Transsexual Sues Bank of America

On February 24th, Robert "Helen" Hazleton filed a suit through his attorney, Dick Gayer, for \$799,250 in Superior Court against the bank for false arrest and imprinsonment, and the resulting physical and mental pain and suffering that he has gone through as a result of the arrest, jail and trial, in which the charges brought against him were dismissed.

Hazelton was arrested on October 29, 1975 at the Bank of America's Van Ness and Market branch, by part-time teller Donald Merkley, who is a member of the San Francisco Police Dept. and "moonlights" as a teller at the bank. (he makes nearly \$20,000 a year as a police officer)

Donald Merkley claims that Hazelton, who was wearing his normal apparel, feminine clothing, i.e., pants suit, blonde hair piece, shows. Merkley claims that Hazelton "fell asleep at the counter (at the bank) and babbled that he had just had a shot, and had fresh needle marks on his arms." In reality, Hazelton had just had his regular morning treatment of Methadone at the Ivv St. Clinic. and his thickened skin coupled with the lack of accessbible veins in his arms (the result of 30 years of heroin addiction), make injection of anything into his bloodstream via his arms impossible. Furthermore, a subsequent urine test at the Clinic showed the complete absence of amphetamines, barbituates and heroin derivatives. As might be obvious, all criminal chrages against Hazelton have been dismissed.



The Family Lobby "Pervert" Haters Exposed

The anti-gay crusaders are at it again, convinced that homosexuality which has been around since the beginning of time — will somehow destroy the world, not to mention Walnut Creek! This time around they call themselves, The Family Lobby. These are the same self-rightous fundamentalist Christians who in 1975 were the Coalition of Christian Citizens. Eighty Christian bookstores across


the state are now distributing petitions,

which when completed may produce 312, 404 valid signatures. That is what is needed by May 3 in order to place on the November ballot a proposition that, if approved by the voters, would again make private, consentual sex between adults illegal. The bill which legalized oral and anal copulation (AB-489) became law on January 1 after being carried in the Assembly by Willie Brown and in the Senate by George Moscone. The major effort of the Family Lobby will be in rural, small-town counties, inland farm areas and small coastal towns. Many people in these areas play close attention to the local police chiefs and mayors and ignore the officials in the "sinful" city. For example, Sheriff Tom Kelly of Trinity County believes the legalizing private sex points to an "outright degradation of morals" that will not be tolerated by "grass root American citizens." He says that the Family Lobby must "arouse the silent majority and appeal to their better judgement to turn around the present

course of the demise of 'the girl next door' and 'Jack Armstrong, the All American Boy'." He is convinced that citizens must sign the peitiion in order to "fight for right and decency . . . things our country was founded on and that the American people have built pride in for two centuries." Although the proposed initiative

petition is titled "Sexual offenses" by the State the Family Lobby people have labelled it the "Public Decency Initiative." The state coordinator for the Lobby is Attorney Robert Sassone of Santa Ana. His treasurer is Marilyn Afeldt of Fresno. Three other attorneys head the effort: James Clancy of Sun Valley, John Cormack of West Los Angeles and David Depew of Alhambra.

Sassone is active in Pro-Life, an anti-abortion group, while Depew is an attorney for the Women's Christian Temperance Union. It is Depew who headed the Christian Coalition petition effort last year in the Los Angeles area.



He publishes, with his mother's help, an anti-gay, anti-alcohol newspaper.

Locally, the peititons and the Family Lobby newsletter are available at two San Francisco locations - The Western Christian Bookstore, 131 Franklin St., and the Christian General Store, 551 Taraval. In Marin, the effort is being launched from two Christian general stores, 2130 4th St., San Rafael. and 972 2nd Ave., Novato, Alameda County petitioners are working out of the Western Christian Bookstore, 1618 Franklin St., in Oakland, and the Bible Bookstore at 4071 Fremont Hub in Fremont and the Bible Bookstore, 2281 Foothille Blvd... Hayward. Palo Also has the Newton Christian Bookstore at 320 California and Family Lobby News may be also obtained from many Christian bookstores in San Jose, including Newton's at 1559 Meridian. In Daly City the anti-gay effort comes from the Western Christian Bookstore at 2386 Junipero Serra.

