A.B.C. SPEAKS OUT

A.B.C. ANSWER QUESTIONS

At a special meeting of TAVERN GUILD bar owners and managers, Mr. Steve Gin, Supervisor of the Special Investigative Section of the A.B.C. San Francisco District spoke to a capacity crowd at THE MINT on Tuesday, Feb. 26th. In the absence of the President, the meeting was chaired by the Secretary, who read questions submitted by members present. Mr. Gin replied to each one in depth.

Among the questions asked, one was for the A.B.C.'s thoughts on valid and proper I.D. cards. In answer, Mr. Gin said a great deal of acumen and consideration must be given in cases where perhaps the I.D. card reads "blonde" hair but the holder says he has recently dyed his hair. Proper switching of I.D. cards among over and under 21 year olds require intelligence and concern from a bartender or manager, if he does not wish to jeopardize his license.

Mr. Gin was handed copies of the February VECTOR and current copies of KALENDAR and CALIFORNIA SCENE, each of which displayed photographs or drawings of frontal nudes and/or rear ends in full view. The investigative agent said that while he would not purposely come into a licensed premise looking for such a contravention of the code, if he found such magazines, papers or even nude pictures on the wall he would certainly be compelled to write a citation under Sec. 143-4 of the A.B.C. code - "Visual Display."

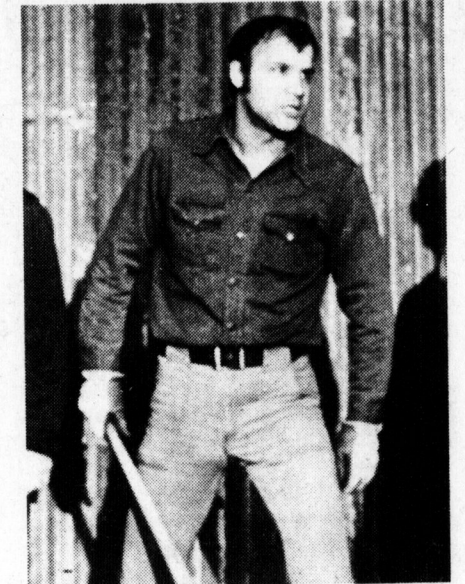
Mr. Gin denied that he knew of any bars where "hanky panky" was going on and said to the very best of his knowledge, no one in the San Francisco office would be guilty of accepting a bribe or gratuity. He reported that it was his office which asked the District Attorney in Alameda County to arrest and bring charges against the agent from the Oakland office who recently was sentenced to fifteen years.

The State Agent pointed out that while a simple peck on the cheek between two males would not necessarily be grounds for a citation, however if those same customers were "spit swapping and tongue kissing" in a corner of the bar, it would certainly be sufficient grounds for a citation. He pointed out that it is the obligation of the bartender to police his bar while he is on duty. If he sees extreme amorous conduct, he should request the customer to cool it, whether between the same or opposite sex.

Mr. Gin also said that the A.B.C. does not require that "people must be out" of a licensed premise by 2:00 A.M., but they do have a very strict law that says that every and all glasses, drinks, bottles, etc., must be off the bar and out of customers hands by 2:00 A.M. and no further drinks may be served.

During these days of violence on the streets, he further said that should an A.B.C. officer knock on your door after you are closed, unless he is known to you and you could see his official credentials, you need not let him in the bar. When in doubt, phone the city police and ask them to come and verify the status of the men wishing to enter. He also pointed out that while the A.B.C. does not enforce the clearing of the bar at 2:00 A.M., there is a city/county ordinance which requires you to have a cabaret (after hours) license in order to have customers after 2:00 A.M. for coffee or sandwiches. Your liquor in such a case need not be hidden from the customer's view, but certainly none may be sold after 2:00 A.M. NOT EVEN A JANITOR OR EMPLOYEE may take a drink after 2.

Mr. Gin invited any member of the GUILD to contact him at any time at the San Francisco office of the Alcoholic Beverage Control for clarification of any of the A.B.C. rules and regulations. He received warm applause from the audience.

SERIOUS GAY THREAT

SB 39 PASSAGE SERIOUS THREAT TO GAYS

Under Senate Bill 39 passed January 21st by the California State Senate a new felony crime to be called "Homosexual Conduct" is created. SB 39 authored by Sen. Grunsky (R) of Santa Cruz runs to 205 pages and makes many substantive changes in the entire state penal code. The vote on the bill was 23 - 11. (S.F. Senators Marks and Moscone, San Mateo Senator Gregorio, and East Bay Senator Holmdale voted against the bill. However, East Bay Senator Petris and Marin Senator Behr voted for the bill.) The bill has now been sent to the State Assembly.

Whereas under present state law (secs. 286 and 288a of the Penal Code) oral copulation and sodomy are felony crimes for all persons, under SB 39 oral copulation and sodomy would be legal for heterosexuals but illegal for homosexuals. Of particular interest to gay persons are the following sections of SB 39:

SB 39 Division 9.

Offenses Against Sexual Morality, Public Decency, and the Family.

