

The Castro Arrests

After the initial furor over the mass arresting of gay citizens in the Castro area some of the hue and cry has died down and we are presenting the more pertinent facts for you.

1. Several meetings were set up with officers of the S.F.P.D. and many spokesmen for the gay community. For the most part these meetings were fruitless as the police would or will not discuss the incident openly. Their excuse being that it is not departmental policy to discuss pending court 2. Many other areas were discussed at these meetings and it is hoped that some of these thoughts will help both sides in our coutinuing struggles for gay rights.

3. It was reported elsewhere that one person set up the bail for all arrested, this is not true. Many persons bailed out their friends and or acqaintances, it is also sad to see "so called gay leaders" involved in their own ego trips that no one bothered to check if all parties were out of jail, and 5 persons spent the weekend in the county lockup at the hall of justice.

4. The S.I.R.board met and the matter was discussed at length. After

the motion from attorney John Wahl it was agreed that the defense of the arrested parties would be handled free of charge by the attorneys from S.I.R. as a public service. They are to be commended and we would publicly like to thankthefollowing members of the Bar for their work on behalf of this community John Wahl, Don Banks, Rick Stokes, Bob Mann, Dave Clayton, B. J. Beckwith, George Applegate and Lloyd Taylor.

5. At the first pre-lim trial hearing on friday Sept 13th all defendants pleaded not guilty and a pre-trial hearing was set for Thursday Sept. 19th.

6. Also most people have shoved under the table the fact that another 19 persons were also arrested in the park area around the corner on the Friday and Saturday night of the same weekend. 15 persons joined together in solidarity and pleaded not guilty in another courtroom and the judge dismissed all the charges. The other four in another courtroom pleaded guilty to a lesser charge and were then dismissed.

Of all the charges placed against the defendants in both cases, not one was for any type of sex crime.

8. With every one shouting to set up legal defense funds, we should hold back and see exactly what money will

be needed and then raise it as a community effort and not by individual groups and or organizations. We do feel however that some sort of fund-raising should be set up to help refund the bail money to all of the defendants, as many of these people cannot afford to put out the \$25, \$50, or \$100 bails that most of these charges required.

9. The community relations meeting in the Castro Valley area:

Several hundred people attended this meeting, and it should be noted that there was a very belligerant mood in the air. The chairperson Thomas Edwards, self proclaimed gay spokemens, read a statement denouncing Harvey Milk and the B.A.R. for its reporting of the incident in its last issue. This statement was greeted by ieers, catcalls and general booing by the assemblage, Mr Edwards has a right to his own political views but he should also realize that others are also entitled to theirs. While we do not condemn Mr. Edwards, we think he should be more realistic in his attitudes, while most of our police are honorable men there are still too many with built in prejudices and bigotry to give the S.F.P.D. a complete blanket

approval.

This meeting again did not discuss the Castro incidents but it did air a lot of other grievances from both sides straight and gay.

One of the main grievances was the massing of many gay people on Castro Street in fromt of several businesses and people cannot get through the crowds on the sidewalk. Another was the complete disregard for decency to others in the manner of wearing apparel, some of it so close to being indecent exposure. Perhaps some of our brothers should consider that we are not the only people living in the Castro area and respect the rights of others, and they in turn will help to respect ours.

In closing let us hope that many people in our community who work so hard for so many, will be able to set their political goals, aspirations and thoughts as well as their egos aside and honestly try to work together for our common fight- gay rights.

While the attorneys for the defense have several witnesses to the incident - more are needed. PLEASE contact them through S.I.R. 781-1570.

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


tub-folk...some waiting to be discovered, some to see, others to do what one usually does at the tubs.

"My best friends are my ex-lovers and wives. It's the only way I'll do it. I won't hate anybody.'

Wakefield Poole, a San Francisco resident for over 2 years, is sitting in his rustic porch with overhanging flora and fauna surrounding him, the epitome of the free spirit. "I do whatever I feel like doing. I don't want to make Boys in the Sand 40 times. No way. I've had fantastic offers to re-make another version, even write a play of it. How could I? There was no

script to it... I am going to write a play about what happened leading up to the filming of Boys in the Sand, when I was staying with 3 sets of lovers in a house on Fire Island. Incredible!" Wake, a double Pisces ("Looneyville!"), is the producer/ director/writer/distributor of porno film classic Boys in the Sand, Bijou and his newest, Bible!. He is the

only other man besides Walt Disney to distribute his own films, plus finance them himself (with partner Marvin Shulman). "I want every movie to be better than the one before it. God knows, \$5.00 is a lot of money for gays, for anybody, to pay. Everybody thinks I'm filthy rich. It's suicide to back your own movies with your own money, but that's the only way I want

