


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

OFFICE OF THE EMPEROR NEW RELEASE

San Francisco. Three candidates for the Office of Emperor II were selected tonight when members of the COUNCIL

OF ORGANIZATIONS convened at SIR Center at 8 PM to question applicants for candidacy of the office.

The three candidates who will run for the office are Michael Damon, sponsored by Dowager Empress Jose' I and THE ROUNDUP; Russ Higginbotham sponsored by Ed Heavner and FE-BE'S, and Richard Novak, sponsored by Ken Leetzow and Bill McWilliams' WILD GOOSE, CITY DUMP and BOOT CAMP. The candidates will commence a vigorous campaign immediately and make several appearances with speeches followed by question and answer periods at various bars in San Francisco to be announced and in the East Bay and Peninsula.

All candidates expressed their desires to unite the community with emphasis on fund-raising and participation in many functions in the coming year. They also answered questions from the representatives of various Gay organizations in a grueling 2½ hour session of intense and serious questioning regarding their campaign finances, views

with the incumbent Emperor I Marcus to the degree that a great amount of prestige was now attached to the Office and it was his view that of the three candidates running, he felt apprehension that the Office would be diminished if the candidates or the new Emperor did not follow through with the verve and vigor in which Emperor Marcus filled his tenure.

Tann, as she is known to intimates, is currently starring at the SHOW BIZ LOUNGE in San Diego with a group known as the Turnabouts. Empress Tawny Tann will perform live before the expected sellout crowd. Royalty from Vancouver, Portland, Seattle, Long Beach, Los Angeles, San Deigo, Monterey, Pomona, Santa Monica and the San Fernando Valley will attend the

function including some surprise guests. Emperor Marcus will present the two Hall of Fame Awards as well as the Accolade Award in keeping with the tradition started at the Coronation of Emperor I last September 29th. In addition, Emperor Marcus will present five awards to persons in the Gay community of San Francisco for their performance above and beyond the call of their dedicated volunteer work, devotion and hard work in the interests of the Gay community at large.

A hospitality room will be set up in the Osaka Room of the Miyako Hotel the day of the Coronation. Voting will be conducted from 12 noon until 6 PM at HANS in Oakland and the BAYOU LOUNGE in Redwood City. The polls will remain open from 12 noon until 10 PM on Saturday, September 15th in the lower lobby of the Miyako Hotel and is open to the public Gay community. Emperor II of San Francisco will be crowned at midnight. After the coronation itself and the bars close, Emperor Marcus will host a breakfast buffet in honor of Emperor II, visiting royalty and honored guests. Don Berry will M.C. the Coronation Ceremony assisted by the Knights of Emperor Marcus' Court and the Committee to Elect Emperor II.

Chaos, confusion, police sweeps with arrests of innocent persons, stupid statements from "leaders" with contradictory statements from other "leaders," silly letters to the editors that cry out "I'm not like that," has been the wierd San Francisco Gay community's reaction to the horrifying mass murders in Houston Texas.

The fuzz is not only hot on the trail, arresting victims to prevent crimes, but a fuzzy growth seems to have replaced gray matter between the ears of many homosexuals.

What is happening typifies the disarray left in the wake of our radical revolution which has been experienced for the last four years. SO, LET US CAREFULLY GO OVER THE FACTS, THEN OUTLINE WHAT NEEDS TO BE SAID AND DONE.

As a preface, again, let us reiterate that criticism is NOT to be confused with hostility. Those misguided egos who attempt public life without being able to put in proper perspective concerned criticism should bid fond farewell to their "star category" before they are destroyed by their petty vindictiveness. My concern is to make those tough enough to endure the up front rat race, at least, credible, and hopefully, effective for all of us. I have no desire to hurt anyone's feeling. (Please take note Mr. Milk.)

Everyone knows of the disastrous effects press coverage can have when statements are taken out of context; therefore press conferences must be held so that statements can NOT be misused. Giving the benefit of the doubt that the intentions of C.R.H., D.O.B., et al; were honorable, the press coverage of the August 18 press conference held at the TOKLAS CLUB and at HELPING HANDS did more harm than the original stories from Houston. These statements as published, misrepresented facts and gave an air of authority to a misrepresentation of all Gay persons's attitudes.

The gobbly gook is so extensive and so pervasive that is is difficult, at best, to

sort it out. Because of space, we are pointing out a mere outline of mistakes.

At the same time as the story was breaking from Houston, a vicious sadistic rape and attempted murder by, as the press pointed out, a heterosexual male was reported committed on a female fashion model in San Francisco. This was AT LEAST THE SECOND similar crime of outrageous brutality. The investigating officers described the offenses as the most sickening in their twenty years on the force.

