This has been one of the quietest elections in San Francisco history, but the issues for the homosexual community are real and very important. Proposition K, District Election of Supervisors, has become the key issue on this year's ballot. If we all get out and vote yes on K it looks like we not only will have a way to elect Supervisors who will really be responsive and we will eventually get some homosexuals elected to City Hall. This is the first time in four years that any election can deliver for San Francisco's Gay community some real political advantages.

Not to be overlooked is Harvey Milk, candidate for Supervisor. He has waged a credible campaign, much to the surprise of many persons, and for that he has become the first viable up front Gay candidate that deserves the vote of homosexuals. There are those that will say there have been others from the Gay community who have run for public office in the past as up front Gay persons, but Mr. Milk is the first and only candidate so far that has been able to speak, look, act and run as a politician who merits consideration and presents a knowledgeable constructive political program.

From surveys it seems certain that no Gay candidate in a city wide election can win public office at the present time in San Francisco. Yet Harvey has conducted himself in such a way as to be a credit. Future Gay political candidates will benefit from his campaign.

The other two Gay candidates in this election do NOT deserve the votes of the Gay community anymore than those that have run in years past.

There are two very good reasons to go to the polls on November 6th: YES ON "K" and HARVEY MILK FOR

SUPERVISOR.

The strange political games that heterosexuals play become stranger everyday, but we still have the old police roundup of homosexual before elections.

Let's trip a minute. Elect Gay politicians and have a police roundup of heterosexuals before every election. Or, how about a yearly assessment for all children that attend school, you have got to pay to go to public school. (That gets my no on A + B) How about outlawing heterosexual gathering places, more courts, judges, district attorneys, police, etc. would have jobs. (That's the no lever on "C") We could set up machinery in elections that would allow a veto vote by homosexuals of all candidates up for elections we didn't like. (That means a no on "D") Wouldn't it be wise to tax the hell out of every heterosexual for just being married? (The tax discrimination against single persons always gets me to vote no, no, no, on every proposition that raises taxes.)

I see every reason in the world for ALL homosexuals to vote every election and to qualify their votes with self interest concerning homosexual rights. Every issue should receive scrutiny as to heterosexual past treatment to homosexuals. Until homosexuals start getting due consideration for their civil rights they should give priority to voting on all issues from a homosexual viewpoint only.

A new political poll shows that Supervisorial candidate Jack Morrison has come up from behind, and now has a fair chance of getting elected. Morrison is running on a platform of shifting the police emphasis off of victimless crimes, including homosexuality. He says he won't vote for the police budget until the changes are made. Like Jeff Masonik and Harvey Milk, Morrison thinks the police should concentrate on crimes against persons and property.

Dorothy Von Beroldingen is still running weak, and probably can't be re-elected without the full support of the Gay community. Jeff Masonik is running in 8th place, but still has a remote chance of getting elected. Harvey Milk ranks even further down the list; his election is highly improbable.. The other Gay candidate, Howard Wallace is near the bottom of the the list; his chances are nil.

The election is important to Gays, because there is a good chance that we will be able to elect at least one, and perhaps two, pro-Gay candidates. A great apathy has overcome the conservative law-and-order voters out in the sand dunes. The confession and resignation of Agnew and the pending impeachment of Nixon has exposed law-and-order as a hypocritical slogan used by crooks to conceal their own lawlessness. The new poll shows that law-and-order candidates John Barbegelata, Peter Tamaras, George Chinn and Snooky Nelder are loosing strength as a result. Any or all of them may be defeated.


With due consideration to the positions of the candidates and their likelihood of election, I urge a vote for Feinstein, Morrison, Masonik, Von B. and

And I urge a NO vote on Ronald Reagan's tax limitation bill (Proposition 1). It will write into the state constitution a provision requiring that single people be forever taxed 20% more than marrieds.

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Let's Get It All Together at the 8th Annual


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Editor, Mr. Ross:

The following letter presents Morris Kight's position regarding U.S. Mission Scnadal in the last issue of B.A.R. We are always ready to give a forum to all sides and aspects of the many faceted homosexual community.

B.A.R. has contacted Ms. Hehmeyer, We quote her, "The District Attorney is not indicting anyone at this time, while some facts seem inaccurate in the article, we are thankful to have B.A.R. report our efforts to protect the consumer. Anyone who feels he is defrauded or cheated in any way, should report the facts to the Consumer protection section of the District Attorney's office."

