THE SECOND ANNUAL GREAT RACE

The crowd started gathering at City Hall at 1 PM for the big event of the year, the Tricycle Race. Well over a thousand were there by 2 PM, the starting time. By the looks of the costumes, many of the entries must have stayed up all night preparing for the big event. Naomi and Luscious Lorelei, riding on top of an unofficial Red Cross station wagon, were the un-Registered Nurses for the day. When they arrived at City Hall, cameras were flashing from at least 50 photographers.

Just minutes before Charlotte of THE MINT sounded her starting pistol, two of San Francisco's bewildered young police officers approached the official photographer and inquired what was going on. The photographer replied that nothing was going on as far as he could see, to which the officer replied, "When

there are between 750 and 1000 people gathered here in the Civic Center Plaza, something must be going on."

When the re-enforcements arrived in a squad car at City Hall at the request of the bewildered police officers, the Civic Center Plaza was practically deserted and another peaceful, fun-filled-Gay-event was off and running, making their obligatory pit stops at bars enroute to the finish line.

Of course, some breakdowns occurred in the first block. Someone should tell Bette Bonko she is just too heavy for a mini-trike. All along the route there were tricycle tires, handlebars and other assorted tricycle parts. Luscious Lorelei and Naomi were explaining to the crowd watching what it was, the Second Annual Tricycle Race for Guide Dogs for the Blind. Except for a few bruises, everything went fine. The nurses spent most of their time offering help to almost everyone in pants.

At the finish line, over 1000 people were waiting to see the big finish. The

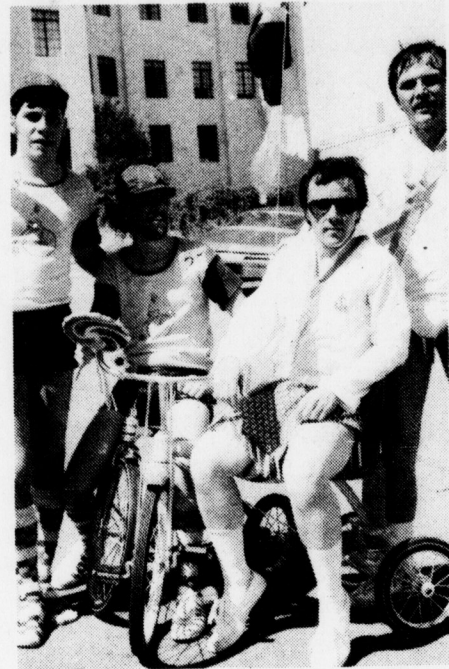
crowd was so big that the trolley buses could not get by, and a special truck was sent out to push the buses by the mob. Conviviality reigned throughout as the crowd surged through THE MINT (the finish line) to pick up their spirits and cheer the winners in, some of whom were riding, some crawling and some who came in on two pedals and a lot of guts (the rest of the bike demolished somewhere along the way). Certainly, all entrants are to be commended on their enthusiasm, if not their pedalling ability.

Prizes were offered for the best costumed entries and the most elaborate and amusing tricycles. Empress Maxine's court took first place in costume and second place in tricycle decoration. PIER 54 won third prize in a matching "his & hers" blue and white yacht club ensemble as they passed out pennants for PIER 54.

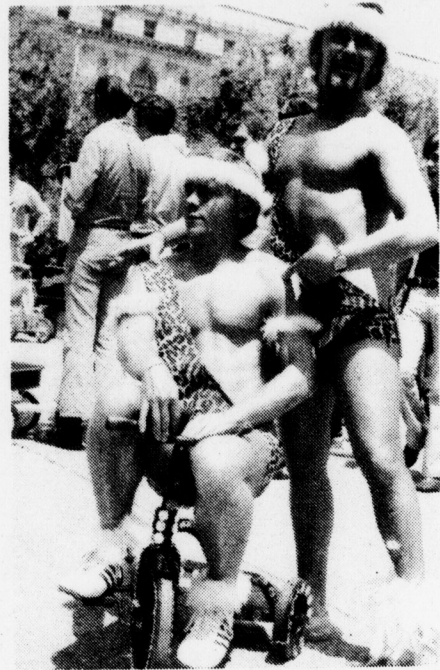

GAY FREEDOM WEEK JUNE 17 THROUGH 24, 1973

On one day of the year all Gay persons should come together with mutual respect for our differences and with an open pride in our homosexuality.