9001. The following definitions and provisions are applicable to this division:

(a) "Sexual intercourse" occurs upon penetration, however slight, whether or not an emission results.

(b) "Sexual conduct" occurs upon contact between the penis and the anus; or between the mouth or tongue and the penis, the scrotum, the anus, the vulva, or the clitoris.

(c) "Sexual touching" means any touching of the private parts of a person, or the breast of a female person, or any such touching through the clothing, for the purpose of arousing or gratifying the sexual desire of any person.

9303. (a) A person is guilty of homosexual conduct when he engages in sexual conduct with a person of the same sex.

(b) Homosexual conduct is a felony of the fifth degree.

A person who has been convicted of a felony of the fifth degree may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment in the state prison whose maximum is five years and shall not be released from prison until he has served at least six months.

In the imposition of a felony sentence, a person may be fined as follows:

Upon conviction of a felony of the fifth degree, not exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

9310. (a) A person is guilty of soliciting sexual conduct or sexual touching when, under circumstances in which other persons are likely to be offended, he solicits another person of the same sex in a public place to engage in sexual conduct.

(b) Soliciting sexual conduct is a misdemeanor of the second

degree.

A person who has been convicted of a misdemeanor of the second degree may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six months.

In the imposition of a misdemeanor sentence, a person may be fined as follows:

Upon conviction of a misdemeanor of the second degree, not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500).

At a time when the California gay community was looking forward to the eventual elimination of laws criminalizing any sexual activities between consenting adults in private such as proposed in Assemblyman Willie Brown's recent AB 992 the Senate passage of SB 39 is a serious threat.

SB 39 is now before the State Assembly where there are hopeful indications that it will receive closer and more critical scrutiny than

it got in the Senate. The Assembly Criminal Justice Committee set a hearing on SB 39 for Tuesday, March 5th. A number of gay persons from San Francisco were scheduled to appear before the committee to oppose sections 9303 and 9310 of SB 39. Among those from San Francisco going to Sacramento to speak against the bill were Law Professor Walter Barnett, Attorney Rick Stokes, and activists Rev. Ray Broshears, Robie Robillaird, and Larry Littlejohn.

Public testimony and lobbying efforts will be used to oppose SB 39. Additionally and most importantly every gay person is needed to fight against the anti-gay provisions of SB 39.

KQED ANNOUNCES PLANS FOR 1974 ART AUCTION

Paintings and prints, collages and crafts by top Bay AREA artists will be sold at public auction, when KQED - Channel 9 broadcasts its 20th annual fund-raising telethon this year, June 1 through June 9. On June 2 (designated as ART SUNDAY), nearly 1000 pieces of art will be sold in eleven continuous hours of auctioning.

Highlights of this year's art auction include: a two week showing of 50 selected works at the Crown - Zellerbach Gallery from May 13 through May 24; a preview at the Cow Palace of all the art to be sold, beginning on May 27.

The drive for art donations to this year's Auction will be launched with a re-broadcast of the half-hour television special honoring last year's top art donors. The program, titled "1973 Auction Awards: 3 Local Artists," will be aired on Channel 9 on Saturday, February 23 at 7:30 p.m.

This year two of the top donating artists will be singled out for recognition in another half-hour television special to be aired on KQED following the Auction. In addition, three "second prize winners" will each be featured in one of KQED's Emmy Award - winning station breaks, "Spaces Between Programs."

A jury of prominent members of the Bay Area art scene will choose the works for the Crown-Zellerbach Show and the top awards. Selections will be open to all media and will be based on the quality of the work donated. Only pieces by living Bay Area artists will qualify.

The deadline for contributions of art work to the KQED Auction is April 25th. All donations must be ready for hanging or exhibition. Due to handling problems caused by the energy crisis, pieces larger than 4 1/2 square feet cannot be accepted.

Last year the Auction raised \$470,000 for the Bay Area's only public - supported television station -- approximately 15% of KQED total annual budget. More than \$93,000 was brought in by the sale of art contributions alone.

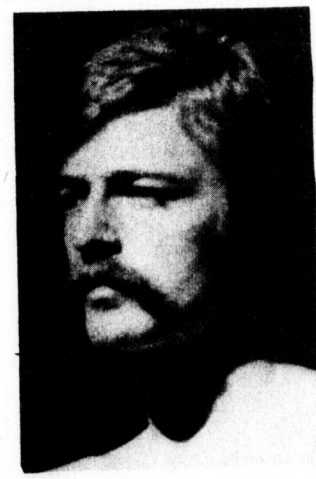

WORLD BOOKS OF J. D. MILLER

HOW I TURN ORDINARY COMPLAINTS INTO THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS, the diary of a tough customer, by Ralph Charell. N.Y., Stein & Day \$6.95.

By way of introduction to the author of this book, we are told, prior to interview, that the "Guinness Book of World Records" recognizes him as the world's most successful complainer. On a publicity tour for the book, those few of us who found the book interesting, interviewed him at his hotel room in the St. Francis Hotel. A publicity team is also present, and usually there is only one lady to act as hostess, so he must be an important customer, much more-so than the countless other authors who have previously come through our fair city.