"Fditors"

Dear Brothers Bob and Paul:

An article has appeared in your issue Volume Number 1, Number 21, which has a good many errors of fact having to do with me. I have called you to discuss this matter and you ahve offered to print a retraction, which I now have to insist that you do. Much harm has been done; a retraction, while never reaching all of the same people that the original accusation did, would at least help to mend much of the wilful destructiveness of your article.

I have also called various gaypeoples in San Francisco to discuss this matter, including Mr. Joe Roland, Vice President of the TAVERN GUILD OF SAN FRANCISCO, and Mr. Bob Humprhies, Director of the U.S. Mission. I have from him a signed letter that I am in no ways in control of the Treasury, nor the finances, nor any bank accounts of the U.S. Mission.

In addition I have talked with a professional associate of Mr. Evander Smith, Attorney, who is your Corporation Counsel, quoting to him the California Civil Code in such matters. He promised to contact you to discuss the meaning of that code.

Also, I asked you the name of the author of the article, suggesting that many San Franciscans recognized the familiar writing style of the author; you denied that this man was the reporter and instead gave me the name of a distinguished civil rights and civil liberties attorney as the author. I just had a call from him saying he did no such writing, and would not have done such an irresponsible act. Since he has done many spectacular favors for me, and the community around me, I am acceding

to his request to not mention his name. I am honored to grant that request since its hardly fair to bring in a good name to such seamy circumstances as your article reveals. He has told you all of this, and has also contacted Ms. Carol Hehmeyer of the San Francisco District Attorney's office to discuss the various legal ramifications of your irresponsible action.

Also, two of the candidates for Supervisor's office in San Francisco have flown to Los Angeles to discuss the matter with me and to offer their support should Ms. Hehmeyer proceed as you state she might: "As to Assistant District Attorney Carol Heymeyer she says she is going to seek criminal indictments, if possible, against the officers of the U.S. Mission Corp. (Humphries, Dill and Kight)". I was able to reassure these wonderful people that while I was touched with their concern that nothing could be further from the truth. They have since conducted an independent investigation, and have reassured me that they understand that it was malice.

In addition, I have talked with Ms. Hehmeyer twice during the day, and she has said she never contempted such a thing as an "indictment" against me, and since that word indicates felony action, she has no such plans for others whom you mention. I have also talked with her about the dangers of criminal libel and slander.

She has also told me that it is the official policy of the San Francisco District Attorney's office not to discuss cases with the press. How she got gulled into this breach of a canon of ethics is that your reported "offered to help with the investigation, has furnished information, and helped out." That her candor in dealing with your reporter stemmed from her misunderstanding that this "helper" is also one of your reporters. She is embarassed.

Because of this serious breach of ethics, I urge you to contact her. And while you are making that contact you might mention that gay peoples have other agendum with District Attorneys since much of their felony work has to do with charging gay peoples with major crimes, and that might be a subject for the Bay Area Reporter to "assist" with.

I am not, to my knowledge an officer of the U.S. Mission. Had I been elected I would have declined to serve, since it is a long-standing policy of mine not to serve in organizations in any responsible way, unless I am invovled in the day-to-day decision-making processes, and thw

work to make those decisions reality. The Mission is four-hundred and twenty miles away, and I could give no such input. I have no access to its bank accounts, if it has any, have no authority to sign checks, have no access to

their books, nor records, nor minutes of meetings. I am not a member of it's Corporation Board in the Secretary of State's office, since it was incorporated years before I knew any of the principals.

I do serve on various Boards, locally and nationally as an "Honorary Trustee", or "Advisory", or whatever. In each case I have made it clear that I served in that capacity only. If I am responsible for finances, or day-to-day affairs, I insist that I be directly involved.

One more point with Ms. Hehmeyer: you quote her as saying in connection with bank accounts: "discovered that famed Los Angeles Gay Morris Kight of the GCSC is listed as "Treasurer of the U.S. Mission Corps." "Mrs. Hehmeyer stated that had learned that there were two bank accounts fro the U.S. Mission Corporation, and was attempting to learn the whereabouts of the second. A source has disclosed that it is possibly near the home of Morris Kight in Los Angeles at the Security Pacific Bank, a lead which the District Attorney's office is looking into."