Set aside the third week of June 1973 for joining the largest and best Gay celebration that has ever been put together. A responsible GAY FREEDOM DAY COMMITTEE is sponsoring a totally new concept in happenings that will help put out a true image of homosexuality.

Every spectrum of the local homosexual community is represented by the fine men and women that compose the committee's volunteer workers on this event that, it is hoped, will become an annual coming together of all Gay persons of good will.

Events are scheduled nightly during this most important Gay Week in San Francisco.

On Sunday—June 17, 12 noon to 6 PM, East Bay Gay Festival at Lake Merritt Park, Oakland.

At 7 PM Interfaith Religious Services at MCC, 1074 Guerrero, S.F.

Monday, June 18, Open House at Gay Peoples Union at Stanford 8 PM at the Club House Old Union Building. At 11 PM KPFA-FM radio broadcast on Parade.

Tuesday, June 19 at 8 PM Council of Organizations Meeting at S.I.R., 84 Sixth Street.

Wednesday, June 20, 8 PM an art exhibit and show at EMMAUS HOUSE, 618 Shrader

Thursday, June 21, 8 PM Rap and discussion sponsored by Chutzpah-Jewish Gays at Jewish Community Center, 3200 California St., S.F.

Friday, June 22, 8 PM, Gay Video show sponsored by Queer Blue Light at S.I.R., 83 Sixth St., S.F.

The highlight of these events will be the GAY FREEDOM DAY DANCE on June 23, 8 PM at California Hall. Tickets are available at various Gay bars or from members of the Parade Committee at \$1.50 advance and \$2.00 at the door. The dance features many rock groups including special cameo appearances by our wild entertainers of S.F.

The culmination of the entire week takes place on Sunday afternoon on June 24th beginning with the GAY FREEDOM DAY PARADE OF '73. All peoples are invited to participate. The formation of the parade will be at Post Street between Montgomery and Sansome Streets at 1 PM. The Parade route goes up Post Street to Larkin and north to Sacramento Streets to Lafayette Park. The Parade will end in a smash old-time picnic at Marx Meadows in Golden Gate Park.

Transportation to the picnic will be provided for marchers from Lafayette Park to Marx Meadows.

Gay bar or business.

The Parade/Festival/Picnic will of course, also have many persons that will just wish to join hands and march openly together reaffirming the pride and personhood of just being and being homosexual.

THE GABBY DIAMOND AWARDS

The beautiful Foothill College Theatre, in Los Altos, will be the site of the first annual "Gabby Diamond Awards Show" named after Gabrielle the second Grande Czarina of the Peninsula.

The spectacular event will be held on Sunday evening June 3rd. with a starting time of 7 PM. Fabulous production numbers and specialty acts will be interlaced with the awards presentations.

Over two hundred and fifty nominees will await results, by computer, to learn if they have won one of the beautifully designed "Gabbies" of which there are a total of forty two. The "Gabbies" were designed by a New York jeweler and each contains a beautifully mounted genuine diamond. The diamond is set in a bronze medallion which may be removed and worn as a necklace or bracelet.

The Academy of the Gabby Diamond Awards is headed up by "Ernest" popular high chief of the Polynesian Royal Court of the Peninsula.

This will be the second show by the Peninsula Gay Community to be held at the 1000 seat Foothill College Theatre. Every conceivable visual and audio advancement can be found in the technical set up of the theatre and the performer never had it so good when he or she appears on that stage.

Gabrielle and three other set designers promise an explosion of grandeur as the curtain goes up on Sunday night. Ms. Barbara Moore, of the SAVOY, The Peninsula Woman of the Year, will be co-master of ceremonies along with John Leavitt, last year's Man of the Year.

Award Presentations will be made by Peninsula business owners and various members of the Peninsula Royal Courts and other local personalities. This event is open to all who wish to attend. Tickets are on sale in all Peninsula bars and at the Box Office on Sunday Night. Seats are non reserved and admission is \$3.50. See the full page ad elsewhere in this edition for further details.