Bay Area locations for the petitioning effort are significant but the real effort is in counties and small cities that few Californians can locate on a map such as Mendota, Irwindale, Seaside, St. Helena and Turlock. The police chief of Mendota, like many other city-county officials, ignores the constitutional separation of church and state by quoting Biblical scripture on city stationery to support his contention that passage of the Brown bill "hurt us, by lowering our moral laws." He claims that "we will be praying that our Lord will hear the Family Lobby's efforts and convince through hearts the change in this outrageous law . . ." Chief police James Provenza of Irwindale concludes that "the passage of the Brown bill will bring about legalized prostitution by

Fear of a new "Sodom and Gommorah" is rampant in communities like Seaside where the mayor, B.J. Dolan, says that "the common decency and moral fibers of our families are being challenged, eroded and require a direct attack to eliminate the adverse of results of AB-489." Mayor Greta Ericson of St. Helena agrees and calls the legislation of private sex acts "disastrous." Temple City's mayor Louis Gilbertson called private sexual freedom "human pollution" and "a piece of ridiculous legislation tht will be rejected by the vast majority of our citizens who decry the adverse moral trends in our Country." In Pacific Grove, city council member Thomas Drakes says that AB-489 is legalized amorality. He dismisses the gay lobbying effort as the work of "loud spoken minority who would subvert the concept of family life as the basis for the most successful human relationships." Drakes is convinced that "this trend increases crime and encourages a "breakdown in moral and ethnical concepts."

In nearby Turlock ("Watermelon Capitol of the World!"), mayor E.S. Christoffersen is vocal in quoting scripture to justify his contention that homosexuality is "against nature" and 'the work of the devil.

Using the old Christian Coalition mailing lists, Attorney Sassone is mailing out petitions and his Family Lobby News. Although Sassone insists that with Family Lobby "the main issue is not homosexuality" almost all of its literature is anti-gay. Sassone says that the real issue is "public decency" but he stresses that the new sex legislation allows "public school teachers to perform in private sex orgies and still

continue teaching in school." He also attempts to inflame readers of the Family Lobby News by writing that "sex perverts and child molesters" may now be hired as policemen and serve as scout leaders." What he does not say is that there are some gay policemen and scout masters - with or without Brown's successful legislation. Sassone further confuses the issue by inferring that prostitutes and pornographers nowhave a "green light." In fact, the Brown bill did not effect these pro-

A Lobby publication asserts that "sex perverts feel that California legislature can be used to pass legislation to force all employers to hire - and not to be able to fire - homosexuals and other perverts." The Foran bill failed and will be re-introduced in another form in 1976

The Family Lobby is also well aware of gay activist George Raya, who was instrumental in the passage of the Brown Bill. It calls him the "lobbyist for



There is considerable anti-gay literature available for those who enjoy reading it. Sassone mails out a reading and tape-recording list and such material can be ordered from Good Neighbors, Box 73, Clovis, Calif. It includes "Joy" - a hardbound book by singer Pat Boone about a young Lesbian who gave up sex for Jesus; and analysis of how homosexuals use the worship of Satan to seduce young atheists - "Hell on Earth" by Rev. Bob Larson; and a colorful anaylsis of "The Gay Church" in which the writer claims that the Metropolitan Community Church follows the Pentacostal faith, "speaking in tongues and performing physical healings." Tapes available (\$5.50) each include your choice of three "scripture" attacks on homosexuality - Christian View, Straight Answers and Homosexual Arguments. One of the major problems faced by the Family Lobby is that it is attempting to use evangelical and fundamentalist churches to circulate petitions. Strict requirements by the federal and state governemnt state that churches remain non-political in order to retain their tax-exempt status. Attorney Sassone attempts to circumvent this requirement by dealing with ninisters as "citizens." The Christian Coaltition attempted the same thing in 1975 but ran into fearful ministers who saw their tax exemptions being challenged by a San Francisco-based gay group, The California Committee for Equal Rights. Sassone knows of the Equal Rights group, headed by activist

sodomites" and indirectly credits him and other urban gay activists with having considerable influence in Sacramento

