The Gay Freedom **Day Celebration** 1974

To Culminate with a Large Parade June 30, 1974.

The Gay community of San Francisco has announced plans for more than a week of celebration. It is anticipated by the Gay Freedom Day Committee that 86 organizattions and over 30,000 people will participate in these events. Among the organizations participating will be the Society for Individual Rights, Gay People's Union at Stanford, East Bay Gay, Achvah-Jewish Gays, Emmaus Foundation, Golden Gate Gay Liberation House, the San Francisco Tavern Guild as well as many San Francisco based motorcycle clubs.

Major events span the Bay Area. Mayor Warren Widner of Berkeley has proclaimed Sunday, June 23rd as Gay Pride Day. It will be celebrated by a day long festival in Willard Park sponsored by § East Bay Gay.

At Stanford, The Gay People's Union is sponsoring a provocative week long series of lectures and workshops covering aspects of gay life. One of the many featured speakers is Sheriff Richard Hongisto of San Francisco.

Week long events are also being held in San Francisco. One of the major events here is the world famous softball game between the San Francisco Police and the Gay Community Softball Leaague on Saturday, June

Entertainer JAE STEVENS Slain!

On Monday evening, June 24th, at 11:45 p.m., entertainer Joseph (Jae) Stevens was brutally murdered near Spreckels Lake in Golden Gate Park by a, as yet, unknown assailant. A resident of the area said she heard cries for help at that hour. The body was not discovered until 7 a.m. the next morning, dead of five stab wounds, three directly in the heart.

Two hours earlier, at approximately 5 a.m., Mr. Stevens car was spotted in Hayward in an area where there had been a high incidence of rape attacks and was pulled over by a deputy sheriff. The car suddenly raced away and a chase ensued, ending when the car went out of control and crashed into a house. The young driver, described as having blond, shoulder-length hair, escaped. Jae Stevens started his profes-

sional career eight years ago at The Fantasy on Mason Street as part of "Jack & The Giants." He continued to work in San Francisco in the showroom of the *P.S., appeared on The CONTINUED NEXT PAGE

During July, a series of auctions will be held at various bars on each Monday Night and Tzarina Luscious Lorelei will hold a Groovy Guy Contest later on. The B.A.R. and Camp Awards on July 7th at California Hall Will be the first major event for Operation Concern in an effort to raise \$10,000 to continue the work being done by Mr. Jim Stoll, the psychiatric social worker now employed by Operation Concern and housed in the Family Services Agency at 1010 Gough Street for the express purpose of counseling gay persons seeking his help. The Board of Directors of Operation Concern hope to expand the 20-hour work week of Mr. Stoll to 40 hours, or hire another gay counselor to give 20 hours more

service to the gay community. Emperor, I Marcus Manulis is the Chairman of this year's Circus again and heads a huge committee of volunteers from various sections of the gay community of San Francisco and in conjunction with the G.D.I. Club of San Francisco who are furnishing an abundance of manpower to assist in this mannoth fund-raising project to date.

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With that line up working for the community, it is expected that this year's Circus will be the best ever, a worthy cause for a worthy objective.

Gay Chamber of **Commerce** Formed

What started out as just another meeting of the Community Guild last Sunday night turned into a pledge by that newly formed association to devote considerable effort in helping firmly establish the Gay Community Building and the Guild foundation.

The sense of responsibility to the gay community seemed to even overshadow the original purpose of the association. The members feel very strongly that if the gay community does make an effort to Buy Gay then the gay merchants and professionals must in turn show their appreciation by offering not only good value and service but by turning some of their energy and gains back into the gay community.

The Community Guild members have already started joint advertising and joint buying. Other programs initiated are: group insurance, a soon-to-be published Directory of Business, and a monthly business newsletter edited by Harvey Milk who has over 8 years experience writing financial and investment studies for several major stock brokerage houses. The Guild was given its initial

push by the long established Tavern



Guild which for over a decade has 5 been one of the strong forces in the gay community. The T.G. realized that there was a need for a similar association, divorced from the liquor and bar industry, which could not only help each other but could be another strong guiding force in the community. With that in mind the T.G. helped in the formation of the C.G. and then stepped out of the picture.

Interm officers of the Community Guild are: President, Bob Ross: Treasurer, Bob Iacini: and Secretary, Harvey Milk. The annual dues for the Guild is set at \$24 per year but all who EMPEROR I MARCUS surrenders his royal blood to join now will only have to pay the July-December charge of \$12. An investment of some 46c per week for one more step in creating a gay economic power. The timing of the Guild's announcement had been delayed to this week to coincide with Gay Pride Week.