A MELODIC-BUT LANGUID, GIGI

Often times a hit Broadway musical finds its way to the screen. Some are successes and others are not. It is a rare event, however, when an outstanding Academy Award winning musical, originally created for the screen, is adapted for the stage. "GiGi," now at the Curran, is such a vehicle and, unfortunately, has not made the transition very well. It's hard to pin point where the problems exist. The production cannot be tagged as a turkey by any stretch of the imagination, but, it's not a winner either. "GiGi" is a pleasant show musically and the performers are adequate in the roles. In short, "GiGi," will probably never set box office records in New York if it ever gets that far.

Lerner and Loewe, who created the original screen version, handled the script, music and lyrics for the stage production. They added new songs, but with one exception missed their target as far as providing material of the calibre of the original score. The dialogue has its moments but generally fails to hold your interest. More rewriting may help.

The cast, for the most part is passable, with Alfred Drake (Honore) and Agnes Moorehead (Aunt Alicia) providing the production's better moments. Daniel Massey (Gaston) as the bonvivant about Paris is the essence of the character and Maria Karnilova as Mamita is delightful. The production introduces Terese Stevens as Gigi but, unfortunately, she is it's weakest character. The program notes say that Miss Stevens is the product of a long search and also that she celebrated her 20th birthday during rehearsals. This is all very well and good if you can look and act the role of a 16 year old. Whether due to inexperience or bad direction Miss Stevens does not capture her character. She looks 25 and performs like a veteran of far more advanced years. She is simply not convincing as a 16 year old girl.

In the technical field, the production was directed by Joseph Hardy, who managed to move his performers on and off stage with ease. Onna White created the unexciting choreography, Oliver Smith the eye pleasing sets and Oliver Messel the colorful 1900's costumes.

Although "GiGi" is, in a manner of speaking, in out-of-town previews, it is doubtful this production has the potential of becoming a Broadway hit. The production will remain in San Francisco until June 30 at the Curran Theatre.

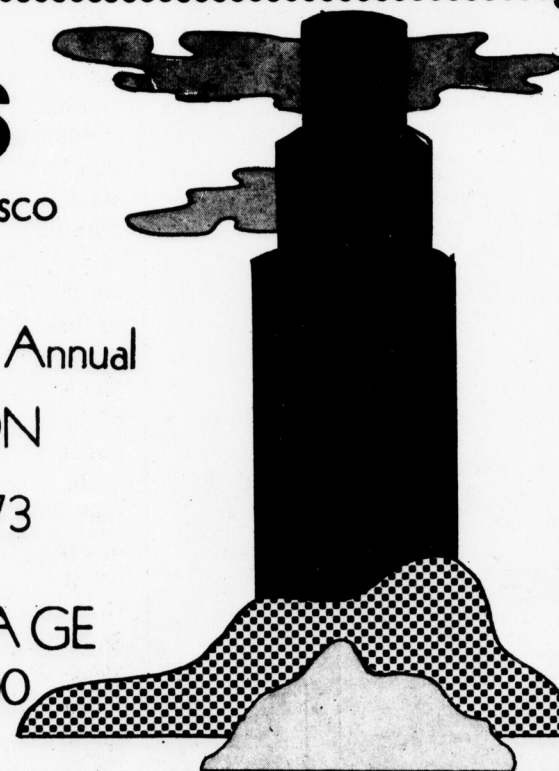

ON THE PROWL

The ink was no sooner dry on the review of the show at JACKIE D'S than Vicki Starr and Skip Gillmon walked out. Lori Shannon has joined the cast of

JACKIE D'S, reuniting the former HIGHLIGHTERS. Needless to say, the Andrew Sisters are coming out of retirement, plus several new numbers and a couple of old biggies. Pepper Dale has also joined the show as their new male dancer, so drop in soon and catch the all-new production show. Show plays Wed. thru Sat. nights at 10 and 12, with no door charge and moderate drink prices.

Lavern Cummings sailed into 1001 NIGHTS last Monday, May 28th, with virtually no advance publicity, and still managed to draw a goodly crowd. Backed by the regular FINOCCHIO orchestra, which never sounded better, Mr. Cummings presented a smooth relaxed show with his accustomed style and ease. However, two things bothered me. Working alone for 45 minutes, Mr. Cummings definitely needs some patter between numbers, if nothing more than an intro and a little repartee with the audience. The lack of patter gives a coldness to the show that the Cummings personality belies. And a stronger opening would grab the audience immediately; good example is the exciting bongo

arrangement on "This Dream" — moved into an opening spot, it would rivet attention right from the start, rather than building slowly. There are flashes of humor throughout show that need to be developed; they probably wouldn't work in that big room on Broadway, but they're marvelous in an intimate atmosphere. The dramatic ballads remain the Cummings forte and always garner ovations, and the voice cannot be faulted. The show just needs some re-structuring,, which should not be difficult for someone of Lavern Cummings' abilities.