The police department did not, as a consequence of this sickening heterosexual crime, round up all heterosexual women in the area of Union Square where this victim was picked up. BUT, with some strange clairvoyance and weird heterosexual logic, because of the "possibility that a Houston type homosexual murder MIGHT occur in San Francisco" the police are in the process of rounding up POSSIBLE VICTIMS who are homosexuals. A witch hunt is in process and the whole stupid mess is justified as crime prevention.

The frosting on the cake is that not one damned self styled homosexual leader who called these press conferences, got into print or on TV a word about the victims. No one told the police that their job is to protect victims, not seek them out and harrass them again and again. No one reminded our political friends that homosexuals were being put in double jeopardy. No one complained that the victims were "paying" for being harrassed through high taxes.

The time was ripe for the homosexual community to demand these stupid police activities and the police rationales to justify their actions, be stopped immediately.

All Supervisors should have been put on notice that they will be opposed for reelection unless they do their job as Supervisors and demand that the police stop harrassing homosexuals because they might turn out to be victims of a

deranged rapist murderer.

Throughout the unfortunate statements published and broadcast by the media are found mistakes in facts about homosexuality both stated and implied. These mistatements are credited to homosexual leaders. It gives the impression that the only thing these leaders know about homosexuality is that it feels good to get sucked off.

The "12 year old" statement was an affront. Homosexuals are no more all "in love" than they are "all sadists." No one has "to fight the S&M trip" because true S&M is a mutual consenting intellectualized act. These above are only a few of the misconceptions attributed to homosexual leaders. But the biggest mistake was not to mention the victims of these two deranged murderers. The boys who were murdered were obviously consenting to engage in homosexual acts, they were the TRUE homosexuals in this sordid drama. Concern should have gone out for them and their parents.

Another mistake was to attack the media. Their reporting of the police sweep and arrests on Market Street saved many Gay persons from arrest.

Another mistake was to say that homosexuals were not like the murderers. Who in hell said they were. One of the criminals claimed heterosexuality, and the other criminal claimed bisexuality. These Gay persons who were denying their "guilt by association" were exposing their secret desires more than defending anyone.

The list goes on and on. So, next time before Gay leaders and writers are so quick to get into print, a few thoughtful considerations of orchestrating a press conference should be made, a press release must be carefully written, and answers to possible questions from the press should be discussed and worked out.

Maybe Thomas Edwards should hold a workshop for Gay leaders at the TOKLAS CLUB on how to write succinctly and present a consistent statement for the press.

As you will undoubtedly note, this is not the first nor will it be the last time that I am making an issue of ANYONE who claims to be doing an event for charity, only to see the money in their private bank accounts. This is really serving notice NOT on Ray Broshears, but on others within this city who use this tactic to fill their own coffers. I would expose anyone who adopts this tactic, regardless of who they were, or what their position. Mr. Broshears HELPING HANDS CENTER is a vital and necessary part of our world today. Please don't anyone mistake that. The Tenderloin is filled with problems, and someone has to be there to give some direction, lest we wind up with more difficulties than we already have. There are a considerable number of people within this community who do make every attempt to do some good for ANY

of our people, without blustering, banner waving or shouting matches on or off the television stations, which is a natural for Mr. Broshears, who, it would appear has a penchant for putting our worst foot forward. It must then seem natural for the general population who are not oriented toward Gay revolution, or Gay life for that matter, see these loud talking, fist shaking, saber rattling — usually crude displays shoved down their throats, to assume or presume that "they are all that way" syndrome which has haunted each of us in our own way since we came out.

It is true, that many of our own people have taken a back seat when it comes to the "less than desirable" part of our world, mainly because they feel their jobs, lives or social position is in jeopardy. It is also true that it would indeed be a shattering revelation to these same "conservative" types, that we are all trying to impress the world that we are presented as a united front, when in truth, we have pushed our dirty laundry into the back of the closet and forgot it. These same people are the first to admit that the Meat Rack and the T.L. problems are a fact much easier ignored than to face up to, but unfortunately that is not going to eliminate the problems.

WE DO NEED DEDICATED PEOPLE who are genuinely interested in working in these areas. It may come as a shattering revelation to Mr. Broshears that there are a considerable number of people in various organizations who have been working with these problems for years, without fanfare, and with just about the same degree of success which Ray has met with. In the matter of PUBLIC MORALS, our community is not too far different from any other community. "They" also look the other way with regard to whores, prono, hookers or whatever, because unless another crime is committed with relationship to these activities, these are VICTIMLESS CRIMES. The law of demand and supply has satisfied many a person on a long cold night. I don't say that this is right, only that it is.