A Bloody Mary for Your Blood!

Despite the fact that the Gay Community is admittedly sexually active and representative percentage has had hepatitis and other "no no" diseases, more than sixth unites of blood were donated to the Tavern Guild's first blood bank drive last Thursday (June 20th) in the Cristal Room of the *P.S. Restaurant.

The Irwin Memorial Mobile Blood Bank's doctors, nurses and technicians with facilities for eight donors to give simultenously, worked in an atmosphere of joyful jovialty friendliness. The *P.S. provided coffee for the donors while the Tavern Guild picked up the tab for those who felt they needed a "bloody mary" to replace their donated blood. Commencing at 11 a.m., the facilities operated until 5 p.m., during which time approximately one hundred



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would-be donors offered to give. while only sixty units of disease-free blood was placed on deposit for the account of the Tavern Guild. Most gratifying was the fact that Capt. Joe Flynn, in command of S.F. Police Dept., Northern Station, arrived with eleven of his "finest" as did Officer Ray Carlson of the Police Community Relations Department, all of whom gave towards our total. Also responding gladly to an invitation to donate was San Francisco Supervisor John Molinari, a consistent friend of our community. Because of the great need for whole blood during the summer montlhs, the Tavern Guild will repeat its blood donor program and asks its friends to give toward its account which is in reserve for You. "What greater gift can a person give then his or her own blood that it might sustain the life of a fellow human being."☆

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With such a great demand for gay c ounseling service inSan Francisco, Slaughter states that "success obviously brings about other considerations: if demand for this service continues to grow, we may be forced to consider that there is a need for a full-time counselor."

It is in view of this that one of the goals of the Operation Concern July fund-raising is to raise the money to pay for additional counseling service. In addition, plans are being jointly made between OC and FSA for the purpose of applying and receiving matching funds from state, federal, or local sourc es in the form of a grant.

"The kinds of problems he (Stoll) is working with cut pretty much across the human spectrum. The largest number are seeking help for relationship difficulties, depression, sexual identity problems, and other identity concerns such as gay lover relationships," says Slaughter

"An interesting sidenote is that he has received many letters about this program from all over the country. Along with comments about the program he has had invitations to speak, requests for him to be involved in projects and discussion groups." It is Operation Concern policy that the whole range of gay mental health is our own area of service to the community and therefore welcome his participation in these additional programs.

It is apparent from FSA's regular reports to Operation Concern that:

1. There is a tremendous demand for professional gay counselling in San Francisco.

2. The Operation Concern program has helped considerably in this area, as indicated by Stoll's heavy caseload AND THE QUALITY OF HIS WORK.

3. There is still an even greater demand for gay counselling than the current OC program can handle.

4. Operation Concern should try, if it all possible, to expand its counselling service to include a full-time counselor.

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With July fast-approaching Operation Concern, along with its friends in the community have many events planned for the enjoyment, and satisfaction of the community and for the purpose of raising funds. 

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



"The only reason I didn't change my name is I've worked so damned hard to build DeDe Warwick...I've been introduced as Dionne Warwick. In the beginning, everyone thought it was her or her nickname...I had a guy in New Orleans who came to the door, where they were charging \$5.00, laid down \$3.50 and said it was all he had. They told him it was \$5.00, he picked up his money and started to leave, turned around and said, 'Who's here?'. They told him DeDe Warwick, he laid out \$5.00 and said 'Goddammit, she better be good!' "

Appearing at Jackson's Penthouse for 2 weeks, Miss Warwick reduced audiences to stomping, cheering ardent fans from a crowd (on night I saw her) that was blandly indifferent in the beginning, looking like they were stuffed and paid to sit there. 45 minutes later, even fighting a hoarseness caught walking in the evening mist, DeDe Warwick had them standing, yelling, "Oh, yeah, sing it!" and generally behaving in a fashion usually reserved for rock festivals. After working as a single for five years on the East Coast, she joined her



famous sister for a year and a half as a backup singer, and about a year ago started working again as a solo act. With her full, rich voice, powerhouse energy, laughing eyes and instant communication with her audience, she turns the subdued Penthouse into a gospel revival meeting. She's playing the Penthouse as a showcase, and mid-way through our interview, it pays off. Her manager comes in ecstatic to tell her Harrah's wants her for the big room in Reno/Tahoe. Is she surprised? Not really, she knows she's going to make it. "When I really click, I want to do the big houses (wish granted), so the people with me can make substantial salaries. But I personally prefer the smaller rooms, with a 250 top... Dionne's a superstar. I'm a star but not the star I soon will be." Such a comment by most people would be embarassingly egotistical, but when DeDe says it, you know she just means she knows she's good and that sooner or later the Big S will happen for her. And anyone who's seen her knows she's right.

