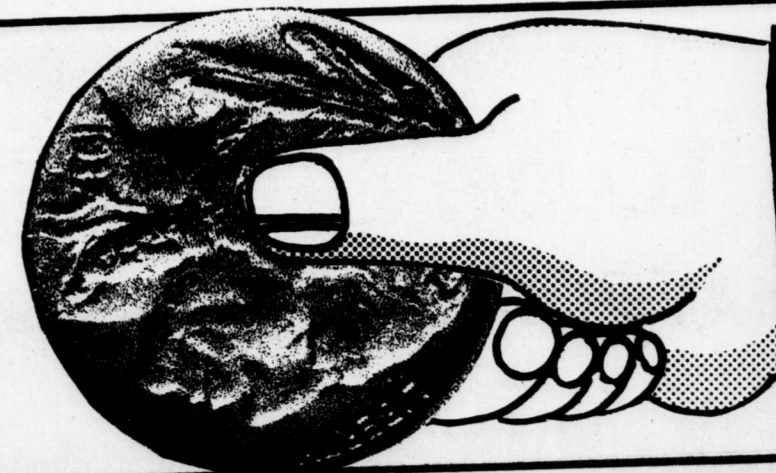

The city, our city, which we hold so dear, is being washed clean by Indian Summer rains. The "pollution," of all

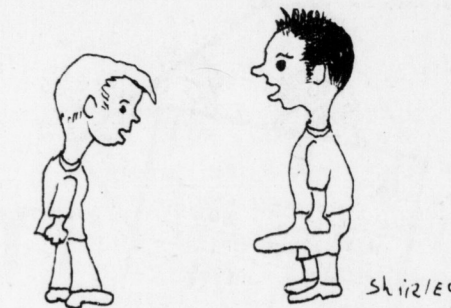

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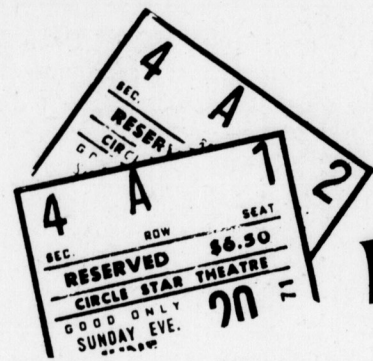
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## Show Reviews

# MAME

Christmas came early to our community as MAME swept into California Hall with a bagful of charm, wit and elegance. To say MAME lifted the status of musical comedy by our theatre groups is an understatement. I'm afraid the days are gone for twin pianos and drums. We have an orchestra, yes, an orchestra, and from its opening bars

sends MAME soaring into the heights to which community theatre has not been accustomed.

To the CITY PLAYERS (a theatrical experience), the kudos are numerous and well earned. Faye, in the title role of Mame Dennis, was superb. An adept actress, a good dancer and the interpretation was a well thought out

one. It was most gratifying for this writer to watch a performer and watch the performer give an even interpretation to the role. By that, I mean not getting out of character and this Faye didn't do. She was in command of her every moment and movement onstage. But then again, could we expect less from Faye, as she is a performer's performer.

As Vera Charles, Mame's bosom buddy, John Reynolds was extremely effective. Vera Charles is a choice role and anyone who gets it cherishes its witty moments... and Mr. Reynolds did. But California Hall's acoustics are less than passable so a lot of Vera's best lines are lost. I think the word here is projection and this applies to any of the actors that are caught with dialogue

under the proscenium or a lot of it goes downstage instead of up. But it was the only qualm I had on Saturday night's opening.

The cast is huge and versatile with lots of doubling up and all performed with the style and grace to match its star and production.

Roger Learn's Young Patrick was boyish and cheerful and gave a good reading. How nice it is to have a perennial juvenile lead in our community.

Fernando's Ito was a fine endeavor, as he was giggly and just plain fun as Mame's houseboy.

Jim Short's Nora warmed to an even performance which, in the beginning, I found cold and without feeling as the Irish house keeper.

Jim Hart, as Beauregard Burnside, was handsome of stature but the acoustics plagued him also. Vern Becker's Sally Cato was syrupy and cornpone and bitchy and that's the name of Sally's game and Vern was a winner. As Mother Burnside, Joe Vigil was quarrelsome and grouchy and danced well. But Southern matriarchs shed their widow's weeds as soon as

they can and dress not quite so plain. But I loved the whole scene with the jumping from the wheelchair.

John Carlyle's Babcock was gruff and sour as Babcock is. But he is also a top New York lawyer. Must he be so nervous?