Well, near my home, and the GAY COMMUNITY SERVICES CENTER, are sixteen banks; if the U.S. Mission has any money in them let someone find it. I have not time to meddle in affairs which are little of my concern. I hope the workers there have a few dollars, but am told that they are absolutely broke, and have been for months.

As for groups I do have to do with: yes, they have bank accounts, under their own names, with multiples of signatures, checks and balances, excellent books, internal and external audit, and each month file a formal report with our Board of Directors, and customarily send copies to responsible persons in the community, that they might know where we stand. That you have jeopardized some of these Funds is an unbrotherly act; its your conscience you have to live with, however; our records are

I would call upon you now to publish financial reports in the B.A.R. of the various organizations you report upon, and which are central to the ',good works" of your reporters; we should be glad to exchange them with you.

Much of this action has had to do with jealousy, and resentment because of the growth of the Center, and its many allies around the country. I urge no one to be jealous and resentful. Much work needs to be done, but without direct concern to that work, we shall just get farther and farther away from our goals. The sky is the limit, should we develop a sense of community, and loyalty, and keep our genuine concerns among us as family matter -and not air them in the press. We stand ready for positive: criticism from the Bay Area Reporter.

I presume I should tell you that when Bob Humprhies and Val Dill were in Los Angeles, that they were involved daily in good works. Both served as telephone resource people at the

Gay Survival Committee, giving the finest of service without seeking recognition and being totally responsible to the callers. Both served in the Christopher Street West Committees, with vigor, style and accountability. Both repsonded at all hours of the day and night to gays who were in trouble or troubled.

Might they be given the same opportunity to serve the San Francisco Community? Hardly, with attacks being railed against them daily. If mistakes have been made, and I do not know that they have since I am far away, why not call them in with other community workers and offer love and support, tenderness, caring and sharing, which is what Gay Liberation is all

An office of the TAVERN GUILD of San Francisco tells me that the Bay Area Reporter is not the house organ of that organization. I had already understood that; but because of your Presidency of it, someone might mistake your actions as having to do with the Guild. I hope that it is made clear that the Guild has not joined into any of this libel and slander.

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
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WORLD OF BOOKS by J.D. Miller **HOW I BECAME** AN AUTHORITY ON SEX by Jim Moran. Stein & Day, \$5.95

The exploits of Jim Moran in the world of public relations and as a television wit are now further celebrated by a thin little book about sex, very funny and very authoritative. All the authority comes of years of being involved in what Moran calls "worship on the prayer mat of flesh." It is solidly backed up by personal experiences related in a tone which is open and amusing, and an extensive bibliography of over two hundred books ranging across the widest spectrum of literature and workds of reference. The meaning of the bibliography is that wherever Jim Moran has looked and read, he has found sex.

Notably absent from reference are books by infamous authorities such as Dr. Rubin. Moran cannot waste his time on the mordantly serious clinical


although he has lived in Washington, New York and Los Angeles. There has never been ny place for homosexuality in his personal life, unfortunately for prevalent notions on sexuality by Dr. Kinsey and anyone's thoughts about people who live in Los Angeles and have anything to do with the entertainment world. Still, no life is complete without a perhaps, and perhpas something happened on a bus once between Pittsburgh and Washiggton.

Jim Moran is famous for selling an icebox to an Eskimo and for finding a needle in a havstack. His career in public relations has always involved him in manufacturing news around the celebrity or product he is representing. He is the master of the put-on. The exact veracity of any book by him, in view of his well-known past, might also be a put-on. Yet he says that there is but one incident in this entire book wheih is not strictly true but which he could not resist including.

Modestly, he does not look upon himself as an author or as a writer but simply as someone who has something he watns to say and a few odd moments over a three year period when he could get it down on paper. The first half of the book is autobiographical, and the second half is "general." He did not write this book to make money or to win fame, both of which he already has in tolerable quantities. Nor did he write the book for fun, because while very funny in spots, this is a light book which is always quite serious, especially where jealousy and possession are discussed. Almost everything in this book leads to that subject.

