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

You will note that this paper recommends a "NO" vote on Proposition 15. This proposition is so murky in its reading as to make it unacceptable to us. It is basically an initiative to halt all use of nuclear energy in the state of California. It offers no alternatives to the nuclear power now being generated.

Its main theme is the safety factor in the reactors themselves. Upon inquiring into the actual safety of the plants themselves, most knowledgeable persons in the Bay Area do not think there is any cause for alarm.

Proponents state that we can look forward to the use of solar energy to replace these plants. The actual fact is that solar energy use on this level will not be an actuality for between 5 and 10 years. That means that other sources of energy would have to be utilized (i.e. oil, natural gas, coal or water power). We would have to go backwards and use some of our already overburdened natural fuels.

When in the future solar energy is a reality, then we can move the shutdown of the nuclear plants. Until then, "NO on 15!'




In the controversial Harvey Milk -Art Agnos campaign in the 16th Assembly District, club sentiment was too divided for a choice.

Alice backs two of its members for Democrat Central Committees - Anne Daley in San Francisco, and Jerry Jackson in Alameda County.


Toklas urges a "yes" vote on state Proposition 15, the nuclear safety initiative. On the other 14 state measures, Toklas says "yes" on all except 2 and 10, on which it urges "no" votes on June 8. #2 would give California veterans breaks on state loans for home and farm purchases. #10 would let the state legislature bypass the electorate in issuing bonds.

Some Toklas members perceived a conservative trend in the club by its positions on the city propositions. It said "yes" on Props J, K and L, viewed as anti-labor measures. On court-disputed E, which would mandate firings of striking city workers, it also nearly said "yes" (opinion was too divided for any position). However, the club urged "no" votes on B and D (city employee suspension and inspection of papers fees, respectively). On all other city measures, the club endorsed "yes' votes.






Fire Fighters Endorse Harvey Milk

When Carol Whitehead of Portland divorced her husband in 1971 in Georgia, she was awarded custody of Saturday, May 29th. Application forms father helped support them for one her two small children. The children's year, then stopped all assistance in 1973. During this period, the exhusband harrassed both Carol and the children in repeated attempts, both through the courts and by illegal means. He wanted to regain the children from Carol, whom he calls a "sick lesbian." To escape the harrassment of the father, Carol and her family moved to Jacksonville, Florida, where the man followed . . . with venomous attacks, in a hospital - physically.

In an attempt to gain peace and security from her former husband (who was released from the Army for "mental instability") Carol and her children moved again, this time to Portland, Maine in July 1975.

Several weeks ago on April 28 at 1p.m., Carol got a phone call from the South Portland school where her children attend and was told that a man from out-of-state was at the school with a Georgia custody paper and demanded to remove the children. The custody paper was invalid in Maine, and the school authorities refused to release



the Portland area.

running, contacted a Portland attorney, Kim Matthews. Although a judge has ordered the ex-husband to stay away from the children - who are extremely upset that their father has followed the family to Maine – Carol fears that he may abduct them. Because of what is believed to be hired spies watching her home in South Portland, Carol has made arrangements to resettle outside

Meanwhile, a court case is looming over the custody of the children. By all reasonable standards, the father is unfit to provide other than the most basic financial support to the children. Carol strongly believes that she has been a good and loving mother to the children and that they will suffer greatly if forced to return to the father. Indeed, she believes the father is using the children "as pawns in a war" against her.

Attorneys from both sides have met in Portland and a court date will shortly be selected. For the State of Maine, this marks the first time that an open Lesbian mother will fight in court for the custody of her children, and the ruling will set a precedent for future cases dealing with similar issues (such as a Gay man fighting for child custody.) But the legal costs will be vastly more than either Carol or Kim Matthews, her attorney, can absorb. Without generous donations of publicity and funds from all which Kim feels is necessary will not be possible. To this end, Carol, Kim Matthews and the Maine Gay Task Force are requesting donations - no matter how small - for a special fund to support this historic court case. For the



black, chicano, or asian members of the Steering Committee, and until the last Parade Committee meeting, it had only two women and two Third World gay persons in attendance.

