On Monday, January 22, Judge Lynch of the Municipal Court declared that nude dancing was not illegal and dismissed all charges against the GASLIGHT, its owner, Elmon Clifton, and the boy dancer cited for indecent exposure. B.J. Beckwith was the attorney representing Mr. Clifton on charges 314.1 — Indecent Exposure—and 314.2 — Procuring People for Indecent Exposure. The case was dismissed with Not Guilty the verdict on both charges.



The guardians of our public morals have struck again! **OUTRAGE AT** REV. WM. JOHNSON APPOINTMENT

Several Bay Area Gaypersons are highly incensed at the appointment of the Reverend William Johnson, a homosexual, of the United Church of Christ, as the executive director of the Council on Religion and the Homosexual. Many anti-religious Gavpeople viewed it as an attempt by what is for practical purposes, a "paper-organization", the CRH, to try and get Gaypeople back into a "religious bag." Don Jackson, moderate leftist Gayradical, has denounced the Johnson appointment as an "attempt to give a transfusion to a corpse, the Christian Church, which CRH certainly represents." He said he felt that CRH had done nothing in the past few years of its existence to warrant all the attention some papers are giving it, with the appointment of Johnson. An un-ordained graduate theologian from

attempt by the liberal do-gooding paster of 1st Congregation, Reverend James Brown, another whiteman, to insert his rather reactionary conservative influence into the Gay life of San Francisco and the west coast at large, and to once more to try and enslave Gaypeople into a dead trip (meaning the

A rising star on the Gay spokesperson scene, Victor Korensky, said. "I have tried for the better part of a year to find out what CRH is doing except putting on seminars which cost \$30 and \$40 a session, and nobody knows into whose pocket the money goes, and as far as I have been able to determine, CRH has been a "pusher-front" for a couple of book writers." Other comments ran from "where are the black people in the leadership of CRH" and why is it always a "honky queen" in the spot light.

Perhaps the most harsh indictment of Johnson and CRH came from a person whom CRH has ignored and

tried to cover over, that according to many of his friends and critics as well, the Reverend Ray Broshears. Broshears said that, "To me the appointment of Johnson is just another Phyllis Lyon-trip, which means a Jim Foster-SIRdomite trip, and doesn't make the CRH the least bit meaningful. Johnson is a dingy-Jesus-Freak, and we have too damn many of them running around loose. His pretty-boy trippings and his puppetteer, anti-Drag queen minister "whitey Brown" over at Old First, just isn't going to amount to a hill of beans, but I may be wrong," On that point he was told by another GAY ALLIANCER standing by, Jason King, that Johnson will be a success as most Gays want to be told how much Jesus loves them and then wants the pat on the head type of tolerance Johnson will give them via Pastor Brown. Almost all had harsh words for Brown whose Church is on the border of the Tenderloin and has consistently refused to allow Gaypeople any use of his Church. At one time writer Nick Benton, a man whom Brown promised to have ordained into the same denomination as Johnson, with Benton having the same credentials as Johnson, perhaps better, had a Gay-trip goingin 1st Congregational, but because of Nick's radical politics, and championing the Street-people, Brown threw him and his group out of the Church.

Most all Gay Liberationists interviewed by this reporter have stated that they will boycott the CRH dinner and rubber stamping-elections to be held at 1st Unitarian. Pastor Brown is also seeking a post on the Board of Directors of CRH.

Well, of course these are but a few radical views and they are written so that Reverend Johnson should best know that not everybody loves him. Just wait until Nick Benton writes his article in the Barb! Wow!!!

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

## HELPING HANDS

THE HELPING HAND **COMMUNITY CENTER** 

What is the HELPING HAND community center? This Center serves the needs of the young and old alike. It is an information center and a drop-in center, which will serve the new arrivals to our City and on a regularly scheduled basis, programs for the elderly thru the Old Folks Defense League. The Orthodox Episcopal Church of God, Inc., is the sponsor of the Center, which will be operated and manned by the GAY ALLIANCE of San Francisco and "friends" of the ALLIANCE. We hope to create a bridge of understanding between all facits of societ.