Ralph Charell is a tall, thin, moderately good looking young man too full of his subject and himself to have let the housemaid clean up his room during his absence. He left a "do not disturb" sign on the door while he was out. It is the second room he has occupied in his

two days here. The first room was an "outside room", and the garbage trucks disturbed him. So it was a surprise that he originates in New York City.

During the previous day he had rushed to Los Angeles for a special taping and returned after the hotel dining rooms had closed. Except for the elegant Victor's in the tower. But he wanted room service. Of course the St. Francis is in something of a flap, renovating the Terrace Room, doing away with the Medallion and the Grill. And there is only one room service waiter on after 10:30 PM. What he ordered took forty or so minutes to get there. Naturally he let the hotel know about it. Naturally he complained about his noisy room. In addition to this someone put a call through to his room in the middle of the night. The hotel sent a basket of fruit and its apologies. But anyone wise in the ways of room service anywhere in the world knows that these days you simply go down, and out if necessary. Saves the wear and tear all around.

Services are no longer what they used to be. That is the premise of the book: services should be better than they are. Any student of philosophy, if it takes that, knows that services have never been any better than the service personnel could get away with. People are too easily intimidated into accepting and being brow-beaten by poor services, incompetent repairmen, faulty merchandise, inflated prices for services which are covered by ineffectual warranties or insurance companies. Here is a smart book filled with advice to the consumer which goes beyond a simple complaint to the Better Business Bureau. What do you do when your new color television bursts into flame, when a set of x-rays is going to cost three times as much as they ever did, when merchandise falls apart in your hands at a mere touch. The author illustrates fully how he manages to get his way when things go wrong whether he has to complain to a store, to a landlord, or to a public service. It is absolutely a primer for all those who have ever been wronged and got short shrift at the complaint desk. It is an absolute study in knowing what you are doing when you have been wronged and dare to obtain justice.

The author points out that there are standards which have to be kept up. The customer should be properly served. If goods are to be delivered, they should be delivered on time, for other people than deliverymen also have obligations which cannot keep them waiting all day.

Why do we have these situations today more than ever before. A brief attempt was made to diagnose the situation, assuming that today services are poorer than ever before. We got as far as seeing that too much is left in the hands of the computer, that personal services are no longer given. We did not say that people now do not want to pay for personal services but only take it for granted they should get them. We did not say that people only care when they are the ones who are wronged and simply would never give the services which they demand of others. We did say that there is a tendency of employees today to want to make it tougher for their employers to succeed, and that employees seem to know a thousand and one small ways in which to sabotage their employers, to sabotage anything which looks halfway establishment, too dance with glee when the employer's business fails. The employee cannot be fired because he belongs to a union, and if his boss goes out of business the employee can collect unemployment benefits, and has the satisfaction of having bested the guy who paid the bill for any employee who was never really on the side of the employer or his business.

So it comes down to a moral question which has been many years in growing and now has been many years with us. We cannot solve the basic causes. We cannot even solve these with out complaints. For the saddest remark at the end of the author's personal success with complaining is that he does not presume that his complaints have made a major change either in the goods or services furnished by any of the businesses or agencies against which he has complained. He for a fact feels that someone else out there is being given the same shoddy treatment he got even today. The businesses, the goods, and the personnel of those places still go along doing the same poor performances.

During the course of our interview, refreshments were ordered from the bar through room service. They were rather quick to come. Unfortunately the waiter got or was

given the incorrect order. The waiter, a studious, fine-looking oriental, did not take it in good part and made the mistake of slamming the door as he left the room. Of course, no news travels faster than that the occupant of room so-and-so is a chronic complainer. Several remarks were then made about waiters as a class being the drop-outs of the world. The interview progressed, and the order was corrected, and this time the waiter was carefully observed by the complainant-author, who took time to observe and remark that the waiter wasn't even an American. This is not a criticism normally heard these days in San Francisco. A mistake can after all be a simple little mistake, but we do not want to mix up a simple mistake with a major complaint, or we all become paranoid sons-of-bitches.

GUILTY FOR THE REST OF YOUR LIFE

Are you a veteran with a less-than-honorable discharge?

HOW has your discharge hampered your advancement in your job?

WHY do 'young' potential executives become 'old' potential executives?

WHY is it you are having difficulty finding a job, even though you have a 'good' discharge?

ANSWER: A bad SPN number!! "What's that," you ask.

Your Special Processing Number (SPN) is found on all Separation Papers (DD-214). It is the coding system used by the military to classify discharges, 'even though it may not be related to your discharge.'

Any prospective employer can obtain, upon payment of a nominal fee, the complete list of SPN code numbers from the Bureau of Documents in Washington, D.C. Even if you are accepted for employment, your employer may use this SPN No. information to relegate you to 'low,' 'menial' positions. You may never know the reason for this since very few employees ever see their personnel file.

In the ten years between 1962 and 1972, 560,000 less-than-honorable discharges were issued by the armed forces. Many of these were due to low morale and resistance to the war in Southeast Asia.

