

endorse the Christmas in Vacaville Caravan on Wednesday, December 27th, which will carry gifts to the prison gates, and leave them at the gates, with a short religious service following at the gates.

Vacaville officials refused to allow a BAY AREA REPORTER sponsored show appear at the prison recently, and as a result, Gaypeoples are rising up angry, so to speak, over the matter. Superintendent, Pope has since resigned, Dr. T.L. Clanon has replaced him. At first, this brought tears of joy, which quickly turned to tears of sorrow as it was learned that Dr. Clanon, who advocated psycho-surgery and who has performed such at C.M.F. and U.C. Medical Center, is curretnly seeking more money to expand his psycho-surgery policies. He had instituted such lovely programs as "psycho-surgery", and "prolyxin-zombism", and other such horrors. His last act was to segregate Gaypeoples in the prison once and for all, moving overt Gaypeople from all sections to P-1 and P-2. In recent months, Vacaville has instituted a "rotating system" with the prison at San Luis Obispo, C.M.C. (California Men's Colony), a program in which prisoners were exchanged between the two facilities on a super irregular basis, with some of the inmates being flown back and forth. Some attorneys have charged that this is a harassing tactic, making it difficult for them to know the exact whereabouts of their client. Many attorneys having gone to see their clients at Vacaville, only to find that they have been transferred to C.M.C.







## **O.R. BAIL PROJECT "FIRES" CONCERNED EMPLOYEES** by Gay News Service/SF

December 1st, the Board of Directors of the San Francisco O.Or Bail Project, fired, WITHOUT giving cause, three of its more people-dedicated workers. Fired were, Bernie Houden, 3 year employee; John Eckhowe, a 2 year employee, and Lynn Tsouras, who has been with the "free bail" project for a year.

Director of the Project, Kenneth Babb, would give the GNS no reason for the dismissal, except to say that it was the decision of the Board of Directors.

A "flyer" signed, the Concerned O.R. Workers, has charged that the three were dismissed because of the dedication to the poor, to the peoples arrested, and not to the police, courts, etc., the system, which places them in jail.

They go on to say that they believe that all members whose loyalty is not to the "system," aka: Richard Milhouse Nixon, and his ilk, that it will be a matter of time before they are all dismissed and replaced with "scab" labor. Witness of this, is the recent "re-hiring" of a person who is very "uncle tomish", that according to Reverend Ray Broshears, who works with the Project closely, but states, that the various ', establishment-types" have

been less than co-operative with him in the past 2 weeks, and causing a curtailment of his jail and court activities. Broshears also blames various shadowy figures at S.I.R. for some of this as well.

Most all observers at the Hall of Justice are not surprised at this turn of events. One observer, who refused to give his name, stated that the Nixonites are making themselves felt, and the courts have become increasingly hostile to the O.R. Project workers. The Project director has told various workers that their loyalty must be to the Board of Directors and NOT to those who have been arrested.

Reverend Broshears "exploded" at this stating that the "whole thing had been set up to serve thypeople, to put the people arrested first, not a damn bunch of bureaucrats." Broshears blasted the chairman of the Board, Charles Rump from the Attorney General's office, stating that if the funding had of remained under the "poverty program" O.E.O., that this could have never happened, but "outside" funding entered into the picture, and with it the old establishment bullshit.


Sister Mary Bernadette Giles of Presentation High School, another member of the Board voted for the firings, and she is extremely conservative and anti-Gaypeople, that according to Reverend Broshears.


The outside political activity of the workers within the Project has been the cause of discomfort to Babb and the SFPD in particular. It is believed that the four dismissed, were fired because they were strong advocates for the poor and the oppressed. The very peoples whom the O.R. Project serves. GAY ALLIANCE chairman Broshears stated, that "if these firings are allowed to stand, then you might as well write-off the O.R. Project as far as being a help to the poor. For it will be a "tool" of money attorneys and the SFPD." All concerned peoples are urged to protest the firings by writing to your local media protesting their dismissal. Remember, today the "FOUR", tomorrow who?

## MA BELL SHAFTS GAY RIGHTS by Don Jackson

Gay equal employment opportunity advocates suffered a major defeat Nov. 30, when the San Francisco Human Rights Commission ruled that public utilities are not required to comply with equal employment opportunity legislation.

The Commission ruled that it had ',no legal grounds" to proceed on a complaint filed by Don Jackson against the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company. Pacific Telephone stated that it has not and will not "knowingly hire nor retain a homosexual." The HRC ruling came after testimony from San





Francisco City Attorney Thomas O'Conner. The Commission decided that O'Conner, "In effect, upheld the phone companies' position that they are an involuntary contractor."