The 38 year old Mr. Poole never set out in life to make porno flicks. That's all very recent, when he got bugged at the quality of porno films being shown and decided he could do better (and did). For many years, he toiled in the Broadway wineyards as a dancer/choreographer after leaving the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo. His first Broadway show was Tenderloin with Maurice Evans ("a dear"), one of those Broadway flops that record collectors keep hoping will someday be revived. "I blame the failure of that show on George Abbott. He did not want to do the show, all he wanted to do was be on the tennis court. Mr. Abbott took things out of that show that were fabulous." Next he was brought in to do the choreography for Richard Rodger's Do I Hear A Waltz. with English director John Dexter brought over to direct his first Broadway show. Mr. Poole was listed as "choreographic associate", a title that meant nothing since there was no choreographer until Herbert Ross was brought in on the road when the show was in trouble. "John Dexter screwed me with both elbows. Nobody connected with that show knew my contribution. I would present him with

my ideas, then he would tell me to get lost when the producers were around and present them as his own. It's the most unpleasant experience I've had with a human being." There was Unsinkable Molly Brown with Tammy Grimes ("the cunt of the world... and I hope she reads this." I mention libel suits, his eyes twinkle and he says, "She has to prove she isn't.") and No Strings with Diahann Carroll. "No Strings was a wonderful concept that didn't visualize. I love Diahann Carroll and would kiss her feet if she were here right now in front of you. She's a very strong lady. She's what I try to be, she's herself. We used to go to 42nd Street movies after the show. Imagine! Walking down 42nd Street with Diahann Carroll. She used to tell me that my grandmother must have fooled around with a black man once,

While working as Joe Layton's assistant and dancing in No Strings, Wake also staged all shows for a year and a half at the Pepperment Lounge in New York. "I made tons of money. I made more money doing those shows than all the year-and-a-half in No Strings". There was also Noel Coward's The Girl Who Came to Supper, when Wake was in the Bradford Hotel in Boston during tryouts and spotted Marlene Dietrich sitting downstairs in the bar. He told Mr. Coward, who raced down to the bar, embraced Marlene and said, "Show me your legs! Miss Dietrich calmly hoisted her skirts and said, "They're still young, darling." And

in me."

there was the opening night of George M (Wakefield did work a lot you may have gathered) when he was en route to the cast party held at the Plaza Hotel. He was standing in the elevator when Tallulah Bankhead swooped in with the eternal cigarette dangling from a mile long holder. The elevator

operator politely announced there was no smoking in the elevator, Miss Bankhead furiously stubbed out her cigarette saving, "Oh my God, the Plaza's the only good thing left in New York. I don't want to burn it down!"

Despite all this heady employment, there was one period for a year and a half when "I couldn't even get arrested... my business manager, Marvin Schulman, carried me for a year and a half and never even suggested I take a job as a waiter or something. He knew I had to make it my own way. He's one of my closest friends in the world and my benefactor and we hardly even kiss. He now is my partner and has 50% of all my films. I recently told him "the problem with the partnership is we need more kissing, more touching.'

While appearing on the Garry Moore Show as a regular, he met and married Nancy Van Ryan in 1962. Four years later, they separated ("we just got a divorce finally this year") and two years later after that, he met Peter Fisk, who became his lover ("we just broke up about a month ago, very amiably". To prove it, the phone rings

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

and it's Peter.) Peter will be remembered as the first boy with Casey Donovan in Boys in the Sand and will soon be seen in Mr. Pool's current project, Moving, which Wakefield describes as another film in three separate segments a la Boys ("I'm queer for 3's. Three segments in each film, three is my lucky number, I don't plan it, it happens subconsciously.") and says of Moving, "I don't think there's even been a movie to show S&M like this one does. I've tracked that segment to Strauss' A Heroe's Life. A lot of people are going to hate that because they want me to get away from using classical music for my fuck movies. But if it's right for my head, it's real."

"I think in the long run, Bijou is going to be the classic more than Boys in the Sand. I wanted to make a hot abstract porno movie. I hired Bill Harrison by telephone without ever seeing him because I liked his head. I like to film organically — I set up things and then let nature take it's course. Bill Harrison in that movie is you, he's me, he's everybody... Did you know that I received the Best and



Worst Film of 1972 Awards from SCREW MAGAZINE, both of them in one year, but I had to share the Best with Deep Throat because Al Goldstein said he couldn't give the best film of the year to a gay movie." I mention that I found Bijou less than totally satisfying. Wake replies, smiling, "Isn't life?"