Singer/impressionist Jim Bailey will make his Venetian Room debut May 31st thru June 10th in the posh Fairmont Hotel. Mr. Bailey returns to San Francisco following his recent triumphs at the Copacabana in New York and the Dorothy Chandler Pavillion in L.A. He will play nightly except Monday at 9:30 and 12. Tommy Almon taking a short vacation from THE FROLIC ROOM show, so "Black and Beautiful" Carol Lynn headlines currently, along with the return engagement of the "Bubbly Blonde of Bashful Bend" Ty Linstrom, the bare bods of Chuck, Terry and the outrageous David, and guest star Chico Starr, last seen on Broadway at the EL CID.

"Little Mary Sunshine" will NOT open at GOLD STREET. AAhhhh!

I am amused and amazed at the attitude of certain readers that if a show is Gay, it has to be good. Since when does sexual preference have anything to do with talent? The downfall of many a performer has been well-meaning "friends" who "just love everything" and never offer an honest opinion. That's not friendship, that's just lack of discrimination!!



For all you avid devotees of horror films, run, do not walk, to the Fox Warfield and see "Theater of Blood!" This superb tongue-in-cheek horror epic will undoubtedly go down in cinema history as a classic, in the great tradition of "House of Wax," "King Kong," "Baby Jane" and "The Glass Bottom Boat" (well, wasn't that a horror?).

Vincent Price finally gets to pull out all the stops as Edward Lionheart, a great (by his definition) Shakespearean actor who is denied the ultimate award of Best Actor of the Year by the nine London critics. He extracts his revenge by murdering each critic in a fiendish reenactment of a famous death scene from nine Shakespearean plays (Ottello's jealousy, Duke of Gloucester's blindness, Joan of Arc burning, etc.). Mr. Price has stated that this is his favorite film, and small wonder. What actor wouldn't thrill to the chance to play nine great Shakespearean roles in one film and murder the critics at the same time?! Mr. Price chews all the scenery in sight and offers a wide variety of cameo gems,

ranging from a masseuse to French chef to a screaming nelly hairdresser (naturally named Butch). He is ably abetted throughout by Diana Rigg, as his daughter. Miss Rigg's fame as a male impersonator is assured with this film. Ian Hendry plays the one critic who tries to fight back, while eight of England's top character actors gleefully romp as the "guest victims," as they are billed. The murders range from the subtly diabolic (Jack Hawkins) to the truly gruesome

(the Merchant of Venice sequence) and this is not a film for the nervous or faint - at - the -sight - of - blood (of which there is oceans). Each murder is totally different from the previous, the shocks come fast and steadily, and there is a marvelous humor that pervades the entire script, so you cannot help laughing while recoiling. The murder of the queen of England, Robert Morley, has got to be the most repulsive horror sequence ever

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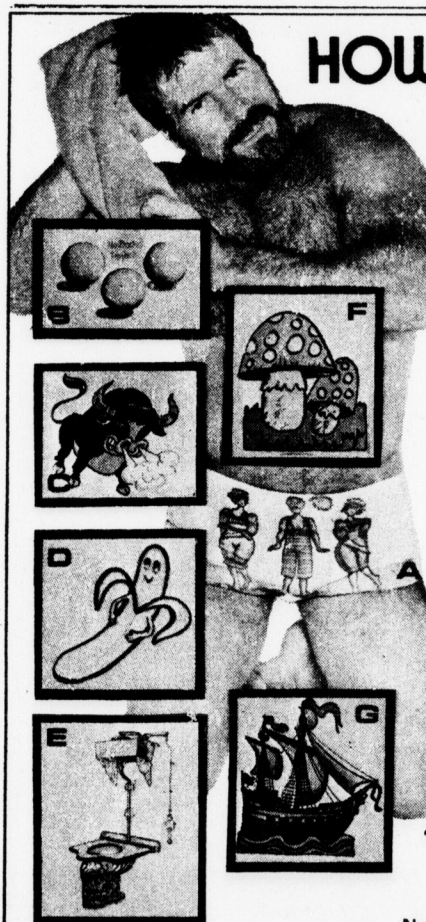


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MAJOR POLICE CHANGES COMING

In a public television broadcast, S.F. Chief of Police Don Scott announced his new captains for the city's police districts.

