



Tunney Denounces S.3197

Senator John V. Tunney (D. Calif.) today denounced a proposed new bill authorizing bugging, wiretapping and break-ins. bill treads on dangerous ground," said Tunney, chairman of the Senate Constitutional Rights Subcommittee. includes as targets of surveillance homes and offices of American citizens who have committed no crime."

Tunney offered the only opposition to the new bill, S. 3197, "The Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act," when it was approved by an 11-1 vote in the Judiciary Committee. The bill was drafted by the Ford Administration and is the first bill ever to require no evidence of criminal activity to authorize a bug or wiretap.

Senator Tunney instrumental in having the Democratic National Platform Committee adopt Monday night a plank condemning the bill. "I recognize the value of legitimate intelligence effort to combat espionage and major crime, but that is already the law," said Tunney. "This new bill uses that as an excuse for making possible abuses such as bugging and wiretaps aimed at lawful political and private activity," Tunney added, in language which was adopted in the Democratic platform.

The new bill leaves key phrases undefined, Tunney said, and could have been used to justify the taps and bugs of Dr. Martin Luther King, the Congressman tapped in the "sugar lobby," and the Kissinger wiretaps of journalists and government aides.

The New York Times switched on Tuesday from its former support of the bill and warned of "a threat to the personal privacy that is a fundamental right in a free society." The A.C.L.U. has also condemned the bill.

"It is important to have a law regulating national security intelligence," Tunney said, "but after the abuses revealed by the Watergate and Church committee hearings we must close the loopholes and protect the privacy of law-abiding citizens."

An American could have his home or office bugged or tapped under the bill if there was evidence he had been intelligence "clandestine activity." The bill does not Tapes from wiretaps and define what that means. Since crime of "espionage," the Justice Department admitted that the new phrase is intended to cover lawful activity. To be tapped, there would also have to be evidence that the American either was an "agent of a foreign power" or "conspiring" with one or "aiding" one in such activity. Just what "conspiring" or "aiding" would mean also is not defined in the new bill. The New York Times pointed out that Martin Luther King, Jr., was bugged on this



Hank Wilson Vs. The Club Baths

San Francisco. Judge Ira A. Brown, Jr., listened patiently blacks, older men, skinny men for over three hours. The witnesses came and went; endless details were reported; but when it ended, Judge Brown ruled that Hank Wilson had been discriminated against by the Club Baths at 8th and Folsom Streets discrimination. on the 18th of March.

But the judge did not stop at his verdict; he turned to the attorney for the bath house and coldly told him that "your witnesses are liars"!!!

Seemingly ignoring the decision, the losing attorney demanded that he be permitted to give "arguments on the law."

Recognizing the legal right of the attorney to attack the law under which his client was charged, Judge Brown set aside his own ruling and permitted legal arguments on the

The report also showed an increase of 46% in the number of felony cases which go to jury trial. In his campaign for D.A., Freitas was critical of his predecessor's policy of pleabargaining in violent felony cases. Freitas had insisted that tough sentences often meant more jury trials.

The report indicated that Freitas' office has increased by 17% the number of felonies taken to Superior Court for trial or guilty pleas than last year. The report suggests that the increase in felony convictions and resulting State Prison commitments is the product of Freitas' felony team system which provides for accurate charging and better police investigation. The felony team system permits better case preparation because deputy District Attorneys take charge of their cases from start to finish.

"By accurate charging and no plea-bargaining in serious and violent felonies, we can go after the really bad characters; of course, there are a lot of cases which we should be prosecuting, but with a prosecution staff of only half that of comparable District Attorney offices, our top priority will be prosecuting the violent, repeat offender," Freitas said.

The report emphasized the crack-down on violent, vicious, and coercive pimps which the D.A.'s office has undertaken. It also pointed out that the office is pursuing a policy of equal enforcement of the prostitution laws, against both streetwalker customer.






