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## 1st Victim of Bryant Crusade

MIAMI, FLA. - A report from the Dade County Coalition for the Humanistic Rights of Gays announced the death of a Cuban-born Gay activist: Ovidio Ramos.

Born Jan. 7, 1949, in Havana, Cuba. Died March 16, 1977, in Miami, Florida. Age: 28 years. Cause of death: Suicide.

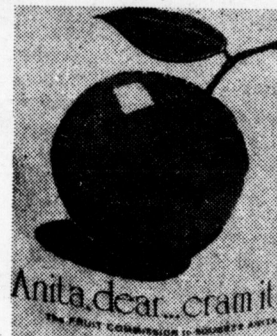
Ovidio's last communication was a cry of anguish over his family's lack of acceptance of his lifestyle, and their unfavorable comparison to his married brother who has two children. Ovidio is described by his friends at the Metropolitan Community Church of Miami, a homosexual fellowship, and his neighbors as a

"quiet, artistic man who lived only for his music." He was a serious and talented pianist. We last heard Ovidio's voice on a local Spanish radio station, WQBA, two nights before his death.

Our fellow member and friend, Manuel Gomez, who helped Ovidio organize the Latin Committee of the Dade County Coalition for the Humanistic Rights of Gays, was on WQBA with Ovidio. Manuel discussed his own dismissal from Cosmopolitan Magazine for collecting signatures supporting the new Metro Ordinance banning discrimination of homosexuals in jobs and housing. This firing took place despite the fact that the Ordinance is now law in Dade County. At the end of the WQBA program, Ovidio was very depressed, says Manuel, about the vicious com-

mentaries expressed by some of the callers. "It is incredible," said Ovidio, "that Christian people can hold such unjustified hatred toward us."

## Police Harassment Jumps 500 % In San Jose

According to recent statistics provided by the San Jose Police Department, arrests under penal code 647(a) have increased dramatically since the first of the year. In January of this year, 38 people were arrested on this charge, compared to 7 during the month of January 1976. The figures for February of this year are being tallied and will be available in a few days. We have reason to believe that the February total will be similar to that of January.

To put this matter in perspective, I would point out that the total number people arrested during the entire year of 1976 in this general category was 141. It appears that a directed campaign is underway in this city to harass, entrap, and intimidate members of the Bi/Gay community. The official... "reason" given to justify this assault on our civil rights is that there have been "citizen complaints of homosexual activity" in the downtown 4th and St. James area.

I would like to know how many "citizen complaints" there have been in relation to the total number of people that are being arrested and harassed. I would also like to know what "homosexual activity" so-called could justify a police action of this sort. I wonder if the Vice Squad would be just as enthusiastic in the entrapment/harassment of 'straights' if there were "citizen complaints" of heterosexual activity in a certain area. I think we already know the answer to that question.

The Gay community in San Jose is responding to this wanton brutalization of our rights in several ways. A "police watch" has been established to monitor the number of arrests made under this charge (Solicitation for a Lewd Sex Act); past court records are being researched to document the pattern of this harassment; and a study is underway to consider the various options for filing a formal protest with the appropriate city, state and federal agencies. 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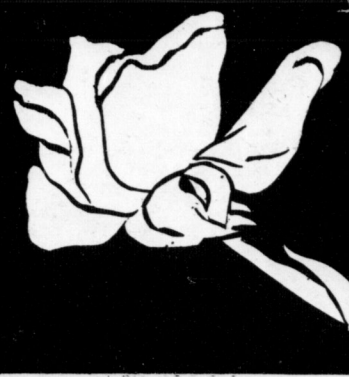

## Police Entrapment in San Jose

To our Gay brothers outside the city limits:

This past year word has repeatedly filtered through that all has not been well in Santa Clara County. We urged our informants to speak out, but nobody seemed to want to or be able to come up with the facts. So too, there was that inbred fear of too violently rocking the boat.

Finally, one man, Art James of San Jose, chose to fight for his rights. He was sufficiently outraged over his classic vice squad entrapment: the decoy

singling out the victim, then presenting himself in a provocative, available manner (a tape recorder hidden in his pocket) bumping his knee into the victim's. Asking leading questions; denying he was a police officer. And after 45 minutes of toying, flashing his badge. Subsequently apologizing because he was only doing his job.

Art James decided not only to bring his case before a jury but champion the cause of every other Gay who has been arrested and advised to "cop a plea." To suffer the mere consequences of being a registered SEX OFFENDER for the rest of his life.

Art has unearthed startling statistics - an almost rampage of arrests up from 1976 by 500% Vice hasn't run amuck in San Jose, but police zealotry seems to know no limits. He's learned that the undercover agent's tape recorder has already curiously malfunctioned - at crucial points in the conversation. (It seems San Jose P.D. is taking lessons from Richard Nixon.)

A male sexual decoy - enticing a man into a "criminal" posture - is a pervert in the truest sense of the word. An undercover agent standing at a urinal with half an erection, fondling himself, is the scum of scums. And if the San Jose police, officials and public don't know this - it's time they did.

We urge our Gay brothers in Santa Clara, Marin and San Mateo Counties first to be more cautious and second, to rally round men like Art James. There is little glory in store for these gutsy men, but the real possibility of justice for himself and those who will meet a similar fate.

The San Jose Vice crowd will never stop their harassment and traps until their twisted application of what THEY choose to be the law is brought before judges and juries. And the public.

The District Attorney's Office has already offered Art James attractive bargains, to wriggle themselves and the entire corrupt system off the hook.

The slight gains made in San Francisco over the years have come only through the repeated courage of those who have experienced the oppression. At the B.A.R. we feel it is now San Jose's time to occasion its very own Stonewall. And we predict things will never be the same.

These claims were submitted by Molinari on March 15, based on a Jan. 6 analysis of the proposed ordinance in B.A.R.

