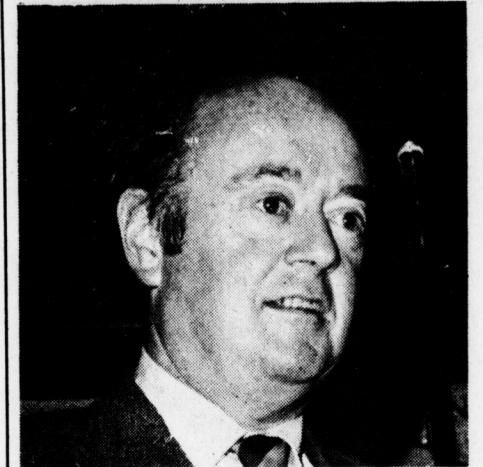

SECOND HEARING FOR GAY MAN by Frank Fitch

Allan Rock, who is threatened with loss of security clearance and job, will again appear before Hearing Examiner Farr of the Department of Defense, on Nov. 17 at 10 AM, Room 2041, Federal Bldg., 450 Golden Gate. S.I.R. held a well attended news conference in front of the Sansome Street hearing room on September 21, protesting the fact that the meeting was closed to public and press. Good coverage of Mr. Rock's position appeared on the front page of the Examiner that day, in both the Chronicle and the Examiner the next day, and on five radio and two TV stations that day. The reason for the news conference and for the importance of the newsperson's reaction revolved around the first objection that both S.I.R. and A.C.L.U. have raised to the hearing - that it is barred to public and press. As Mary Crawford, of the Examiner, said, had they granted an open hearing, the press probably would not have covered it; they are creating an issue by this decision.

Director Scanlon, when contacted in Washington on September 22, told the B.A.R. that the second hearing will also be closed to public and press. When asked for the reason for closed hearings, he said, "There are any number of reasons. We have decided in our own discretion, and by we I mean the Department of Defense, that we are going to keep these hearings small and closed because it is so much easier for us to maintain order and decorum that way. From what I understand from Mr. Farr, there was a big slice of the public, press, television cameras and Lord knows what else trying to get into this hearing." When told that the reason for attendance at the meeting was that they felt the public had a right to know. He

asked, "Who felt the public had a right to know?" When told of the names of some newsmen who felt that way, he said, "Oh, Oh, reporters. We don't feel the public has got a right to know what goes on in a hearing where a man's reputation and a few other things might be at stake." Asked, "Including his job?" "Including his job, yes," he said. "These are private hearings between the applicant and his government." He did not comment on the fact that Mr. Rock is not an applicant, but has held clearances for 16 years. Mr. Scanlon is the Director of the Industrial Security Clearance Review Office.

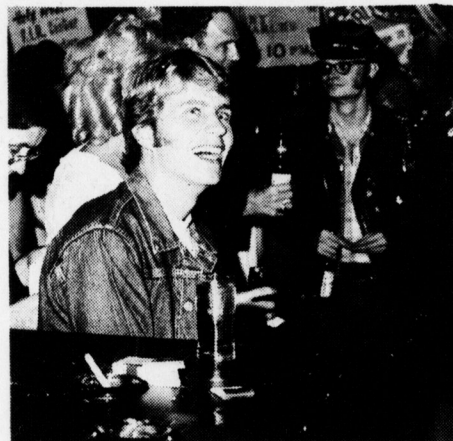
Informed sources have told the B.A.R. gays will attend the second hearing on Nov. 17 to again protest the secrecy decision. Dick Gayer, who just last year won a court decision against the DOD involving his security clearance, suggested that letters to Director Scanlon, Industrial Security Clearance Review Office, Room 3D282, Pentagon, Washington, D.C. would be helpful in showing that the public feels they DO have a right to know what the government does to a Gay person's employment.

The second hearing was originally scheduled to take place this month at the Sansome Street location of the first hearing. The Department of Defense notified Allan Rock through his ACLU Council, of the change to the Federal Building. It is believed possible that the higher security of the Federal Building may have played a part in the YOY decision. In our interview with director Scanlon it was obvious he did not like a "big story to the public... and lord knows what else" outside his examiner's hearing room.

BEAUX ARTS BALL

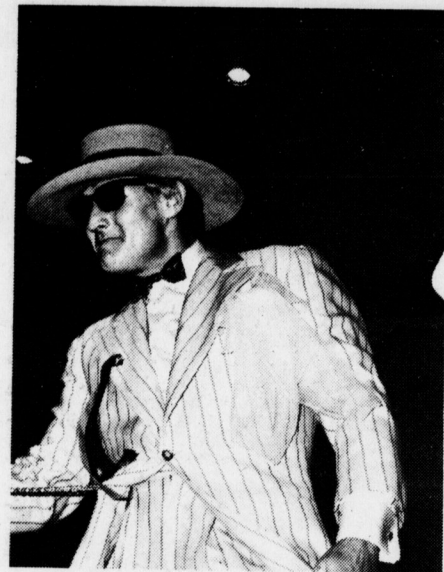

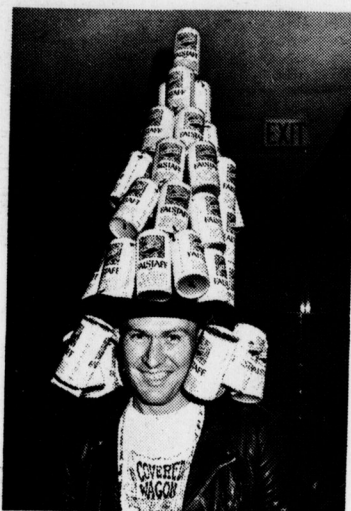

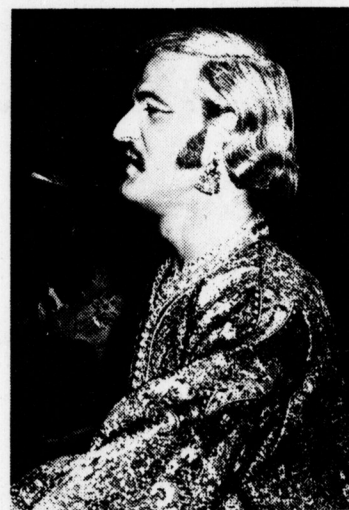

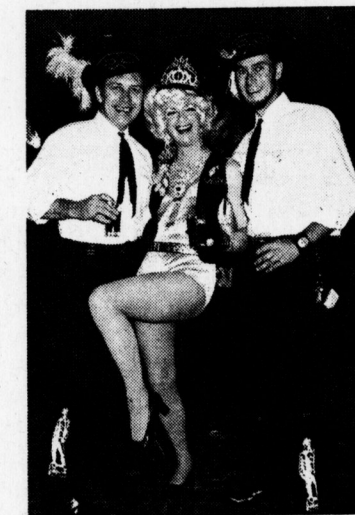

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KNOW YOUR ENEMY

A barrage of anti-Gay hate literature in the form of comic books, magazine articles, leaflets and radio broadcasts have been circulated for the past few months.

It looked to me like an organized hate campaign. It is. And it was apparently ordered by the John Birch Society.

Investigation discloses that the campaign opened with a hate article, published last spring in American Opinion Magazine, the official John Birch Society organ. The article was reviewed extensively in a recent issue of VECTOR, so we won't repeat it all here, except to note that the theme of the article was that homosexuality is a Communist plot to destroy the family, the church, the flag and the American Way of Life as we have always known it.