"I love movies. There's never been a bad movie. There's always something to get off on, even if you just laugh at it. Wait a minute. There's one film that there was nothing to get off on, The Rise & Fall of the Roman Empire, the worst movie ever made. It was so bad I couldn't even laugh, not even at Sophia Loren's dirty costumes... I heard Frank Capra once say, 'With the introduction of sound, motion pictures stopped their progression. You have to LOOK at films. Sound is a supplementary thing. I want to get into sound next. I always have one line of dialogue in each of my films (except Boys) to prove I can do it... You cannot read subtitles and see an Ingmar Bergman film. He's the one filmmaker that should be dubbed." He mentions that one of his favorite films is Chabral, s Riders in the Rain, which some friends didn't understand as it unrolled and Wake told then, "Relax, don't become paranoid." He loves the film because it is full of puzzles. "The guy is freaky for circles, zooming in on the barrel of a shotgun, the number 18 on a door with the 8 made of two circles, a shot in a bowling alley, a bald man putting a stocking over his head, becoming a full circle... I have a lot of little puzzles in my films. There are hundreds in Bible!. You have to look at every little detail in each scene." To illustrate, he shows me the goblet Samson has to drink from in Bible! when he takes Delilah's potion. There is no flat base to it, so it sits upside down on the drinking cup; once filled, it cannot be set down without spilling the contents, hence, Samson has to drink it all before relinquishing it. Or astute filmgoers might notice Delilah never opens her mouth until she goes down on Samson. Mr. Poole does not expect the average filmgoer to notice such details, but it's fun for puzzle addicts ("which I probably picked up from Stephen Sondheim").

Bible! is a silent movie; it was made as a tribute to silent movies. I like the whole of this film, because I tried to structure this one as a progression, starting out with innocence (Adam & Eve segment), then becoming a little more jaded as well as funny (Georgina Spelvin as Bathsheba), the third to be outrageously erotic (Samson & Delilah), then back to innocence (the Immaculte Conception)." The film, which has just opened at the **Richelieu**

on Geary Street, cost well over \$100,000 ("I told Marvin "just let me know when to stop") and although X rated, "it's really not a porno movie." It's four short vignettes from the Bible from a woman's point of view, a "woman's picture". He is not pleased with the X rating ("there's not a hard dick in the movie, no beaver shots, there's not a thing in bad taste") and was told by the censor board that he could receive a R rating if he cut 2 minutes of Adam "humping" (their term) between Eve's legs and cut out the "implied fallatio" (again, their term) of Delilah, plus a second and a half when David lands on Bathsheba. The told Wakefield, "If you cut that, we'll give you an R rating... of course, we realize it would ruin your movie." "and then I see someting like The Exorcist with an R rating!"


The unquestioned star of the film is Devil in Miss Jones Georgina Spelvin, an old friend of his from their years together as dancers. Miss Spelvin tested, then came to dinner one night to read a scenario at Mr. Poole's New York loft, one enormous room with a 6' bathroom in one corner. "We sat around and talked and talked and talked because we both talk too much, and finally she said, "I'm going in the bathroom to read this!" She did, and from time to time we heard hysterical laughter coming from the bathroom, then Georgina came out, her pants still unbuttoned, and threw her arms around me. She said, 'Thank you so much...and I don't even have to fuck!'...She's one of the finest people I've worked with." Having seen the film, I hasten to assure you that Georgina Spelvin's hilarious Bathsheba in Bible! will be long remembered.

Well, what next for Wakefield Poole after his success as a dancer, choreographer, and porno trailblazer? "I don't know. Every four or five years, I go through a total change in my life. I'm in my third year of filmmaking." It should be very interesting to see where Wakefield Poole will go from here. One thing for certain, whatever he decides to do, it will be done with great humor and exactly the way he wants it. A charming, easygoing guy, Mr. Poole marches to no drum but his own... an individualist with a zest for making it his own wav.☆

THE MEN IN MY LIFE PAUL-FRANCIS HARTMANN Lawrence of Arabia

I have explored around the life of T. E. Lawrence (as would the fabled archeologist himself) sifting the shards and dust of biographies, picking through his autobiographic Revolt in the Desert and the larger classic Seven Pillars of Wisdom. My purpose was primarly to unearth artifacts revealing some of the essential Lawrence (not to prove that Lawrence "was" or "wasn't"). Secondly, whatever he was, did he have something to give us beyond a diary of military campaigns or a subjective account of the Arab revolt, something beyond a National

Geographic desert description or an anthropologic tract on Bedouin mores.

Lawrence of Arabia has stirred twentieth century imaginations as have few other men. In our time he was the hero of ultimate proportions: beautiful, brilliant, brash. A brief comet of youth and strength. He was worshiped by his desert bodyguard who at his zenith numbered close to a hundred of the wildest, boldest, most colorful raiding party ever assembled in the Middle East. This band of cut throats rode the fastest and finest camels of all Arabia, billowing out in every imaginable color - save white, which was reserved for Lawrence alone... flowing bridal silk embroidered in gold.