Many of those branded 'unfit' or 'unsuitable' after brief service

should never have been in the military in the first place. In other instances, less-than-honorable discharges (LTHD) were issued to those who already served many years honorably. In ALL cases, LTHD holders are being penalized for being veterans. A LTHD is a lifelong handicap in civilian life. **DISCHARGE UPGRADE PROJECT**

About one year ago, a discharge upgrade committee was formed. Through actually engaging in the administrative process they have increased their success on discharge upgrading. This group has since become the present Discharge Upgrade Project (DUP). There are now more than a dozen DUP offices in the U.S. DUP is affiliated with the Vietnam Veterans Against the War-Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW-WSO). Many of the local DUP members are also VVAW members.

WHAT DUP IS DOING

DUP appeals in Washington, D.C. are presented by David Addlestone, a retired JAG officer. Rep. Ronald Dellums of Berkeley acts as liaison officer and obtains military files for DUP. A voluntary group of law students draws up legal briefs for DUP. These volunteers and others are working to upgrade 'bad' dis-

charges.

The goals of DUP are three fold: A single-type of discharge be issued to all military veterans, All previously issued discharges be changed to a single-type discharge,

The SPN number code system used to classify discharges be stopped.

Counseling service is available to active duty members through DUP's Active Duty Outreach Committee. Primarily, its functions are: (1) to assist servicemen with problems on upcoming discharges, and (2) to give legal advice to AWOL servicemen to aid them in returning

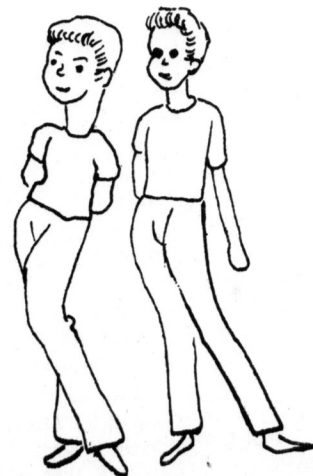
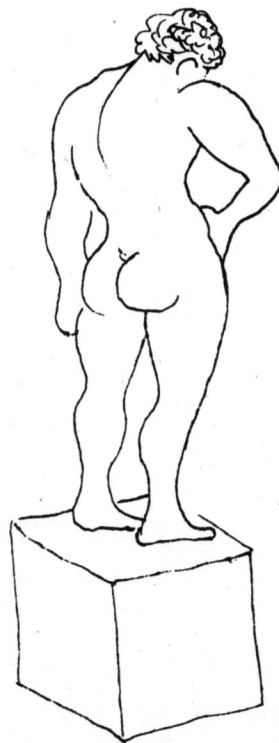

WHEN you the people become aware of DUP and WHEN your support has been gained, THEN DUP can move forward for changes that accomplish its three goals for ALL military personnel and veterans, without regard to whether they wet the bed, led a protest, or fired a gun.

Only by working together, channeling all efforts on a political solution for bad discharges - a retroactive single-type discharge - can the 'guilt' of being found gay, conscientious objector or whatever be erased and a clean slate be obtained.

PRIDE FILES EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION COMPLAINT AGAINST PACIFIC TELEPHONE

On February 6, 1974, the PRIDE FOUNDATION filed a formal complaint with the San Francisco Human Rights Commission charging employment discrimination based on sexual orientation by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Pacific Telephone has stated to the press and to staff of the Human Rights Commission that the company does have employment policies and practices that discriminate against persons based on their sexual orientation.

Pacific Telephone has in the past maintained that the company does not come under the provisions of the nondiscriminatory employment practices provisions of Chapter 12B of the San Francisco Administrative Code. At the urging of THE PRIDE FOUNDATION the San Francisco Department of Public Works has now required that all permits to install pay telephones on public property include provisions binding the telephone company to abide by the provisions of Chapter 12B. Pacific Telephone as the permittee under recent Department of Public Works permit (Works Order No. 96,773) has now voluntarily agreed to abide by the provisions of Chapter 12B.

THE PRIDE FOUNDATION by its complaint filed today is now asking that the Human Rights Commission take appropriate action to require that Pacific Telephone abandon its discriminatory employment policies and practices in regard to applicants' and employees' sexual orientation.

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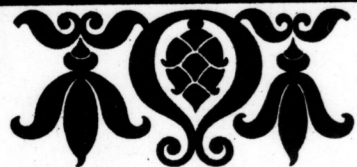
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THE MEN IN MY LIFE

"O body swayed to music,
O brightening glance,
How can we know the Dancer
from the dance?"

A renowned Psychic, to ingratiate himself with his Masonic Auditorium audience, opened with, "One thing I know for sure: San Francisco is the LAST civilized city in the world." APPLAUSE! One supposed the expert in parapsychology came to this "flash" via ESP. A torturous hour followed of banality, confusion, and boredom (the next significant applause erupted when he said he would be finished shortly). On our way out some friends, yawning their sophistication, noted how his knowledge of the here and now was more sure than his graps of the beyond. "At least he recognized America's greatest city," said one.

"Not so," I interrupted. "San Francisco is not the ultimate oasis of civilization."