Whatever Jim Moran is an authority on, he is not a psychologist or psychiatrist in the clinical sens. Friends come and refer thier friends to his sex seminars, groups of from twleve to twenty, male, female or mixed, who come to discuss their hangups and discover the universality of their problems. This book is the result of those seminars, an effort to loosen things up in the five-to-eighty age groups, and anyone in that age bracket, regardless of persuasion, can learn from this book.

SENATOR SPEAKS ON GAY RIGHTS

State Senator Arlen Gregorio (D) will address the Peninsula Group of Concern at 7:30 PM Thursday, Nov. 15 in the Goldstar Room of the Veterans Memorial Bldg., 1455 Madison Ave., Redwood City. The Group aims to bring about better public understanding of homosexuality in order to reduce fears and prejudices, and eliminate discrimination in employment, professional licensing and other areas of civil rights. The meeting will be open to all interested in the subject.

The Peninsula Group has recently hosted other legislators, attorneys and officials at its monthly meetings.

Sen. Gregorio, who represents San Mateo's 12th Senatorial District, is expected to discuss the the progress of legislative reform efforts affecting homosexuals, and to respond to questions submitted during the meeting.

VOTE "YES" ON "G" Rheabilitation Loan Program Authorization

A ballot measure of major importance ot San Francisco is Proposition "G". It enables the City to operate a loan program to rehabilitate residential buildings in a similar manner as the successful FACE Program which operated for seven years.

The State of California through the Marks-Foran Bill has passed similar enabling legislation. Therefore, for the first time, both the State and the City would have commitments to enable local government to proceed to borrow funds from private financial institutions and make low interest loans available to property owners.


There is no known opposition to Proposition "G," primarily as a result of the acknowledged success of similar programs using federalfunds throughout the State of California and the nation.

The Bank of America has committed \$20,000,000.00 toward this program once the legal enabling legislation is enacted. It is, therefore, expected that within four months passage of Proposition "G" loans can be made to property owners in those areas eligible for funds.

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"THERE ARE NO SMALL ROLES..."

Stephen Sondheim's "Follies" finally made it as far as San Carlos. San Francisco audiences seem destined to be deprived of seeing this much acclaimed

musical (it got to L.A. last year, but plans to bring it here were canelled), so theatre buffs dutifully trooped to the Circle Star Theatre last week to see this lavish tribute to a bygone era. Boasting a cast list that changed faster than meat prices, with the promise of the original New York costumes (untrue; only the showgirl costumes, minus headdresses, were from the original), it held the expectation of being an exciting evening. Well, once in a while it was, but pared to the bone, without the lavish sets and costumes, all the glaring weaknesses of the show were readily apparent to one and all.

On a barren theatre stage, several aging Follies girls get together for a final reunion before the theatre is torn down. The book, by James Goldman, focuses on two ex-roommates, Phyllis and Sally, and their husbands. Phyllis has become brittle and cynical, married to smug and pompous Ben; Sally is romantic and superficial, married to Buddy but actually still in love with Ben. And tonight's the night all the hostilities and frustration come out, in song and talk. Oh, God, they talk! Endlessly!! Verbal masturbation by four of the most unpleasant people you'll ever meet. You find yourself rooting (if you care enough) for Phyllis, because she at least is a fighter and has some guts. The other three just complain bitterly, with all the heartfelt beliefs of callow alcoholics in their cups at a cocktail party. No emotion is left unverbalized, with Mr. Sondheim creating several dreary ditties to help explain how trenchant and mordant it all is along the way. James Goldman shows great promise of being the 60's answer to Fannie Hurst.

Fortunately, Circle Star assembled a cast of pros and a director who knows what in-the-round staging is all about. Vivian Blaine proved she is a very classy lady indeed, making Phyllis vital and interesting to watch, but never electrifying (I can only imagine what Alexis Smith must have pumped into this role to garner such raves). Robert Alda, in excellent voice, gave solid support as the cold, success-driven Ben, and Don Liberto managed to make the weak, ineffectual Buddy into a bigger bore than already written. But the master stroke was the casting of Jane Kean as Sally, the disillusioned idealist afraid of facing reality. A role of great potential charm and vulnerability, Miss Kean stomped through it with all the softness of Tugboat Annie scraping barnacles from the hull. When she announced to Buddy she was leaving him, it had the dramatic impact of a polite guest asking the maid to fetch her a fresh martini. Hopelessly miscast, Miss Kean seemed at moments ready to join Miss Blaine and share the role of Phyllis. Certainly, the part of Sally was up for