In comparison, when it comes to exploits, scope and scale of the mission, PT-boat Kennedy and San Juan-hill Roosevelt look like cub scouts. Lawrence makes Charles Lindbergh look like a mere grease monkey, George Patton, a cab driver. Whatever one can say critically, Lawrence was ever larger than life. larger than fiction, larger ever than Peter O'Toole and every Hollywood resource to create the last word in epic

films. Throughout his short life he challenged authority and got away with it: he defied convention upon convention, while the men about him never ceased to adore him. His courage seemed limitless. One area not to be ignored were his fearless writings on the then unmentionable subjects: the love/sex relations between men. On these issues he wrote with appreciation if not admiration.

World War I England wasn't far advanced from the thinking of the 1895 trial of Oscar Wilde, whose novel The Picture of Dorian Gray was entered as evidence as a "certain immoral and indecent work." After Wilde's sentencing, his plays and books were banned, and later in attempting to publish The Ballad of Reading Gaol (the work based on his two years in prison) Wilde knew it would be automatically suppressed if it appeared under his own name. It was decided the author would be simply C33 (C for the cellblock in Reading iail, one 3 for the floor his cell had been on, the second 3 for the cell

E. M. Forster, the celebrated English novelist, wrote Maurice in 1913, dealing with man-and-man love. The book had a happy ending which while imperative to Forster's intent kept the novel from publication. He showed it to a carefully picked group of friends and dedicated the manuscript "to a happier year" which might have been 1971 when the work was released posthumously. This tale of love between the all-English-boy and a gameskeeper unfolds in the blandest of Edwardian skirting the issue. Nothing more than a decorous, refined fairy tale. Forster was neither going to jeopardize his career nor shock the reading public of 1914 with forbidden fruit.

"OUR YOUTHS BEGAN INDIFFER-ENTLY TO SLAKE ONE ANOTHER'S FEW NEEDS IN THEIR OWN CLEAN BODIES -- A COLD CONVENIENCE THAT, BY COMPARISON, SEEMED SEXLESS AND EVEN PURE. LATER SOME BEGAN TO JUSTIFY THIS STERILE PROCESS, AND SWORE THAT FRIENDS QUIVERING TO-GETHER IN THE YIELDING SAND WITH INTIMATE HOT LIMBS IN SU-PREME EMBRACE, FOUND THERE HIDDEN IN THE DARKNESS A SEN-SUAL CO-EFFICIENT TO THE MEN-TAL PASSION WHICH WAS WELDING OUR SOULS AND SPIRITS IN ONE FLAMING EFFORT."

Two of Lawrence's favorite and totally devoted servants were the love-fellows. Daud the hasty and Farrai the beautiful, "a soft-framed creature with innocent smooth face and swimming eyes." They were a famous pair, always in trouble, and Lawrence took them into his service because "they looked so young and clean." He wrote of their relationship: "they were an instance of the eastern boy and boy affection which the segregation of women made inevitable. Such friendships often led to manly loves of a depth and force beyond our flesh-steeped conceit. When innocent they were hot and unashamed. If sexuality entered, they passed into a give and take, unspiritual relation, like marriage." Later when Farrai, suddenly "dark and hard of face, leaden-eved and old" brought Lawrence news of Daud's death, the now commandor-in-chief of the Arabian Army noted, "these two had been friends from childhood, eternal gavety: working together, sleeping together, sharing every scraps and profits with the openness and honesty of perfect love."

Farrai's bereavement ("the others offered themselves to comfort him. but instead he wandered restlessly, gray and silent, very much alone") gave rise to these further speculations:

"... MAN'S PSYCHIC SIDE COULD BE SLAKED ONLY AMONGST HIS PEERS. WHENCE AROSE THESE PARTNER-SHIPS OF MAN AND MAN, TO SUP-PLY HUMAN NATURE WITH MORE THAN THE CONTACT OF FLESH WITH FLESH.

WE WESTERNERS OF THIS

COMPLEX AGE. MONKS IN OUR BODIES CELLS, WHO SEARCHED FOR SOMETHING TO FILL US BE-YOND SPEECH AND SENSE, WERE, BY THE MERE EFFORT OF THE SEARCH, SHUT FROM IT FOREVER. YET IT CAME TO CHILDREN LIKE THESE UNTHINKING BEDOUINS, CONTENT TO RECEIVE WITHOUT RETURN, EVEN FROM ONE AN-OTHER. WE RACKED OURSELVES WITH INHERITED REMORSE FOR THE FLESH-INDULGENCE OF OUR GROSS BIRTH, STRIVING TO PAY FOR IT THROUGH A LIFETIME OF MISERY; MEETING HAPPINESS, LIFE'S OVERDRAFT, BY A COM-PENSATING HELL, AND STRIKING A LEDGER-BALANCE OF GOOD OR EVIL AGAINST A DAY OF JUDGEMENT."