O'Connor verified that under the ordinance as written: "mom-and-pop" stores which devote 5% of their shelf space to "Playboy," "Playgirl" and similar periodicals would be classified as "adult bookstores;" that they would have to re-locate in order to conform to the "1000-ft." rule (stating that all adult bookstores and theaters must be at least 1000 feet away from residential areas); and that they would not be allowed to display "any stock in trade, including food, sundries and other non-pornographic items, where they may be viewed by the public from the street."

Acting on the City Attorney's findings, Molinari proposed an amendment to part of the Feinstein ordinance: Section 791.12, which states that no adult bookstore may display "any stock in trade" where it may be viewed from public streets.

Molinari's amendment would change that to "any stock in trade" which is defined as pornographic under the ordinance.

Aides to Supervisor Feinstein say that the ordinance is presently being re-written to conform to recommendations made by the SF Planning Commission earlier this month, and may be presented at the Board's Planning Committee meeting in April.

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## White House Opens Doors -

### GAYS MAKE DEMANDS

Ten Gay people from across the country met on March 26 with President Jimmy Carter's assistant for public liaison,

Margaret (Midge) Costanza. The three-hour session was reported on all major television and radio networks and in releases from the Associated and United Press Services.

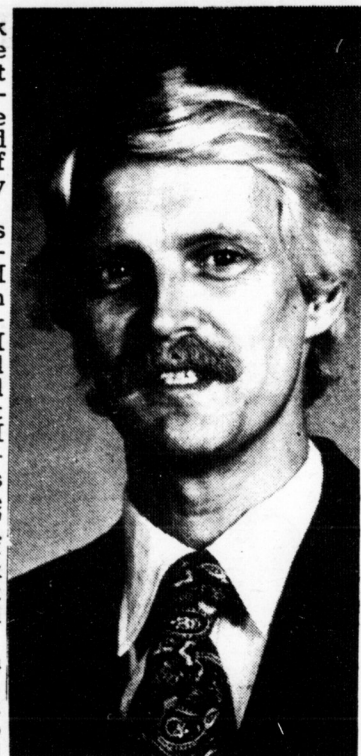
"This is the first time in the history of this country that a President has seen fit to acknowledge the rights and needs of some 28 million Americans," Jean O'Leary, co-chair of

the National Gay Task Force, told the press. She said that the ten who met with Costanza were "highly optimistic" that the meeting would soon lead to complete fulfillment of Carter's pledge to Gay people.

In campaign statements in his race for the presidency, Carter had said, "I oppose discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation. As President, I can assure you that all policies of the Federal Government would reflect this commitment. . . . I certainly will sign Congresswoman Bella Abzug's bill (which would have added 'sexual preference' to the Civil Rights Act of 1964) because I don't think it's right to single out homosexuals for special abuse or harassment."

Those meeting with Costanza told her (and, indirectly, Carter) that they wanted the right to serve in the military and to receive honorable discharges plus more homosexuals in the State Department, FBI and CIA.

They asked for tax-free status for Gay groups and additional rights for Gay prisoners - the privilege of receiving Gay publications, increased recreational opportunities and freedom from abuse and assault. Federal grants for homosexual social and research programs were demanded along with an expansion of the Federal Communications Commission rules to require broadcast access for the homosexual community.

rights were discussed along with the ban on granting United States citizenship to homosexual immigrants.

George Raya, former Sacramento lobbyist for pro-Gay legislation, was one of the NGTF choices to attend the meeting. Raya is presently on the staff of District Attorney Joseph Freitas. A full report on the White House meeting will be given to the Gay community on Monday, April 11, at 7:30 at Trini-

ty Place. This is a free, public meeting - the monthly business gathering of the Alice B. Toklas Democratic Club.

Raya was joined in the capital by Charles Brydon, president of the Dorian Society in Seattle; Charlotte Bunch, editor of the feminist quarterly, QUEST; Ray Hartman, Los Angeles attorney; Frank Kameny, long-time Washington, D.C., counselor in Gay legal matters; William Kelley, former editor of CHICAGO GAY CRUSADER and former chair of Chicago Gay Activist Alliance; Elaine Noble, state legislator in Massachusetts; Jean O'Leary, New York activist who was instrumental in setting up the White House arrangements; Troy Perry, founder and moderator of Metropolitan Community Church; Betty Powell, instructor in education at Brooklyn College; Myra Riddell, Los Angeles psychiatric therapist; Charlotte Spitzer, president of Parents & Friends of Gays in Los Angeles; and Bruce Voeller, who co-chairs the National Gay Task Force with O'Leary.

Marilyn Haft, a Costanza aide, told the press, "The point is they are being discriminated against; the point is not their sexual views." Jody Powell, press secretary to Carter, explained to CBS News, "They feel they are discriminated against, harassed, because of their sexual preference. They feel this is unfair. . . . I think that when an organized group of people feel that they have a grievance, that part of this whole business about what sort of country we live in is for them to have a right to put that grievance before the officials of this land and to say, 'We want redress.' That is the essence of what America is all about. How I feel about Gay rights or any other rights doesn't have anything to do with it. It is a question of their right to say, 'Look, we are not getting a fair shake and this is what ought to be done.'"

## Lesbian Student Elected

Cynthia Adams, co-director of Clark University's Gay Center, won election to the student council on this Worcester, Mass., campus.

Adams has been outspoken in her support for the political equality of all campus groups. She was well known for her Lesbian activism.

When asked her first order of business, she answered, "I would like to see Clark U. take a strong stand in regard to human rights and stop the sale of Florida citrus products on campus. Anita Bryant is becoming a life and death issue, and it's our lives at stake and the quality of our lifestyle."

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## Tavern Guild Gives Large Sum to Miami Coalition

The San Francisco Tavern Guild at its March 29 meeting donated \$500 to the Dade County Coalition for Humanistic Rights of Gays.

In a motion by Vice President Wayne Friday, the officers and members voted to contribute to the Miami Gay community's battle against Anita Bryant's "Save Our Children" crusade.