Jim Collins as the Grown Patrick was handsome and rose to the occasion of distress with his aunt.

As Agnes Gooch (another choice role) came Nancy and a casting director's dream. Nancy gives a beautiful portrayal of the girl done wrong. A joy to watch as always.

In lesser roles, Billie Woods Gloria Upson was stylish and top drawer and as her mother, Mrs. Upson, Jim Richie was indeed fun. Jimi Prince, as the Messenger, was clever and funny. To all the people in the cast of MAME that I have missed, chorines and chorus boys, you all shone with the style and grace a lot better than some of the companies (pro's) that have come through our town.

Tying all these people together was one Chuck Largent. His was indeed a large task. His direction was brisk and clever, fast-paced and not cluttered. His

eye was everywhere. A large company to keep an eye on but he did and did successfully. Kudos, Mr. Largent. A triumph!

Choreographer Michael Owen gave the dancers their due as all moved and executed their moves with ease. Good show Mr. Owen. The costuming by Herman Neive and Pat Campano was sensational. Brilliance was everywhere and blended and complimented everyone. Colors danced and made Carl Berry's duplex of Mame's apt. even more elegant than it was.

MAME had many stars Sat. night, Faye as its brightest. Production value was indeed a factor, a full orchestra... But I think the single factor was work on the part of all concerned and it showed, dear people, it showed. Talent is one thing but the meshing of all talents into a single production is hard work. If you were tired Saturday night, I'm sure it was a happy tired.

To those in our fair city that haven't seen this show, don't ask questions. Just go and have a good time. MAME is a four-letter-word-plus-one, called SMASH!!

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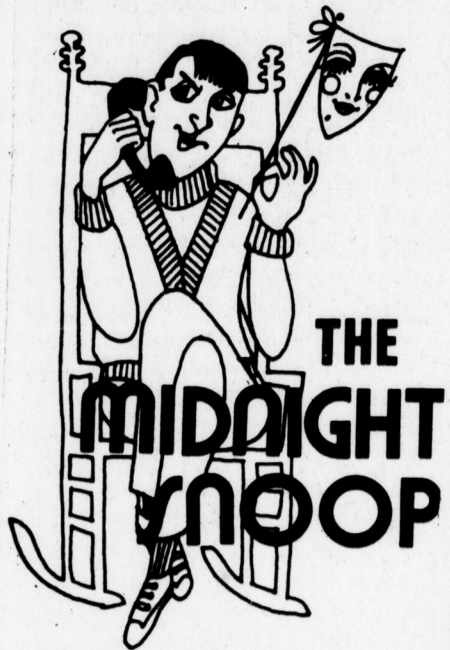
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## Show News

DEEP COMPASSION at the LAUREL

"Deep Compassion" is a new film written and directed by Brad Kingston that will soon be shown at the LAUREL THEATER. I saw a special preview last week and recommend it, with reservations, for your enjoyment when it opens.

The plot is fairly complex for an "erotic" film. Rocky, played by Duane Ferguson, has just escaped from jail and hides in a mountain cabin occupied by a blind boy. Rocky is rough and uncouth; the blind boy, Carl, is spiritual and virginal. Guess what happens? Right!! But, Carl goes for walks in the woods and there meets his Love God (read in Angel of Death), played by the hunky Jim Cassidy. And he isn't quite as virginal as we're lead to believe. And

when his Love God appears, nude, it seems that for these few blissful moments, Carl can see just fine. It really would have been a waste if he couldn't have seen Mr. Cassidy's body — it's quite worth looking at. Carl gets spiritually fucked (I know it's spiritual because there's a choir of heavenly voices singing madly while Carl's bent over that tree stump, direct from an old Quo Vadis soundtrack), then Love God walks into the woods and disappears, Carl goes home and horny Rocky decides to rape our innocent. I won't reveal the ending, but suffice to say, Carl doesn't take getting raped lightly!

On the plus side, the direction is very good, photography (after a shaky opening scene) is good and in one scene, the meeting in the forest, exceptional, and the sex scenes are explicit and

integral to the script. There is one hilarious touch early in the movie where Rocky, in the getaway car, decides he needs sex and is banging Carl's brother in the back seat. There is a shot of the car driving down the highway and these two legs hanging out the window. And that's funny. Rocky is well played by Mr. Ferguson, who is not particularly good looking but has a rough-and-ready toughguy quality that makes his part convincing. And Jim Cassidy is beautiful to gaze upon.