They all complained that the Steering Committee is comprised of "elitists from BAGL and from the Sentinel newspaper." Sentinel newspaper owner Bill Beardemphl has copyrighted the use of the name Gay Freedom Day Parade, and had to date thwarted efforts of others to try and change the nature of the Parade from one of a "mardi gras" nature to one of "gay pride."

Beardemphl himself was instrumental in changing the site of the Gay Fair this year from Golden Gate Park's Marx Meadows, where it has been held the past two years, to a site in a Black neighborhood. The site chosen was a playground and neighborhood park, Hayward Field.

Radical gay leftist elements who work in coalition with the Black community groups were apprised of possible trouble, if nearly 15,000 persons, gay and 90% were to "invade" a Black community park.

At a March parade meeting, the view of the Black community groups was presented to the Parade officials by the Rev. Ray Broshears, radical leftist. His presentation was met with hostility by white members of the committee, but a few did see that it was wrong for a group of middle-class whites to "invade" the Sunday afternoon gathering spot for Black people, forcing them out.

The Gay Parade Committee then voted to look into other sites, as well as to change the Parade route, a move which was opposed by Chairperson, Randy Alfred and Sentinel representative David Johns (Ramon Naruda).

The next site chosen by Bill Beardemphl at another closed meeting at his home, was DuBoce Park, located on the edge of the nearly all Black Fillmore District. Again, Esstelle and Broshears raised the same objections, joined this time by Black Gay Caucus leader, Bill Beasley, who strongly opposed this "honky invasion of a neighborhood playgound." Also, a nearby hospital (Franklin) which is adjacent to the park, was not consulted beforehand. The protests by the radical gay leftists and the lesbian feminists rose, and they took it to the city officials, and threatened a counter-fair and possibly a counter-parade.

This time, Chief of Police Charles Gain joined in, and agreed that it would be most unwise to try and hold such a large function in such a small park in what is considered to be a Black community playground.

Larry Eppinette of S.I.R. and others joined in the fracus, forcing the BAGL leaders and Sentinel staff to relent, and now, the Gay Fair will be held in Golden Gate Park - Marx Meadows, which can easily accomodate 15,000 people and with greater security by the crowd.



B.A.R.T Adopts Gay Rights Policy

In a brief announcement, the management of BART issued a statement that the inter-county transit system voted to include sexual orientation among the protected classifications protected by their stated employment policies

The issue of contractors being required to include "sexual orientation" clauses in their contracts will be brought up in the administrative committee

They are also against "homosexual and they are against "sex orgies . . . heterosexual and homosexual, now legal," and they are against "Living in (sin) Adultery, legalized!"

According to the Family Lobby, 'God said this (consensual sex) is sin, but our legislators say it's okay."

May 9th was the final day for the Lobby to have its signatures turned in the various Registrars' offices at throughout the state. They then had five days for the Registrars to check the Initiatives and report to the Secretary of State's Office.

No signatures were turned in locally and the March Fong Eu's Office know of none elsewhere in the state. This means they must try for the ballot in 1978, by having the signatures validated by June 25th 1976. They will need 312,404 validated signatures, and that usually means they must collect

450-500,000 signatures, and that covers the errors and other defects in collecting signatures.

The main thrust of the Initiative is against the Consensual Sex Law (AB489), signed into law by the Governor last January.

By their own admission, the Family Lobby is "the new name for a group of concerned citizens," which attempted and failed to put a Referendum on the Ballot right after the Consensual Sex Bill was signed; it is the former Coalition of Concerned Christians. They also admit it is an organization which includes church and lay groups.