Shortly thereafter, Farraj reck-

lessly led a charge into the face of a waiting Turkish patrol. He rode up to them, halted, and was shot out of the saddle. When Lawrence found him, the boy was dying. "Happy to die since he no longer had care of life. As it was an agreed bond never to leave a badly hurt comrade to the fiendish Turkish cruelty, Lawrence administered the coup de grace. That evening the men were wrangling as who would ride Farrai's camel the next day. Lawrence interrupted, "I was bitter that these perfected dead had again robbed my poverty: and to cheapen the great loss with a little one I shot the poor beast with my second bullet."



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


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






Bible!

This was my week for the soft-cores — that's an X-rated yet non-porno film. Both were very interesting and strangely enough nongay. I say strangely enough because the first one was Wakefield Poole's Bible!". Those of you who follow the



magic of erotic celluliod will undoubtedly remember Mr. Poole's previous works, Boys in the Sand and Bijou. With Bible!, he departs from the hard core male works and brings his special brand of artistic quality to what is essentially an erotic film dealing with a retelling of biblical stories, just different modes of telling and decidedly different than written interpetations.

The film is set to open this week at the Richlieu and it's definitely a film I recommend to those who like exciting and unusual visual trips with sex treated with beauty and humor.

Starting with a very lyrical and sensual segment on Adam And Eve (played demurely by Bo White and Caprice Couselle), we next venture into the funniest telling of the tale of David and Bathsheba on record (Susan Hayward's version pales compared to the rompings of Georgina Spelvin and Nicholas Flamel). The longest and "trippiest" sequence involves telling of the story of Samson and Delilah. This is done in a very Felliniesque manner with an exquisite music score. The tag tale is almost a blackout skit between the Archangle and the Virgin Mary and puts a new twist on the Immaculate Conception. Gloria Grant is marvelously expressive as Delilah and Brahn Van Zetten as Samson adds himself the stable of gorgeous men that Mr. Poole has unleashed on the screen.

As usual with his films, this one is done with only his one line of dialogue trademark and is all filmed to music. This effect works better than it has in his previous two works, Getting away from the actual sex act, Poole manages to fill the screen with sensual images without ever going too far not because he's afraid to but rather because he doesn't need to. I guess that's it for awhile, I won't short summer hiatus and dashing down with Del Vecchio to catch a glimpse of





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A Little Night Music

A TOTAL THEATRICAL TRIUMPH!

An actor appearing in Stephen Sondheim's *Follies* once said, "The only people who really appreciate Sondheim are people in the business.

He's never written a show for the general audiences." It's a valid criticism; Anyone Can Whistle, Company and Follies are all far too demanding upon an audience to allow Middle America to "enjoy" and feel "comfortable" watching them. Mr. Sondheim demands his audience think, have a sophisticated sense of humor and listen attentively to every lyric, all of which qualities are relatively unheard of in musical comedy... until recently. With A Little Night Music, Mr. Sondheim and author Hugh Wheeler have given us a gentle and literate modern operetta that is flawless theatre and should appeal to nearly everyone.

In lilting walztime, A Little Night Music has swept into the Curran Theater starring Jean Simmons and Margaret Hamilton. Based upon Ingmar Bergman's slight film, Smiles of A Summer Night, director Harold Prince has retained the setting of turn of the century Sweden and teamed with Messrs. Wheeler and Sondheim to show us the bittersweet folly of lovers, young and old, when the Swedish summer night smiles three times — once for the young, who know nothing, once for fools, who know too little, and once for the old, who know too much. It is a fragile piece, with no lavish production numbers, no huge chorus screaming about Welcome to Sweden on a Hot Summer Night!, virtually no dance numbers per se and no grab-thecurtain - tear - the - house - down showstopping songs. It's simply glorious!

Headlining this wonder is the exquisite English actress Jean Simmons, whom I have always regarded as one of that handful of Hallmark actresses (when you care enough to get the very best). Miss Simmons, for whom time has stood still physically, does not disappoint in her first Broadway musical. As Desiree Amrfeldt, the middle-aged actress who longs to exchange the dressing room for the sitting room, Jean Simmons is magnificent. The cool elegance with the mischievous twinkle in the eye, the toying with her lovers and the wistful summation-ofa-life Send in the Clowns are all dispatched with the aplomb of an actress more than worthy of her vehicle, commanding her audience with qualities seen all too rarely these days, glamour and femininity. Her singing voice is a little huskier now; her beauty and talent remain incomparable.

George Lee Andrews, as Desiree's ex-lover now married to an 18 year old virgin who intends to remain that way, brings an excellent voice and wry delivery to complement Miss Simmons and provide us with a strong, interesting leading man. Their duet, You Must Meet My Wife, is a droll highpoint of the evening.