On the negative side is the writing. Carl, when we first meet him, describes his idyllic life in the forest. "I have my books and my music, I go for long walks in the woods, and the animals come and visit me." It's enough to make you puke! And the performance of Carl by David Arlen is the most offensive portrayal you're likely to see on the screen. I think he figured if Patty Duke could get an oscar for "The Miracle Worker," why shouldn't he make his bid? Granted, it's very difficult to portray a blind boy convincingly, but Mr. Arlen overacts and bangs into walls and doors so constantly, it's embarrassing. And, unfortunately, Mr. Arlen is the star of the film. After five years of living alone in his cabin, I would think Carl could find the front door without groping the entire door frame first. And when Rocky announces, "Let's have a little fun," Carl, before a hand is laid on him, throws himself all over the room in hysterics, falling over tables, banging his head on the floor, and carrying on like Barbara Stanwyck having an epileptic attack. And nothing's happened yet! A strong directorial hand here could have saved much of this. I would strongly suggest Mr. Arlen

consider an early retirement from films. Even with these drawbacks, this is definitely a film, a high cut above the average. There is a substantial plot that works on a double level and the actors, with the one exception, are at least convincing. When "Deep Compassion" opens (in glorious color, I might add), do go see it. The scene in the woods between Carl and his Love God is worth the admission price alone, it's so beautifully photographed. Just don't expect to see a pornographic Patty Duke!

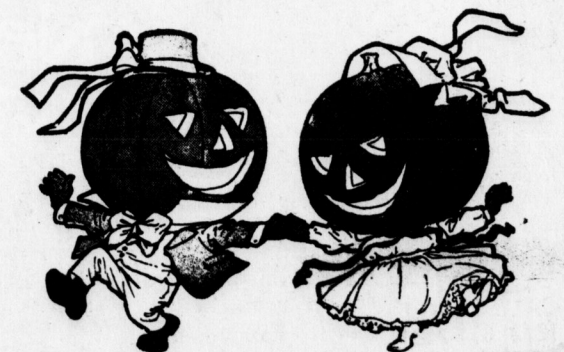
Special mention should be made of the excellent backup of the Bill Bell Orchestra, who played everything from Rachmaninoff to Russ Columbo with

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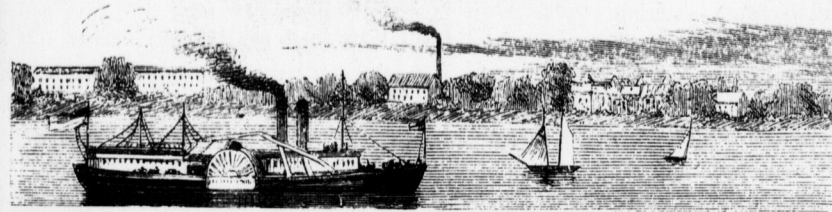

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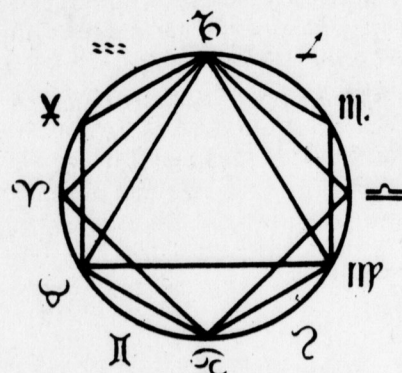

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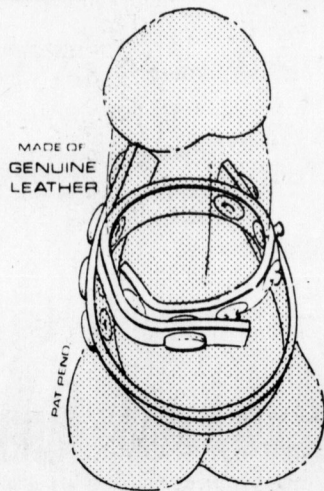

One of the most powerful films of the year is now on view at the Metro I. "Deliverance" has come to the screen from the best-selling novel by James Dickey with overwhelming intensity and dramatic punch. Jon Voight stars in a role that proves his versatility and gives a performance that will probably be remembered when awards are handed out. Co-starring with Voight is Burt Reynolds who proves, with this picture, that he is more than just a centerfold sex symbol. Reynolds' portrayal of the ultra-butcher type leader of the quartet of river travelers is delivered to perfection.