With the amount of energy expended by Mr. Broshears in the quest of publicity for any reason, it would behoove him to learn to work within the framework of the community and in conjunction with it rather than on his terms, I feel that he would get a great deal more assistance

han he has enjoyed in the past. The idea itself is a good one. I, like so many others here in the city have been residents of the realm over which the HELPING HANDS reader now would like to believe he controls. Some of us still care for the people there, because they are people, and NOT OBJECTS TO BE USED FOR PERSONAL GRANDIZEMENT OR RECOGNITION. It is a rotten state of affairs when anyone would use the backs of people who are down, as stepping stones to a greater position in the world for "self." Ray, if you will bother to go back and reread this column, please note that I have given recognition for the many things you have tried to do. You will also note that I have blasted you where your own little self blown ego trips are involved. As is customary for people with good sense that criticize, I would also like to try giving a possible solution.

If you would try to look at things from other viewpoints rather than set yourself up as the last word of the Almighty, people could live with you easier. Try a little cooperation with other segments of the community, rather than "do it my way, or no dice." After all, a baseball game is not legal until it has gone five and a half innings. 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

GOOD VIBRATIONS AT THE GEARY!

Please don't be hesitant about seeing the hit musical currently at The Geary "Don't Bother Me, I Can't Cope" because of its title. The show is exactly the opposite of what the title implies. "Cope" is a non militant collection of songs and dances, combined with satire and humor. It is in no way negative or hostile.

It is a lively, well performed and superbly staged theatrical adventure. Even the most conversative audiences will find "Cope" to be one of the more memorable evenings they could spend at the theatre.

The show consists of approximately 24 or more songs with no narration in between. The songs tell the whole story. The music and lyrics are the product of Micki Grant who has created a pleasing varetty with her songs. She utilizes a wide range of tempos from calypso to ballads and hard rock to convey the feeling of love and peace. Her lyrics have a hearty appeal as well as being warm and honest.

The show was concieved and the entire production directed by Vinnette Carroll. She should be commended for the idea of presenting blacks as people - fun loving, proud and patient rather than as hostile and racially active militants.

The choreography by Edmond Kresley is the most exciting and lively combination of classic and contemporary dance styles to come along in some time. His fresh approach is especially enjoyable in "Lock Up The Door" and "Men's Dance."

The company is large and work effectively together. To comment on every performer would consume more copy than space can allow, however, to highlight a few members is a pleasant task. Salome Bey is inspirational with her ballads, Lee Kirk and Nat Morris convey heart-warming love with "Thank Heaven For You," Edmond Wesley overwhelms with a moving rendition of "My Name Is Man" and Sherman Hemsley has a real

show stopper with "Look Over From Your Side."

If you like audience participation, "Do A Little Living In Peace" is a song to enjoy. It brought the house to its feet and the cast into the aisles to bring to a close an exhilarating evening of theatre.

"Cope" is a black showcase, tastefully packaged and executed. Try it, you'll like it...



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

The peerless puppeteer, George Buchanan, is back at GOLD STREET for

a brief three weeks. I could drag all the adjectives in the dictionary out to describe his current act, but will contain myself by saying that if you are looking for a sophisticated hour of entertainment, beautifully presented and executed, and totally different from anything you've seen before, George Buchanan is the act for you! If you prefer the more standard nightclub fare of stale one-liners and ya-hoo blue humor, Prof. Irwin Corey is

right down the block at the Playboy Club.

Approximately half of Mr. Buchanan's act is new, including not only string marionettes but hand and rod puppets. Working in the tradition of Bunraku, where the puppeteer remains in full view of the audience at all times but it's up to the audience not to see him, his "Dancing Swan", Richard Nixon, the Great Bambino, and especially "Ghosts in A Graveyard" remain fresh and exciting. Of the new material, his Madame Butterfly singing "Un Bel Di" is an exquisite masterpiece of simplicity. There is an adorable pig who does a "Gay Cop" routine, a Fairy Queen who tells us "Nobody Loves A Fairy Over 40", two glowworms who twinkle as they sing, a lifesize jaded cat who wants to take us back to the fun of World War II, and a grand finale where Madame Lotta Crabtree with heaving breasts sings "Land of Hope and Glory" in front of a fog-laden San Francisco skyline. The stage at GOLD STREET has been wisely cut down to draw focus, while Mr. Buchanan and his unseen assistants keep a pace that rivets your attention from start to finish.

There is an unfortunate Punch-and-Judy connotation to the word "puppet" that may keep some showgoers away. And that's a pity. The only comparison I can make with George Buchanan is "Les Poupees de Paris", the marionette show by Sid and Marty Krofft that packed 'em in at the New York World's Fair. That also was a stylish, imaginative show (much more lavish with much less substance) that appealed to adults. I can only recommend the George Buchanan Show in the hope that the discriminating theatregoer (and that's what it is — theatre) will find him as rewarding and unique an evening as I did!!