The state director is Gene Huber, a member of First Assembly of God, Santa Ana. Jimmy Carter's SF Gay Rights Statement

The following is the unedited, complete statement on gay rights made by presidential candidate Jimmy Carter at a May 21, 1976, press conference at the Hilton Hotel. The first question (Do you believe that homosexuals are immoral or sinners, based on biblical teachings; and as President, will you sign Congresswoman Bella Abzug's bill which would add sexual preference to the Civil Rights Act of 1964?) was asked by B.A.R. reporter George Mendenhall. Included are additional comments made by Carter in answer to other questions on the subject:

JIMMY CARTER 'Well, I believe in the Bible teachings. The Bible teaches against Abzug bill), because I don't think it's homosexuality; the Bible teaches right to single out homosexuals for against fornication; the Bible teaches special abuse or special harassment. L.A. Police Chief Strikes Again **BUT IS REJECTED**

Police Chief Ed Davis, LA's notor iously anti-gay official, has been attacked by his friends on that city's police commission for his refusal to work with the L.A. gay community. The angry Davis said he was "sick and tired of the pressure" from gay bar owners and said that he was being unfairly charged as being anti-gay by "the most powerful lobby in the city, the homosexual community."

The Chief's vehement stand was that he was being "cowed" into being "too lenient" on gay bars. Davis has consistently encouraged his officers in their harassment of gay bars, baths and special events over the years. Countless bars and bath raids have resulted and many homosexuals in Los Angeles have been arrested in gay establishments for allegedly "groping" or making other advances toward planted young Levi-attired police officers.



The San Francisco Sentinel has recently made several disparaging comments about Harvey Milk and his campaign for the California Assembly. Your May 6 issue criticised Harvey Milk for "munching political pie with straight folk" while thousands will be marching as a protest against the United States Supreme Court decision. Harvey Milk's fund-raiser was planned long before the parade, but he attended both events. Harvey Milk should be commended, not condemned, for his political contacts with non-gay persons.

In your April 22 issue you criticized Harvey Milk for not speaking out on gay rights in every speech and vou condemned Jo Daly because she did speak out for gay rights at a political forum. Your consistency seems to exist only in your negativism. Gay persons should support Harvey's attempt to be more than a one-issue gay candidate. There is no need for Harvey Milk to cram his sexual preferences down the public's throat. He has been openly gay since his first campaign.

Your "Editorial Comments" stated that "I, for one, could not care whether he (harvey Milk) is straight or gay." Obviously you fail to recognize the most important issue in the struggle for gay rights - that we are just like other folks. Gay people, whether conservative, liberal or radical must be visible in public office to dispel the myths about homosexuals. Harvey Milk's presence in the California legislature would be a far more powerful statement for gay rights than our letters, our petitions or straight comments about us. The two million gay persons in California deserve at least one openly gay representative in public office and we must be united to get such representa-

Some gay individuals who put their personal interest ahead of our community interest, support Harvey's opponent because he has done a few political errands for our community. I submit that it was his job as a public employee to deliver those projects. We owe him no favors in return. We now need gay officeholders who will deliver political errands to the straight community. This political turnabout will give us more respect than our current beggar's position

Harvey Milk has shown admirable political skills by gathering 50,000 votes in his last campaign. If you support gay rights, your newspaper should unite our community in support of his candidacy. Larry Long

A couple of months ago, Harvey Milk announced that he would run for the California Assembly from the 16th District of San Francisco. (No, Virginia, Harvey is not a big white rabbit that you can't see. He is, rather, an upfront gay, highly visible in San Francisco politics, who narrowly missed a seat on the Board of Supervisors, losing to an all incumbent slate.)

Perhaps in recognition of his good showing in that last race, Harvey had been "rewarded" with an appointment to the Board of Permit Appeals. When word first leaked that Harvey might run for the Assembly against the incumbent politicos' choice, Mayor George Moscone warned that he would fire Harvey from his \$15 a week job and, when Harvey actually did announce that he was running, Moscone did fire Harvey from the Board. (At least Moscone was a man of his word.)

But it wasn't that way. For in the five years since Harvey Milk first ran for office, he has earned the respect of the political community for his ability and capability; a respect that remains despite the fact that he is gay. Where it has become all but commonplace for straight politicians to solicit gay support

But McAlister is only anti-gay, generating no such alarm in either McCarthy or Agnos.

