Gayer stated that he has been the attorney for others discriminated against by the same bath house, and that the situation has become serious enough to seek injunctive relief.

Gayer noted that the bath house caters to gay men and competes for bath house business here. However, he alleges that they use arbitrary standards and classifications unrelated to the bath house business to exclude certain persons from enjoying the facilities.

#### S/M Film Festival **SOCIETY OF JANUS**



#### Caesar Chavez & Alice B Not For Mendelsohn

CEASAR CHAVEZ JOINS ALICE IN NON-ENDORSEMENT OF MENDELSOHN

San Francisco. Word came back from Fresno that the United Farm Workers Union, headed by Ceasar Chavez, endorsed every Democratic candidate in the state except San Francisco Supervisor Robert Mendelsohn in his bid for the Senate seat of Senator Milton Marks in the 5th District here.

The United Farm Workers Union met in Fresno on the 4th of September; at the meeting, the members became aware of the fact that Mendelsohn had accepted \$1,000 as a contribution from the Committee on Agricultural Policy (State) located through Post Office Box 3802, San Francisco.

Checking with the Secretary of State's Office in Sacramento reveals that that

organization has an I.D. Number 741897 which is registered to the California Canners and Growers. The Treasurer of the Committee is listed as Richard Qunan.

The California Canners and Growers is located at the World Trade Center in San Francisco, and it reportedly uses the Committee as its political funding arm.

Since the United Farm Workers Union tends to regard the Canners and Growers as their adversary, it was not surprising to have the membership vote to refer the question of the Mendelsohn endorsement to the "executive level," as one observer put it, and that meant to Chavez himself.

Chavez's reaction has been described by several observers in several ways; however, only the facts indicate what he must have thought: there would be no endorsement for Mendelsohn from his union.

The non-endorsement by the farm workers follows on the heels of the non-endorsement of Mendelsohn by the Alice B.



The purpose of the new centers is to provide full care for elderly citizens who now are segregated to special day care



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centers or to full-care facilities outside their homes.

Designed to enable older persons to remain in their homes longer, the multi-purpose centers would provide a full range of services. Included would be pre-retirement counseling, non-emergency medical care, recreation and educational programs, nutrition guidance and hot meals, as well as financial counseling.



> Meanwhile, Senator Tunney appears to have seen the light. He recently wrote, "Over the past several years, the gay movement has shown the public (and us in public office) the very real denial of basic human, civil and economic rights to people whose sexual orientation differs from the majority. This discrimination exists in areas of employment, immigration, military service and, until recently, employment regulated by the United States Civil Service Commission."

> Tunney now recognizes the problem and gives this analysis of how he and gay rights activists might advance their program: "It is obvious that such discrimination must end, and that appropriate (national) legislation is needed. Rather than make extravagant promises, let me suggest what I believe to be a realistic and workable approach. For legislation of this kind to succeed, it must pass the House of Representatives before it will be

taken seriously by the Senate. The House is currently considering legislation on this subject (Congresswoman Bella Abzug's bill to extend the Civil Rights Act of 1964 to include gay rights). As Chairman of the Senate Constitutional Rights Sub-committee, which would have jurisdiction over such legislation, I am prepared to have the Sub-committee hold hearings on this important issue on the Senate side. Moreover, I have directed my staff to offer assistance to the House Committee working on this legislation in an effort to move the bill during the current legislative session.

"As Chairman of the Constitutional Rights Subcommittee, one of my responsibilities is to ensure that equal protection under the Constitution is extended to all citizens. Be assured that I will carry out that responsibility."

This reporter recently talked with Tunney and received his even emphatic assurance that he will support the Abzug bill when it moves to the Senate. We are firmly convinved that he has been fully educated on gay rights (largely by David Goodstein, publisher of the Advocate) and is sincerely supportive.

Those who question Tunney's credentials as a fighter for other minorities and working people need only check his legislative ratings by the Americans for Democratic action (95%), AFL-CIO COPE (89%), League of Women Voters (100%) and League of Conservation Voters (83%). He received a Zero rating with the rightwing Americans for Constitutional Action.