More's the pity, for the ghost of Young Sally was beautifully played by a charmer named Sara Louise. It was the supporting parts that gave "Follies" what spark it had and made the evening worth-

while. The only memorable numbers in the score are the show songs the ladies recreate throughout the evening. And every one of the ladies, allowing one number to a role, scored and sparkled with their soloes. Fifi D'Orsay, whom the first nighters adored, wiggled and camped her way through "Ah, Paris!", then Helen Blount (replacing Selma Diamond, who cancelled) brought down the house with her belting "Broadway Baby," followed by Mary Small, as the brassy beat up Stella, socking "Who's That Woman" across with the showmanship of a grand old trooper. Later in the show, Jeanne Grant touchingly conveyed the hauntingly lovely "One More Kiss." But the greatest triumph remained yet to come. As the aging movie star, Carlotta, Julie Wilson made her every moment onstage a gem and her one solo, "I'm Still Here," as the most exciting show-stopping number of the night. The magnificent Miss Wilson deserves more than this role offered her.

The choreography, by Jayne Turner and Steven Brookvor, was at best lively and at worst high school variety show. I rather liked the tango quartet, however, with the younger couple doing the spins and lifts and the older couple only indicating. Christopher Hewett directed with only the sparsest hint of bygone opulence, though what he could do with two benches, one platform and three showgirls to recreate a Ziegfeld atmosphere I cannot imagine. "Follies" definitely needs all the help it can get, the large cast, grand production numbers, exorbitant costumes, etc. Particularly disappointing was the "Loveland" second half. I realize the showgirls could never make it down the aisles in those enormous hoopskirts of the original, but the Minsky bras and feathers were a less than satisfactory replacement. It all looked like a tab version of a rather shoddy revue. But my complaints are technical. "Follies" is not suited to anything less than a full scale production, simply because the show itself is only entertaining on the superficial level of the glitter of a past era and rass-ma-tazz of some grand old gals struttin' their stuff. To direct the focus upon Mr. Goldman's plot of human folly would only work if the book and lyrics made us care about any of the four principals. They don't, we don't, so bring on the next number!! Stripped of its glamour, "Follies" is a tawdry little trifle. The Circle Star orchestra, under the

direction of Dorothy Opalach, remains exceptional.

Stanislovsky wrote, "There are no small parts, only small actors." Misses Wilson, D'Orsay, Blount and Small proved it. Bless 'em!

The picture was directed by Sidney Pollack and he brings the same sense of feeling about an era that he did when directing "They Shoot Horses Don't They" Starting in the 40's when Barbra goes to El Morroco and sees Redford asleep on a bar stool and remembers their college days in the 30's, we stay with them as Redford finally returns the love that Barbra has been saving for him since his days of collegiate glory, and their marriage and subsequent divorce in the

Streisand virtually carries the film as an intelligent, educated, committed woman who stubbornly refuses to let go of what she beleives in, even if it means losing the man she loves . She has finally stopped worrying about how she'll photogrpah and in the 30's college scenes looks uncannily like a young Fannie Brice with very frizzed hair.

The film is a series of lover's quarrels and making up until it just cannot go on and the two mismatched people finally divorce and go their separate ways. The background of their marriage takes place in Hollywood in the 50's when the House of Un American Activities Committee was dividing loyalties among the movie industry. Redford is a screenwriter who willingly cooperates with the Committee as a friendly witness. This is the straw that breaks it for Barbra. She walks out on him because he does not have the courage to stand up on his

Streisand and Redford earn their above-the-title credits by dominating the film which is almost a two-character story. Playing in the background are Bradford Dillman and Lois Chiles as society friends of Redford's who are bloodless people given to boring small talk. Vivica Lindfors and Allyn Ann McLerie are two of the couple's Hollywood friends with Miss Lindfors not given enough to do.

It's an interesting film that is not always successful, but one that sould be seen by anyone who enjoys Streisand on film. She also sings the title song over the credits.