Of concern to this community is the appointment of Captain Edward J. Laherty Jr. to replace Captain Creedon of the Mission Station (unfortunately, Creedon moves up to take over the City Prison at the Hall of In Justice).

No sooner had the order reached the boondocks, which it affected, than 94 officers at the Mission Station signed requests for transfers to "any other duty" in the department.

Reporters and television cameramen besieged officers of the Police Officers Association for comment, and the only comment in response was that the requests will be reviewed. However, when Chief Scott was besieged by the newsmedia, his only comment was "No comment." This is understandable as this is probably one of the hottest potatoes that has been served him from City Hall.

New Mission-Castro Captain is a gung-ho law and order cop, an arch conservative, and he is generally believed by some to be unsympathetic to minorities and their life-styles.

Inasmuch as there has been a wholesale request for transfer out of his jurisdiction, it will be interesting to observe the type of cop that he will assign to the Castro Area. Until a rapport has been established between the Gay community and this new Commander-in-Chief, it would behoove bars, stores and businesses in the Mission District to be on guard and live within the letter of the law.

On the other hand, those within the Northern station will find in Captain Flynn a professional officer of the highest esteem, reasonable and fair in administering his domain.

KPFA PROGRAM TO DEAL WITH RELIGION AND GAY PEOPLE

"Aspects of Gay Life," the monthly KPFA program dealing with Gay issues, will tackle the age-old problem of oppression of Gays by Western religions in a program to be broadcast on Monday, June 11 at 10 PM. KPFA is located at 94.1 FM. Misinterpretations of St. Paul's strictures against homosexuality and of

Sodom and Gomorrah are two of the issues explained in the program by the Reverend William Johnson. Mr. Johnson is a minister of the United Church of Christ, and his ordination a year ago as an upfront Gay caused world-wide publicity. Since that time, he has had only two invitations to give guest sermons. He was appointed Executive Director of the San Francisco-based Council on Religion and the Homosexual in January of this year and he also talks of his plans for that organization.

Other new directions that are explored in the program include the formation of Gay groups within established religions, such as Dignity, a Gay Catholic group. The local mission of Dignity was formed just five months ago and already had over 80 members attending their monthly meetings. In the program a number of members of Dignity are heard discussing the meaning of the group in their own lives, as well as some of the tragedies that have been caused in the past by the church's teaching that homosexuality is a mortal sin.

The Reverend James Sandmire, pastor of the METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH in San Francisco, is heard explaining the development of that church, which was formed specifically to minister to Gay people just over four years ago. He tells how it has grown so rapidly that there are now branches in over 40 U.S. cities, and it is even now becoming international. Mr. Sandmire believes that the development of MCC may well lead to a rebirth of the true meaning of the Christian religion.

Also heard in the program are people from Quaker and Jewish Gay groups, and former Catholic priest Tom Fry, a member of Dignity who conducts his own Gay ministry. Producer of the program for KPFA is Alan Farley, who is also a member of the Gay men's radio collective that is involved in the production of "Gay Talk," a new program to be heard on KPFA on alternate Monday nights, beginning on June 4th.

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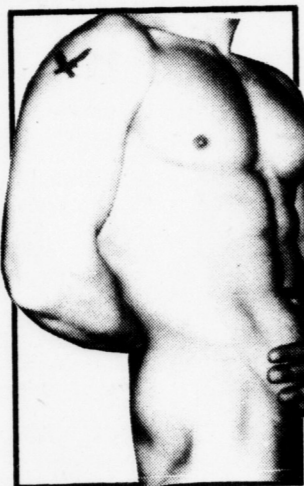