Then, the radical right propaganda mills, picking up on the signal from American Opinion, began to pour out the hate literature.

The several million dollars for the expenses of the campaign come from the treasuries of 14 corporations controlled by the John Birch Society and/or Latter Day Saints Church (aka Mormons).

Gays have a right to know who their enemies are; here are their names: Abbott Laboratories, Armour Corp., Greyhound Corp., Cleanese Corp., Technicolor, Monsanto Chemical, Gulf Oil, Armco Steel, Republic Steel, Olin-Matheson, Alcoa, Sears Roebuck and H.L. Hunt Foods.

The corporations donate the money to certain so called "churches", and deduct it as a business expense, a donation to a church. The "churches"

which are really political organizations, then pay for the printing bills, broadcast time and the like. The churches are: The American Council of Christian Churches, The Church League of America, the Christian Crusade, the Christian Anti-Communist Crusade, and the American Council of Christian Churches is headed by Dr. Carl McIntire, a John Bircher. McIntire has a daily radio show heard on 677 radio stations and publishes several magazines. Occasionally the broadcasts have a smithering of religion, but in the main they broadcast radical rightist political dogmas. Back in 1970, Dr. McIntire announced he was sending several hundred "missionaries" to Alpine County to prevent a Gay take over. He said that homosexuals would be "hit on the head with the Gospel", and said his church was prepared to use force, if necessary to prevent a Gay take over.

The Mormons, the only church involved that is really a church, has not participated in the campaign directly, but the church owns the controlling interest in Greyhound, one of the main financiers of the campaign.

Mormons preach that Gays can't get into heaven, and recently used their immense political power to force the Idaho State Legislature to repeal the legalization of homosexual acts. In California, the Mormons have furnished most of the financing and volunteers for the Harmer-Mormon initiative, the proposition on the ballot that will make it a crime to print or say four letter sex words or to possess, sell or exhibit any drawing, photograph or sculpture that shows male or female sex organs, female teats or asses. Under the bill, written by State Senator Harmer of Glendale, the De Young Museum, the S.F. Public

Library, VECTOR and the Chronicle can be raided and closed for exhibiting, possessing or selling obscene material.

John Birch member, Rev. Dr. McBirnie, "Pastor" of the Glendale Community "Church" has a national network radio broadcast. McBirnie urges listeners to send for his book "The Homosexual Menace." The only thing religious about McBirnie's sermons is the prayer, which is usually an imploremment to "save America from Godless Communism and sex perversion."

The Rev. Dr. Schwarts of the Christian Anti-Communist Crusade goes a little further than the rest by adding anti-semitism. Homosexuals, Jews and Communists are equated in such a way that many of his ignorant listeners believe there to be a great overlap between the three groups.

Sears Roebuck has long maintained an anti-homosexual policy. Not only does Sears refuse to knowingly employ homosexuals, but it Allstate Insurance Company is the instigator of anti-homosexuality in the insurance industry.

Back in the days when we had an understanding Mayor, there were only a hundred or so Gay arrests in San Francisco per year, and most of these arrests were made by private detectives employed by Sears.

Here's the story on that: Sears asked police to come in and make Gay arrests in their toilets. The police refused, saying that they couldn't spare any men for such activities. Thereupon, Sears hired a number of handsome young detectives to go in and entrap Gays in the toilets of its Geary Street Store.

The same technique has been used by Greyhound in other cities. Both firms have gone so far as to install one way mirrors in its toilets to trap people having sex there.

I could find no information on the anti-Gay activities of the other firms, except Technicolor is the firm that fired Gay Activist Freda Smith of Sacramento when they heard a rumor that she was Gay.

GAY VOTERS LEAGUE CANDIDATES NIGHT SMASH SUCCESS

Over 150 persons turned out in driving rain to attend the Candidates Night of San Francisco's new GAY VOTERS LEAGUE. Thirteen candidates were presented to the group.

The event's coordinator Rev. Ray Broshears stated... "Political awareness is coming at last to Gays."

William E. Beardemphl, moderator for the affair, opened by announcing, "Tonight we are not going to discuss the Vietnam war... we will limit tonight's discussion to gay rights and gay issues."

He went on to say that this has been the most confused political campaign in recent memory and that the Gay voters are not pleased with either party for its stands on Gay rights. U.S. Congressman William Maillaird, remarked that Beardemphl was saying, "A plague on both your houses."

Candidates present were Maillaird R; Assemblyman John Burton D; Al Graf R; John Foran D; Joan Irwin R, challenging Assemblyman Willie Brown for the 18th District; Edlo Powell R, challenging U.S. Congressman Phillip Burton for the 5th District; and Peter Hannaford, R, challenging Democratic Congressman Ronald Dellums for the 7th District.

Candidates that were not present were represented by spokesmen. They included, Willie Brown, Ron Pelosi, Phillip Burton, Sen. George McGovern and President Richard Nixon.

Two candidates were extremely well received: Ms. Joan Irwin and Edlo

Powell.

Ms. Irwin began her presentation by displaying her political poster with a nude black male in the background and carrying the words "Joan Irwin Exposes Willie Brown."

She classified the poster as shocking but said, "I needed your attention to expose the issues." She then went on to cite Brown's record in the State Assembly which does not seem as great as everyone thinks. She further elaborated that Mr. Brown's co authored Consensual Sex Bill A.B. 470 should have been passed by now but it has been hampered by Mr. Brown's apathy.

Edlo Powell got rousing applause from the group by listing as one of his credentials a "Ph.D. in the streets." He said one of the major problems in politics is "the bullshit."

The candidates that gave the group the biggest surprise was Foran, who promised to support the adult consensual sex bill sponsored by Willie Brown and John Burton. He said his reason for not voting for the bill originally was that it did not contain the phrase "in private," but noted that it deserves passage anyway. He revealed in questioning that he had never been approached by either Brown or Burton in a lobbying effort on the bill. It was noted by Rev. Broshears at the conclusion of the meeting that Foran represents a very conservative district.

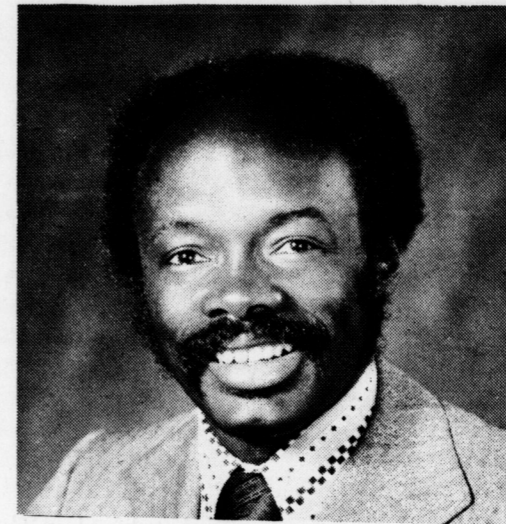

For the distaff bowlers, Lois Kelly's 204 was high scratch game and Diane McClanahan's 607 was high scratch series.