Why have such a center? Many of the needs of the Gaypeoples as well as our elderly, are not met in San Francisco today. Since both the Gayperson and the elderly suffer the unfortunate experience of having no status in society except that of maybe a second-class citizen, the larger society more often than not, fails to take note of our unique needs and contributions. It is all too often humiliating for Gaypeoples to apply to straight agencies for aid or advice; all too often, we are treated contemptuously by various representatives of the City's community service agencies. For these reasons we have dedicated ourselves to the development of this HELPING HANDS Community Center. Gaypeoples, know and understand Gaypeoples needs better than anyone else, the same for the elderly peoples. It is only reasonable, therefore, that Gaypeoples, and the elderly-peoples should join together to establish an alternative agency and offer services to the neglected citizen of society. Gaypeoples knowing the meaning of loneliness can relate to the needs of the elderly and work to help them as well as ourselves.

Structure of the Center: HELPING HANDS is a professional and par-professional community services agency, and is established within the structure of the Orthodox Episcopal Church of God, and operated under the laws and regulations of the State of California governing all non-profit

organization, with all of the services of the Center provided free to both the elderly and Gaypeoples.

HELPING HANDS is managed by a Board of Advisors who together with the Professional Advisory Board are responsible for determining priorities and assuring fiscal and program account ability.

Inter-Organization action: The staff and facilities of HELPING HANDS are available to human service agencies operating within the nine Bay Area counties. Whenever possible, the services and facilities of the Center are available to other community organizations and groups on a regular basis or on an as-needed basis.

Operations: The HELPING HANDS is open daily. The staff and resources of the Center are available to the community to meet emergency needs either on a direct or a referral basis. Services will be maintained through a rotated schedule of volunteers trained for this purpose.

Program Development: All of the programs of the HELPING HANDS are directed toward the full development of the individual. The self-development program encompasses a variety of unique and innovative approaches toward individual awareness and group communication. Operated with supervision from Center staff, the program ranges from individual crisis interven tion and counselling, to open and closed rap groups, and as well, counselling for the parents of Gaypeoples, and for the children of the elderly.

Legal Services: Legal referral services are available through the Center, and as well, on designated evenings, there will be a member of our Legal Advisory Board, an attorney, present at the Center to rap with you about your legal concerns. Times will be posted in the Center.

Outreaches: The informational and educational activity of the HELPING HANDS Center will focus first upon the needs and desire of our local community. Efforts in this direction include personal contact, and cooperation with local organizations and groups, submission of news and informational materials to the media and active participation in intra-organizational coalitions. The Center serves as an informational and referral bureau for the entire communities of both Gaypeoples and augmented through the distribution of informational materials at local places of frequent gatherings.

Programs offered: Information Services, Referral Services, Drop-in Services, Drug Counselling-Gaypeoples, Community Meetings, New Arrivals Information, Rent & Landlord Mediator, Welfare Advocate-advisor, O.R. Bail Interviews-Gay, Message Center.

Groups using Center: GAY ALLIANCE of San Francisco, Old Folks Defense League, Downtown Drug Research Project, GAY VOTERS LEAGUE of San Francisco, Veterans -Military - Draft Counsellor, Prison Project/GA.

Funding the Center: The HELPING HANDS Community Center is totally dependent upon the financial donations of friends who have the vision to recognizes the great advance in human services made available to Gaypeoples and to the elderly through this needed agency. ### **GAY ALLIANCE JOINS** UNITED PRISONERS UNION

The GA has joined into a coalition the elderly. Center activities are further with the UNITED PRISONERS UNION, headed by Popeye Jackson. The GA informed the B.A.R. that they could no longer accept the role of being "tolerated". by the Prisoners Union located at 7th Avenue, who "controls" the Coordinating Council of Prison Organizations. In addition, the anti-Gay trippings of the Prisoners Committee for Humanity & Justice, a San Rafael based group which dominates CCPO as well, is more that GA/SF will no longer accept under any circumstances. SIR & MCC both, according to GA/SF accept their 2nd class status with these two sexist groups, but the GA/SF charges the ALLIANCE is taking equal status by any means necessary, and will not bow and scrape and beg for "acceptance" as do other groups.

The GAY ALLIANCE recently entered into a coalition with the DRUG RESEARCH PROJECT of which Rev. Ray Broshears is one of the more active participants. As well, the GA/SF has an alliance with the MCHR, Medical Committee for Human Rights.