When casting was first announced, I had my reservations about Margaret Hamilton as the aged narrator-courtesan Madame Armfeldt. Miss Hamilton is well known for her portrayals of harpies, busybodies, Tip Top ladies and of course, Wicked Witchs who are mean to Dorothy and Toto. But , Madame Armfeldt is encrusted class, a woman possessing great dignity. My fears were goundless; Miss Hamilton invests Madame Armfeldt with Old World elegance and snappy humor. It is a performance that adds stature to an already illustrious career.

The supporting cast is equally first-rate. Andra Akers, with her Ilona Massey brittle sophistication and biting tongue, scores solidly as the unhappy bitchy Countess (with some of the best dialogue of the play), Ed Evanko is properly stuffy as the

Dragoon lover with the double standard, Stephen Lehew is exceptional as the love-tormented staid son Henrik, Virginia Pulos manages to keep the young wife from becoming a caricature (not an easy achievement with a trilling one-dimensional vapid ingenue to play), and Mary Ann Chinn makes Petra the maid one of the most vital and interesting characters of the evening. All the voices are superb, including the fine quintette that comment upon the action in the manner of the Greek chorus of old.

The costumes by Florence Klotz and Boris Aronson's beautifully fluid sets combine with Mr. Prince's direction and Patricia Birch's graceful staging (it's hard to believe she also staged the energetic Grease right next door) to make this the smoothest, handsomest production I've seen. Forgive me if I wax rhapsodic about A Little Night Music because I'm sure there are certain people who will prefer the old-fashioned razzmatazz musical (which I also dearly love), but it's very seldon a critic can just sit back and totally enjoy a production without finding flaws... and Night Music, the third of the Civic Light Opera season, has no flaws worth mentioning. "Charm" is a tired overworked word, but that's exactly what Night Music has — great charm. For the thinking audience, it's a must!

The Glenn Elliot Show





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sauerkraut with some cooked sausages; often potatoes are served with it, or on it. Tasty (and hot) mustard is seldom far away.

It is quite possible that this culinary stand-by did originate in or near Strasbourg, a North-Eastern French city, situated almost on the borders with France, Switzerland, and Germany. The Rhine actually runs 'Safeway'

Truly, this is such a common dish, that writers about French foods most often overlook it; it is not completely unknown in America, although it is designated in a reverse order of importance here, as 'Franks and Kraut'. One notable feature, both here and in Paris, Munich, or Switzerland, is that this dish, aside from being 'tasty and filling', is very economical And, just now, there seems to be a need...

through a part of the city; on the 'other side' is Germany. The place known around the world for many food specialties, and among the most common is sauerkraut. While Texas has not vet laid claim to it's origin, another country has. A serious foods authority, (deGouy), tells us that sauerkraut '...dates back to the building of the Great Wall of China, where the laborers ate it to combat dificiency diseases resulting from a diet consisting almost solely of rice...' Then, it seems, Tartars brought it to Mittel-Europe, and so to Strasbourg, to Alsace, to France, Germany, Switzerland. Golly! And all this time we just believed it came from

aware of what this ordinary vegetable dish is: in simple words, it is 'pickled cabbage'. Your cook does recall an earlier day when it was sold from great barrels at the old Central Market... (is that still there...?); one could get a 'mild', 'medium', or a 'strongly well-aged' sauerkraut. Now, it seems, one only buys it in cans, and it's all quite mild. In case you're interested, a salt-brine 'draws out' the raw cabbage juices, which form a 'sugar'. A

bacteria creates and ferments, forming lactic acid, which gives the 'kraut' its distinctive flavor, and preserves it. The stuff is, actually, 'good for you'. It is rich in Vitamins A, B, C, and in phosphorous, calcium, and iron, etc. How many of the odd things that we eat, give us so many goodies? Having recovered from these statistics, one may inquire, '...how do you cook

Cooking the Kraut

With most American cooks, the answer to this is very sad; they dump the can of sauerkraut into a pot and heat it; then dish it up. Well, that's easy. A French or Alsatian cook will use a heavy pot (like enamel, teflon, stainless steel; never iron, which does peculiar things to wine cookery); and gently fry 6 slices of bacon in it. This turned often: fried not-too-crisply. Take bacon out (take pot off the fire) and set aside. 2 med. sized onions are sliced thinly; if you like it, mince a small clove of fresh garlic very fine, add to onions; these are lightly fried in the bacon fat, over moderate heat. As they become just browned, pour off almost all of the excess fat from the pot (save it!). Meanwhile, 4 or 5 well-packed cups of canned sauerkraut (about 2 med. lar. cans) are drained; even squeezed with the hands, to get out most of the juice. Add this drained kraut to the onions in the pot and stir together. Let simmer over low heat. Add 2 small cooking apples; peeled, cored, sliced thinly; a scant ½ tsp. of caraway seeds; an 1/8 tsp. coarse-ground black pepper. Mix all together in pot; stir with wooden spoon or fork; pour in about 2 cups of some mild dry, white California table wine, such as a Chablis. Gallo makes a very good one, moderately priced. Cover the pot, leaving the spoon in: let it all simmer about 45 minutes, occasionally shaking it together.