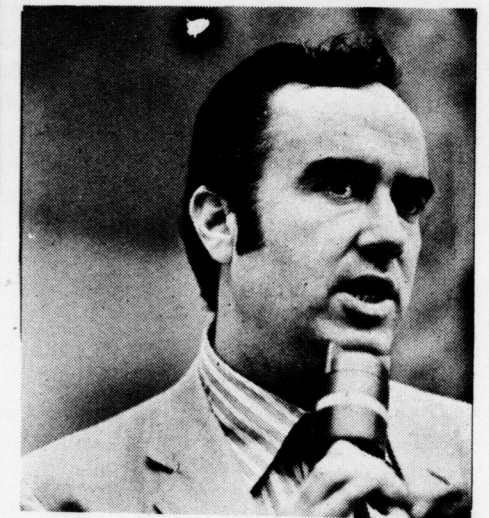

COLLECTION-CREDIT BUREAU AND AGENCIES "EXTORT" GAYS

The various collection agencies and credit bureaus in the San Francisco area, are for the most part, completely honest and ethical. But, there are those collection agencies, who skirt the border line between collection and blackmail-extortion. These agencies have been using the fact that a person is Gay to collect past due bills. They do this in a myriad of ways.

Telephone calls to your employers, or to your friends, and to other places where your credit is good, telling them that you; (1) owe money, (2) are a homosexual, (3) a bad risk.

Some have even gone so far as to cause persons to lose their jobs by such tactics, and other Gays have reported that collection agencies have come to their apartment buildings, told the manager that they were "perverts, and possible child molesters". And many a non-understanding manager has thrown a Gay out for this reason. Should you be threatened by any collection agency

or credit bureau in this manner, do not panic, do not run, but contact either the GAY ALLIANCE or the SOCIETY FOR INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS. Both have persons who can help you in matters such as these. The ALLIANCE has proposed an ordinance which would take away the business license of any bureau or agency that operates in such a manner.

THE GAY LIBERATIONISM OF THE GAY ALLIANCE...

The movement for liberation by Gays in San Francisco is one of practical humanism. It is concrete and political, our expression of the stifled desires of all Gays victimized and exploited in our society. The movement translates desires into demands and the needs of Gays into programs for struggle, a battleplan against our oppressors.

Social and economic oppression is the center target for the Alliance. Our goal is to free those Gays still in bondage, the majority unknowingly tho, from the chains of racism, sexism, and suppression of sexual expression, as well

as the "class-caste system" which exists within the Gay society and society in general. Liberation means to seize control over our own lives, and destiny, and to begin to build a truly free society in which all will be encouraged to be participants, equally.

The oppression of Gays stems from essentially the same source as that of other repressed groups; the restrictive competitive social roles necessitated by the corporate economy's ruling class. The GAY ALLIANCE believes that we must take care of things here in our own backyard, San Francisco, and forget the idealistic goals of those seeking to influence the national scene, for each group, in their own city, doing their own thing, will in the end, affect the national scene. We must end the exploitation that exists within San Francisco and in particularly the Tenderloin, once we do this, then Gays all over the City will be on the road to personal liberation. Certain commercial scenes are extremely exploitative, in that they cater to the young stud sexpot, so that he will draw in the customers, and discouraging old Gays, what they consider ugly Gays, from "hanging around."

The GAY ALLIANCE who have under various organizational names, for the past four years, picketed the BEAUX ARTS BALL, sponsored by the TAVERN GUILD, due to what was the complete indifference of the other major Gay groups in the City and the TAVERN GUILD as, to the plight of the Gay who is oppressed in ways that Gays with money can never be. As a result of the picketings, we have seen vast changes in the thinking of the TAVERN GUILD, who is turning a receptive ear to constructive Gay programs; sweeping changes at S.I.R., where they have become much more receptive to the needs of the unemployed Gay; and a deep and abiding concern by various of the Empress candidates, who are now helping whenever and wherever they can. And most of all, the awakening of those formerly considered, "elitist" Gays, to the fact, that the San Francisco Police are not all nice nice cops as portrayed by Officer Elliot Blackstone, but that a goodly portion of them have a sadistic hate for Gays, and take it out on those whose economic conditions

forces them into the field of exploitation. Elitist Gays are finding out now for the first time that they do not really have freedom, that they have just been allowed so much area of freedom by the SFPD and those "behind them," like a dog on a leash, and now Gays are finding that freedom is nice, real nice, so they are pulling at that leash and the police and going "bananas". Yes, Gay Liberation is not just a word, or a few people picketing, but it is living the full and complete life that we as human beings are entitled to do.

Gay Liberation is the process of struggle in forming our unvoiced needs into political and media "punch." Gay Liberation cannot and shall never mean, "toleration" for homosexuals. It must result in the transformation of existing social roles, the complete breakdown of "straight" definitions of relationships such as male supremacy, the subjugation of women, sexual elitism, and sexual exclusivity. Gay Liberation is total freedom, and it is here and now, don't fight it, join it.

S.I.R. GIVES STAMPS OF APPROVAL TO CANDIDATES AND POSITIONS ON PROPOSITIONS

On October 11, 1972, the Board of Directors of the SOCIETY FOR INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS unanimously voted to give the following stamps of approval. The sole criterium for a stamp of approval is that the candidate does support the rights of gay people.

For United States Congress: 5th District: Phillip Burton; 6th District: Roger Boas,

For California State Senate: Milton Marks and Ronald Pelosi.

CHURCH GROUP CLAIMS DISCRIMINATION

EAST BAY METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH of Oakland is currently involved in a discrimination dispute with the management of the Mount Hermon Camp Grounds near Santa Cruz.

Fred Miller, Controller of the inter-denominational Christian Conference Center, has announced that MCC cannot use the facilities because the church "advocates the practice of homosexuality."

Rev. Peter Wilson, Pastor of the Oakland MCC, has countered that METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH does not preach that everyone become homosexual. He has explained that MCC has been established as a place of worship for Gay persons rejected by conventional Christian churches.

A MCC Spiritual Retreat has been scheduled for October 28th-29th at the Mt. Hermon site. Church members from various parts of California are planning to attend. Wilson states that Miller has cancelled the written contract which allows them to utilize the Mt. Hermon facilities.

According to B.J. Beckwith and Jay Mayhall, San Francisco attorneys for the church, a lawsuit for breach of contract and trouble damages (under the Unruh Civil Rights Act) may be filed in the near future.

MCC was founded in 1968 by Rev. Troy Perry of Los Angeles. The group now has nearly forty churches and missions spread across the entire United States.

Oakland MCC holds services each Sunday night at 7:00 PM at HANS Bar, 316 14th Street.

McGOVERN REAFFIRMS ANTI-DISCRIMINATION STAND WITH REGARD TO SEXUAL ORIENTATION

Sen. George S. McGovern in a white paper covering a broad range of civil liberties and civil rights issues, reaffirmed his strong support for ending discrimination against women and men on the basis of their sexual orientation.

The white paper was issued in New York City on October 7, 1972.

Following is Sen. McGovern's official stand on the question of sexual orientation:

EQUAL RIGHTS FOR PERSONS OF DIFFERING SEXUAL ORIENTATION

The Nixon Administration has not protected the basic rights of persons of differing sexual orientation in the United States. In fact, it has carried out a policy of harassment and discrimination.