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## **GAY AUSCHWITZ?**

NIXON BUILDS AUSCHWITZ FOR GAYS by Don Jackson

Irrefuteably authentic U.S. Government documents have come into my possession, proving beyond any doubt, that the Nixon Administration is constructing a concentration camp for

"deviants" at Butner, North Carolina.

The documents disclose Nixon's plans to round up sexual, cultural and social deviants, including homosexuals. Those rounded up will be sent of the facility where they will be "cured" of their deviance by antrotelemetry (anthro means human, telemetery means radio controled) Electronic devices will be surgically implanted in the bodies of the subjects. The devices include a microminiature radio transmitter to monitor the subject's conversations, a penile pleisemograph to record and transmit his erections, and a radio controlled shock device so that police can shock him anytime he engages in disapproved behavior or thoughts.

The coecive behavior modification facility is already under construction. It

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will be run by the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

A lengthy, detailed and illustrated story of exactly what Nixon has planned for you and me is in the January issue of VECTOR Magazine. Nixon says that the foremost objective of his second term is to stamp out permissiveness (that means sex, in case you don't already know). The fires of puritanism burn warmly in his heart. If you care to know what horrible things Nixon plans to do to you, you'd better go out and buy VECTOR before it's sold out.

During the 1930's German homosexuals went merrily on their way, drinking in bars, living their hedonic lives, despite the clear evidence that Hitler was planning to exterminate them. Hitler sent a million homosexuals to the ovens. Gays should now rise from their complacency and organize before it's too late. NEVER AGAIN.

Thomas M. Edwards, Gay conservatives and reactionaries, beware! Nazi homosexuals went to the ovens right along with the communist, liberal and conservative ones. Hitler didn't ask about their political views. They were queers, and that was reason enough. Nixon is not going to care how you voted either.

It is said that history repeats itself; every now and then, personalities appear on the stage of history that bear striking similarities to personages of the past. While writing the story about Nixon's new "cure" center, I couldn't help but compare Nixon and his administration with the administration of Adolph Hitler.

Try as I did, I couldn't think of any differences between Nixonism and

Nazism, other than the fact that the Nazis were more honest about their racism. Nixon, of course has not yet gone to the excesses of Hitler's second term of office, but then Nixon's second term has just began. The first four years of both regimes show a striking similarity.

The political and economic systems appear to be identical. Each was under the absolute control of a friendless recluse. Hitler made all decisions personally. Living alone, except for a female companion, he isolated himself from the press, his advisors and members of the Reichstag (Congress). Inaccessable, unapproachable, Hitler isolated himself from the world in heavily guarded, fortresslike Berchtesgarden

Hitler ignored the Reichstag by circumventing it, waging war without its consent, and refusing to implement the programs voted by the representatives of the people. He was elected to his first term by a thin plurality, and re-elected to a second term by a large majority, which the Fuehrer claimed was a mandate from the people to wage war on smaller nations, to suppress the press in the name of national security, to suspend civil liberties in the name of alw and order. He mocked justice by packing the courts with authoritarian judges. He incessently denounced permissiveness and moral decay. He conducted a campaign to close cabarets, theaters and bars featuring titillating

Hitler climbed to political power as an anti-Communist crusader. Later, he softened his anti-Communist line and became the new Hitler. Just before his re-election, he went to Moscow to make his peace with communist leaders. He said that peace was just around the corner, at the end of the tunnel or something like that. The peace overtures were just a charade, a typical Hitler trick. There was really only one Hitler a hateful, bigotedreactionary. The peace trick was just an artifice to get re-elected. After the election, he reverted to the old Hitler, because he knew he was no longer accountable to the voters.

Hitler said that a tiny, impoverished agricultural country, not a tenth his size, was getting ready to attack. If we don't go to war and fight them in their homeland, Hitler said, we'll have to fight them here. The militarists, anxious for more power, jumped on the Hitler band wagon. So did the industrialists and businessmen, who hoped to make huge profits from war goods.

Hitler constructed the extermination camps in secret. There were a few ominous rumors, but they could not be confirmed.

Shortly after Hitler began his second term, he prohibited the publication of news or opinion articles that were unfavorable to him. He habitually lied to his own people. When caught in a bold faced lie, his raction was to repeat the lie, or tell a bigger lie.