After the vote, the hat was passed and another \$260 was raised - bringing the total to \$760. A check was immediately forwarded to the DCCHRG, P.O. Box 414, Miami, Fla. 33133 c/o Bob Stickney.

To defeat the June 6 referendum to deny Gay rights, the Miami coalition is trying to raise \$400,000.

## Prostitution To Be Decriminalized?

Winging its way to the State & National Affairs Committee next month is a proposal by Supervisor Terry Francois that would remove the social stigma which hangs over San Francisco's oldest profession: prostitution.

Introducing the matter before the Board last Monday, Francois called for the State Legislature to "enact legislation which would decriminalize private acts of prostitution between consenting adults, with appropriate conditions and proscriptions."

These "conditions and proscriptions" would result in the total prohibition of street prostitution and public soliciting, while relaxing the taboos on privately-run prostitution establishments, such as massage parlors.

Such establishments, however, would only be able to operate with the written permission of the establishment's owner, and the male or female prostitutes would have to submit to "periodic health examinations" - a measure designed, according to Francois, to keep the VD rate down.

Pimping would still remain a felony offense, and sex establishments would be limited "to zones designated by local govern-

ments." This, however, would not amount to the establishment of a new "red-light district," Francois emphasized.

The proposal would also call for additional conditions which would protect minors and curtail public annoyance and consumer fraud.

## Fed. Aid For Survival House

SACRAMENTO - Assemblyman Art Agnos announced that he and F. E. Mitchell of the Golden Gate Gay Survival House have been successful in winning approval of a proposal to place VISTA volunteers in the Survival House to find jobs for unemployed people.

Agnos said, "The approval is a first for this federal agency and we had to overcome major obstacles to win this fight." In January Agnos became involved after the proposal had been rejected and community leaders sought his assistance.

Assemblyman Agnos stated that the resistance to the proposal was primarily based on "bias against Gay persons and a belief held by Action officials that the Gay community is wealthy when compared to other disadvantaged groups."

"When F. E. Mitchell and I met with federal administrators, it became apparent that this proposal was not being evaluated on its merits but colored with prejudice and misinformation." After several weeks of heated negotiations between Agnos and Action Region IX, the administrators agreed to submit their "specific objections" to the Survival House proposal in writing.

Under the plan worked out with Agnos, F. E. Mitchell, Director of the Survival House, would be given the opportunity to work with Action staff on resolving these specific objections and before funding approval deadlines passed.

Agnos and Mitchell then called upon Senator Alan Cranston for additional assistance.

Agnos concluded, "The real reason we were successful was the quality of the program at the Survival House. F. E. Mitchell, his staff and Board of Directors had put together an excellent proposal and pursued each objection raised until it was resolved."

"This approval by Action marks the first time that any federal poverty program has recognized the needs of the Gay community."

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## Transsexual Bill Update

AB 385 wherein transsexuals could receive new and "corrected" birth certificates (new gender designations to reflect sex change operations) was approved by the Assembly Ways and Means Committee. The vote was 12 to 3 in favor (one more than needed).

The bill sponsored by Willie Brown (D - SF) and backed by Art Agnos (D - SF) now goes to the Assembly floor.

While AB 385 has the backing of the Brown administration and Bay Area legislators, transsexuals and their friends are urged to contact members of the Assembly.

Under AB 385, a transsexual would apply for a birth certificate change to the State Department of Health. A letter from a surgeon attesting to the sex change would accompany the application. Local birth records would automatically be brought into conformity. For a fee of \$5.00 a new certificate would be put on file, indistinguishable from the original. Thirty other states now allow transsexuals to change their birth certificates to reflect new gender.

## Christopher St. Demo Club Boycott

SAN JOSE - Following the lead of the S.F. Gay community, Christopher Street Democratic Club has formally sponsored the boycott of Florida citrus products in the South Bay area. This boycott is in response to the virulent comments made by homophobe Anita Bryant in a series of recent interviews.

In these interviews she stated that homosexuals are recruiting children because they cannot reproduce for themselves. In an interview on the program "Good Morning, America" she said some Gay male teachers will want to wear dresses to work and flaunt their homosexuality in front of her children.

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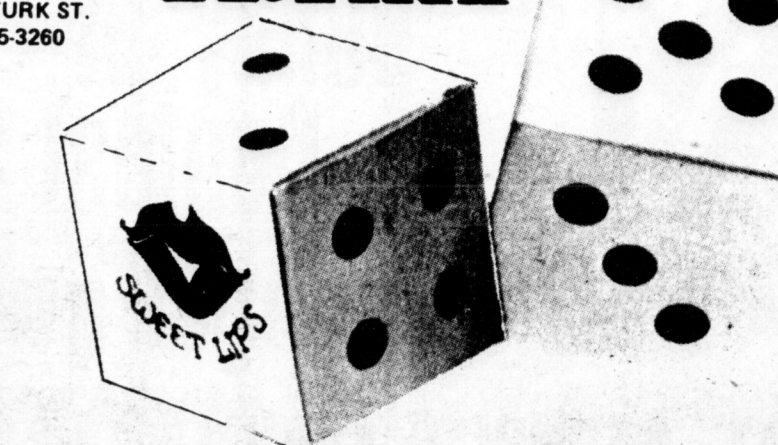

Speaking to what could be regarded as a "monied" audience, a people from the Peninsula and Marin, Pines talked about his accomplishments as City Attorney, what he has done to improve the conditions of nursing homes, his help for the Spanish-speaking population, his help for the environment and for Gay people in L.A. Looking at the audience and listening to his talk, one might have at first thought it was the wrong speech to the wrong audience. But, no - this was Bert Pines. He is proud of what he has done. His attitude towards all minorities is the opposite of Anita Bryant's.