When not publishing anti-gay pamphlets and books and recording hate" tapes, the self-righteous fundamentalists are publishing comic books. This allows them to reach the very young and those who like cartoons with messages. The most blatantly anti-gay is The Gay Blade" which has a sketch of a swishy looking, limp-wristed male on the cover. It is 24 pages and can be purchased for only six cents from the Christian bookstore at 131 Franklin St., San Francisco

"Gay Blade" depicts two males getting "married" by a gay minister and

gay activists are shown in a mob demanding their rights. Cartoons also portray a Lesbian, speaking to a large crowd, and several sketches that depict how homosexual activity allegedly destroyed Sodom and Gommorah. The commentary is partly accurate: "Their power structure is widespread. They occupy all kinds of jobs. Their identity for the most part is carefully hidden. Some have been reported to be in high government positions. Homosexualks are invited to speak at clubs and religious meetings. They cry for equal rights - boasting that homosexuality is normal, healthy, a desirable form of sexual outlet." The comic book concludes on how "tragic" the homosexual is and how he and she can escape from that "tragedy" through accepting Jesus. (MCC has an excellent pamphlet that refutes this "scriptural" basis for antihomosexuality).

Sassone sent literature to his reporter which stated that "probably 50% of all suicides and homocides in the big cities can be attributed to homosexuality." This blatant lie was refuted by Suicide Prevention in San Francisco, which says that less than one out of ten of its calls are from homosexuals and that the 50% figure is "preposterous." Gay-related homicides are less than one out of ten in San Francisco, which has a high ratio of homosexuals in its population.

Obvious facts do not bother the Family Lobby people. They go ahead with a claim that "the greatest threat that homosexuals impose on our society is the seduction of children." All recent research literature on this subject clearly indicates that child molestation usually comes from close family friends and relatives - overwhelmingly heterosexual.

Attorney Sassone evidently sees no moral wrong in sending out material which uses material from a Dr. Daniel Cappon, "Canadian psychiatrist." Cappon says that homosexuals are "heavy into the drug scene in many cases, and degenerate too often into sado-masochism and are extremely vicious with one another.' He further concludes that "homosexuality is not a mental illness, but is a moral issue. It is a spiritual illness." That such statements could come from a "psychiatrist" is almost inconceivable

Family Lobby literature also uses a religious writer, David Wilkerson, to relate that he allegedly met three girls in "a Southern city" who related that after reading homosexual literature in a bookstore they had become gay. The implication is that a person can change his or her lifestyle merely by reading. Few psychologists would agree with that contention.

The fearful anti-gay, small-town fundamentalist Christians are now at work in Glenn, Mariposa, San Benito, Plumas and Del Norte - counties that are only vague names to Big City dwellers. They are circulating the petitions that could result in a November ballot proposition. Gay activists are in agreement that it will take a considerable amount of money to defeat an anti-gay measure, if it gets on the ballot. People, even "liberals" are not prone to vote against "morality." Whether the Family Lobby can muster the support they need, is debatable. They had six weeks to get enough valid signatures last year. This year they have three months to do it.

It appears that there is nothing gay activists can do to stop the Family Lobby effort, accept to challenge the tax-exempt status of some involved churchs. Patiently, gay people will have to wait until May to see if the Family Lobby was successful. Will the right to enjoy sex in private - legally - be taken away by self-righteous Christian fundamentalists?

Viral Hepatitis Type A

Viral hepatitis continues to rise in incidence in San Francisco, in contrast with the State of California. Gay Health Board Elections

Elections for the Gay Health Board are being held Sunday, March 7 at the Lurie Room of the Main Branch of the S.F. Public Library. Tornado Down At The VD Clinic

The formation of a Gay Health Board to advise the city's Health Department of our needs has been unfortunately mixed into the attempt of four gay VD assistants to get their jobs back at the VD Clinic. Both sides of the VD conflict have been lax in resolving the problem. Public Health Director Dr. Francis Curry and Dr. Erwin Braff, Disease Control Director, agreed that the election of a Gay Health Board would be a good idea but they were too casual in setting it up. The four time gay employees at the VD Clinic. dismissed VD employees and their allies

were quick to fill a communications gap by announcing the election of the Board on March 7