Hitler's political power was in the lower middle class (small business owners, skilled workers and employees of large corporations). He was able to politically exploit the ignorance, prejudices, taboos, bigotry and dogmatism of this uneducated and supersticious class. He heaped verbal abuse on the upper middle class (the educated class - writers, reporters, teachers, social workers, bureaucrates, professors and the like). Hitler described the educated class as "intellectual snobs". His technique was divide and conquer, and he found class differences in values the ideal place to practice this technique.

Take the above seven paragraphs, change the name Hitler to Nixon, Berchtesgarden to San Clemente and they are equally accurate.

But the similarities don't end here. Hitler convinced the Germans that they were exploited by Jewish shop keepers, landlords and lenders. Nixon has convinced middle America it is being robbed by the poor who are a bunch of lazy bums living off the hard earned dollars of workers. The poor are Nixon's Jews. Both Fuehrers believed that all problems could be solved by the use of force. Hitler thought he could win the war by bombing the bejesus out of the British. Coventry, Birmingham and other cities in the industrial heartland of England were wiped off the face of the earth with Nazi bombs. Hospitals were bombed. Apartment blocks were bombed. Hundreds of thousands of civilians - men, women and children were killed in their homes or where they worked. It didn't work. It only increased the determination of Britain

to fight on. One of Nixon's close associates followed Nixon's advice. Former police chief and now Mayor of Philadelphia Philip Rizzo was told by Nixon that the way to control crime was to increase the number of police, and to implement repressive policing. Rizzo tripled the size of Philadelphia's police force. The crime rate immediately increased by 80%, the largest increase ever reported in a 3 year period.

Nixon, like Hitler, has been able to make political profit out of a class struggle, in both instances the natural antagonisms between the upper middle class and the lower middle class.

Here's a rundown of the ideological differences.

An educated, logical man might say "Astronomy, geometry and world travelers prove the world is round. The fundamentalist dogmatic answer is "The Bible is the Word of God." The Bible says the world is flat and has four corners. Who are you going to believe, men or God?"

Except for a few primitive religious sects, most of the dogmas have now been secularized. But there are still fervently believed despite the fact that they have been time and again disproven. The dogma is considered an absolute truth; disproofs, logic and facts that conflict with the dogma are simply disregarded.

Some of the more idiotic dogmas are "ALL problems can be solved by the use of force — war, more police, long prison terms, capital punishment, etc."

(Or as Hitler put it "Might makes right.") "Crime and poverty are the result of personaltiy defects." "The rich are wealthy because they are so good, thrifty and hardworking." "The poor are poor because they are sinful, lazy, promiscuous or lushes." "Taxes are high because of welfare." "Civilization will collapse if sex is not repressed."

The logical humanist would answer "Force cannot solve any problem. Crime and poverty are the result of defects and injustices in the socio-economic system. The rich are wealthy because they are dishonest or cheated someone, overcharged their customers, underpaid their employees, gouged their tenants, bribed government officials or lied on their tax returns. The poor are poor because they have been

unjustly treated by society, often because of their race or sexual orientation, cheated out of their share of the good life by the greedy. The working man's taxes are high because 70% of their tax dollar goes to pay for war, and because the wealthy don't pay their share of the taxes (often as not the rich don't even file income tax returns because they have managed to have loopholes created to exempt them from income taxes). Sex is a delightful entertainment that never hurt anybody."

In Democracies, the upper middle class has always been the ruling class, except during the Hitlerzeit and the Nixon Administration. Our impotent Congress is still dominated by upper middle class values, but Nixon, as Hitler, caters to the dogmatism of the lower middle class. Even the Russian, Chinese, Cuban and French revolutions were firmly in control of upper middle class people. Practically all revolutions are attempts by the upper middle class to overthrow a decadent upper class.

Throughout history, the upper middle class has had the poor as its class ally, while the wealthy line up with the

lower middle class - and for good reason, lower middle class values perpetuate the concentration of wealth in the hands of a few.

The university is an upper middle class preserve. The campus is where the upper middle class young are sent to be indoctrinated in the class values by senior members of their class. That's why most movements for change start on the campus.

The reaction to current events demonstrate the conflict in values. Take these headlines "Nixon Bombs Hanoi." The humanistic upper middle class member, who thinks that all men are brothers and international boundaries only artificial, man made lines, reacts by thinking "How awful of Nixon bombing all those people in their own homes. He even even bombed helpless sick people in hospitals. It's an atrocity." The nationalistic lower middle classes things: "Hurray. The only good Vietnamese is a dead Vietnamese. Nixon should kill all those slant eyed little yellow bastards."