Had it not been for a viligent outsider alerting us to that impending appointment, McAlister would right now be sitting in a very powerful position in the Assembly, wreaking havoc on gays throughout the state in his wielding of that not insubstantial power. I'm not being accusatory here - in some respects, I may be envious. HARRY S. TRUMAN

Like every politician, I have my own model. My personal hero in government - it's no secret - is Harry Truman. He was a great President and I think that one of the reasons why, is that he operated a small business prior to going into politics.

Unlike many Presidents, he wasn't born into great wealth; he had to scratch or every dime he made. He never developed a contempt for the common man, perhaps because he had personally waited on so many of them in his Kansas City clothing store. Once in public office, he never patronized his constituents, perhaps because he never forgot the time when he had to file bankruptcy.

The people who supported Truman were those who had to sweat for their daily bread, many who may not have been as inarticulate as others, with their tongues, but were loving in their hearts, those who instinctively recognized that no person is born to greatness but many people rise to it.

Truman was beloved by the people because he was one of them - and they knew it. He was not a devious President and disconcerted many of his fellow politicians by saying what he thought, not by parroting what he knew would be popular. When he retired, he spent his days in Independence giving personal tours of the Truman Library and lecturing to school kids on repreentative government.

In his final days, Harry Truman always considered himself a representaive of the people.

I think that's important. The overnment doesn't belong to the lawyers. It doesn't belong to the professional politicians, and it doesn't belong to the bureaucrats who, understandably enough, have become wedded to the patterns of thinking that prevail within the bureaucracy itself.

The government belongs to the people. And new ideas, as they usually do in business itself, will have to come from the outside - from the people. That's why we have elections as often as we do: to get new ideas and new input from the people.

I can understand my opponent's approach to government and sympathize with it. He wants to solve the day-today crisis — it's the only approach he knows. He's a bureaucrat and to be honest, we need some bureaucrats. But we aren't going to solve our problems by electing to public office the aides of those who have already wrestled with those same problems for the past two decades - and lost, two falls out of three. News From Foran

Legislation giving San Francisco the first National Maritime Museum in the nation has been approved by the California State Assembly, Assemblyman John F. Foran announcedrecently

Foran's legislation would transfer to the Federal government the San Francisco State Historical Park at the foot of Hude St and the Haslett Warehouse. In addition, the legislation would transfer to the Federal Government. Phelan Beach, Baker Beach and Seal Rocks State Beach, and the government would assume responsibility for maintenance of the Victorian Park at Aquatic Park

Foran's office also announced passage of AB3067, the Angel Island Immigration Station Bill, which will appropriate \$250,000 to the Dept. of Parks and Recreation for the repair and restoration of the Immigration Station Barracks on Angel Island. This bill further calls for the display and interpretation of the calligraphy found within the barracks.

From 1905 to 1941, the island (often called the Ellis Island of the West) was the foreboding gateway for tends of thousands of Asian Immigrants to Northern California. The calligraphy laments the sufferings and sorrow of its

"Angel Island Immigration Station has a great social, cultural and historical significance on a national, state and local level . . . It constitutes an invaluable and irreplaceable part of Asian-American history. It is in the best public interest to make ... the Barracks available for study and visitation by all people in order to inform the American public of a very significant chapter in the history of Asian-Americans," Foran said



Interview: Meet Tommy Breslin

Tommy Breslin has certainly had a varied career thus far, but his latest assignment really has him going to the dogs. The 30 year old actor is currently on view at the Little Fox Theatre in the title role of Snoopy, Charles Schulz's favorite canine. Breslin was last seen in San Francisco as the young Freshman in the pre-Broadway production of Good News a couple of seasons back, which went to the dogs in an entirely

Breslin's entrance into show business could be best described as circuitous. Originally from Connecticut ("where they make aspirin"), he was an 🛛 Business 🗆 Individual 🔲 Group English major at Rutgers Univ. "Two friends and I used to save our money and go into New York to see shows. I even saw Anyone Can Whistle. And that was my only exposure to drama.' Prior to college, poverty, chastity, and

obedience. They asked me to leave because I was too worldly. I was into writing shows by then. I transformed My Fair Lady into My Fair Novice. My father used to make fun of me. When I'd wear my habit, he'd say 'Are you wearing that black dress again?!"