The gist of O'Conner's written testimony was that anti-discrimination laws cannot be enforced against monoplies because the law of contracts provides "the consent of the parties must be obtained on the basis of willingness." The phone company, O'Conner argued, is an involuntary contractor in that it is requiied by law to furnish phone service. For the city to require it to sign a non-discrimination contract would amount to coercian, O'Conner said.

The anti-discrimination ordinance provides that firms must sign an anti-discrimination contract as a condition of doing business. "Obviously", O'Conner said, "we can't stop doing business with the phone company."

"Why not?" asked Don Jackson, "The law does say the City should cease doing business with non-complying firms. Why doesn't the Mayor call Ma Bell and tell her to disconnect San Francisco. She'd sign an agreement fast because the loss of revenue would be too great."

Jackson, who was released from the Columbus, Ohio, Correctional Institute only a week before, said he was disappointed by the ruling because he had to find a job to meet a condition of probation.

Former S.I.R. President Larry Littlejohn, who, along with S.I.R. Community Services Director Chuck Schneider, accompanied Jackson to the hearing, proposed that the Public

Utilities Commission be asked to amend its regulations prohibiting anit-Gay employment discrimination by public utilities in San Francisco on the grounds that discrimination violates the City's public policy.

Schneider said he would refer the matter to S.I.R.'s attorney to see if any legal steps can be taken.

Although the ruling was on the specific complaint against the phone company, it applies to all public utilities - railroads, trucking firms, bus lines, water, gas and electric firms. In San Francisco, an inordinante proportion of the jobs are connected with utilities because it is the administrative headquarters of many statewide and in a few cases, nationwide public utilities.

Since the HRC ruling was made on the bases of the common law of contracts rather than on local or state law, the enforcability of similar legislation in New York City, Ann Arbor and East Lansing is dubious.

The background of the case goes back to last June, when Jackson wrote to the phone company, stating that he wished to apply for a job there, but wanted to find out if they had changed their anti-homosexual policy before wasting his time and theirs by filing an employment application. Mr. H.A. Garrish, Vice President in

Charge of Personnel, answered, saying that their policy is still, in spite of the new ordinance, "We do not knowingly hire nor retain homosexuals."

Then, Jackson filed a formal complaint with the Human Rights Commission. A phone company spokesman told HRC they would not employ homosexuals because: 1. homosexual employees would be offensive to their customers. 2. Homosexual employees would create a morale problem with their straight employees. 3. Phone company jobs involve national security, and homosexuals are a security risk.

The Commission referred the matter to Deputy City Attorney Milton Meyer. Ma Bell's prestigious attorneys, Pillsbury, Madison and Sutro, then changed the line, saying the phone company would not comply with the ordinance because it is a monopoly, and requiring them to sign a non-discrimination agreement would amount to coercian. 
## NEW PRISON GROUP ADMITS FOUR GAY REPRESENTATIVES

The recently organized, BAY AREA PRISON COALITION, which is comprised of various prison organizations in the San Francisco-Oakland Bay area, has admitted a representative from four of our Gay organizations. The Coalition has thirty groups, which now include, with full voting membership, the MCC (METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH/SF), S.I.R. (SOCIETY FOR INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS), GA/SF (GAY ALLIANCE), and the Ministry of

## Concern (M.O.C.).

Representing M.C.C. is the Reverend Ralph Gordon, dynamic minister, who works with former inmates, and he himself is a former resident of a penal institution. Reverend Gordon, along with Paul Mariah of C.R.H., co-chaired the first ever, Gay peoples workshop in a major prison conference, which was held December 2nd and 3rd, out of which grew the Bay Area Prison Coalition. Thirty-one Gay peoples participated in the GAY FREEDOMS WORKSHOP, and in other workshops as well. Chuck Schnieder of S.I.R., who is

the delegate seated for that group. manned the Gay Freedoms Workshop Informational Table along with the GAY ALLIANCE delegate, Reverend Ray Broshears. The fourth delegate seat to the Coalition went to the Reverend Bob Richards of the Ministry of Concern. Richards. Gordon, and Broshears, all have been in prison at one time, and it was felt by Gaypeoples in the Workshop, could well represent the Gay Communities in the new organization.