"And just what is it lacking, Miss World?" I hung back, fingering my car keys, stalling, waiting for my private sorting process to cough up a print out. "For one thing... it lacks dancers... as I've met them and known them and cared for them."

This larger-than-life dancer of mine is a fiction, a sum of many partners, a composite portrait of memory's many snapshots: Las Vegas, Hollywood, New York, Paris, London spawn and support the breed. Road companies aside, the species does not thrive in San Francisco.

One awakening to the dancer took place in a hotel in Syracuse, N.Y.; I was an emerging 19. The family had come up from Manhattan on the 20th Century Limited for a cousin's wedding. Somewhat bored, I wandered out of the mid-afternoon reception to get some cigarettes in the lobby. As I stepped out of the elevator, I stared at a beautiful man who was staring at me. He turned and followed me to the front desk... and however those things happen... I was soon lying beside him in his room. He was part of a dance troupe appearing at the hotel. Who he was, whatever became of him - all past in the past - one picture remains of that wedding day; a sharply defined body, supple and tanned, propped against the white

pillows, his strong arms crossed behind his head, his dark eyes tasting me, sadly... hopefully. Like stepping away from Goya's 'Maja', I showered, dressed, and returned to the complaining families (nineteen year olds are always in a hurry). "Where've you been?" "An hour to buy cigarettes?" The bride's inner glow was anticipatory; my own, the warmth from having tarried awhile with Eros and Dionysus (I was old enough to glimpse certain strange and wonderful dimensions). That afternoon began a life-long romance with The Dancer, sensitive, sensual, and sweet. Again and again I have found similar characteristics: radiant bodies that are firm yet soft; boy/men who are full of themselves, yet who spill over and explode in giving themselves away. From their circus lives they gleam much camp wisdom which passes on as camp lore (as one chorus boy told me, "we never sleep with anyone from Boston; they're too screwed up.")

Eric Marlowe, one of New York's great beauties of the early 1960's, who at 21 had his own penthouse apartment on Central Park South (in the block between the Plaza and the St. Moritz) dazzled me. With the way he carried himself, as if ever prepared to accept the Blue Ribbon for Best of Show. With his body, layered satin over steel. Haughty and vain (I liked even those traits... in Eric they fit). He used to squeeze me in between his bigger fish (I liked him even for that). One darkening afternoon, slipping into trousers, I noted how I was putting on a little weight around the middle. His eyes slowly inspected the lines of my body, professionally, clinically: "A person who uses his body as you do has an obligation to keep it in shape!" That line I've tacked up on my mind's bulletin board: to live by its message: Sex is a giving before it is a taking, and the primary gift is a body pleasing to behold. Dancers know these kinds of things.

Gypsies, from Broadway hoofers to premier dancers of the Royal Ballet, I've found carefree and clannish, generous and easily crushed... all a bit mad. Their surface/stage life is oftentimes brief, cut short with damaged joints, irreparable tears and sprains, with arthritis (see a handsome man, chin jutting proudly, walking with a cane, and chances are he once danced). Many are destroyed by the stage-door admirers who want to carry them away from the "loose"

world of the theater. Many over-drink and overdrug. Aging ingenues can always find some summer stock show somewhere; musicians are ageless, singers always have the church choir, weddings and funerals. For a chorus boy that fateful day arrives - too old for even the pink lights and layers of make-up to prettify. Once a generation, perhaps less, a show like "Follies" comes along needing older dancers to play the has-beens while their ghosts in youthful splendor dance behind them. A few become choreographers, a few open dancing schools in shopping centers, a few latch on to tired screen stars or become some ex-sex-pot's eighth husband. One in ten thousand is gifted with his own dance company as was the boy lifted out of the "Lido" chorus line by France's great film star, Jean Marais (plus a villa built in the shape of a G for George) I met this fabled Botticelli beauty at a Fire Island gayla - he was everything legend said he was. I took his hand; shyness took my tongue and nerve, and I slouched away. Bittersweet, for friends later told me that George would have carried me back to Paris if only I had given him the rhythm.

I like to think I am today the better man for every dancer I ever danced, for those who tip-tapped me into glitter, for those who tangoed me into richer ripening. I toast this airborne breed for living higher than high, these gypsy moths that grace OUR world... wherever brighter candles glow.

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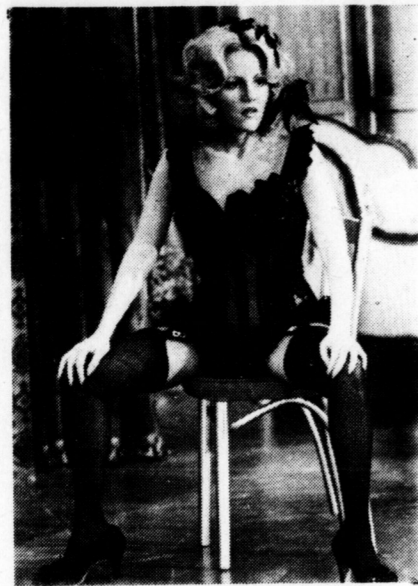

What Mel Brooks did to the theatrical world in "The Producers," he now does to that sacred cow of the movie world, the Western - in his newest big screen epic, "Blazing Saddles."