Bert Pines is considering a run for state office next year - Attorney General. I suggest that Gay people from the Bay Area send him letters and wires urging him to run (c/o the City Attorney's Office, L.A.). Of all the people mentioned so far who may make that race, Bert Pines is head and shoulders above them in the area of civil liberties. His record - not speeches - is there to back him up.

### TAXI DRIVER

Once again (for the third year in a row) our

Board of Supervisors has passed a taxi fare increase. The sad thing is not whether one was needed, but that not once in three years has any of our "fiscally responsive" supervisors asked for a complete examination of the books of the cab companies. The Board just accepted the word of the cab companies. No other regulatory authority would do that. They not only demand the books but have their own people do a complete examination. But S.F. is different. Oh, they asked their own budget analyst to go over what few bits of accounting were submitted. But no audit. No demand that the companies submit their records. Only those that did bother to submit anything were looked over. It is a mockery. There are no standards. No accountability. In fact, at the hearing, the supervisors who have heard the cab companies argue their case for three years still admit that they do not understand how the different cab companies operate - and they granted the increase without any proof of need. I guess they don't care about anything. Look at what they are about to give the people who live in the upper Market St. area: a nice six-lane freeway.

### FLEISHHACKER POOL

These same supervisors seem to want to do something about crime. Well, let them spend some money to reopen Fleishhacker Pool. It will cost, but it will once again give our young some place to go and get rid of their energy. Playland is closed. Fleishhacker pool is closed. There is no alternative.

One of the reasons for youth getting into trouble is the need to "do something." When all the alternatives are taken away, some drift into crime for "kicks." The

money spent restoring the pool will probably be less than the costs of treating some of these youths in the criminal justice system. The pool uses salt water, important in a water-short city. But, our mayor and his parks commission have another idea for the pool. They want to fill it in and use it for a parking lot for the zoo! And so, once again, the auto may win out. Some day when there is not enough gas for cars and that huge parking lot is empty, someone might ask, "Why did they fill this in in the first place?" And someone else might ask, "What was here before?" A great pool that a lot of the youth of the city used. Fleishhacker Pool is more than a pool. It is symbolic of attitudes - symbolic of the ongoing battle between people and machines.

### MIAMI ORANGE PARTY

I ended this article talking about a pool and started it talking about the statements of Anita Bryant that belong in a cesspool. History has shown, time and time again, that the most effective thing that people can do - short of violence - to stop an outrage is an economic boycott. It works. For the sake of Gay people who are "coming out" and have difficulties handling it, I feel that we must get rid of the Anita Bryants. The only power we have is economic. I urge all to join the boycott of all Florida orange juice. It is a small price to pay for freedom. Two hundred years ago a group dumped some tea into Boston Harbor. A nation won its freedom. It is time for us to dump Florida orange juice. Maybe we will find our freedom coming a lot faster.

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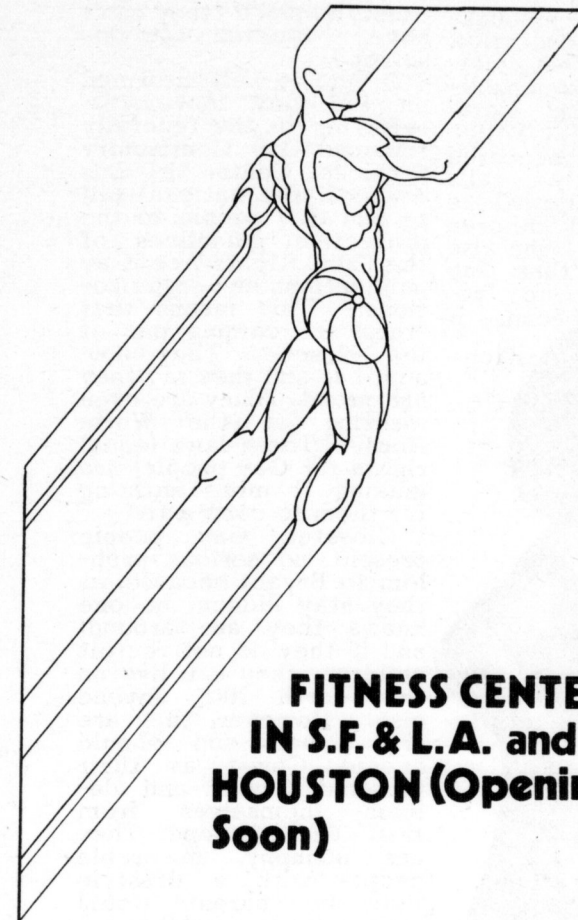


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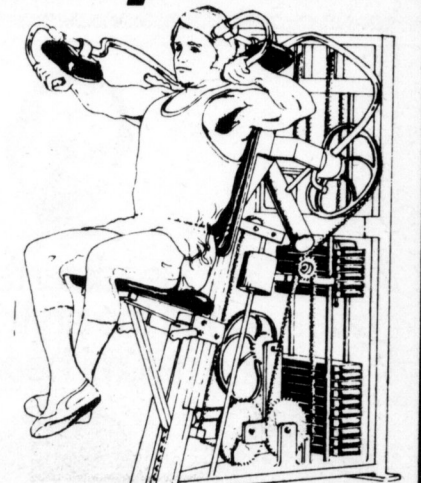
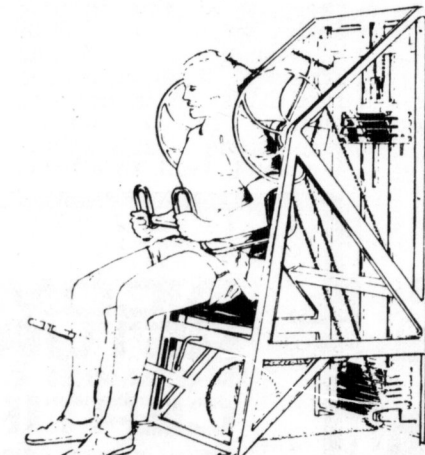
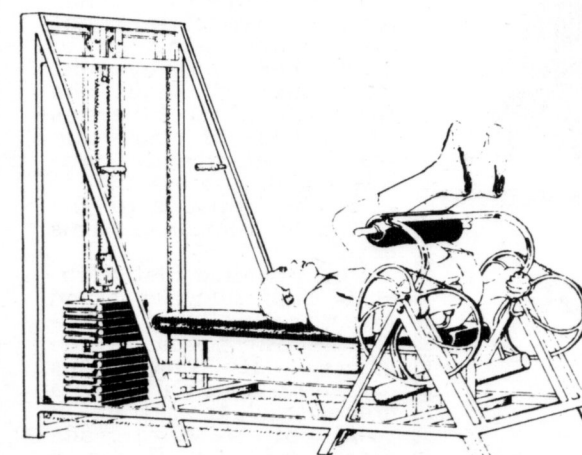