During the second day of the conference, the GAY ALLIANCE was represented by S.I.R. member, R. Daniel Smith, as Rev. Ray had church services and a radio program. Danny, a volunteer at S.I.R. voted as he saw fit. And he voted for the Chuck Schnieder sponsored resolution, which called for the following wording to be used in connection with Gay people in prison; "The term 'spouse', shall include any person of the same or opposite sex with whom a staff member in effect (if not in law) has a stable marital relationship. All other definitive terms shall enjoy the same equal broad interpretations." This would be a step towards bringing prison officials into the realization that Gaypeoples should have the same visitation rights as do heterosexual couples.

## GAY MEN'S NIGHT IS ON THE MOVE

Gay Men's Friday night rap groups are moving to the lounge of the Berkeley First Baptist Church at Haste and Dana after four successful months at the Berkeley Free Clinic. The drop-in rap groups will begin as usual at 7:00 PM in the new location. A Gay medic will continue to be available at the Free Clinic, on Durant and Dana, at the same time for drop-in Gay male V.D. check-ups. One-to-one Gay counseling will also continue; appointments can be set up by coming on Friday night or calling the clinic, at 548-2570.

Gay Men's Night was started by the Gay Men's Collective of the Berkeley Free Clinic last July to provide a space where Gay men could meet each other and rap about our situations and ourselves in a more open and human atmosphere than is available at bars and such places. (continued on next page)

The number of men attending has gradually grown from an average of about fifteen to about fourty-five, and this has meant attempting to crowd four small rap groups into a space that's really too small. Consequently people had expressed a need for someplace roomier to meet than the Free Clinic's Rap Center. In the lounge of the First Baptist Church we've found not only a larger space, but one considerably more comfortable. It will also be more Gay space on Friday night away from the inevitable tumult of the clinic.

The move will also facilitate other activities of Gay Men's Night. In addition to the rap groups, we started community meetings about two months ago. They begin at 9:30 and provide the opportunity for people to announce various activities going on of interest to Gay men as well as to give feed-back about the evening's experience. Several activities have emerged out of the community meetings, including a Gay guerilla theatre troup, a Gay men's dance class, and a Gay political action group. All of these have come about simply by one person announcing his interest and asking for contact with others with similar interests.

The Collective also uses the community meetings as a way to set up on-going rap groups that meet in people's homes and provide a more intense and continuing experience for Gay men who want to examine their lives and their experiences together. So far six such groups have been set up and more are in the process of forming and are still open to new members.

It should be noted that neither the Gay Men's Collective, nor Gay Men's Night are affiliated with or sponsored by the First Baptist Church. Also the First Baptist Church is neither affiliated with nor sponsored by the Gay Men's Collective.



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
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## **WISHING YOU** A MOST HAPPY HOLIDAY SEASON







The spectre of advanced technological control over social "deviant" persons is exemplified in a new California prison facility. It is called the Medical-Psychiatric DiagnosticUnit (MPDU) and is part of the Department of Correction's Medical Facility at Vacaville. It has 84 beds, and is designed to handle eventually all 600 to 700 inmates from the various prison Adjustment Centers (maximumsecurity wings) around the state. Inmates and their supporters view the MPDU as a laboratory of behavioral 'torture,' which in practice will be performed primarily upon militant black and Chicano organizers in the prison population.

On November 19, 1971, the California Department of Corrections (DOC) invited a group of psychologists, psychiatrists, researchers and prison officials to meet at the University of California (Davis) to discuss prison violence and a possible new psychiatric unit at Vacaville. At the meeting, DOC ooficials were entirely vague as to what kind of treatment they envisioned at the proposed new facility. Pointed questions about electrochock therapy, aversion techniques and the like were evaded; several DOC officials even hastily disappeared when the questioning became too direct.

Two drugs commonly used on prisoners are Prolixin and Anectin. Prolixin was injected 1093 times in 1970. Anectin (succinylcholine chloride) paralyzes one's voluntary muscles for oneand-a-half to two minutes. According to those who have been injected, the patient is overwhelmed by a feeling of suffocation, of drowning, of sinking into death. While in this fearful state, the inmate is told that when next he has an impulse to smash or attack, he will stop and think and remember the seansation he is experiencing under Anectine.

Anectine was used by the DOC on about thirty prison inmates in the late 60s. When a psychiatrist asked about consent, the DOC medical director, Dr. John Gorman, wrote that "every one of these patients had signed an informed consent." However, a report made for the DOC by two researchers. Drs. ARthur Mattocks and Charles Jew, states that "the patient was requested to sign a statement of consent. On five patients, consent was not received from the patient himself, but was granted by the institution's Special Treatment Board. (These prisoners have since sued the state.)