On Monday night, Aug. 13th, the FROLIC ROOM had a contest to crown a "Miss Frolic Room" (dear God, another title!!). Judges for the gala event were Pat Montclair (Old Chesty to her friends) and Estuardo of FIN'S, H.L. Perry, Erika, Jerry of HELPING HANDS CENTER, and my dear friend, Lori Shannon. 3. If you don't move well, stand still (if you're a dancer, by all means, pick a number with lots of movement; but why are performers afraid to stand still and insist on movement just to look "busy" — maybe it's the theory it's hard to hit a moving target.)

4. If you're going to do a "downer" ballad with a message, you better put some guts into your mime; otherwise,

why not just play the jukebox version.

5. Don't be afraid to be different; pick something that shows you off at your best and don't worry about it being a "popular" number already familiar to the audience. (I, for one, will be quite happy if I never hear, live or mime, another rendition of "Cabaret" to my dying day).

6. Don't do cute little "throwaways" that have no build or punch.

Granted, the FROLIC ROOM is a very difficult room to work, because on that runway, there's always part of the audience looking at your back, but a clever performer can work around that without running up and down the runway 50 times a number (it begins to look like a 100 yard dash). Carol Lynn emceed the proceedings graciously, and there were a couple special production numbers, "Big Spender" and The Pointer Sisters, added for that night only that were fun. So now we have a "Miss Frolic Room." And who knows?! Maybe THE MISTAKE will have a contest, and then we'll have "Miss Mistake".



Have you ever spent an evening in Modesto, Merced, Tulare or even Canton, Okla.? If so, then you might find a bit of nostalgia fun in the current release, "American Graffiti" (now at the Cinema 21). The film is a potpourri work with a complex music score composed of

"Oldies But Goodies" and presents us with one summer night in Modesto, circa 1962.

Prior to seeing this film, I had read a few articles and reviews of the film which praised it to the sky and so I was oddly disappointed in the actual viewing. There is much that I found amusing and fun and I do like the picture, but I can't agree with Rex Reed's acclaim or the New York Times calling it "easily the best movie of the year."

The first thing that threw me was that I never really got a feeling of '62 at all but rather a late 50's mood. I graduated from high school in '60 and identified with much of the slang and music from my own 1956-60 school years. Putting that little matter aside, I also found the film's almost constant soundtrack of rock n' roll music ("Sixteen Candles," "Teen Queen," "Rock Around the Clock" etc.) very distracting as much of it was more interesting than the action on the screen at the time. Other than these two slightly negative feelings, I must say that I relaxed and let the events on screen entertain me as I'm sure the director/writer, George Lucas, wanted me to do.

The scenerio is on the "Summer of '42" side, as we follow what happens to four friends on a night at the end of the summer of '62. The young actors in the film are all relatively new to the screen, even Ronny Howard, who is remembered as "Opie" on the Andy Griffith TVer, has grown up so much that his is also a "new" face.

To delve too much into the series of vignettes that compose the film would be telling too much as the plotline is rather on the thin side anyway and the fun of the picture lies not so much in what happens as in the style the tales are told. Each character is well defined and vividly brought to life by the talented actors and actress of "Graffiti."

Cruising down the main drag in his customized hot rod comes Paul LeMat, at 22 the oldest of his peers. This particular night he is burdened by 14 year old Mackenzie Phillips who has a wisecrack answer for everything except disclosing where she lives so she can be dropped off by LeMat.

LeMat handles the situation the best he can and his philosophy of life come through in his many scenes with the young teenager.

Ronnie Howard and his Girl, Cindy

Williams, go to the hop and dance their last dance together as Howard plans to leave the next morning for an Eastern college. He was the senior class president and she's the head cheerleader - a typical all-American situation which ultimately leads to Howard staying in town and becoming an insurance salesman.

Richard Dreyfuss is the intellectual of the bunch and wants to spend his last night experiencing new adventures which he does in pursuing a hot blonde in a white T-Bird and reluctantly joining in the juvenile delinquent hijinks of the town gang, The Pharaohs. His is the most significant change from boyhood to young man as the evening progresses toward daybreak and his departure to college.

By far the funniest scenes involve the town clown, beautifully played by Charlie Martin Smith. Smith is a year behind Howard and Dreyfuss and is kept around as a kind of mascot-errand boy. He is entrusted with Howard's Impala for the night and manages to pickup Candy Clark by telling her how much she looks like Connie Stevens. Their moments together are delightfully goofy.

The film is well directed and edited, switching from one scene to another without changing the radio dial. Wolfman Jack is the town's top D.J. and one of the most poignant scenes in the film is the one between Wolfman and young Dreyfuss.

It's a fun evening and well worth seeing. If nothing else it's a delight to see the Mel's Drive In car hops swishing thru on roller skates.

Just remember when the lights go down, the screen lights up and it's "magic time" again.

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
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EMPEROR MARGUS

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