Meanwhile, prepare the potatoes and the sausages. The potatoes may simply be plain-boiled, peeled halved; or — much nicer — un-peeled (but well-scrubbed) small potatoes. Cook potatoes to just done, not too well.

There is a large selection of sausages possible; large Polish sausage (Kielbasa) are sometines used; more often just good quality wieners. If really peppery sausage is preferred, one could try some Mexican Chorisos. All the larger sausages should first be cooked about 10 min. in near-boiling water; then they are well-browned in a

skillet, in a little of the saved bacon fat. For a novel taste, one might even try some Fresh Italian Pork sausages; of course, these must be thoroughly cooked. Whatever your choice, all the sausages are finally well-browned in a big skillet, just before serving. Some cooks use not only the sausages and the bacon, but add a nice slice of ham to the top of the dish, as it is served. (or several smaller slices). These are heated, but have been pre-cooked.

And that's the way it comes to the table; a mound of savory sauerkraut; the sausages or wieners or whatever, laid about: the bacon strips with them. And, possibly, slices of ham on top. The potatoes may be served around the platter, if it's very large, or in a separate dish. And there you have it. an unsung hero of 'French Cuisine,' and not too costly either.

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

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
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Lambda Gay Community Center

The Golden Age of **Oueens**

In San Francisco, in the late 30's, the big thing was 'booze'. With a handy supply, a girl could do almost anything, or anyone. People would drink almost anything for a drunken kick. Almost everyone knew 'how' to make gin, and while many did do it at home, more piss-elegant parties preferred to call a bootlegger. Practically every building in the City housed one or more; and they all bottled the stuff in faked Burnett's White Satin bottles. Mother never did know where those came from, though for many months she delivered a lot of them.

Gin, as you may know, can be made by mixing 1/3 water, 1/2 grain alcohol, adding a little juniper flavoring, a little glycerine 'to smooth it out'. And this is almost 100 proof! Most manufacturers soon used 2/5 alcohol to 3/5 water, for a more potable product. The delivered bottle (a quart, I believe) cost \$2.00 plus a tip to the carrier, who also got .25 from the maker. Business thrived.

Well, 'things' were cheap in those days; would you believe that one of the City's most popular French restaurants (Gireard's; there were two, one on O'Farrell across from Old Tait's, one on Market St.) sold a complete table d'hote dinner, family style, for .35 cents. On Thursday and Sunday you could get chicken, with everything else, for .50 cents. With coffee and a glass of wine! So help me! Rooms in not-too-bad small hotels were \$3.00 a week. Speaking of hotels, there was a small hotel on Bush, just off Grant Ave. where the old Chinaman always cackled — at the appearance of two men - 'You wanchee 'rong time' or 'sho't time' loom. . .?' We loved it!

And Gawd! Was Market St. gay! Local belles all had to make the scene each evening; the 'promenade' was marvelous to behold. Recall a mad 'girl' called Anne Pennington, who would stop anything male, on the pave, and purr: ". .would you like a fancy boy, tonight. . ?! Of course, nine out of ten ignored her, but that and went in for weird hair-do's. boy lost. Mother remembers when she once

and glossy, and combed back a la Chester Morris; the other side was pale blonde, and all in little French curls. She was really 'too much', but that expression had not yet come into use; my teenaged amanuensis tells me.

'it's dead, man! like dead!. . Anyway, the time was before the 30's.

When groups of clattering queens, on Market St., grew a little too shrill, a big, handsome, burly (Irish!) policeman would look at them sternly and might remark, pleasantly enough, "Come now, bhoys, . . . let's move it up an down. . 'Often he'd make somewhat suggestive, but always humorous, gestures with his club, . . .er, baton.

Of course, in those days, 'the promenade' was to show off new outfits', hair-do's, jewels, or the like. One might latch on to a trick; quite often one who'd pay. Not at all like so many years later when the tired, rejected and dejected, stand about on the 'meat block', demanding \$2 or \$20 for their flaccid (at best!) services. Ah, well. . .