There's nothing hard or calculating about her. She's 27 years old and been around the business long enough to know. She says, "I'm very happy" and I, always on the lookout for another Lillian Roth story, comment, "How dull!" and we both crack up. "I hear ya!" says DeDe, "Life is so



Dionne Warwick, a superstar sister.


simple to me. People complicate life...My mom said, 'DeDe, if a tree says, "Hello, DeDe," you say "Hello tree." And I always have...I dig me. Take me as I am or not at all." The atmosphere is very casual and relaxed, there is nothing of the driven I - must - prove - myself - to - be - the biggest - of - them - all sucess-crazed career woman about her; she has 8 or 9 men constantly working for her career and she trusts in their judgement. She just sings. "With all those men always with me, there are times I feel smothered, but it's always been with love. I have Bettina (her aide de camp)

with me. I had to have a woman around to relate to." As long as we're on the subject of men, I ask her what kind of men turn her on? Ahhh, no hesitation at all. "Billy Dee Williams! I've known him since I was 16 years old and he still turns me on. A beautiful man, not just physically either. And Richard Roundtree. Oh, and Paul Newman. He does it all. It's sinful for a man to look that good!"

I'm apologetic as we approach the inevitable question, but DeDe smiles tolerantly and says, "I know." At the first mention of sister Dionne, she throws in "And yes, we're friendly" without me asking. Shucks, another hot angle shot down. The two sisters from East Orange, New Jersey, were both backup singers, along with two of the Sweet Inspirations, for Burt Bacharach in the early days, and Mr. Bacharach locked in on Dionne's voice and the rest is, as they say ... "Dionne's a nice lady. As kids, everything we pursued was in the same direction. Dionne is a pathfinder for me, then I break out and go running. She's my biggest fan and vice versa. We work together on our acts... I think more gospel remained with me probably because of her training with Burt. Bacharach music is not easy to sing. He's a fantastic writer, the greatest. We both trained as gospel singers in church, singing all our

lives... Gospel music to me is a total freedom. If you go for a note and you can't quite reach it, go anyway. It will come if you really believe it. It is the truth. Most of our music today is gospel because it tells the truth, it's honest... I think Dionne sometimes would rather be as free as I am. I get a chance to have more fun." I mention that you cannot compare them either as singers or performers, DeDe having a lower, fuller sound ("definitely true") and working with a more intense energy. Again, and DeDe agrees, it is the difference of Dionne's success in the Bacharach style and DeDe's complete freedon of choice musically. They have both sung at various points in their careers in each other's styles, then gone their separate musical directions. To compare them is ludicrous and unfair, especially since each digs the other's style. "I must be free to interpret. I believe in rephrasing to where it's mine, but I have a lot of respect for composers. I'm flipped out over Neil Diamond and Paul Williams...I'm an inspired

singer." DeDe Warwick had two gold records, million sellers, "Foolish Fool" and "I Want to Be With You." "I shouldn't say this, but I hated both of them. I kept saying 'I wonder why they're buying it.' Oh, God, you're not going to print that, are you? (Yep!)

Oh, go ahead, it's true." She left Mercury Records and is now considering offers from other companies. "I may be with Brut Records, a division of Faberge. After not recording for over a year, I've still got the major people interested in me. That's a great compliment." Does it matter to her if she has another million selling record? The eyes light up and dot the exclamation marks—"Yesss!!! Iwant a trillion seller record! Get the T, that's more than a million . I like records, listen to 'em myself. I want to be heard!"





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Andy Warhol Frankenstein


When the name "Warhol" is attached to a film, it's usually not your ordinary run of movie. Such is the case of the current "FRANKENSTEIN" playing at the Bridge and the Music Hall. Altrhough Mr. Warhol's contribution to the film seems to be in name only and a box officer, booster, "FRANKENSTEIN" is the creation of Paul Morrissey who turned out the last few films hearlded with the "Warhoil" name ("Flesh," "Trash," "Heat," "Lamour).