## Anita On The Stump

Entertainer Anita Bryant's "Save Our Children from Homosexuality, Inc." is receiving one thousand letters a day at its Miami postal box. Enclosed, it is believed, are thousands of dollars from fundamentalist Christians who fear that children are somehow threatened by proselytizing Gay people. The funds will be primarily used to convince the Dade County populace (Miami, Miami Beach) that homosexuals can be discriminated against in housing, em-

ployment and public accommodations. The entertainer-huckster is convinced that homosexuals molest children. She refers to a publication that the Coral Gables, Florida, Police Department discovered which allegedly tells homosexual adults where they might find children on the beaches. She also vaguely states that Gay people attempt to "recruit" children because it

is the only way they have of perpetuating their own lifestyle, since "they can't have children themselves." Bryant is well informed on the Gay movement referring to the federally financed Gay Community Services Center in Los Angeles, the national bill to add Gay people to the protective guidelines of the Civil Rights Act, Gay publications and organizations. This means that "they are coming out of the closet. They now admit it and they say they are proud. They are even meeting at the White House. These laws (equal rights for Gay people) are making it more enticing for them to come out."

Some confusion arises when an attempt is made to analyze what Bryant is saying about homosexuality. She says, "I am not saying that they are not nice guys. I know a lot of homosexuals who are nice. I feel no animosity, no hatred, no anger. I am really beginning to have a love for homosexuals. . . . No one wants to discriminate, least of all I." She also says, "They are forcing, flaunting and proselytizing on people who believe that it is immoral. . . . I pray for them. God says, in His word, that He hates the sin but He loves the sinner." She states that the Bible is a literal document, not subject to interpretation - so homosexuality is an "abomination."

The United States will be destroyed by God "just as He destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah, according to Bryant if homosexuality is accepted as an alternative lifestyle. The fear is that children will be exposed to upfront Gay teachers, acceptable as role models, thus making it clear to children that there is nothing intrinsically wrong with being homosexual. Bryant stresses, "Such an alternative lifestyle is not conducive to a healthy, wholesome atmosphere. We don't want an alterna-

They are coming out of the closet and that is okay with me.

"I honestly think that many kids are not too sure what their sex lives are all about. I don't believe that someone just wakes up one morning and says, 'Hey, I am a homosexual.' It is much more complicated than that. . . . The culture says that being Gay is not acceptable so a young person who may want to come to grips with being Gay is faced with a hostile society. Dad is saying, 'Get into Plastics, son' and this boy may marry my daughter in an effort to show the world that he isn't Gay. Three years later, with one or two kids of their own, there is a very painful tragic realization of the situation. I don't want that kid to be obliged to 'play straight.' I don't want that kid to feel closeted."

Donahue asked Anita Bryant what she would do if she discovered that her son was a homosexual. She replied, "First of all, God has a standard, a judgment. I would tell him that God loves him and that I love him, no matter what. I would not disown him. I would also help him to repent of his sin."

In order to protect her children from outside influence, Bryant and her husband said that they screen all television programs that their children watch, actually sitting with them to assure that they do not view things that might be harmful. Bryant said, "I feel I have a responsibility to place nutritious food on the table for my children. I wouldn't feed them garbage too because it was an alternative. Husband Bob Green added, 'We don't want our children to have any alternatives.'"

The one-hour Donahue interview included a lively audience question/answer period in which one viewer said that 1,000 homosexuals were at a recent dance in her neighborhood and "I found that to be sickening." Another person took a different stand: "I think that you are discriminating against your children's right, their freedom, their right to decide what atmosphere they want. You were brought up among a lot of permissive people, but it didn't affect your own lifestyle. Weren't you given alternatives when you were young? If you raise your children as Christians and you have a good relationship with them, they will come to you about things."

When pressured, Bryant repeatedly returned to quoting Scripture. While she repeatedly took Scripture out of context, she said to one questioner, "You cannot separate God's love from His righteousness. You cannot take out of context what you want to believe in the Bible; you have to take the whole Bible. Jesus said, 'If you love me, you will keep my commandments.'" Bryant was not asked to explain Biblical passages that call for the stoning of adulterers, the

prohibition of the eating of pork or "Thou shall not kill."

The Donahue audience was almost 100% female and supportive of Bryant. One lone male in the rear of the audience may have made the meaningful statement at the end of the program. "We are trying to mix fiction with fact here," he espoused. "They don't mix at all. We are hearing about what some people believe but the fact is that homosexuals are part of the human race. That is a fact of life. You have to live with that reality."

The significance of the Dade County-Anita Bryant controversy is that it has become a national issue of long-range importance to Gay liberationists. A defeat in Dade County of Gay people could encourage fundamentalists elsewhere to

Education, which should be helping youth to understand and adapt to their revolutionary new environments, is instead being used merely as an instrument of cultural aggression, imposing upon retribalized youth the obsolescent visual values of the dying literate age.