The evidence over the last four years is overwhelming. Sexual orientation has been a criterion for employment by public and governmental agencies, in work under federal contracts, for service in the Armed forces and for licensing in government - regulated occupations and professions. Between three and four thousand military personnel under Nixon have been given less-than-honorable discharges solely for

allegations relating to sexual orientation and for relations between consenting adults. Homosexuals have a difficult time obtaining housing, insurance, or surety bonding. Data on sexual orientation of individuals has been collected by government and private investigatory agencies, and sexual orientation is a standard of immigration into this country.

George McGovern would use the full moral and legal power of the Presidency to end this form of discrimination.

You are to be commended for "clearing the air" regarding an alleged beating in the Castro Area which in fact was a police aided case involving a self-induced ingestion of a caustic agent following a lover's quarrel. (B.A.R. 18 - Oct 72).

Not wishing to burden you with extraneous details I do feel I owe the Gay Community and the Police Department - which has been unjustly maligned in this matter - the following:

This so called "attack" was brought to my attention by a barowner, and not the Police as usually happens when there is a beating involving a Gay person in this area; I immediately contacted Mission and the Police Report was read to me; subsequently I left word with the PCR Unit, Hall of Justice, to have Officer Elliott Blackstone contact me, as the rumours in this area were becoming rampant and out of hand.

The following day the matter had tidal-waved to such a degree that in my conversation with Officer Blackstone he informed me that until he had set "the record straight" with SIR they were incensed enough to form vigilante groups. Further, certain well known, irresponsible and decidedly anti-police gays were describing the condition of the injured person in such horrifying terms that I decided to see him personally. (They, I later learned had not to that point seen him.)

Before visiting the hospital I went to Mission Station and read the Report myself. Had any of the rumour mongers taken the time to do this they would have seen that said report contained certain information which only could substantiate a suicide attempt. At the hospital the victim's condition nowhere approximated the talk innundating the Castro Area. After talking to the victim (he responded by writing on a tablet) I was then, and am now satisfied with the Police Report

and that capsulized in B.A.R.

Editor:

I think each of us in the gay community should now and then find time to appreciate the strides we have made in such a few years. We have become a community, complete with newspapers, structure, legal-medical services, and even religious facilities.

Many of these services have been available for some time, if one could find them and afford them. Only recently could they be found through our own channels of communication. For those of us with religious leanings, however, there was little unless we took a vow of dishonest silence that covered our sexual orientation and, in effect, caused us to live a lie during our Sunday observances.

The Church was an integral part of my early upbringing, and it remained so until I formed a very, very close relationship with a preacher's son and then one morning was led to the street. After that, my Sabbath prayers were said silently at brunch while camping up a storm with a few fellow sinstresses.

When I first attended METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH at the insistence of a young lovely I had met the night before, I expected to see a covey of drag queens lighting candles and chanting the maiden's prayer. I was in for a rude awakening. This was an average group of people, mostly gay, although some not - men and women from the business community, the professions; kids I had seen around the bars the night before, gentle people from the streets. Drag? Oh, yes, there was that, and leather, too. I came away not only surprised, but found I had enjoyed myself socially at the coffee hour after the service, and at the same time had been able, for the first time in years without looking over my shoulder, to exercise that devotion to God that, for me, has been a basic need since childhood.

No saints are these, but neither are they a group of nellies playing church. Services are serious and earnest without denominational affiliation; the sermons are direct and to a

point. Sins are not overlooked, yet sight is not lost of each person as an individual with ordinary human desires and frailties, but one who is trying in some manner to do better within his capabilities to do so. Most important, however, was the caring one for the other, and this with tolerance and understanding rather than criticism and put-down.

Dear B.A.R.:

I write to give some firsthand evidence in relation to Don Jackson's Sept. 20th article on sex laws and arrests.

I was arrested for cocksucking in the big Macy's busts of 1970. The court proceedings took from June 1970 to June 1971 - a year nearly to the day. During that period, Judge Kennedy of Municipal Court and Judges Axelrod and Karesh of Superior Court were given the chance to dismiss the case on the grounds of the statute's unconstitutionality.

The three judges agreed in refusing to even seriously consider such a motion. The reasoning: The statute is applied in practice to only homosexual behavior, true. But such discrimination in enforcement is the duty of police and D.A.'s, a necessary part of their job to carry out the will of the Legislature. Since the Legislature considers homosexuality a dangerous perversion, the sex laws are completely within the State's right to have and to enforce. In other words, the Legislature has a duty to protect society's mores and insure the continued existence of the race, but homosexuals have no rights to public or to private sexual expression.

At the same time our case was in court, a group of "Gay Movement lawyers" had arranged a suit in Marin County to test the validity of the laws. My co-defendant's original lawyer was one of these.

Also at the same time, the American Civil Liberties Union expressed an interest in helping mount an all-out attack on the

California Statute. The "Movement" lawyers, sure of success, told the A.C.L.U. to "keep out of our business," and the A.C.L.U. dropped their plans.

The Marin County suit failed. My lawyer's court petitions failed.

Meanwhile, my co-defendant had on account of the case lost two jobs, gone deeply in debt, and broken up with his boy friend. He was broke and alone, having just gotten out of the Marine Corps. After the first hearings, he was forced to give up his lawyer and use the public defender - who advised copping to a misdemeanor while my lawyer's suits for dismissal were still pending!

Luckily, my employer didn't fire me. Even more importantly, my man stuck by me through it all. But the proceedings used up our savings, drained our energy, and left us feeling very alone.

So, at last, we copped to a misdemeanor. The alternative was a trial we couldn't afford, before an unsympathetic, straight jury, where we were certain to be convicted by prejudice and perjury - and sent to 10 years in jail.

We couldn't face the trial, because we had insufficient support against the D.A.'s strong weapons. And we could have never afforded an appeal, taking perhaps years, and more money than either of us had ever seen. We did not have the ability to withstand infinite legal hassling.

The reason the constitutionality of California's sex laws has not been so seriously challenged before, is that myself, my attorney, and others in our position have not been able to find a judge who would even entertain a motion to dismiss on constitutional grounds.

Defendants suffer a lot, and alone. No one who hasn't been through it can imagine the torture of helplessness, frustration, and total irrationality through which an arrested person is dragged by our legal process.

Judge Dell has done what is long overdue. But don't blame the tardiness on those persecuted by the Police and the courts. Beating off their arresters is all they could have done. The fault lies with those who work for and vote for the legislators, administrators and judges who pass and enforce such laws.

In his decision not to endorse George McGovern, George Meany stated he could not stomach Senator McGovern's stand on the rights of gay people. In a recent speech to the Nevada Labor Council, Meany stated that "the Democratic Party has been taken over by people named Jack who look like Jills and smell like Johns." At the same time that Meany is making vicious attacks on gay people I find that my brothers and sisters in the Gay Activists Alliance/New York City are conducting a "Zap" at the headquarters of the very man Meany has attacked for supporting us.

I realize that my brothers and sisters at Gay Activist Alliance/New York City conducted their "Zap" with the best of intentions; however, I have to wonder if their energies would not be put to better use in "Zapping" those enemies of Gay Liberation such as George Meany and Richard Nixon.

It is obvious to me from the remarks of George Meany that he has no understanding of gay people, or of the repression under which we live. It is equally obvious that Richard Nixon is no more willing to end the repression of gay people than he is willing to end the bombing of North Vietnam.

I grant that Senator McGovern's public statements concerning his commitment to Gay Rights is less than perfect, but I would point out that he has made statements in support of Gay Rights and he has made a commitment to us.