The film is an exciting, edge-of-the-seat adventure story as well as a

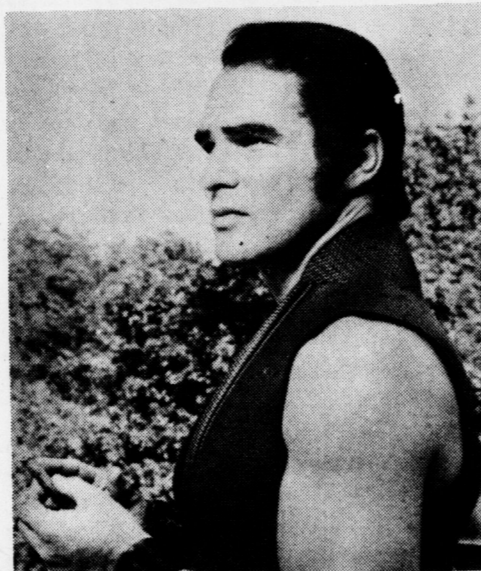
meaningful, thought provoking allegory of our time. The fantastic, right-there photography of Vilmos Zsigmond does everything but throw water on the viewer.

It tells how four city men set out for a weekend trip, in the Southern wilderness, with canoes down the Cahulawasse River. They find themselves faced with the threat of death from man and nature. Voight and Reynolds, along with Ned Beatty and Ronny Cox, make this diverse group of city friends come alive as they travel downstream and reveals separate and distinct personality held together by two canoes.

The film begins with the hostility encountered by the group from the mountain folk who live near the river and this sets the tone for the events that follow. As they travel down river, Voight and Beatty's canoe gets ahead of Reynolds and Cox and they meet two shotgun-wielding redneck hillbillies who bully, threaten and finally sexually attack Beatty, who has been forced to strip. As they attempt to make Voight — who is strapped to a tree — "go down" on them, Reynolds shows up and shoots one of the men with an arrow, while the other runs away. Now the he-man riverrun turns into a much more deadly "game" than anyone has bargained for. Reynolds persuades the others that they must bury the body rather than face the uncertainty of "mountain justice." They continue down river until Cox suddenly falls into

the violent rapids. The canoes overturn and one of them breaks in two while the men try to keep themselves in one piece till they reach a calm spot in the river. Reynolds' leg is broken and he maintains that Cox was shot by the avenging mountain man who is on a cliff above them. Voight must deal with climbing straight up the precipice and in a panic he manages not only to kill the man he finds there — who may or may not be the right man — but to wound

himself by falling on his own arrow. The bodies of both the mountain man and Cox are weighted and sunk in the river as the trio of survivors wend their way to the end of the river and their "deliverance." But all is not over when they reach "civilization," as the sheriff is suspicious and not easily convinced of the accidental fate of their missing companion. Voight returns home a very changed man with tormenting dreams to haunt him thru the remaining years.

James Dickey, author of both the novel and screenplay, also plays the part of the rural sheriff in a very good debut. With the exception of Voight and Reynolds, all the actors are "unknown" to the general public and this helps immensely in making the drama so intensely real.

It's hard to imagine anyone not being affected by this film in some way. The direction of John Boorman is such that you have the feeling that you, the viewer, are the fifth member of the river travellers.

I could go on with adjectives such as "brilliant" and "superb" etc., but the best thing that can be said is "see it!" Definitely a \*\*\*\* flick in my book.

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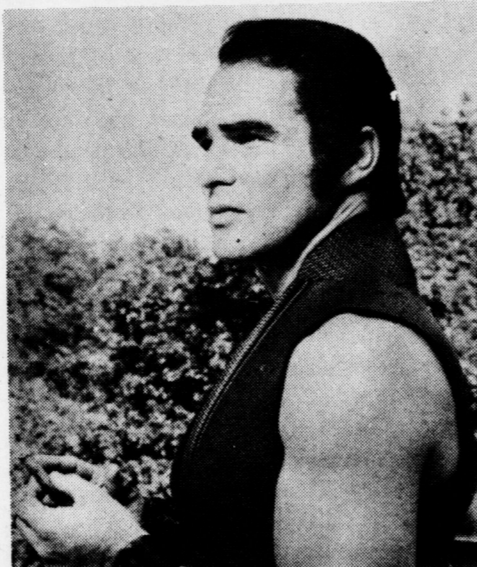

In answer to that love I met at the GOOSE opening, no, Fat Fairy and Sweetlips are not one in the same.