The 'other' Law of those days consisted of Officers, Reed, Crystal, and Jennings, all in plain clothes. This was the real Vice Squad, and principle among their assignments were gambling and 'hooring' (as all Irish police had it. . .) on the part of 'street girls'. You must remember that in those days, right up to late '41, there were literally dozens of nice, clean, neighborhood whorehouses. Small hotels. with a Madame and usually or five girls. These were all over downtown San Francisco; some more elegant houses were farther out. Many of the smaller houses were just off Market St.; some toward North Beach, many South of Market. The Mission and the Fillmore had their share, too. While these places were never lavish, often forbidding drinks or drunks, the 'service' was 'homely', and — the price was right! (\$2.00, with a tip for the girl. . .) At one period, and for about a year, Mother lived (not worked!...) in one of these houses. Right on Market St., between Mason and Leavenworth; it was upstairs and had entrances both on Market and Turk St., in the rear. I seem to recall that it was the 'Carson'; it was run by two mature and kindly Frenchwomen, Pauline and Ger-10th! She was always in full make-up maine. They really 'mothered' a li'l

Anyway, the 'houses' paid off to appeared with her hair parted in the the beat cops, in the natural way of center, all the way back. The hair on things, and the Vice Squad kept one side of the part was black, straight well-meaning amateurs off the streets.

A policeman could, and would, always recommend a neighborhood house. Along the same line, the Vice Squad was to 'keep the queens down. . ' for the same obvious reason. This was a duty in which they were ultimately and spectacularly unsuccessful; but that's another story.

While really based in San Francisco over the next few years, Mother made the first of her many trips to sea. Met this mad young thing (though older than I..) in the small park at the top of Nob Hill. Mother has always said, '. .to make money, go where money is. . '. A nice clientele parked around this little park, which was next to the City's most exclusive club, and almost 'across the street' from three leading — and expensive — hotels. It was here that Sonny met this scion of a leading local banking family. 'Temp' promptly asked, "where do you want to go. . ?" As Mother expressed no preference, we zoomed down the hill to the Marina, onto a nice, new yacht (the Zaca, later to be Errol Flynn's..) and ended up in the Galapagos Islands. A mad, drunken, trip! Later, on return to San Francisco, a shipping magnate offered to 'fix me up' (a sort of tat for tit!) as a Cadet (officer) on a passenger-freight liner. So, off again, this time to Buenos Aires; jumped ship in Montevideo, hitch-hiked home from port to port, getting back to Market St. a year later. Mother was

Perhaps this would be a good place to add, that - while based in San Francisco, Mother went to sea for the next dozen years or so. Was over 4 years on the Lurline, a mad ship in those days; 500 in the Steward's department; probably 486 were actively gay! No wonder the Islanders called it the 'Queerline'. Then, 8 or 9 trips around the world, on 'world cruise' vessels, and so it went. But, every few months it was back to gay San Francisco. What, dear. . . ? room steward. . . ? waitress. . . ? Hell no! Mother learned to cook, and but good!, and that's another story. . .Sometimes told. . .

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
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"MARCUS WELBY" ANTI-GAY?

Gays Protest TV Show

A forthcoming episode of the television series Marcus Welby, M.D. that deals with the sexual molestation of a 14-year old boy by one of his teachers has been rejected for broadcast by three ABC-TV stations, largely as a result of a coordinated national campaign by homosexual rights groups.

Four regular advertisers have also withdrawn for that episode. They are Bayer asperin, Listerine, Gallo wine

and Ralston Purina.

Bruce Voeller, Executive Director of the National Gay Task Force, said the concern of the homosexual rights organizations was chiefly that "the take-home message of the program was that the rape was a homosexual one," since both the teacher and the pupil are male.

He said it was feared that this would reinforce old myths about homosexuals and plays upon the apprehensions of parents, at a time when homosexual rights legislation is pending in the Congress and about 20

"We feel the program will definitely have a chilling effect on legislation which would protect gays from discrimination in employment and housing," Voeller said.

Although two of the largest affiliates, WPVI-TV in Philadelphia and WCVB in Boston, were among those rejecting the program, ABC-TV will carry the episode October 8, as scheduled, a network spokesman said.

The third station to cancel,

KATC in Lafayette, La. probably acted more from concern with the subject matter than with the alledged injustice to homosexuals, the spokesman added.

Voeller noted that homosexualrights organizations in a number of other large cities, with support from clergymen and psychiatrists, were still attempting to persuade their local ABC stations to keep the show off the

According to Voeller, some of the most reliable studies of sex offenses against children, including those published by the Kinsey Institute and the American Humane Society, have found that child molestation is almost exclusively heterosexual.

ABC executives maintained that the Marcus Welby episode does not deal with a homosexual teacher but with a pedophile, one who has erotic desires toward children. They noted that on several occasions in the program the point is made that the teacher is not homosexual.

The homosexual rights organizations contend, however, the disclaimers do not mitigate the clear homosexual implication in the situation of a male adult attacking a male

Note: Although the above named ABC affiliate stations have cancelled, the vast number of people in America will unfortunately see the show. Markets Minneapolis, Cleveland, Washington, Baltimore, New Orleans and Kansas City have for sure ruled that they will