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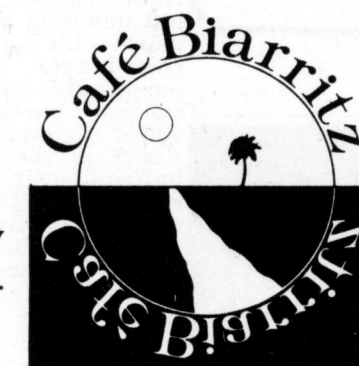

## Ed Davis: The Cop/The Candidate

Although Jerry Brown is still riding the crest of his popularity, there are those who believe he could be beaten next year. There are at least three Republicans who would like to take on the Governor. One of them is the current Los Angeles Police Chief.

Ed Davis, at 60, is less than a year from retirement and prefers not to

talk of his candidacy until his retirement. Still, he has been taking speaking engagements all over the state, and there is little doubt that he will jump into the GOP primary against San Diego Mayor Pete Wilson, Attorney General Evelle Younger and other Republicans as well. Davis is the darling of the ultra-right wing of the Republican Party and

of some conservative Democrats as well; he has the aggressive backing of State Senator H. L. Richardson, the conservative from Orange County, and the network of gun owners and other groups who have shelled out hundreds of thousands of dollars for conservative candidates. He also has access to many of the Republican organizations in California that find Evelle Younger too liberal for their tastes.

Davis says he became a Republican in fact, as well as in spirit, because as a landlord he got caught in the rent-control squeeze after World War II and couldn't raise rents to keep pace with rising costs. He blamed the Democrats then in power. Davis next became a Democrat in registration, but never in principle, because his good friend, then-Mayor Sam Yorty, personally asked him to switch parties so the Chief could vote for Yorty in the 1970 gubernatorial primary. Davis remained a Democrat for more than five years; he changed back to the GOP in 1975 after the then-Democrat National Chairman publicly blamed him, among others, for the failure of L.A. to land the 1976 party convention.

Davis is currently careful not to act too much like an active candidate. However, he is playing

along with Richardson and other right-wingers and doesn't mind being known as their "favorite candidate," all the while disclaiming any candidacy. Richardson already has created a "Committee for a Responsible Governor" and invested enough money to take a poll of conservatives which showed Davis as their

sure your protection from hoodlums, it becomes your responsibility." Speaking recently to the State Republican Convention, Davis made several derogatory remarks about "fruits" and "fairies."

Davis, who is president of the International Ass'n of Chiefs of Police, is so ultra right-wing that he worries even some conservative Republicans. Ronald Reagan is thought to feel that Ed Davis' leading the Republican ticket would damage the entire ticket. Many think the former Governor would step in if the nomination of Ed Davis became a possibility. Turning his wrath recently toward Sacramento, Davis charged that legislation favorable to homosexuals has produced a massive increase in homosexual pornography and that last year's children's rights law has benefited homosexual adults who prey on youngsters. Because of the children's law, Davis says, authorities are powerless to do anything about "chicken hawks, predatory homosexuals (in Hollywood particularly), who have young boys and, in some cases, procurers who have young girls."

From Gays, the L.A. Chief turns just as easily to his hatred for marijuana. An angry Davis said recently that a proposal to reduce penalties for growing small amounts of marijuana could "make dope addicts out of two-year-old children." Speaking of a move in the Assembly to eliminate arrests and prison terms for growing six or fewer marijuana plants, Davis described the proposal as the "Willie Brown roll-your-own bill so every hop-head can have a victory garden." If the law passed, the ranting Davis warns, backyard marijuana gardens would be discovered and used by neighborhood boys and girls all over the state. Whenever in front of a crowd of any size, Davis blames the courts, the Legislature, and the Governor for California's rising crime rate. "We're holding the line in Los Angeles (despite) the avalanche of judicial, legislative, and gubernatorial action that always seems to undo everything we're trying to do," he said. "Those people up there in Disneyland North (Sacramento) seem to be participating in a destruction derby in terms of law enforcement."

Davis charged that the state Parole Board appointed by Brown has "dumped many dangerous criminals back on the streets" and has made the state the only one in the country to lower its prison population. Davis' hatred for Gays is well known. Many a Gay in Los Angeles has felt the wrath of Ed Davis' police entrapment; many a Gay bar has known the constant hassle with police; harassment of Gays in Los Angeles has long been commonplace. Ed Davis not only hates Gays, he has a fear of them that is hard to understand. Davis told

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reporters he had no regrets for remarking recently that homosexuals could get together with farm workers and form the "United Fruit Workers of America." "I was relating what a man told me ten years ago about the plans some groups had to take over this state," said Davis. "It really wasn't a joke; it's deadly serious." Ed Davis is a bigot of the worst kind, and his nomination for Governor would be a disaster for the Republican Party - a Party that despite the overwhelming Democrat majority, still managed to carry the State for Gerald Ford and at the same time elected a Republican Senator over a well-entrenched Democrat incumbent.

As a former Republican who believes that this state needs two strong parties, I would hate to see Ed Davis - the living symbol of hatred, bigotry and a police state - become the nominee of the Party which gave us Lincoln, Theodore Roosevelt, Eisenhower and Jerry Ford. The Republican Party has a chance to defeat Brown next year, but they will never do it with a man like Davis.