Two other current headlines read: "Nixon discontinues school milk program" and "Nixon discontinues \$20 million program to feed starving infants." The humanist thinks: "Even the most primative societies see that all of their members are fed before they do anything else. Nixon has been trying to starve the poor for a long time, but cutting off the milk for little children, and cuasing helpless infants to suffer permanent brain damage and mental retardation to save a measly \$20 million is too much. It's cruel and inhumane. Why we-can't even buy a landing gear for a 60 billion dollar B-52 for \$20 million, and Nixon drops B-52's on Hanoi every day. The dogmatist thinks:

"Good, I'm tired of supporting these lazy bums. Their parents should go out and get jobs, then they wouldn't starve."

The fact that the hungry children are often orphans or their parents disabled or unable to find jobs because the number of unemployed exceeds the number of jobs that exist, are simply disregarded because they conflict with the dogmas that poverty is the result of sin and that American society is perfect.

The basic message to Gays from all this is: Nixon has no moral qualms about napalming children, bombing people in their homes or in hospital beds, starving American babies, depriving little children of milk or ruthlessly supressing the newspapers and civil rights. Whatever makes anyone think this awful man would have even the slightest moral reservations about atrocities against homosexuals? Especially in view of undenyable evidence, that such atrocious plans have been made, and millions of dollars spent ot implement them.

The upcoming SIR Election is considered by many as one of the most important events of the year. It will give the membership a chance to keep the organization in the same crucial state or put it back in the hands of the membership. As you are aware, SIR has been a target of many leaders of our community this past year. Everyone seems to ask questions and receive no satisfying answers.

Maybe SIR has bitten off more than they can chew. Every time any other organization comes up with an idea, SIR rushes to put it into effect. It's like being a "Jack of all trades, master of none." Beardemphl and I have seldom agreed on any one subject (the necessity for the closing of the SHED being one of the few areas in which we concur) coupled with the fact that we have a healthy respect for each other's integrity makes me, I feel, uniquely qualified to respond to that which I consider the zenith of poor taste and the nadir of responsible political advertising, to wit: the "Open Letter" criticizing Bill's column of 27 Dec. 72 and signed, inter alia, by Dewey Harrington and Rick Falconer.

First, I must point out that if any persons or institutions have played a devisive role within the Gay community Mr. Harrington and Mr. Falconer together with their questionable enterprise, take second place to no one. From my own personal experience, and going as far back as to the tragic days preceeding Captain Philip G. Kiely's death when Mr. Harrington threatened me in his office with the fact that he intended to take a "death-bed deposition" from the Captain in order that he could keep his dance license (I told him if he tried it would be over my dead body, as I was one of very few people permitted to be with the Captain during the final stages of his illness) I can relate without fear of contradictiion, that no more unprincipled person exists than Wm. Dewey Harrington. Being cognizant of the laws of libel I am equally aware of the legal axiom that "truth is a compleate defense." This man has the supreme gall to sign his name to an ad which in its closing statements uses the word "responsible." Hells bells, Harrington doesn't even know the definition of the word and I have been supremely greatful that he and his left-of-center attorney have subpoened me into court in order that I can give sworn testimony as to the perfidious nature of this sub-culture character.

Enough of Dewey Harrington - let us turn to Bill Beardemphl. True, he goes off half-cocked (no pun intended) and at times his reasoning and logic (like all liberals) is fuzzy and unclear. In fact I would pay little or no attention to the man, his rantings and ravings except for one reason: he is a compleately honest person whose sincerety and integrity are without peer. proclaim his homosexuality.

Hell, no, I don't agree with Bill, but damn it all he has more integrity in his little finger, and has done more for the Gay movement in general than have Bill Plath, Dewey Harrington, Jim Foster, Emperor Marcus, Rick Falconer, Hal Call, Duke Smith and George Coffman all put together.

Finally this thought comes to mind, and if you see fit to print this, I trust your readers will consider it: I would rather cross swords with Bill Beardemphl knowing that he states his position in forthright terms than I would align myself with those whose actions proclaim them to be the inheritors of the mantle of Judas Iscariot.

## Commentary

## William E. Beardemphi Comments Here is a project that every

responsible and constructive Gay person can support.