Mr. Brooks does not know the meaning of the word subtle and hits the audience with every corny, outrageous, campy and fun gimmick he can think of while keeping together this saga of the first black

sheriff in the West.

"Blazing Saddles" opens with a gorgeous panavision vista of desert with appropriate titles - vintage WB - with no less than Frankie Lanie wringing out the title song ("They conquered hills, they concorded grapes"). We move in to a work-gang of blacks and chinesebuilding a railroad track. The white boss-man encourages the blacks to "sing a nigger work song, you know like

when you was slaves". He's greeted by a most sophisticated version of "I Get A Kick Out Of You." From then on the hilarity mounts in this tale of the unscrupulous villain, Hedley Lamarr (devilishly played by TV favorite Harvey Korman) and his plan to take over the town of Rock Ridge and get the land cheap so he can sell it to the railroad company at an outrageous profit.

Into the scene comes Bart, a black, who is sent to Rock Ridge by Gov. Leptomane (madly played by Brooks himself) as their sheriff in hopes that the town will be so upset about having a black as sheriff that they will leave town, enabling Hedley to make his move.

But Hedley and Lepotomane haven't reckoned with the resourcefulness of Cleavon Little as "Bart." He finds in the jail a reformed gunslinger turned drunk, The Waco Kid (Gene Wilder in one of his "calmer" roles). With the help of the Kid, Bart overcomes Mongo, the town terror (Alex Karras) and becomes a hero in the eyes of the townfolk. They finally all ally together to combat the band of evil tough guys recruited by Hedley to destroy the town of Ridge Rock. Under the leadership of Slim Pickens, the bad guys find it tough going with a fight that goes on and on, even on to the next set.

The ending itself is just so way out, I don't want to disclose it but you have to see it to believe it - I will tell you that the climatic fight does contain a very funny dance rehearsal by swishy director Buddy Bizarre (Dom De Louise) of "The French Mistake" with some very funny, if stereotyped, gay humor in the midst of the fracas.

All the people of Rock Ridge seem to be named Johnson - including a Howard (One Flavor Ice Cream Shoppe), Van, Olson, and Gabby Johnson. Of course much is made of the name of Hedley Lamarr, especially when the bad guys plead alliance to Hedy Lamarr.

Standout in the cast of zanies is Madeline Kahn as Lili Von Shupp, the Teutonic Titwillow. Ms. Kahn is currently riding on an oscar nomination for her role as Trixie Delight in "Paper Moon" and with "Lili," who is well on her way to becoming a leading film comedienne of the 70's. Her devastating take-off on Marlene Dietrich ala "Destry Rides Again" will long be remembered and her musical number "I'm Tired" should insure a



giggle upon hearing "Falling In Love Again" again.

The humor in the film is very "earthy" with an "R" rating due to the language, I'm sure. At one point Korman calls Ms. Kahn - "The Teutonic Twat," and there are generous tossings of "ass," "fuck," "shit" and other former film naughties.

I'm afraid to say much more about the film as since it's mostly a series of sight and sound gags, telling them would spoil the surprise. So if you like your humor broad and don't blush too easily, then you'll probably have a ball with "Blazing Saddles."

Must dash off now as have a rehearsal with Bellita, we're doing a remake of "Silver Skates."

This year's event is to be held at Bimbo's on June 22nd. Tickets go on sale May 10th on a non-reserved basis.



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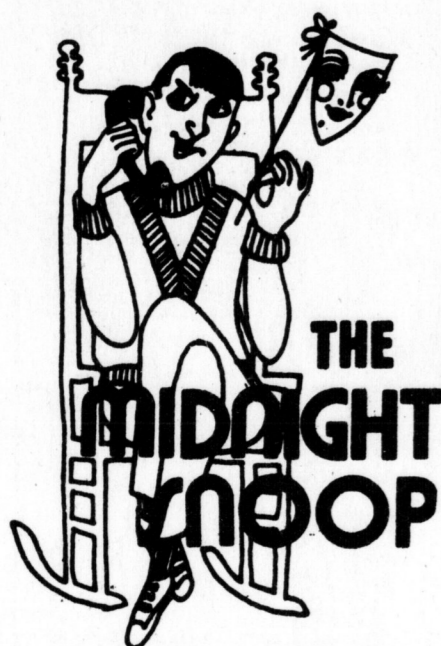
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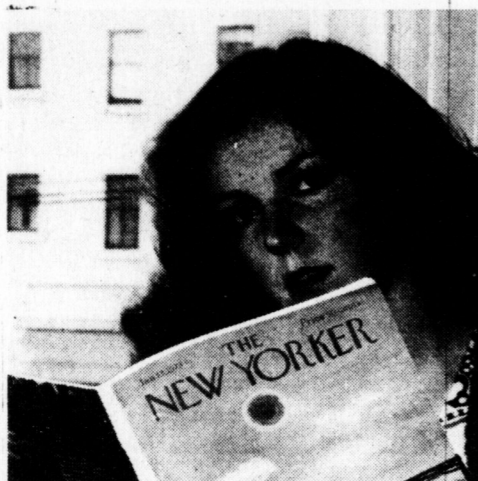