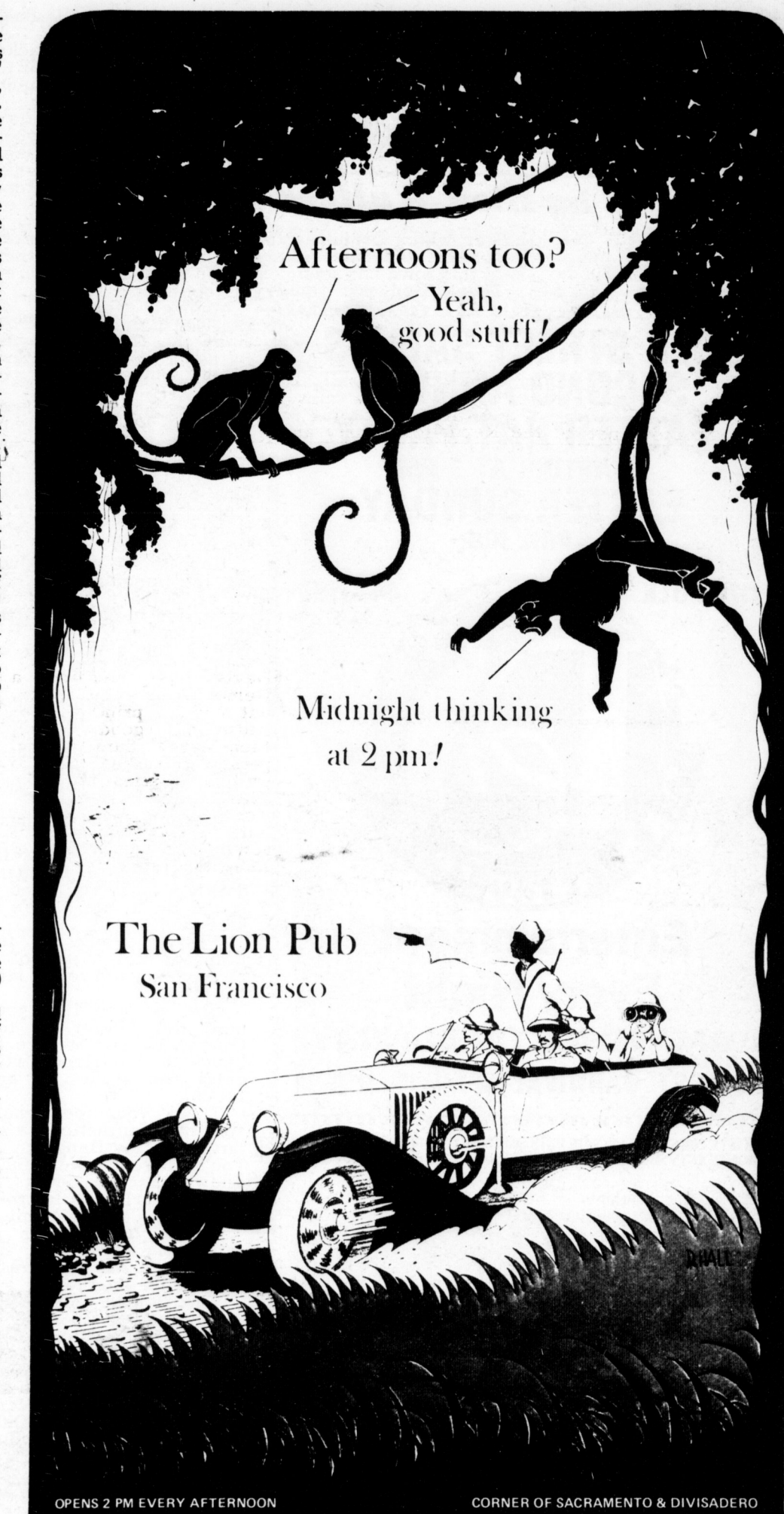

### Gay Named To NYC Human Rights Panel

The appointment of the "first Gay activist" to



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serve on the New York City Human Rights Commission was announced March 20 by Mayor Abe Beame. Robert L. Livingston, a former publisher of MORE magazine and a member of the finance committee of the National Gay Task Force, was one of six new appointments to the 15-member commission, which Mayor Beame said "represent the city's unique diversity."

In NYC, the Human Rights Commission has the legal power to prevent discrimination based on race, creed, sex or age in employment and housing. It also investigates "situ-

ations of racial tension." The appointment of an "upfront Gay" is viewed as a major breakthrough by New York Gays, and the Mayor's choice praised by local Gay leaders. A former theater and television producer, Mr. Livingston said, "I don't want to be known as the Gay member of the commission; I do want to be known as the commissioner who happens to be Gay." Livingston, the son of the famed clothing designer Mollie Parnis, described his appointment as "timely recognition of the large number of homosexuals in New York

City," which he estimated at "at least half a million." Mr. Livingston was appointed to a three-year term. No HRC Commissioner receives a salary, except the chairman; but the commission is one of power and is highly sought after. Mr. Livingston published MORE magazine until its sale last year. He also directs the city-wide "Dress Up Your Neighborhood Campaign" which gives awards for neighborhood improvement programs.