It is my conviction that this election year is one of the most decisive in American history. Just a brief look at the sorry civil rights record of the Nixon administration over the past four years gives us more than an indication of things to come. The extension of the Senate Anti-Security Act through Executive Order, The Preventive Detention Bill, the No-Knock Clause, the Organized Crime Bill, (which has nothing to do with organized crime), the Anti-Riot Act are all attempts to whittle away the Constitutional rights of the American people. In addition to all this, it is wise for us to remember that it

was under the Eisenhower Administration that the Executive Order was signed forbidding gay people the right to work for the Federal government. Richard Nixon was then Vice-President. There is good reason to believe that he was personally responsible for that Executive Order, as the work that went into it was done during the days of Senator Joe McCarthy's investigation into the State Department and Richard Nixon, then Senator participated enthusiastically in that investigation. The couldn't find any Communists, but they sure found a lot of us.

Last May, the Nixon administration, under Attorney General John Mitchell, caused the mass arrest of over 13,000 people from the streets of Washington, D.C. They were herded into the Washington Coliseum and a blanket of tear gas was laid over them every forty-five minutes. All this because they dared to oppose Richard Nixon's handling of the war in Southeast Asia.

These violations of the basic rights of Americans all work together. If Richard Nixon shows such contempt for the rights of citizens in general, are we to believe that he will treat us any differently?

Many people in the Gay Community have told me that they find George McGovern's ideas on tax reform frightening. Most of these concerns are voice by brothers and sisters whose incomes fall between \$10,000 and \$25,000 a year. I have to wonder if they are really listening to what McGovern is saying. We are aware that we are taxed the heaviest and derive the least benefit. Mr. Nixon fools no one with his statements about no new taxes next year while the Wall Street Journal lays the groundwork for a national "value added tax" which will cause even more hardship to those of us whose income falls between \$5,000 and \$25,000 a year. We are all aware that Richard Nixon and Ronald Reagan and others who fall into their income brackets pay nothing near their fair share of taxes, while we are saddled with the major burden. McGovern is saying everyone should pay their fair share and the avenues of opportunity for the Ronald Reagans of this country to escape paying their share should be closed.

Finally, the election of George McGovern is not just the election of one man alone. It means a whole new administration, a chance to save the Supreme Court from certain domination by the forces of repression and a whole new tone in the nation's capital.

The National Institute for Mental Health grants hundreds of thousands of dollars to studies of urine specimens to determine causes of homosexuality and other such grotesque projects. Under the present administration, it is nearly impossible for us to obtain funding from the Federal government for our badly needed Community Service Centers. Can we not see the possibilities with a McGovern administration?

I would like to say to my brothers and sisters that the choice is clear, if not imperative. Can we not work together to assure the election of a man who will turn this

country's priorities back to the needs of the people and who will give us, as Gay citizens, the rights, the freedom and dignity to which we are entitled.

OBITUARY

Harrison M. Kleinschmidt, better known to his friends as J.D. Mercer, died Saturday morning, October 28, in Palo Alto. He was 54,

"Merc," the name many of his associates knew him by, was investor in several businesses related to the Gay Community. Among them are the BQ Sauna Baths in Palo Alto, and the ADONIS BOOKSTORE in San Francisco. In addition he had befriended many others in business and community service projects over the years he lived in the San Francisco area.

In 1959 Mercer's compendium on sexual variations with emphasis on the ambi-sexual and homosexual components appeared as "They Walk in Shadow," with no less than 600 pages. This early work attained significance later, having been cited in court cases and in research as valid although it was the work of a confessed ambisexual layman. Of it, Dr. Albert Ellis, marriage counselor and therapist in New York, said, "J.D. Mercer has spoken out sanely and courageously against the needless and inhuman persecution of sex

deviants which still persists in our society and he makes suggestions for changes in our sex laws that invite serious consideration."

Mercer himself was probably as controversial throughout his life as his book was when it came out 12 years ago. His lifelong interests were centered in Montana and Idaho - mining properties and claims. A few years ago a large copper operation in Montana acquired some of his vast copper holdings. About this time Mercer invested in a rubber bumper manufacturing company which initiated safety bumper designs that incorporated cells containing liquid that released so as to absorb impact. Subsequent designs of these bumpers are seen on some taxicabs and on many muni buses in San Francisco today.

Insurance companies often were the targets of Mercer's actions. They also, in some cases, considered him a kind of Nemesis, forcing litigations more than once.

While seldom engaged in a business entirely his own, Mercer nevertheless

worked hard and consistently to promote those with whom he was associated, sometimes to the point of consternation for some. Recognition of sorts for this came in 1971 when the BAY AREA REPORTER named Mercer as "Promotional Genius of the year" in its Camp Awards.

Once a cab driver in Vallejo, Mercer always drove with deadly direction and determination. Many who have ridden with him in various big cars often marveled at how he had so few accidents - but that was Mercer.

Driver of a hard bargain on an insurance claim or a mining property, Mercer was nevertheless generous, kind and loyal to friends far beyond the degree which his personality would indicate. The instances of his helping others are countless.

Funeral services were held on Tuesday, October 31 conducted by Rev. Carlson of METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH and cremation of the remains followed.

OBITUARY

Harrison M. Kleinschmidt, better known to his friends as J.D. Mercer, died Saturday morning, October 28, in Palo Alto. He was 54,

"Merc," the name many of his associates knew him by, was investor in several businesses related to the Gay Community. Among them are the BQ Sauna Baths in Palo Alto, and the ADONIS BOOKSTORE in San Francisco. In addition he had befriended many others in business and community service projects over the years he lived in the San Francisco area.

In 1959 Mercer's compendium on sexual variations with emphasis on the ambi-sexual and homosexual components appeared as "They Walk in Shadow," with no less than 600 pages. This early work attained significance later, having been cited in court cases and in research as valid although it was the work of a confessed ambisexual layman. Of it, Dr. Albert Ellis, marriage counselor and therapist in New York, said, "J.D. Mercer has spoken out sanely and courageously against the needless and inhuman persecution of sex

deviants which still persists in our society and he makes suggestions for changes in our sex laws that invite serious consideration."

Mercer himself was probably as controversial throughout his life as his book was when it came out 12 years ago. His lifelong interests were centered in Montana and Idaho - mining properties and claims. A few years ago a large copper operation in Montana acquired some of his vast copper holdings. About this time Mercer invested in a rubber bumper manufacturing company which initiated safety bumper designs that incorporated cells containing liquid that released so as to absorb impact. Subsequent designs of these bumpers are seen on some taxicabs and on many muni buses in San Francisco today.

Insurance companies often were the targets of Mercer's actions. They also, in some cases, considered him a kind of Nemesis, forcing litigations more than once.

While seldom engaged in a business entirely his own, Mercer nevertheless

worked hard and consistently to promote those with whom he was associated, sometimes to the point of consternation for some. Recognition of sorts for this came in 1971 when the BAY AREA REPORTER named Mercer as "Promotional Genius of the year" in its Camp Awards.

Once a cab driver in Vallejo, Mercer always drove with deadly direction and determination. Many who have ridden with him in various big cars often marveled at how he had so few accidents - but that was Mercer.