There is being circulated by the Citizens Committee for Representative Government, a petition that will place on the ballot in June of this year an initiative that would require the election of San Francisco Supervisors by districts. Needed are 40,000 valid signatures of registered voters to accomplish this task, on the initiative The city has been divided by a computerized population standard from the 1970 census into 11 districts. Supervisorial candidates will be required to live in the district that they represent. Many politicans of the present San Francisco establishment are opposing this measure because it will

mean that the powers that be will no longer be able to control through financing and pressure the Board of Supervisors.

In the 1971 Supervisorial election Mendelsohn spent \$99,371.65; Pelosi spent \$86,429.00; Francois spent \$67,620.02, and so on down the line of the winning candidates.

As presently constituted, no one can get elected as Supervisor without vast funds. Our current city wide method of electing supervisors means that there is a very small group of persons, "a Nob Hill Cabinet," representing powerful moneyed and downtown interests controlling who is elected through campaign funding.





### **Proposed New City Districts**

The equation is simple – the most money equals the most votes.

This means that we now have a Board of Supervisors whose first loyalty is to well-organized, monied pressure

Monied special interests win out time after time over the needs of our neighborhoods in the votes of the Board of Supervisors, like the Urban Design high rise ordinance; or the neighborhood needs from our Muni system; or District Police Stations; or the Redevelopment fiasco; or Consumer Protection; or so many, many other pressing needs of the individual citizen of San Francisco.

San Francisco's City Government is totally unresponsive and aloof to the needs of the people. Yet, taxes go up and up for the average person.

In November 1972, San Franciscans voted two to one for some change of the way Supervisors are elected. Our present Bard of Supervisors sabotaged the will of the people by purposely placing on the ballot a cumbersome five part policy statement that was not legally binding on them.

If San Francisco is to be governed by the people of San Francisco, then we must establish a sensible method of electing Supervisors by neighborhood districts.

ELEVEN DISTRICT SUPERVISORS WILL MEAN that if a citizen needs something, he has a Supervisor he can go to and that Supervisor must act if he wants to get that important neighborhood vote in the next election.

ELEVEN DISTRICT SUPERVISORS WILL MEAN that campaign expenses can be cut to 1/11th of present costs and good candidates can be elected without being indebted to special monied interests.

ELEVEN DISTRICT SUPERVISORS WILL MEAN that our neighborhood groups will have a receptive audience at City Hall and will no longer be bypassed for the downtown privileged few.

BUT MOST IMPORTANTLY TO GAY VOTERS IS THAT ELEVEN DISTRICT SUPERVISORS WILL MEAN that in those neighborhoods that Gay voters are concentrated, we can control the election to insure that there will be Gay persons elected to the Board of Supervisors.

We have seen the Gay community suffer too long from our political heterosexual friends who are listening to the traitors within our community. If we are to bring representative government to San Francisco, then we must support this proposed charter amendment to elect Supervisors by neighborhood districts. For questions, volunteer work, or to pick up petitions you can contact me, at the B.A.R. office or at 392-1270 during the day. Please leave a message if I am not in at the time you call.

Speaking of responsible Gay persons, I would like to say that I did read the ad that certain persons, a small number indeed, took out against me in the last B.A.R. I wish to thank them for spelling my name correctly because that was the only thing about the ad that was correct in my opinion. It has started a lot of persons in the Gay Community to ask questions never asked before of the signers. I want to thank the signers for pointing a finger at themselves, something that I have NOT had the temerity to do.

A checking of the facts by all concerned will be a revelation, I feel.



There's a new dinner-theatre in Oakland (ah, exotic Oakland) called "Cabbages & Kings." In the grand tradition of those old M.G.M. plots, it is

a warehouse that was sitting empty, has been converted into a pleasant dining room that seats 200 comfortably, and

some enterprising youngsters (and not-quite-youngsters) have gotten together to present Broadway plays and musicals not seen before locally. Sound like a scenario for an old Mickey Rooney - Judy Garland musical?