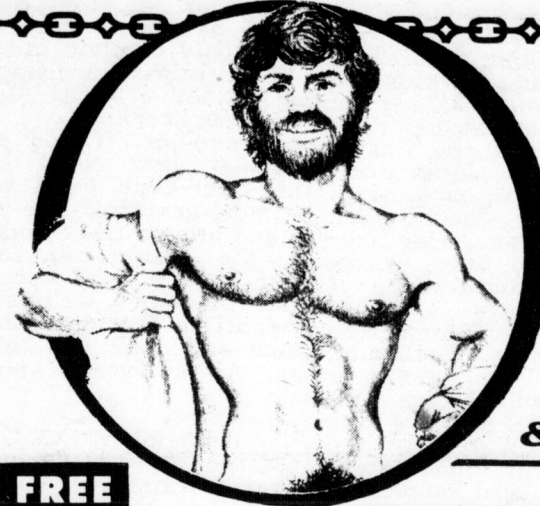

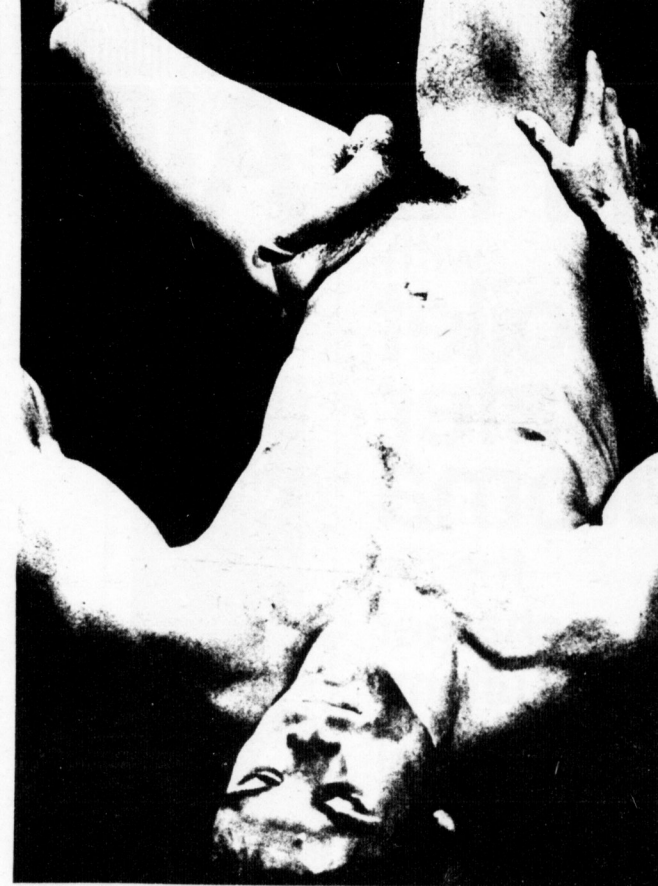

# An Interview With Jules Feiffer

Now in previews at the Little Fox Theater is Jules Feiffer's latest Broadway hit, "Hold Me!" making its West Coast debut (hopefully to travel on to L.A. eventually). The eminent cartoonist/playwright briefly zipped through town to supervise rehearsals and meet an admiring press. Looking more like a rumpled bank clerk than a successful artist, Feiffer is an essentially shy man who speaks in matter-of-fact tones about his jaundiced views of the political scene and having a hit show on

Broadway. He also is a self-aware man who knows himself. "I'm really a product of the bullshit of the 30's movies. But I haven't seen 'A Star is Born.' I don't need to see another Barbra Streisand movie where she ends up winning herself... I never studied to be nothing. But I always wanted to be a cartoonist. I was doing little comic books as a kid. It was Milt Caniff who introduced me with Terry and the Pirates' to the idea of character in cartoons... I think that most newspapers today are mindless because they reduce them so much that any really graphic art will look like mud and cartoons that used to be 5 or 6 columns wide are now only 3 or 4. They're barely readable. The newspapers claim it's because of a shortage of space; but if you read what they're printing nowadays, what there's really a shortage of is serious thinking. And cartoonists themselves have come to think of themselves as famous but disreputable. I don't see cartooning and playwrighting as having zilch to do with each other. Only the point of view is the same. You always have to start anything on the assumption it's going to be brilliant. It's a con but you have to believe it or otherwise there's no reason to get up in the morning.

"The only person I admire in the Carter administration is Andy Young. Jerry Brown is a punk. The narcissism and tremendous ego and general callousness outweighs the good. I need to meet Jimmy Carter in person 'cause then I'll know how to draw him. I never could draw Lyndon Johnson until I met him. When I saw those eyes, I realized he was the guy who turned you down at the bank for a loan - and was glad about it. The tragedy of Gerald Ford is he looked like an actor in horror movies. And to have THAT follow Nixon? Nixon was Dr. Frankenstein and Gerald Ford was the monster. I try to never get to know political candidates too well. I supported Eugene McCarthy in '68 and was absolutely charmed by him. Thank God he never got anywhere or I would have been in his pocket. During Watergate, I got most of my hate mail from San Francisco and L.A. But none when I attacked Henry Kissinger. It's amazing how much underground hostility there was toward Kissinger. He should have won the Nobel Prize for warmaking!"

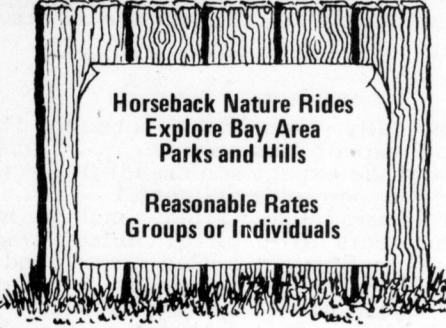

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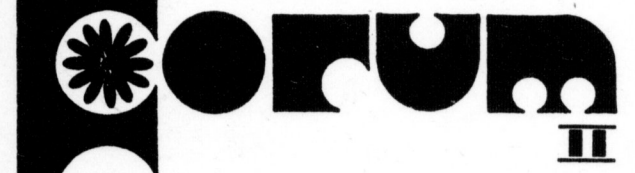
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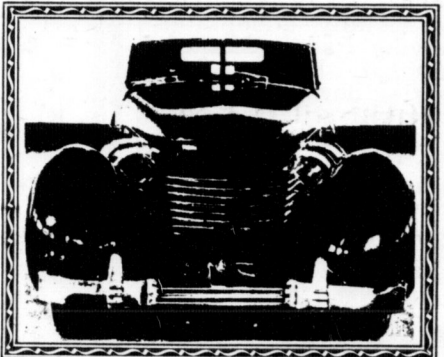

### Boise Policewomen Ousted

The Boise Police Dept. has dismissed four female officers. Two to three women were dismissed on charges of Lesbianism. A fourth female officer was let go after having been informed she had not successfully completed her probationary period.

One of the woman officers (Boise's first on the force) claimed that she had been the victim of vicious rumors. She stated that an investigation had focused on her personal life and violated her right to privacy.

Judith Baker (dispatcher) and Theresa Silva (dog warden) said that their termination letters stated that they were removed because they had violated the state statute of a "crime against nature."

Boise was rocked twenty years ago by one of the most widely publicized homosexual scandals in the nation's history. In 1955, 1472 citizens were interrogated and 16 were convicted. Five men were sentenced to life in prison for their "crimes against nature." The "witch hunt" became the subject of the best-seller "The Boys of Boise."