Fifty people attended an organizational meeting at SIR Center recently to establish a Steering Committee (which anyone can belong to merely by showing up) to advertise and bring off the Sunday, March 7 election at the Main Library (1 - 5:30). Any gay person can vote and there are several sex and ethnic classifications in the 13 person Board to keep it "representative." The literature advertising the SIR meeting was widely distributed - but it was highly inflammatory, calling for the public to protest the firing of the part-Thus some (many?) of those involved in

bringing off the election, are also involved in the Clinic conflict. This fact has made Health Dept. officials apprehensive about the coming election. They feel they should have been consulted about setting up the election. They were "informed" of the election, but did not participate.

Braff is well aware of the outcry that will come if the Health Dept. refuses to accept the elected Board, but this may happen. He says that Dr. Curry would not accept a Board that is "not representative of the gay community" - See letter from Dr. Curry. Ed.) in fairness to that community. Curry will also be watching to see how many people vote - if the turn out is small, the Board could possibly represent only a faction of the gay community. This could result in our health needs being set up with a limited concept in mind. The question becomes will there be public hearings on gay health needs and what kind of proposals will be sent to the Health






Gay Health Project Misunderstanding

It has come to my attention that there has been considerable misunderstanding of my meeting with former employees of the Gay Health Project in Feb. 6, 1976 and of my letter to Mayor Moscone reporting that

tative leaders of the Gay Community. and ask them to form a committee, which represents the entire Gay Community and not a segment, to work with me and the Health Department to plan and develop a Gay Health Program, which will better serve the needs of the Gay Community, especially with relation to the detection, diagnosis and treatment of venereal disease. Also, the Program should include related health and emotional problems. Furthermore, the Committee should decide at their first meeting, how the Planning Committee will function with the Health Department, to develop as rapidly as possible, a thorough, complete and comprehensive program plan which shall be submitted to the Federal government (HEW) for requested.

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

It is the


average person buying a loaf of bread who sees greater and greater parts of that price going for taxes, all down the line, and finding out that the ones benefiting are a handful of priviledged people.

The TG (Tavern Guild) has outlived its usefulness. The bars of San Francisco are not the only businesses which need an organization behind them. San Francisco needs a GAY BUSINESS ASSOCIATION (or some other title as long as "Guild" is not part of it) which would represent ALL businesses in San Francisco whether they be bars, hair styling salons, newspapers, graphics houses, florists,

I feel we should abolish the TG and establish a GBA. Once that has been accomplished, transfer title of the Empress to a Council of Empresses with a Constitution similar to the Office of the Emperor (please don't forget the boundaries of the realm).

Once that has been accomplished, we should set about the process of Building our own community center with all public funds collected to date for that purpose. This center would house the offices of the GBA and other organizations like SIR, MCC, and shop or office spaces for Office of the Emperor, Council of Empresses, and such gay services as B.A.R., and Kalendar, one of more graphics houses. a silk screening company, a quickprinting shop, etc., with a snack bar (operated by BGA) to serve customers and employees of these businesses.

As long as the building will be used for various gay functions, there should be a sufficient number of bars strategically located throughout the second floor. GBA would own the liquor (or catering) license outright and be responsible for quality of drinks, prices, and service, in return for which they would receive all proceeds from the bar to help operate the building.

Two floors of parking in the basement (or lower floors) should be adequate to handle these facilities. If the building were located in an area where parking is a problem in general, the garage could be operated during peak parking periods as a regular bus venture to bring in still more revenue for



Film: Seven Beauties

Lina Wertmuller's new film, opening March 10th at the Clay Theatre, re-establishes her as the "director of the 70's." Wertmuller's jaundiced view of life enables her to slash politically left, right and center while unraveling a frequently hilarious, ultimately repulsive and always cynical tale of an Italian soldier in World War II who ends up as a deserter in a German concentration camp destined for the

meaningless life at the expense of everything we are taught to hold dear. Pasquali Seven Beauties (Italian slang for "hot stuff") flashes back to his macho Italian male upbrining, saddled family. He kills the oldest sister's pimp, chops up the body and ships if off in sections to three different cities, is camp, he saves himself by making love to an obese S.S. bulldyke, and ultimately ends up ordering his Italian Film: buddies slaughtered by joining the