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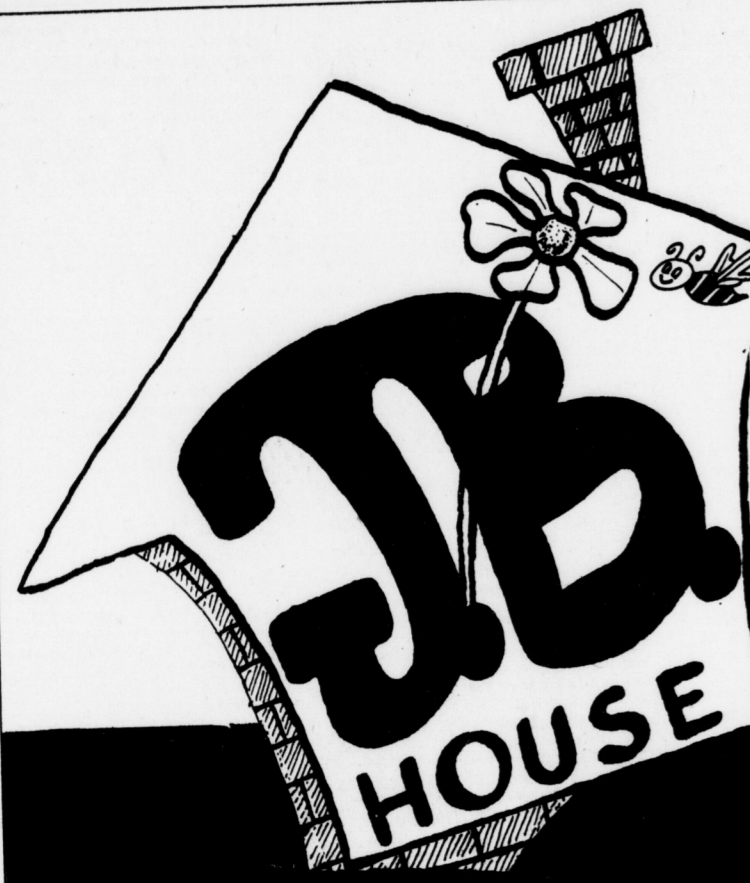
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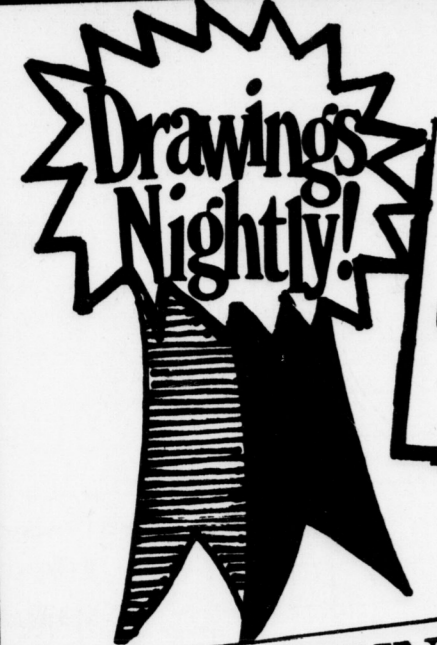

The Gay Community of San Francisco will have a week of celebration culminating in a spectacular Gay Parade on Sunday June 24th, carving its way straight through the downtown area of San Francisco. The Gay Freedom Day Committee announces that as to date organizational participation is 32 from all over the West Coast and Canada, as well as 17 floats, 4 bands, and 19 neighborhood groups. It is estimated that over 30,000 persons will participate in the parade, as directly or as spectators. Among the organizations participating will be SOCIETY FOR INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS, TAVERN GUILD OF SAN FRANCISCO, METROPOLITAN COMMUNITY CHURCH, COUNCIL ON RELIGION AND THE HOMOSEXUAL, GAY PEOPLES UNION OF STANFORD, EMMAUS HOUSE, JOIN HANDS and ACHVAH — A group of Jewish Gays.

The committee has declared June 24th as GAY FREEDOM DAY and will hold a Parade beginning at 1 PM at Post and Sansome Streets. The city has granted a parade route up Post to Larkin, down Larkin to Sacramento, up Sacramento to Gough. The Parade will end at Lafayette Park and from there continue to Marx Meadows in Golden Gate Park for a grand old fashioned picnic with music and fun.

Many Gay businesses and organizations are planning decorated floats. Also participating will be a horse unit, motorcycle group, cable car, fire engine, bands and many, many marching groups of Gay people.

The week prior to GAY FREEDOM DAY will include events sponsored by some of the participating groups. On