Driver of a hard bargain on an insurance claim or a mining property, Mercer was nevertheless generous, kind and loyal to friends far beyond the degree which his personality would indicate. The instances of his helping others are countless.

Funeral services were held on Tuesday, October 31 conducted by Rev. Carlson of METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH and cremation of the remains followed.

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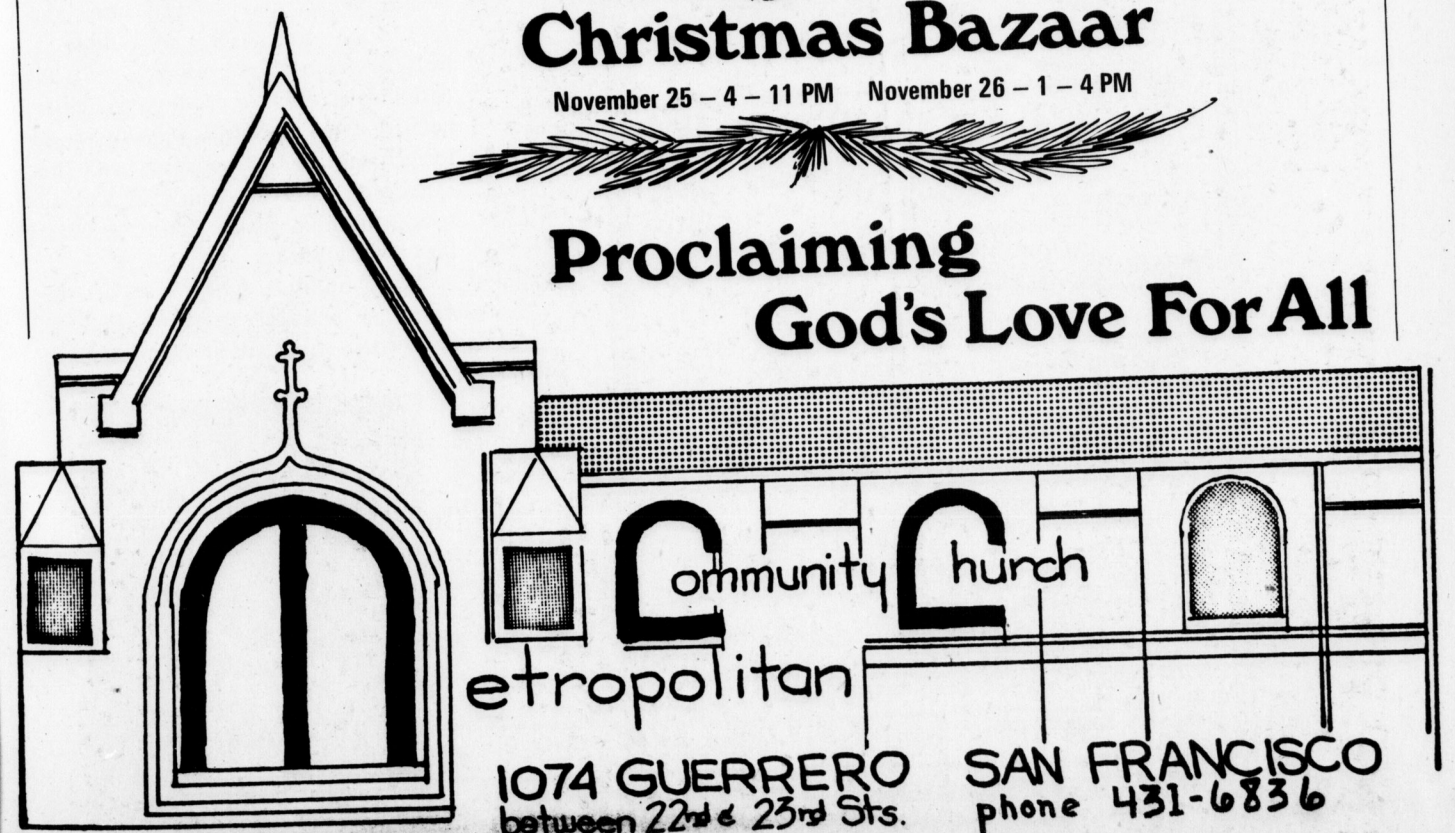

"We want a president we can trust, not one that says one thing in public and another in secret, one that will take responsibility for the activities of his own."

Would you like to take a big fat guess as to who said the above. Well, there is no reason to keep you in suspense; that great quote came from George McGovern in his speech in Portland, Oregon at the same time he is reported to have disavowed his own pledges to the homosexual community. We had been told that Senator McGovern has made private commitments to Jim Foster as well as endorsing the published seven points on Gay Rights that has been sent out from

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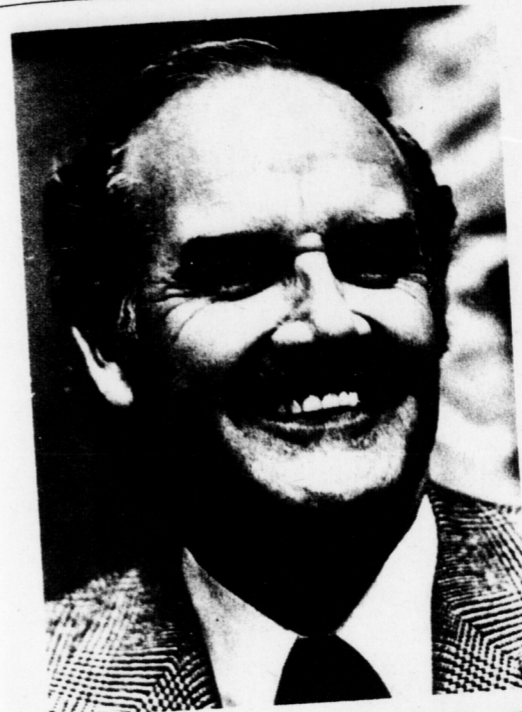

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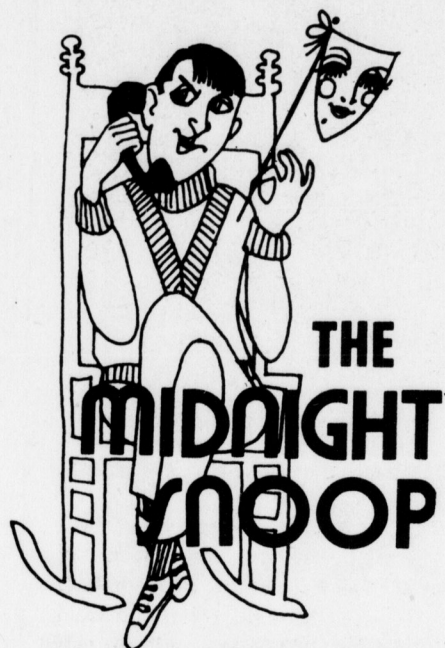
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McGovern's Year

MAN OF LA MANCHA

I remember when I first saw "Man of La Mancha" many years ago, it was a chilling experience that left me feeling emotionally drained. Last week, at the Orpheum Theater, I was often amused, highly impressed at times, and was left totally unmoved when it was all over. And it's hard to be left unmoved with an entire chorus singing the "Impossible Dream" as the gallant Miguel Cervantes walks up those sinister stairs to face the

Inquisition. But unmoved I was!