It sounds incredibly grim, and it ofen is, but there are flashes of brilliant comedy, such as the scene chopping up the body done in pure Chaplinesque Giannini as Pasquali. All along the way, Wertmuller softens the horror by touches of comedic genius, but her cynical indictment of the "Man in order" - i.e., the non-thinking, blindly conventional people who follow any strong leadership that offers them the path of least resistance — makes Seven Beauties a bitter pill to swallow. The writer/director opts for a cynical look at the power of the individual to survive. the barbarian that lurks beneath the surface in us all, while bitterly condemning the power structure of leaders who believe "Christ was Santa Claus as a child!" It's powerful, it's ugly it's disturbing, it's Wertmuller attacking at all levels simultaneously, conjuring every emoton possible in her cerebral attack upon her audience. There is a frightening performance by Shirley Stoler as the S.S. bulldyke, but it is Giannini's portraval that ranks among one of the great ones ever to be remembered. Seven Beauties may ultimately repell you, but you'll be fascinated steadily along the way.

Taxi Driver


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
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explores the mind of a psychotic cab driver in New york City, an ill-educated idealist revolted by the human filth he comes in contact with daily. Scorsese examines only the most sordid side of humanity, a world of hookers, pimps, junkies and gangsters. Travis Bickle, stunningly portrayed by Robert De Niro, eventually finds a symbol of purity in Cybill Shepherd, and when he becomes ultimately disillusioned by her human frailty, he seeks to save a 121/2 year old hooker, beautifully played by Jodie Foster. He sees himself as an avenging angel, trying to rescue this child prostitute (who is quite satisfied at her trade) from herself.

The film is exquisitely made, every performance is topnotch (even Miss Shepherd manages to generate a little interest), and I find the script and premise by Paul Schrader vomitous. The final ten minutes, when De Niro becomes a one-man army against the hoods, is stomach-turning in its unrelenting gore; a man's brains are blown out onto the wall behind him in vivid color, etc. There is no sympathy for this demented cab driver, the other characters less so (except Foster), and Taxi Driver ultimately becomes another wallow in the muck and mire of human depravity. It's harsh, it's ugly, but worse, it's a portrait of a psychotic vigilante elevated to hero status. It holds much the same appeal as last year's Death Wish but without justification, the final scene absolutely morally repellent on every level.

New Yorkers are lined up for blocks daily to see this film; they're obviously even more masochistic than I thought.

Stage: Rusty

Rusty, now playing at the new 444 Broadway Theatre, is a modern day gay play by Douglas Dean that parallels that classic melodrama by Dumas Fils, Camille. It takes more than a little getting used to accept the premise that bronzed, bursting-with-health Jack Wrangler is slowly wasting away with Leukemia (consumption being passe in this day and age). But as the play unfolds, you begin to realize that this is probably the easiest premise in the play to adjust to.

It becomes a lot harder to accept that Peter (or Armand), a young college student, has worshipped Rusty (Wrangler) from afar in class, while being exclusively heterosexual, and after two five minute encounters with Rusty (both times of which Rusty is quite rude), Peter decides to sweep all before him and turn gay so he can have Rusty with nary a backward glance. Okay, he's an impetuous kid, Rusty is quite a charmer physically, and while there's no hint Peter has been fighting with his closet, it seems probable. 1. The California Environmental Quality Act sets standards aimed at providing a high quality environment, now and in the future. All state agencies dealing with public projects must write impact reports on any project that may

affect the environment. A private building that is supported by grants, loans or public assistance is also affected. Just getting a license or certificate from a public agnecy may bring one within the environmental rules.

2. You can't dump waste in any river, lake or waterway. New laws deal with certain kinds of water pollution. Laws control oil spills, waste discharge, and discharge of heat.

3. There is control of air quality. Auto emission is only one part of this. Many There are State and Federal laws agencieds control pesticide sprays,




















Empress Flame Busted

Costumes in the traditionof Mardi Gras were in evidence and created an atmosphere for the occasion.