Electroshock therapy was administered at Vacaville nearly 500 times in 1971. Reports out of the California State Hospital for the Criminally Insane at Atascadero repeatedly mention that genital electrochock was used on sexual offen ders as aversion therapy. (Reportedly the. inmates are shown movies of explicit sexual content. If they begin to display sexual arousal, their genitals are

shocked. This program is entitled "Errorless Extinction of Penile Responses."

The MPDU funding proposal also reads: "There has been, for an example, a study in the California Medical Facility to determine the usefulness of lithium carbonate in treating hyperaggressive eatingout patients. Further follow-up in this area would make a significant contribution."

"We don't really know what it does," says Dr. Joseph Tupin, who administered to prisoners for years at Vacaville.

The MPDU raises another question. According to its public position, the aim of the facility is. if possible to "cure" the

inmate and return him to the prison mainline; if he doesn't respond to the therapy, he will be returned to the Adjustment Center whence he came. CREDIT: This story was exerpted from an article by Bernard Weiner in the NA-TION.


Marty is still your genial chef and Jim a most friendly waiter. The special at \$2.95 was Swiss Steak. We started off with a relish dish and then a tasty bowl




# New On The Península Where The North Meets The South

There is a rumor that when the doctor first slapped Charles Pierce on the behind, he coughed once, looked up and said, "Max, you sly puss!" in his best Bette Davis fashion. Charles, his electric blue eyes twinkling, says, "Now, isn't that silly? You see how rumors start? I didn't start doing Bette until MONTHS later!!"

If the truth be known, it was actually several years later. A few years after puberty ("a hair-raising experience"), Mr. Pierce went to the Pasadena Playhouse to study acting. Unfortunately, jobs were scarce and in 1953, a friend of his who worked in the wardrobe department there was fired and collected some wigs and props as a farewell present (unbeknownst to the Playhouse) and gave them to Charles. With these few accoutrements, Charles Pierce made his "camp debut" at the Club La Vie in Altadena, Calif., doing impressions of Tallulah's grandmother and Eleanor Roosevelt for the grand sum of \$5.00 a Sunday afternoon. He was then booked into the Echo Club in Miami Beach to replace George Matson (who originated the now-famous Yma Sumac pantomime). In 1955, at the Echo Club, Charles met Rio Dante. When he first played there, it was with Doodles and Spider. When he was asked back for a second time, he decided.

after working with them, to try adding mime numbers to his act. The first mime number he ever did was a medley from the then-current Broadway hit, "The Boy Friend," with Rio Dante accompanying him on his live material. Thus the partnership that still endures today was formed. Ann's 440, the Onyx Room, and several other clubs followed, culminating in a six-year run at the now-defunct GILDED CAGE. We will now skip blithely over those six years, except to note that in that time Charles Pierce became a San Francisco landmark, second only to the Golden Gate Bridge. How many entertainers in those years got their first exposure on the GILDED CAGE stage on talent night?! Pat Montclaire did his first

number there; ditto Bashka, Glenn Elliot, Lori Shannon and numerous others who have since gone on to fame/obscurity. Eventually, the CAGE closed ("I was tired and out of ideas anyway.") and Charles went to Los Angeles to work.

Last year, while appearing at The Playhouse in L.A., scandal touched Mr. Pierce. A young man shot himself in Charles' dressing room. The rumor factory had a field day, although the story was kept hushed up. Sitting in his suite today at the Raphael Hotel, Charles speaks quite candidly about the incident. "I would like to get the truth known once and for all." A young man, a friend of the owner's, was working there as a day bartender and became an



ardent fan of the show. He would sit and watch every night. After many weeks of this, one afternoon he was showing a friend of his one of the dolls Charles used in his act. The doll had a gimmick and the man inadvertantly set off the gimmick. That night, onstage, Charles started the bit with the doll and suddenly realized that the gimmick used at the end of the number was already obvious to the audience because the man had not reset it that afternoon. The bit was ruined and after the show, Charles asked the man to please not play with the props backstage. This triggered something mentally and the man went on a 24 hour drinking bender. The next night, after drinking steadily, he asked to see Charles alone in the dressing room. When alone, he said, "I'm going to do something you'll remember always", pulled out a gun and shot himself through the chest. Upon investigation, it turned out the young man was mentally disturbed and had attempted suicide in Chicago earlier that year. As Charles says, "It was the worst night of my life!" It was a tragic example of the effect of a harmless remark on a disturbed mind.