become world-famous comedians, it is their development that creates the interest. At the very end of the show, when Julie Marx paints on a moustache, flicks a cigar and strides across the stage in a crouch, rolling his eyes wildly, the audience applauds madly at the emergence of Groucho. The delight of the evening is Sam Taff's Groucho. Bit by bit the famous trademarks emerge, always with the snappy retort and lifted

eyebrows, and when Mr. Taff and Julie Knox (Oakland's answer to Margaret Dumont) launch into a wild tango to "You Remind Me of You," you have one highly memorable moment. One moment that does not work as well as it should is Robert Brothers big number "Mama A Rainbow." It would be much more effective without all the gestures; sometimes just standing still and singing can be more poignant that all the staging in the the world. Mr. Brothers is very likeable as Harpo, although the zany quality of Harpo is missing. He capably conveys the shy misfit of the family, but never do we see the spontaneous whimsey that would prompt Harpo to suddenly extend his knee to E.F. Albee instead of his hand. (Note: Mr. Brothers is a recent replacement in the role, so perhaps it will come with additional performances.) Dennis Walsh, as Chico, has a strong tenor voice and an impish quality, though he tends to over-react. Poor Fred Baily is stuck with the thoroughly ungratifying role of Zeppo (Gummo's part must have been a pip!!). He is required to do little more than fill space and lend an occasional voice, but try as he may, he comes across wooden because the authors have written Zeppo as one of the great bores of the

American theatre. Steve Mengel has the same problem as their father, Sam Marx, the most henpecked husband since Dagwood Bumstead, but Mr. Mengel gets his licks in as E.F. Albee to compensate.

On Broadway, the role of Minnie Marx was played by Shelley Winters, a very dynamic, brassy actress. Anne Haslett lacks the toughness and conniving shrewdness essential to the demonic Jewish mother, so that Minnie Marx comes off as a very pleasant concerned mother, very warm and lovable, and her boys seem just a trifle ungrateful for her natural concern. It throws the perspective off, because we gather that Minnie was the epitome of the pushy stage mother, not unlike Mama Rose in "Gypsy," so Miss Haslett needs to be less likeable and more demanding. Less violins, more brass!! I liked Miss Haslett immensely; I just don't think I should have.

I must pause here and explain, "Minnie's Boys" is performed only on weekends (Fri. and Sat. evenings, Sun. brunch matinee) and is in the spirit of community theatre, so you cannot fairly compare this production to something you would see at the Curran. The key word for the evening is enthusiasm! All the performers work


with such infectous high spirits you cannot help but be entertained. Two very pretty young ladies, Jan Russell and Nola Lee Smith, bubble constantly in a variety of small roles, Curtis Simpson does the drag delight, "Underneath It All," absolutely deadpan, making it all the more hilarious, George Felker III has staged it at a hell - bent - for - leather pace and it all adds up to an enjoyable evening. "Minnie's Boys" is not a great show and I can readily understand why it did not last on Broadway, but it is definitely worth seeing. (And if a certain local drag diva is looking for a new vehicle, as is rumored, he should rush to CABBAGES & KINGS immediately.)

For the sum total of \$7.50, you get both a very good dinner and a fun musical, energetically performed by a talented and attractive cast. I think that's a bargain in anybody's book. So, get your passport out and visit British East Oakland soon!! (Call 451-1644 for reservations.)



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



at the "Bijou", a mythical walk-u<sub>1</sub> theatre. From here on in it becomes a phantasmagorical journey of mirrors, bizzare creations of sounds and sights that end in an all-male orgy. Harrison emerges from all this with a very satisfied, happy smile.

The film is beautifully photographed and contains many filmic effects that are not usually seen in films of this type, including some very interesting use of split screen.

Poole seems to have an aversion to dialogue of any type, and therefore everything is conveyed thru music and sounds. It is to his credit that this works much better in this film than the almost too lyrical "Sand" film. Poole avoids using the conventional "pretty boy" types and opts for more interesting and different types of men. Besides Harrison, the array of men in the orgy sequence should provide someone for anyone's taste.

This is a film that should go over well with the Gay "heads" who might like this type of film. It's a film that probably would be "far out" if under the influence of something that makes one, shall we say, "tiddly." I might even go so far as to call it the "Space Odyssey" of fuck films. So, luvs, if your cup of tea includes meat, don't miss out on this prime example of hard-core Gay "art."

I must comment on the audience at the theatre also: it was all very outrageous and the management is to be commended for running such a "tasteful" auditorium.

Until next issue, when I wander back to the more conventional world of film... take care and keep smiling (if Bill Harrison can smile, so can you)... Lotsa you-know-what!


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

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C.K.W.: Well, I suppose if there is any hanky panky going around the law will take its course.

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