Enjoying Gay Sex



John Foran State Senator

John Foran, a 46 year old Democrat, became California's newest State Senator when he took the oath of office on July 1st. Foran, a veteran of the Assembly before being elected to fill the unexpired term of Mayor George Moscone, will serve the Sixth Senatorial District, which includes parts of both San Francisco and San Mateo counties. Foran served in the Assembly for 13 years and many believe he would have preferred to stay in the Assembly, where he had a lot of power and influence; but he was urged to seek the State Senate

Assembly seat in the 16th District - a seat that Art Agnos, a former aide to Speaker McCarthy, has long wanted; McCarthy is known to have been among those urging Foran to give up his old Assembly seat. Senator Foran was first elected to the Assembly in 1962 and recently served as Chairman of the powerful Assembly Ways and Means Committee; he has also served as Chairman of the Assembly Transportation Committee. During Foran's service in the Assembly, he played a role in developing numerous laws and programs such as the Pure Air Act of 1968, a measure that gave this seat, thereby leaving a vacant state the toughest motor



While in office, he did attempt to obtain the Democratic nomination for State





The following national leaders all talked about EQUALITY. Carter, Mondel, Humphrey, McGovern, Jordan. How many of them meant EQUALITY between blacks and whites? How many of them meant EQUALITY for Gays? In fact, even with all their talk of EQUALITY, the Gay rights plank could not get into the platform. Democrats, don't worry; the Republicans won't put it in their platform either.

The point. With probably the same voting numbers on a national level and a record of being more independent, the Gay voter is ignored. The Black voter, who probably will vote

the party line, is wooed.

There are many reasons for this. One of the most important is that the Black leadership has put Black rights as their main goal; and the Black leadership - even though split on many issues - stays together when the issue is Black rights and advancement. That issue - to them, and rightly so is more important and meaningful than all other issues together. That is why there are many Blacks elected to public office. We have our own Lt. Governor. There are many Blacks in the U.S. Congress. On State and local levels, Blacks are judges, legislators and mayors. Yet the Gay community has failed in coming anywhere near what the Black community has achieved.

But a teacher once told me that if I'd been singing correctly for many years before I started smoking, I probably didn't inhale that much into my diaphragm." Allowing herself that vice, she proceeds to discuss her voice, which possesses incredible range and control -- "Opera was never fun to me. Never wanted to sing that. I can go down to baritone or up to dramatic soprano. But I'm classified as a because mezzo comfortable for me."

Then came Carolyn's period of rebellion, when all professional aspirations went out the window and she fought to come to terms with herself. "I went through an acute identity crisis in 1968. Everything hippie, I did. Hartley contends that "it D.A.'s office. is quite obvious" that the owner, Edward M. "invited" the police raid.

To reply to those charges, here are some actual "facts."

The raid was conducted by narcotics officers under the direction of Kenneth King who is an Inspector of Police with ten years' experience, as a regular police officer for four years and six years in narcotics.

He signed the affidavits which supported the search request of Assistant District Attorney James Dremann, who got Judge Daniel Hanlon to sign it prior to the raid.

The affidavits attached to the search warrant justifying the raid reveal in great detail exactly what it was that the police were seeking. The detailed affidavits report several undercover operations conducted in the bath house.

For example: on Monday, June 14, 1976, between 8:00 pm and 9:00 pm, a "confidential San Francisco (201 8th Street) informant" purchased meth- to crown a wonderful evening amphetamine from a John Doe on the town. "Blue Jeans:" qualudes were each; a bindle of MDA was registry window. purchased along with some thirty bindles were seen.

Auto Deficiency Judgement

Buy a home on time or buy a major appliance on time and if you default on the payments, you can lose your downpayment and installments paid. Foreclosure of the mortgage or repossession of the appliance and there is no further indebtedness beyond the loss of the property. There is no right to a deficiency judgment.

Buy a car on time and if the car is repossessed, you may have to pay a deficiency judg-

This happens when the money owed on a car is greater than what the repossessed car is sold for. Not only does the owner lose his downpayment and the car, but he will have to pay more if the resale price is less than the unpaid balance.

In most cases of installment buying the consumer had paid additional sums in addition to his downpayment. The consumer's loss may be substantial if there has been a long period of installments before the repossession.

The retailer may either up paying large deficiency judg- repossess it or may let the ments when the land was sold consumer keep the item and sue for less than the amount still for the unpaid balance due. He

In auto contracts, a mortgage is given to enable the costly. Most cars repossessed are sold below wholesale prices.

Often there are only a few buyers--often wholesale auto dealers. In many cases the bidders must make considerable allowances for repairs and reconditioning.

This means that the repossessed car is sold for a depressed price. The wholesaler may resell the car at a quick profit, but the new higher price is not credited to the consumer.

The debtor gets credit for only the price paid by the wholesaler. Just about every installment contract calls for attorney's fees and court costs to be added in case of a deficiency.

NOTE: California lawyers offer this column so you may know about our laws.