A couple of months ago, while still at The Playhouse, Charles attended the premiere of "Bluebeard" in Hollywood dressed as Bette Davis. He and Sabu arrived in a battered 1949 Chrysler amidst a bevy of elegant limousines. Rona Barrettt was interviewing the celebrities outside the theater. Unfortunately, nobody had clued Miss Barrett in as to what was happening. Charles, as Bette, swept up to her, with the cameras grinding, and said, "Rona, dahling!" Rona Dahling ("she's very square") went right up for grabs, stammering and stuttering through a very brief interview. Charles/Bette finally looked at Rona and said, "You know, Rona dear, Hollywood has certainly changed. The New Hollywood has violence, sex and passion. The Old Hollywood had love, romance and ... Rona Barrett!" Needless to say, the interview was cut from her show and never seen.

I asked what has been the highlight of his career thus far? "Oh, I'd have to say BIMBO'S last year, because of the show surrounding me. I really don't like to carry the whole show, and there I had time to prepare each character. And, of course, GOLD STREET is always a pleasure." Mr. Pierce just finished his fourth return engagement at GOLD STREET and will be playing there New Year's Eve. And the worst club he's ever worked? "Well, Carol Doda's on Broadway. That was a disaster!!... And a club called Pearl's City Tavern I once played in Honolulu. The crowd was half-Oriental, half-sailor, and I had to m.c., bring the chorus girls out, and when the band took a break, I had to do 30 minutes of talking between shows. I lasted two nights." "The most fun time I ever had was






## TRAVELS WITH MY AUNT

To find a film that is witty, charming, and a visual treat is a rarity, but such a gem opens next week at the Alhambra Theatre in a very nice Christmas gift titled " Travels With My Aunt."

The film adaption of the novel by Grahame Greene deals with the eccentric Aunt Augusta and her rather humdrum nephew, Henry, on a series of adventures taking them from London to Paris to Istanbul and Spain. The film is a beauty to behold and it's mirth is joyously enacted in a superb tour de force by Maggie Smith as Augusta. Her performance is a jewel and shows us another side of the brilliant actress' best

remembered as "Jean Brodie".

All the supporting players, particularly Alec McCowen as the nephew, are a fine match for Miss Smith. Much credit should be given to the costumes of Anthony Powell and the Production Design of John Box. The film is always a joy to behold with wonderful use of both exterior and interior settings.

The film opens and builds slowly from the funeral of Augusta's virginal sister Angelica whose step-son Henry has not seen his aunt since infancy. Henry has grown into a rather boring man whose main thrill in life is growing dahlias. Augusta brings Henry to her flat

above a pub, where she is attended to by Lou Gossett (whose duties are never quite defined to the bewildered nephew). His overdressed. over-cosmeticked Aunt decides that she will need Henry's help in trying to rescue an old lover who is being held for ransom and from then on it's one adventure after another as Henry learns to 'live, live, live" (oh, that's another Aunt isn't it?)

Aunt Augusta might just be the British cousin to the lively Mame, with her convictions and unconventionalities. Although she is at times outrageous, she is not as overdrawn and towering as the American Mame. The reason for this is

not only because she's English but because by the time we meet Augusta, she is in those latter "sunset" years and for most of the film Miss Smith is aged by the makeup of Jose Antonio Sanchez to appear as old and yet as ageless as Estelle Winwood (another actress with a perchance for vivid red wigs).

There are a few flashback sequences which show Miss Smith in marvelous period costumes and elegant locales. We see that the young Augusta kicked up her heels as one of the girls of a traveling Italian bordello as well as mistress to a wealthy Frenchman. She also managed to model for Modigliani during her youth and that portrait becomes a most valuable items for the older Augusta.

My only dismay with the film was the ending. I think that it's a cop-out type ending which does not satisfy at all. I won't spoil it by telling you the ending as you, dear reader, would probably groan and it might deter you from seeing what otherwise is a most enchanting film. A large bouquet must go to George Cukor who once again shows that he is still the dean of "women's directors" by being the chef that keeps the souffle from falling.

It's a delightful, charming way to spend a holiday eve, if you like the light comedy touch and fancy being whisked away on the Orient Express for adventures with a very mad, fascinating Aunt.



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
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### **GETTING IT TOGETHER**

## **AN OPEN LETTER** TO THE GAY COMMUNITY Dear Brothers and Sisters:

With Christmas approaching, METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH wishes all our brothers and sisters a peaceful and liberating holiday. At times like this I am personally led to consider what we may say that is relevant and meaningful to you from a church that is dedicated to ministering to you.

First, this season reminds us again of the reality of a caring, intelligent and purposeful God whose love for us transcends all our experience. Such a divine Being simply means that in our worst moments we are not alone or abandoned while in our best moments we are reminded that we are part of a divine nature that can impel us to be the best we know we can be.

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