Two highly attractive performers named Mary Cleere and Chuck Zinn brought a nostalgic revue entitled "Sing for Your Supper" to

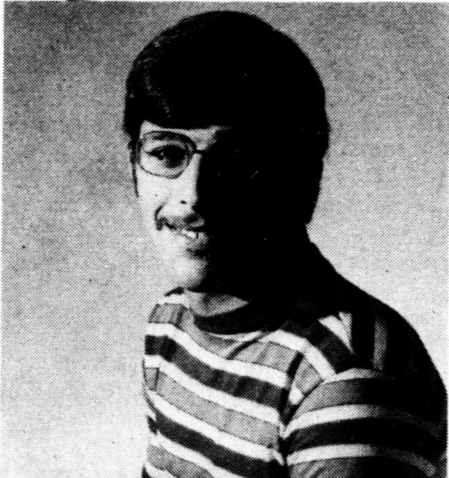


MARY CLEERE - A perky stunner with a big voice.

THE MINT for two nights only on Feb. 23rd and 24th. THE MINT is divided into three separate rooms, dining room, piano bar and front bar, making it very difficult for any performer to be seen from all sections of the club. A small stage was erected in the piano bar facing the front bar, so people in the dining room almost never saw anything except the performer's backsides or a quick profile. However, the audience on the Sat. night show was attentive and the show moved rapidly enough that interest was held

for the fast forty minutes.

Mary Cleere is a stunner. A perky redhead with a big talent, there is no excuse for this lady not to be steadily employed in a small intimate showroom, such as the Hyatt Regency Lounge or GOLD STREET. She needs a relaxed, close atmosphere because the lady is not a hard-sell, socko entertainer, but has a pleasing personality and lets her voice carry the dynamics. Her "bag" seems to be the show tunes of the 30's and 40's, and she is a fine delineator of Porter, Gershwin and Rodgers and Hart. She sang an enchanting "As Time Goes By," belted and tapped her way through a jazz rendition of "Puttin' On The Ritz" and tore the joint up with the complete unedited original version of Judy Garland's "You Made Me Love You." Miss Cleere has a smooth, rich voice capable of either belting or caressing her lyrics and she generates excitement.

Chuck Zinn, on the other hand, works very hard with a synthetic stage personality that is almost overpowering in a small room. He generates a nervous energy that threatens to explode at any moment, with tense body, flashing smile and eager vocal punch that works very well on an uptempo rock number like "The In Crowd." "Nobody Does It Like Me" from "See Saw" is great material but lacked the socko build that would sell it and the Bobby Short classic, "I'm Throwin' A Ball Tonight," just didn't work. The "SeeSaw" number would have worked much better if Mr. Zinn hadn't chosen to sit on a stool, which indicates a relaxed casualness, and had used his physical energy to help punch what is a very intense number. However, Mr. Zinn is not a nightclub per-

former but a stage one, giving Miss Cleere the advantage, and in their duets they blended together nicely. A more interesting arrangement of material would be if Mr. Zinn chose more current numbers and presented a counterpart of old and new, letting Miss Cleere assume the oldies and Mr. Zinn the modern. This would also broaden the appeal of their show; as it stands now, the repertoire of the 40's limits them, both young vital performers, to appealing to an older crowd that appreciates vintage material.

Bob Bendorff lent fine accompaniment at the piano, and taken as a short nostalgic revue, it was a pleasant evening with a sensational new "find," Mary Cleere, and a potentially exciting club performer, Chuck Zinn. Their last song was "Sing For Your Supper"; I hope they got at least a choice filet for their efforts!

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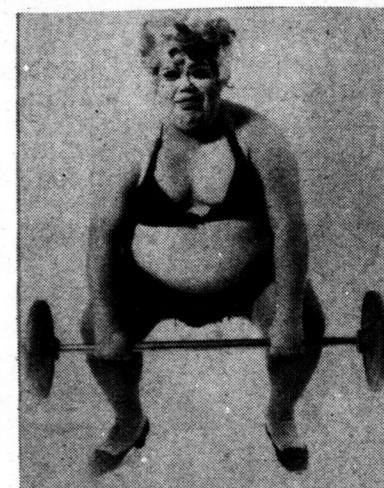

A PRISON DRAMA WITH
LIMITED APPEAL!

"The Ballad of Dangerous George," now at the Artist Enterprise Theatre, is the first attempt by playwright Kenneth Whelan. His drama deals with the 60's problem of racial unrest in a state penitentiary, the explosive conflict of white Neo-Nazis verses the Black Muslims, and the ultimate killing of the play's main character, George. Although, Mr. Whelan spent 15 of his 41 years in prison, his play is more reminiscent of events other than of his own personal experiences. The recreation of in-

cidents that happened during his confinement at San Quentin bare a strange similarity to those surrounding the still controversial death of George Jackson. The author, on the other hand, denies that the play is in any way related to Jackson's tragic death.