After leaving the seminary upon request, and gathering his college credentials, Breslin taught ... for exactly two weeks . . . high school English. But teaching is difficult for a 20 year old who looks about 10, is 5'6" tall and has a baby face. "The first day, I was sitting in my classroom waiting for my first class and this big tall kid walks in


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

got my first job playing Randolph in a production of Bye Bye Birdie only because the director hated children and refused to use a 10 year old. But I got my own Equity card then. I made my Broadway debut in a play entitled Fire, that lasted 2 weeks. It was about the last 8 people on the earth. Nobody wanted to know about the end of the world. Then I went into George M for a year. I'd never tap-danced and I ended up replacing Gene Castle in the Popularity number by the end of the run.'

"In stock I do plays but in New York I always do musicals." Which is incredible considering Tommy Breslin has never had any training, much less a dance class, but has garnered job after job on sheer chutzpah and the ability to deliver whatever is needed. After George (Joel Grey is only 5'4" and I'm 5'6", so ha ha!"), Tommy went into the ill-fated 70 Girls 70. "I was the only person under 60 in the show. David Burns died on stage with me in the Forest Theatre in Philadelphia." And Tommy means literally died. The show was about the residents of an old folks home, and Burns was the principal comedian. One night he walked on stage with Breslin, suffered a sudden massive heart attack and fell dying behind a sofa. The audience thought it was another bit of sctick until the curtain was rung down: Hans Conreid was brought in and the show extensively re-written, but when it opened in New York, the newspaper strike was on. Just a doomed show almost from the start. "And right after that, I got to do Purlie and I was a minority again."

And now the breezy Mr. Breslin is San Francisco playing a beagle that sings and dances. Tommy has flirted with the world of Schulz for a long time. "I auditioned for Good Man, Charlie Brown 15 times and it never worked out." Deciding it was never meant to be, he originally turned down Snoopy when it was first offered on Tuesday, on Wednesday the local producers made another, better offer and Breslin was on a plane that night winging to San Francisco to climb upon his doghouse at long last. "A lot of people in New York wish there was more theatre here because I'd move in a second if I could work.'

Tommy will play Snoopy at least through the summer here. And what then? He affably shrugs his shoulders and smiles confidentaly - "I'm happy to go with whatever comes up for me. I'm all adventure!"

Every once in a while a state or Darwin's theory of gradual evolution

Tennessee tried to stop teaching evolution. The law was challenged in the courts. A Federal court ruled the law unconstitutional. It was a violation of the first ammendment. States may not pass laws "respecting the establishment of religion.

That law not only gave top billing to the Adam and Eve version; it also abeled other versions as "satanical beliefs of human origin." These attempts to have the government resolve religious arguments have frustrated religious students and theologians for centuries. The courts say that lawmakers aren't all that knowledgeable; nor should they be allowed to say that religious theory teachers should teach their students.

As a rule the courts are in no position to resolve religious disputes. In one case the North American Russian Orthodox Church sued to establish the right to use a cathedral that was controlled by Russian church authorities. The plaintiff quoted a State law that made the American Church autonomous - or free of control. The law was designed to prevent political use of the church by the Soviet government. The court held this law unconstitutional. The State was trying to interfere with church policies. This was an ecclesiastical issue for the church to decide - not the state.



In another case the defendant was arrested for using the mails to defraud. The government said that he was making false statements about his religious experiences. An appeal court said this was in effect a heresy trial. No one can be made to prove his religious beliefs.

Long ago courts held it unconstitutional to make a state official or a state employee declare his belief in the existence of God. Such a religious test public office invades a person's for freedom of belief and religion.

Sometimes one faction of a church will challenge control by another group. Even when the suit deals with property rights of the church, the courts usually refuse to rule. They say those are matters for the church itself to decide. [Note: California lawyers offer this column so you may know about our laws.]