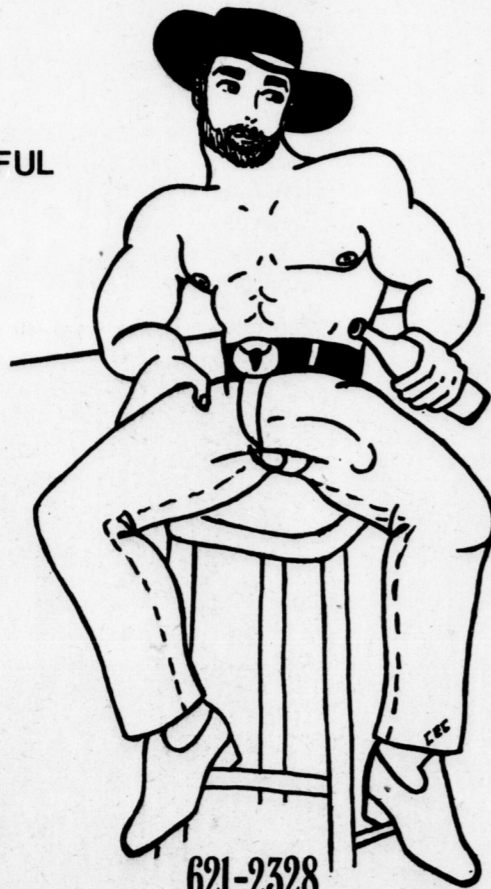
Try the CAMP GROUND for dinner in Berkeley. Jack the bartender is worth the trip alone. Heaven!

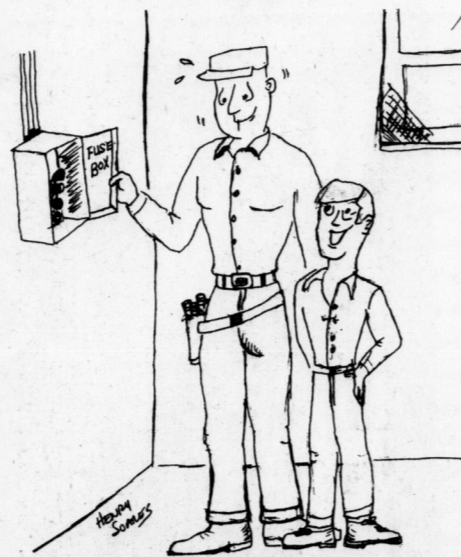
The RAINBOW GROCERY is reopening and will be bigger and better than ever, according to Mr. B.

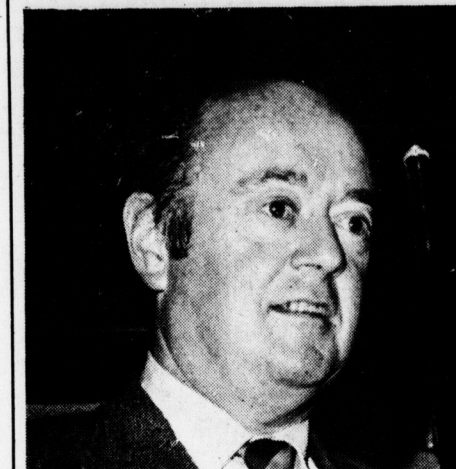

### SECOND HEARING FOR GAY MAN by Frank Fitch

Allan Rock, who is threatened with loss of security clearance and job, will again appear before Hearing Examiner Farr of the Department of Defense, on Nov. 17 at 10 AM, Room 2041, Federal Bldg., 450 Golden Gate. S.I.R. held a well attended news conference in front of the Sansome Street hearing room on September 21, protesting the fact that the meeting was closed to public and press. Good coverage of Mr. Rock's position appeared on the front page of the Examiner that day, in both the Chronicle and the Examiner the next day, and on five radio and two TV stations that day. The reason for the news conference and for the importance of the newsperson's reaction revolved around the first objection that both S.I.R. and A.C.L.U. have raised to the hearing - that it is barred to public and press. As Mary Crawford, of the Examiner, said, had they granted an open hearing, the press probably would not have covered it; they are creating an issue by this decision.

Director Scanlon, when contacted in Washington on September 22, told the B.A.R. that the second hearing will also be closed to public and press. When asked for the reason for closed hearings, he said, "There are any number of reasons. We have decided in our own discretion, and by we I mean the Department of Defense, that we are going to keep these hearings small and closed because it is so much easier for us to maintain order and decorum that way. From what I understand from Mr. Farr, there was a big slice of the public, press, television cameras and Lord knows what else trying to get into this hearing." When told that the reason for attendance at the meeting was that they felt the public had a right to know. He