The dialogue of the drama is strong and laced with obscenities, not to mention the realistic flavor

or the authors' obvious first hand experiences as a prisoner. As a first attempt, Kenneth Whelan has produced an eye-opening look into prison life, however, it is already a dated manuscript that will have little or no social value in a few years

The play begins at the end, as the body of George Jones is placed in the prison yard as a warning to all inmates that any escape attempt will be handled in the same manner (implying death). The action then shifts into the flashback of events that lead to the fatal death.

As George Jones, Al White, is most convincing as the hustler, who violated his parole and has been returned to prison after a two year absence. He is immediately confronted with a social structure totally different than what he remembered. Gambling and homosexuality are no longer the pre-occupation of the inmates. The blacks have organized into a political force and the whites have joined forces in opposition, thus leaving George as an outsider pressed to take a side. "I'm a free man," he quotes, "neither black nor white." He is eventually caught up in the political holocaust and in a desperate attempt to save the day, is shot to death.

Unfortunately, the author failed to establish a smooth transition from good to bad in his character of George. Everything happens at once. George sides with the Black Muslims, violence explodes, George is shot and the play ends. All this action takes place within minutes and renders the drama's conclusion meaningless and coupled with the soap opera quickie ending serves only to confuse the main issue.

David Feldshuh's direction is professional and consistent. His staging is especially rewarding in the scene where the prison psychologist (Derek Charnly) is mocked and harassed by the inmates and also the scene where Billy befriends George.

Among the cast members there are many fine performances. The two most memorable are Ray Ashby, as the devilish, joke-making prisoner Bootnose, and by Chris Persky, as the sensitive boy, Billy, who befriends George.

Judging the production in its entirety, "The Ballad of Dangerous George" is a good effort by the whole company and technical staff, its appeal, however, is limited. M.A.

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SB.39 - ANTI-GAY

Dear Assemblyman Sieroty:

It was with the greatest surprise that I recently learned of the existence -- much less the passage by the Senate -- of SB 39 with its Sections 9303 and 9310. I understand that the Bill is now under consideration by the Criminal Justice Committee before introduction to the Assembly. I hope that it is progressing well and that, finally, the State of California that the courts can get their teeth into.

For years we have pussyfooted around with Penal Code 386 and 288a, never quite knowing for sure how the law would work because of the reluctance of police departments and district attorneys to test its inherent unconstitutionality resulting from its basically discriminatory application against one group of citizens (homosexuals) but not against another (heterosexuals). In fact, records will show that there have been relatively few charges filed against homosexuals under those codes; that homosexual arrests most often result in a copout plea to a lesser offense because of that hesitance to pit such an obviously discriminatory law against the still controlling Supreme Court decision in *Yick Wo v. Hopkins*; a fear that "Though the law itself be fair on its face and impartial in appearance, yet, if it is applied and administered by public authority with an evil eye and an unequal hand, so as practically to make unjust and illegal discriminations between persons in similar circumstances, material to their rights, the denial

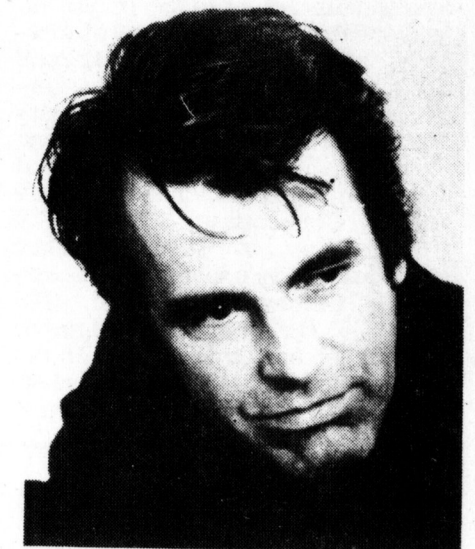
of equal justice is still within the prohibition of the Constitution." 118 U.S. 356, 6 Cup. Ct. 1064. Because of this, the codes have, instead, provided only a vehicle for mere harassment and petty arrest of homosexuals.

But with the introduction of SB 39 and should it pass the Assembly and become law, we will have a law that the courts can work with; a law that will contain no uncertainties regarding its use or application; a law that is straightforward and to the point; a law that bluntly states its intended purpose and use -- to go after homosexuals. Clear. Simplistic. Cut and dried.

At long last, the State of California will have a law that avoids the penumbras and murk of unconstitutionality that has marked the existing Penal Code Sections 286 and 288a. For this law, SB 39, and in particular Sections 9303 and 9310, makes it quite clear that sexual conduct by homosexuals will be illegal in the State of California. With SB 39, we will at long last be getting around the worrisome question of application "by public authority with an evil eye and an unequal hand," and move into more clearly defined areas.

And -- it should take a federal court only about 20 minutes to throw the statute out as unconstitutional on its face -- a much more easily defined unconstitutionality than "uneven application."

There is no doubt that courts have increasingly taken the position that government has no right to interfere with anything between its citizens so personal as sexual relations, and in a rather long line of cases, the courts have reinforced the concept that personal acts by individuals that result in no harm to others are not sufficiently ominous to provide a state