Mr. Morrissey's "FRANKEN¶ STEIN" is entertaining in a ghoulish sort of way with many touches sly humor typical of this school of film. Although much more money was spent on this one then the last films, "FRANKENSTEIN" still has a "B" look about it and at best is second-rate Hammer.

The plotline is simple—as it is in most of these films. Baron Frankenstein (Udo Kier) wants nothing more out of life than to build by hand a race of people whose parts are "borrowed" from other people. Contribution to this aim are his tongue wagging, eyeball rolling assistant (Arno Juerging) and the monster in this case, two monsters-Srdjon Zelenovic (Boy Zombie) and Dalilia DiLazzaro (Girl Zombie). In films of this type there's always a hero and in a "Warhol" production who else could play the hero but 'superstar,' Joe Dallesandro. Mr. Dallesandro's speaking voice is enough in itself to make the film a comedy. Against the heavy middle European accents of the rest of the cast., his dem, dese. dose" Bronx accent stands out like an extended intestine.

Also in the film is the central female who is the "bitch" of the "Warhol" film—in this case, Monique VanVooren—sweetheart of the jet set. Personally I would have loved to see Zsa Zsa Gabor run rampant in this role. Miss VanVooren just didn't hold up to the past "bitch" girls live Viva,

Warren Beatty returns to the screen in a new suspense thriller, "Parallax view." This is the best film of it's type I've seen since "Manchurian Candidate" many years ago. It's a political film involving assassinations and a certain Parallax Corp. which trains men to become paid assassins.


Warren Beatty is witness, along with Paula Prentiss, of a political assassination in the Space Needle of the Seattle's World Fair restaurnat. Time and the courts rule that there was no evidence of conspiracy in this killing and the case is closed. But mysteriously people who were there are being found "accidentally" dead. Ms. Prentiss comes to Beatty and discloses here theory to newsman Beatty that there is indeed a conspiracy but she is unsure of why it is continuing. Beatty takes it upon himself to work undercover with only his boss, Hume Cronyn, knowing the truth. He infiltrates the very well-organized Parallax Corp. and sets out to expose them only to find part of a giant conspiracy himself.

The film is taut with suspense and has many exciting moments. The closing sequence is very reminiscent of the climax in "Manchurian" yet manages to have it's own originality.

Beatty is excellent in holding the film together as it is only his character that is dominant. Others in the film have basically "cameo" type parts with Ms. Prentiss doing a superb job with her small scenes.





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THE MEN IN MY LIFE by Paul Francis-Hartmann

Fey Derry Lad

There are times we involve ourselves with calamity: larger-than-life men bearing a larger-than-life price tag. The turbulance of their lives batters the souls of ordinary men. Prudence would counsel we steer clear of these treacherous waters, yet life's voyage would be ever so much more humdrum. Some bruised memories, a shattered psyche, a hemorrhaging heart are often all one has to show for the adventure before survival insists we pick up whatever shards of ourselves remain and stagger homeward. The trick is to know when to get off the runaway carousel, soon enough to be still able to echo Miss Gouch's "I've lived!"

It was a peaceful April night, another balmy evening at the Colville Pub on the King's Road. One of my

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mates whispered that the "Irish lad" who had been standing some minutes on my left wanted to meet me. I turned and began the melodrama of Desmond: a man at war with himself, with his family, and with half the Irish nation. Who could tell me in that jovial, civilized Chelsea pub I was entering a war zone and that six months later I'd be flying out of Belfast, a casualty of that Celtic barbarism.

I should have remembered one English friend's warning that "you can never trust the "Irish" as soon as this solidly built, sandy-haired fellow opened his mouth. Instead I fell under the spell of a strong, rich, melodious Anglo-Irish dialect.Desmond had escaped the provincalism of Northern Ireland via a scholarship to Cambridge. Brilliant, talented, witty, he chosen a careein in broadcasting over advertising. Withal the acquired English traits, he retained-almost Professionally- the Irish underpinning: the inveterate story teller, the Puck, the boon companion, the raucus heavy drinker. In all, a charming spell binder. The next few days recklessly careening around the Kent countryside in his open Alpha Romeo should have told me something. I merely closed my eyes and held on. I was too, with hatred, anxiety and sorrow-all too enchanted.