There have been two major changes made from the original production I saw. First, an intermission has been added (it was originally played straight through). And, on the whole, I approve. But, because of the break, the first act is now played for high comedy and in the second, we get down to the dramatic values. It would work if the groundwork for the second act was laid in the first, but under Richard Hughes broad, shallow direction, Don Quixote is played as a bumbling old buffoon, slightly mad and senile, but without nobility or spiritual idealism. And

without those qualities, which is what Dale Wasserman's play is all about, why bother to do "La Mancha" at all? Quixote's speeches about a search for beauty in an ugly world and his impossible dream are reduced to a demented old man's ravings and he becomes an object of pity but not sympathy.

Allan Jones delivers a good, craftsmanship portrayal, although I had great difficulty hearing and understanding him. The piping upper register he uses for Quixote's voice does not project and whole speeches were lost. His singing voice is strong and clear and he gives a good, solid performance within the framework Mr. Hughes direction has allowed him, but it lacks depth and dimension.

The joy of the evening is Annette Cardona's interpretation of Aldonza, the barroom slut. From her first entrance to the final reprise, she dominates the stage with a moving, subtle interpretation. Her Aldonza is tough, yet tender, vulgar, yet vulnerable. There are many exciting moments in "La Mancha" and most of them occur when Miss Cardona is onstage.

Edmond Varrato makes Quixote's squire, Sancho, a warm, lovable character who is always interesting to watch. It is a gem of a performance. Along with Harold Brown's Padre (and that glorious tenor!) and Rowan Tundo's Innkeeper. Special mention also to Ted Forlow's excellent comic

characterization of the Barber.

"Man of La Mancha" is a soaring brilliant piece of theatre. The Orpheum production is first-rate in many aspects. The staging of the quartet of "I'm Only Thinking of Him" turns one of the show's lesser numbers into one of its best. Aldonza starts singing "What Does He Want of Me" sitting on the back of the mule (Jeff Shawn), singing the number to Quixote's horse and mule, which gives it a child-like, wistful quality that belies her previous hardness. A beautiful touch. Unfortunately, Chet D'Elia's choreography is standard summer stock, uninspired and unimaginative. The Rape Ballet becomes a French apache and one of the show's most shocking moments is dissipated into a bore. The lighting primarily consists of two follow spots, one of whom must have a serious drinking problem on night caught. The set is excellent.

If you have never seen "Man of La

Mancha" before, you will find this current production vastly entertaining and a good evening of theatre, although you may just wonder what all the awards and accolades were for originally. The evening's top honors must go to Miss Cardona and a fine supporting cast; it's just a shame that Messrs. Jones and Hughes missed the essential quality that makes the "man of La Mancha great!!

MEET MITZI GAYNOR

A PERSONAL INTERVIEW

Mitzi Gaynor recently completed a four night engagement at the Circle Star Theater in a sensational two hour nightclub act that garnered standing ovations. Backed by the Four Fellows, the longest Miss Gaynor is ever off the stage is four minutes, making nine costume changes and singing and dancing up a storm. It is a dazzling display by a multi-talented woman who is the epitome of the word "pro," so I was very curious to discover what this surprisingly petite dynamo was like offstage.

Mitzi Gaynor is an interviewer's dream! She answers anything you ask her honestly and directly, never hedging or bothering to frame an answer. She is probably best remembered for her screen portrayal of Nellie Forbush in "South Pacific." Is that her favorite movie? "No, but it was certainly the most important. My favorite was a picture called "Golden Girl." And my favorite musical numbers were in the "I Don't Care Girl", although they had nothing to do with the plot. You could go out for popcorn and come back and you hadn't missed a thing." Another film she is fond of was a comedy entitled "Surprise Package," with Yul Brynner and Noel Coward. "It wasn't as good as it could have been, but it gave me a chance to work with Noel, whom I

dearly love. He's dear, sweet and wonderful... Yul was very much the King in "The King and I." Sometimes it would get to be a bit much and we'd turn and say, "Oh, come on!" but he's basically a nice guy. He's wise to himself. It's like he knows that you know that he knows that..." And how

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about Marilyn Monroe, whom she worked with in "No Biz Like Show Biz"? "It was hard to like Marilyn Monroe because she was never there. Even when she was there, she wasn't there. You couldn't communicate with her. The director would be giving her directions and you could tell Marilyn was only half-listening, because behind the director was some woman she'd brought from New York shaking her head no... She was so terribly unhappy... If I knew her today, we'd probably be good friends... She was a real, real artist and was never appreciated. Today she is. You look back at 'Bus Stop' and 'Seven Year Itch' and you realize how fantastic she was!"

And what was it like to be a star at 20th Century Fox? Did she get the big glamour build-up? "I was what they called a triple-threat, meaning I could sing, dance and act. I understand that 'triple-threat' is an old football term, so I considered it not terribly glamorous. They didn't know what to do with me... Fox was a one-woman studio. First it was Alice Faye, then Alice Faye's double, Betty Grable, and then finally, Marilyn Monroe. You notice they were all blondes... They'd make something very dramatic, like 'Man In The Grey Flannel Suit,' then another Grable musical." And when 'South Pacific' came, did she fight tooth and nail, claw and fang, to get the role? "I just tested. A lot of people announced themselves that they were doing it, but I'm terribly superstitious about things like that. I never say a word until I've got the signed contract in my hand and the first weeks salary in my purse."

In 1961, the days of the Hollywood musicals were at an end. Miss Gaynor put together a nightclub act and has

been steadily working in clubs, TV specials, and concert tours ever since. She loves that live audience! She

changes her act about every year-and-a-half. It takes a year to find the material and six weeks of intensive rehearsal for each new act. "My first act cost \$58,000. The current act cost \$103,000... In the early days, you could get a hand-beaded gown for 8 or 9 hundred dollars. Now you can't get one for less than \$2,000. and of course, you can't get just one. If a zipper breaks, you can't go on with safety pins all down your back, so..." She goes on to recall a few disastrous moments, those stories that are so great to tell later but so awful at the time. "One night, I was doing some very intricate work with the mike cords. I was really being a showoff! Somehow it got caught around a man's neck in the front row, and all of a sudden, he's turning blue, his wife is screaming, bottles are falling off the table.. Oh, why did you make me remember that!!" (She now works with a transistor mike with no cord)

And what about the future? Would she like to do a Broadway show? "Well, yes, but not right now. I'd like to do something that's so good I would say, 'I will pay to do this part!' and those are very hard to find." She firmly believes in personality staging, tailoring the vehicle for the individual. It's the only way, she feels, that any medium can compete with TV. And the movies today? "I think movies will start making money when they figure out how a husband can take his wife and kids to the movie too... These movies that you sneak in and out of, afraid someone will see you... If a woman sits on a sofa with no clothes on, it's X Rated. If they beat each others brains out and drag their entrails across the screen, it's a G rating. Violence is o.k. as long as they keep their clothes on. That just doesn't make sense to me."

Maybe Hollywood producers should listen to Mitzi Gaynor. She has been successful in every medium she's performed in (remember that fabulous TV special she did a few years back?), and obviously knows what the audience wants to see. She is a performer's performer. She would still like to work with Burt Bacharach, Sammy Davis and Lucille Ball ("She and I feel things alike. She always has that marvelous femininity about her.") I found her to be warm, forthright and a woman more interested in others than herself. Mitzi Gaynor is like a Hallmark Card - when you care enough to get the very best!!