GAY LIB ANTHOLOGY BANNED IN ENGLAND

450 copies of THE GAY LIBERATION BOOK were seized at British customs and declared obscene. The copies of the Gay anthology were on their way to several London bookshops. All of the 450 books that were confiscated will be destroyed at a later date. This means that the books will be burned along with other confiscated materials.

THE GAY LIBERATION BOOK is an anthology of writings, photographs, and cartoons from the Gay liberation movement that was published last January by Ramparts Press of Palo Alto, Calif. The book is in its second printing here in the United States.

British customs did not explain exactly what they found to be obscene in the political anthology, however, it is assumed that they objected to the book's frank language and some photographs of nude men embracing.

The banning of political books in England is a fairly new trend and reflects the conservative/religious backlash that is sweeping the country. There have been several anti-pornography campaigns there lately that have singled out Gay liberation as a "corrupter of youth."

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

UNITED STATES MISSION

Lately, the United States Mission has come under vigorous attack from the BBB, the District Attorney, and the BAR. We find the first two attacks acceptable, since we have been engaged in a type of fund-raising which could be misconstrued by those wishing to do so, and both the foregoing agencies are no great friends of the Gay Community. However, we are crushed that our own Gay brothers at BAR would jump on our back when we are reeling from the effects of the other two vicious attacks. The fact that we are Gay does not exempt us from criticism by BAR, far from it. The fact that we are Gav should exempt us from the vicious, one-sided innuendo and outright lies dumped on us like a load of garbage without any attempt to communicate with us or allow us to explain or rebut.

U.S. Mission has pursued a program of religious-oriented Gay Liberation since its inception, January 2, 1962. We have printed and distributed, door-to-door, thousands of pamphlets all over California extolling people's right to choose their own sexual orientation, condemning intolerance aimed at sexual minorities, and crusading for Gay Religious Freedom. In the process we have provided minimal employment for several hundred Gay persons, sometimes only enough money for a place to stay and a bite to eat, but it allowed them to breathe while they found something better. We have constantly attacked the vice squad as armed priests, and in the process I have been arrested for prostitution in a case I set up myself. We turned the spotlight of publicity on the murder of Howard Efland by the LAPD vice squad, and in the process sparked a community coalition which still functions in Los Angeles. We have raised funds for two Christopher Street-West parades in Los Angeles, and one in San Francisco, and no one complained about a lack of parade money prior to or during any of these events. (Yes, we did improperly use parade funds from the 1972 CSW/SF, after the parade was over. The reason was to enable us to revive our promotional activities which provided a number of jobs and a lot of revenue for the Gay Community. We still feel that we owe that \$289.00 and when it is possible, it will be repaid).

The large sums of money which passed through our hands last year, and pass through they did, were taken from the straight community and plowed into the Gay Community. We grossed about \$120,000.00 and paid out almost all of it in the following approximate percentages:

Is that excessive? Whenever we could we hired Gay and bought Gay. (Even money paid to boys on the "Meat Rack" goes to benefit the Gay Community). We were providing food and shelter and some telephone employment and employment assistance at our Mission House at 112 Fillmore until these attacks were launched upon us. Now it is uncertain whether the Mission House will survive, either as the United States Mission or under a new name (under the management of the present residents and unconnected with U.S. Mission). If Bob Ross had come over to talk to residents and staff of the House he would know that we were performing a valuable service, and that the sexual assault story was the fabrication of a mentally disturbed individual.

It is not bad enough that BAR attacks us in this style, but that it goes on to attack Morris Kight and by extension the LA Gay Community Services Center, one of the best institutions ever to arise from the Gay Community anywhere, this is positively homophobic! Morris Kight has never handled a dime of U.S. Mission money, nor been in charge of any books (though he kindly stored some of our files at his house); his titular position of Treasurer-General of the United States Mission stems from the first LA Christopher Street-West Parade when we felt it would be wise to use a religious exemption to collect the needed parade funds. Many other prominent Gays were placed on our Board of Directors at that time for the same reason. We just never changed the situation. Now, however, Morris has been removed as Treasurer-General in order to spare him and his work any possible hindrance which might result from our activity.

We have made many mistakes and fumbled badly, especially here in San Francisco, though we have never been guilty of mounting vicious attacks upon a Gay Brother or Sister, nor even of wilful failure to communicate; nor would we ever take the word or position of the straight authorities, institutions or press over that of a Gay person without thorough investigation.