Desmond had been covering the Irish civil strife for a London paper and T.V. network; he had come to London for five days of R&R. And I became his furlough. I matched him whiskey for whiskey, wit for wit, charm for charm (we Americans have our own, strange as it may seem to pair, high spirited, romantic, immediate.

On my return to the States, I was bombarded with extravagant, vibrant letters: "It's unnatural kind of spring bittered Orange protestant patriot; his this year. Belfast now looks like a small shop had been fire-bombed blitzed city, the people worn, haggard, three times. His son saw the conflict in

The long-term effect, the paralysis, the hopelessness are horrific..." A barrage of transatlantic phone calls at 4 A.M. sometimes sober, more often not. He repeatedly claimed I was his one security and sanity...and hope. He needed me and I agreed to spend Christmas in beleagured Londonderry (I had read a lot of Hemingway).

We met again in London, four days before Christmas. A flurry of last-minute shopping, a retrieval of old haunts and old feelings. A whiskey enwrapped flight to Belfast and two days of seeking to induce cheer into a cheerless community. A Riotous office party at the BBC where playing Catholic anthems brought up short half of the crowd. The Protestant war songs which followed nettled the other half. I was continually probed for my religious affiliation, prodded for my sympathy. We raced from pub to party, skirting the barricades, stopping at checkpoints to be searched for weapons. I found a people obsessed aswim in a bath of booze. The frenzy was infectious; we made love with desperate intensity, high on hashish and Wagner.

We partied until 8.A.M. Christmas morning. Desmond's family awaited us in Derry at that very hour. I closed my eyes for the hair-raising drive through the morning mist. On ourselves). We were a well-matched the way Desmond mentioned there was no drinking allowed in his home (we had better make a few stops on the way).

Desmond's father was an em-



terms of class warfare, not religious. The son, the youngest and the favorite, to his father's fury identified with niether camp. Before dinner I was taken on a walking tour of the lovely walled-town between father and son. From the one I received the loyalits's history: how Derry had valiantly held out against the Catholic usurpers in the 17th century, the tale of the hero apprentice boys who starved to death rather than surrender, the eventual heroic lifting of the siege by William of Orange. From the other I heard piece by piece refutation and ridicule of the folklore. To the father every Catholic church was a "proven arsenal," every Catholic a traitor. Desmond explained how the Catholics were kept in their ghettos.

The snipping erupted into open family warfare during dinner. Desmond settled some old scores; the father had a few of his own to unleash. A sister mentioned we were supposedly celebrating the birth of the Prince of Peace. She was chewed alive. I tried to call Desmond off. but he was out for blood. I never wanted a drink so badly in my life. It all began to get to me shortly after dinner; I excused myself and went to bed. The dizzying, destructive round began the next day, wherever we went: taking on clergymen, nailing public personages til they cried ouch, fist fights, name calling. I too became fairly adept at the game; one moment backing Desmond up, the next undercutting his attack. I began to detect a change in his attitude toward me...our idyl was souring.

He began to withdraw, then to snarl. My attempts to restore the unity only brought out more spite. The gap widened. It seemed as if I was sinking, we were both sinking. Time to go before we parted enemies. Once back in Belfast Desmond played nothing but Gotterdammerung on the stereo. His mood was black. He snapped, "Somehow the twilight of the gods is a suitable foreground for the distant explosions. But I don't think I'll listen though to the final entry of the Gods into Vahalla. It might be tempting fate too much..." That night he slept on the couch. Was he culpable or innocent? I couldn't tell, for I was losing my point of view.

Sullenly, silently he drove me to the airport. Purposely he whizzed me through the battle-scarred and blackened slums of the city-as if to dare Fate. Gears grinding past English soldiers standing at port arms, burning rubber around sand-bagged check points. I was to be scared, and I was!

Totally blitzed. I arrived back in London; the city was bitterly cold and in the grips of a flu epidemic. With all my friends bed ridden, I checked into the Eaton Court Hotel, their smallest attic room. My body, as if to keep company with my battered spirits, began to fever and ache, and I took to my bed. Lonely, sick, pinned in a freezing closet-sized room, I passed four of the most miserable days I can recall.

Desmond was to teach me that some people are very dangerous. In his case a man who would draw in his prey, charmingly, into the rolling tempest of his life...only to subsequently drive them off. Who knows for what...grist for a black mill (that was once a heart). But then as I stated earlier Desmond and I were a well-matched pair; my rounds were yet to come.

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
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Play Ball!