If gay rights are to be achieved on a national level, it will not be done by sitting on the sidelines and hoping that someday the absolutely perfect candidate will win. Realistic gay voters should be supporting a man who came aboard rather late but who can do us a great deal of good in the future Senator John Tunney.

#### State Denys Gay Job Security

San Francisco. The Pride Foundation was notified by the Chairman of the Fair Employment Practices Commission that its petition to have gay citizens protected in employment was rejected by a vote of 5 to 2 abstentions.

The petition was first heard at a regular meeting of the FEPC in San Francisco on April 1, 1976. At that time. Frederick C. Furth, a prominent San Francisco attorney, represented Pride and presented both written and oral arguments.

The second phase was conducted at a hearing in Los Angeles on May 6, 1976, under the direction of the publisher of The Sexual Law Reporter, the attorney Thomas Coleman.

Noting that the majority of the commission was now made up of appointees of Governor Edmond G. Brown. Jr., it was hoped they would be more sympathetic to gay rights, according to Coleman.

Unfortunately, the commission is still being "served" by Charles Wilson as their Acting Chief Counsel, and does not seem to be in sympathy according to long-time observers of the FEPC.

The Chairman, John A. Martin, Jr., has been openly in support of protecting gay citizens under the FEPC; however, Martin reported that the FEPC staff recommended against the inclusion of gay citizens and that recommendation was the one adopted by the Commission.

There may have been success from this petition had it not been for a suit filed by the attorney Richard Gayer of San Francisco. He filed for the Gay Law Students Association v. Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. and the Fair Employment Practices Commission. In the opinion of Commission Chairperson Martin, that case forced the Attorney General of the State to take a position in opposition to gay rights as a result of the challenge in court. If Gayer had waited until the FEPC could have acted on an administrative level and if there had been no action by the Attorney General, things might have been different.

For example, Martin pointed out, if the petition filed by Pride had been considered on its merits alone, it may have received favorable considera-

As it is, the Attorney General was forced to issue an opinion which has denied protection in employment to gay citizens.

The Pride Foundation is using administrative procedures Aquatic Park — 1st locally to fight the Pacific Telephone Company under sections 12a and 12b of the San Francisco Administrative Code.

That strategy has been very successful to date. Two of the last two rulings have favored Pride against the phone company and the phone company now faces the last of its appeals at the administrative level on September 14 here in San Francisco before the Human Rights Commission. In this case, as planned, the City Attorney must support the position of gay citizens!

Furth is also the attorney for Pride in this hearing.

In the meantime, Gayer has taken another case before the Federal Court as a class action under the 1964 Civil Rights Act. That case is also against the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Company for discrimination against gay persons.

On August 27, 1976, U.S. District Judge Spencer Williams ruled against Gayer and

Would the queen of Sevier County, Tennessee, sell out to Yankee pop commercialism to push the cross-over schtik (ala Linda Ronstadt)? Well, all you Dolly Parton fans out there have nothing to worry about. Ole Porter and Dolly know where their bread is buttered.

ALL I CAN DO could just as well have been called BEST OF DOLLY PARTON, VOL. II, for, although there is no poster, the album is superb and rings with the gorgeous integrity which has marked all of Dolly's past

Emmylou Harris, a longtime fan and friend, contributed "Boulder to Birmingham" and Merle Haggard wrote "Life's Like Poetry," but all the other eight songs were penned by Dolly herself. There are no cuts -- not one -- on the album less than excellent, with "Boulder to Birmingham," "Shattered Image," "All I Can Do," "Hey, Lucky Lady" and "I'm A Drifter" standing out like diamonds in a crown of rubies.

The focus of the album, of course, is overwhelmingly Dolly's unmatched vocal abilities, but on this LP the quality of the supporting musicians is so high that there's no way it can be overlooked. Porter is nobody's fool. The material is also excellent. One thing that has given Dolly much more of a wide audience than her two Nashville peers, Loretta Lynn and Tammy Wynette, is that even when she does soppy/sappy songs, she doesn't do them in a soppy/sappy style. There can be little doubt why Dolly Parton was voted the Country Music Association's "Female Vocalist of the Year."