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a film view

THE "HEAT" IS ON

The Andy Warhol / Paul Morrissey duo has come up with a hot number in "HEAT" now playing at the Music Hall.

This new film from the Warhol factory is another step toward the more "conventional" type of film making that Warhol's earlier projects have rebelled against. "HEAT" gives us a much stronger plotline than before and a surprisingly adequate performance from Joe Dallesandro. The best idea was in obtaining the services of Miss Sylvia Miles, previously oscar-nominated for "Midnight Cowboy." In the role of a "semi-retired" Movie Star, she dominates the screen when she is on,

even upstaging the famed Dallesandro body which has everyone in the state of the film title.

From the first image on film, sorta a take-off on the famous Gloria Swanson photo in the demolished Roxy Theatre, the film moves in a deliberate slow, noon-day hot, fashion to give us what might be called a combination Lana Turner / Johnny Stompanato and "Sunset Boulevard" satire.

As usual with this genre of film, the images and words are funny, sexy and sometimes quite ranuchy but in "HEAT" things are toned down from some of the "hot" items of the past (e.g. "Trash" and/or "Flesh"). With little nudity (no male frontal nudity at all) and nary a graphic sexual scene

(there are a couple nearly-graphic), the picture is one of the "tamer" films from Warhol and who knows one day he might even get a "PG" rating.

The story-line is only of slight importance, (the importance being that there is one in the first place) and we are soon caught up in the world of Hollywood - 1972.

There's a whining young girl (played convincingly by Andrea Feldman) who can't make up her mind whether or not to be a masochistic lesbian. She plays Miss Miles's daughter who has borne a child out of wedlock (prior to her lesbian activities) and now dwells in a sleazy but typical Hollywood motel. The manager of the motel complex, which also houses Dallesandro, is

hilariously and outrageously played by Pat Ast. Miss Ast plays a hot second to the top-billed Miss Miles and only manages to steal the scenes in which Miss Miles is not appearing. Two minor characters are a pair of brothers who do a homo erotic night club act. One of them, Eric Emerson, plays a demented man/child who is constantly "jacking off" under a much-too long wool nightie. They are much more the type of thing one has come to expect in a Warhol film. Unfortunately the brothers do not appear too often in the film.

Dallesandro plays a former teen star ("Mouse Time U.S.A." and "The Big Ranch") who is making a comeback via anyone he can make. He meets Miss Miles, who once did a guest star stint on his series, through her nagging daughter and he proceeds to seduce the "older-than-he" star - quite an easy task. She in turn tries to help him regain stardom by introducing him to various directors and influential show folk. The setting becomes the 37-room mansion which she got in her last divorce settlement. The plot thickens when Andrea moves back into the house and tries to play games with Joe - who doesn't seem to ever say "no" to anyone craving his body. When they go to visit Miss Miles's ex-husband (Andrea's father) for more money, Joe is seduced by the ex-husband's lover and is caught "being done" by Miss Miles. Lots of hysterics follow ending up with Joe leaving her and returning to the motel. She follows and attempts to kill him, only to find the gun empty. We fade out with the gun being thrown into the pool and Dallesandro goes on to the next "helpful" hand.

Dallesandro plays his role in an almost parody of the cliché dumb blond, all body and no brain. Except for

a couple of posterior shots, the formerly much exposed body of Dallesandro remains covered (although the clothes are quite snug). It's a pity since he has not looked as healthy and fit in other recent films.

If you like your films a little on the bizarre side and satirical, "HEAT" may warm you up. *** star blaze.

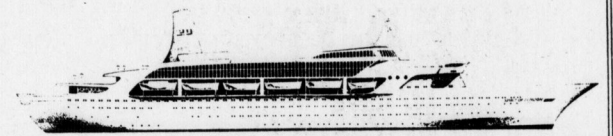

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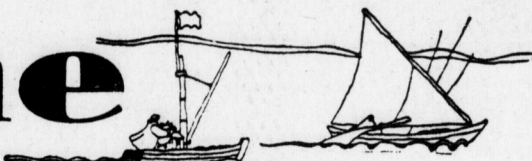
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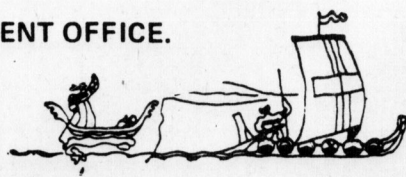

MORALS CRACKDOWN

SFPD ESTABLISH "MORALS SQUAD" ...1984 ALREADY?
from the Gay News Service

"Big Brother" is watching you, busting you, and killing you! That's right, for here and now in San Francisco, the local police have established what is known unofficially as the "MORALS SQUAD". It is a group of six men, within the Bureau of Special Services (BSS-VICE), and they are very smart young men, who know how to make a bust and make it stick throughout the court-trip. Since the unofficial inception of this "Orwell-1984" nightmare unit back in September, they have busted untold amounts of Gay peoples. In recent weeks, they have made two spectacular busts of male model agencies, (the only two left in San Francisco), UNIVERSAL MODELS, and IVAN STERLING MODELS. The Universal busts came on three separate occasions, with the last one netting for the second time within a month of the operator of that group, Carl E. Jordan. Jordan also owns and publishes the Forum newspaper, which John Chase (Emperor Council founder) is the new manager according to the last issue of the Forum.

Several of the UNIVERSAL models were 'set up' for busts later by a police informer, whose name has been given as Michael Barringer. Then, this past week, November 8th, Toby Ross, operator of IVAN STERLING agency was busted along with five other persons at 197 Duboce.

To top matters off, there have been more 288a busts in the past sixty days than in the previous six months combined, with some of them happening at the YMCA. One man is currently being held for 2-TWO, 288a's. That's a believe it or not.

Then the MORALS SQUAD which vows to "clean up" San Francisco, has

stated that they are going after the porno bookstores and movie theaters. One MORALS SQUADER stated that after they finish with them, they will "take care of the bars, etc." He is a fanatic on morals, (Nixon-Reagan concept there of).

The streets of the Tenderloin have been the scene of various of the MORALS SQUAD actions in the early weeks and now the streets of the Tenderloin look bare of the handsome young gayboy types as a result. In the current issue of the ADVOCATE, Issue 99, the "emperor" of San Francisco, Marcus Manulis is quoted as saying that he has read the complaints of Rev. Ray Broshears coming into the Mayor's office, which he says came across his desk. He denounced the Reverend for speaking out on behalf of those who have no voice. As a result of the ADVOCATE article and the subsequent lack of reply from the Mayor's office, Reverend Broshears has charged via a radio broadcast that the "Emperor" Marcus is "squelching complaints about the harassment of Gays in the Tenderloin, and is nothing but a "goody-goody two-shoes front-man for something funny."

Mister Ian Robins noted Tenderloin personality, has charged that as a result of the MORALS SQUAD actions, Gay people in that area are shifting back into their closets. He was joined in this observation by Mark Snow who expressed the belief that too many of the Gay peoples are setting around on their ass, expressing no concern over the well-being of our arrested Gay sisters and brothers." He charged that apathy is destroying the gains made by activists Gay peoples who have gone into semi-retirement. Rev. Broshears concurred in this, charging that such persons as Kevin McAree, Bill May, Al Alvarez, Larry Littlejohn, and John
