

Tavern Guild San Jose P.D. Under Fire

SAN JOSE - Susane Wilson, Vice-Mayor of San Jose, has launched an investigation into questionable vice squad tactics of the San Jose P.D.

Her interest in the matter was prompted by stories in the B.A.R. (vice arrests up 500% over those of a year ago) which, in turn, were picked up by radio and TV news.

Meeting with over 100 concerned Gays in the Almaden Room at San Jose State, the Vice-Mayor read a City Council memo sent to Police Chief McNamara requesting information on the specific methods used in vice arrests.

After an emotional and sometime heated meeting, sponsored by the Gay Students Union, Wilson fired off two additional memos to the Police Chief demanding answers.

Subject: Gay Community

1. Can the Police Department provide statistics for past years that could differentiate between number of Gays arrested on the basis of publicinitiated complaints and number of Gays arrested as a result of independent police activity.

2. Does the P.D. have official or unofficial policy regarding hiring of Gays? Is there any discrimination, subtle or otherwise, at the supervisory level?

3. Does the P.D. have a policy regarding couples of the same sex who close dance, kiss or hold hands in public establishments? Does the P.D. try to prohibit such activities and, if so, on what law, ordinance or regulation is the prohibition based?

4. It has been alleged that the P.D. is conducting intelligence activities against Gay people with the use of Federal grant funding. Please justify the use of such funding for such intelligence operations.

5. Is the sexual preference of persons arrested noted on arrest records? Is an arrested person ever asked to indicate sexual orientation?

San Jose Gay activists see the Vice-Mayor's actions as a significant breakthrough in ending the illegal and questionable police practices against Gays. In particular, the use of motel rooms to interrogate suspects, hidden tape recorders, polaroid pictures, provocative and seductive undercover officers.

At week's end, Gay activists Lucky Guerrero and Art James have carried the issue to City Councilman Jim Self who has expressed interest in the matter. Self, a possible candidate for San Jose Mayor, has agreed to set up a meeting to include the Gay community, the arrest victims, Police Chief McNamara, and Sgt. Hernandez of the Vice Squad.

Art James told the B.A.R. that San Jose Gays

are finally fighting back and that scores of shocking violations of human and civil rights are being recorded and documented for future legal action.

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#### Gays To Picket Supreme Court

A MASSIVE PROTEST OF SUPREME COURT RUL-ING UPHOLDING SODOMY LAWS PLANNED FOR MAY 21, GAYS FROM ACROSS THE COUNTRY TO ATTEND.

Gay men and women and other concerned individuals from across the country will be assembling in Washington, D.C., on May 21 to stage a legal, non-violent demonstration against the United States Supreme Court. Under the sponsorship of the May 21 Gay Action Coalition, already endorsed by over 50 Gay organizations, grass-roots contingents are organizing buses and car pools to arrive in Washington on May 21 and are publicizing the event through leaflets and media outreach within their own communities.

In the spring of 1976, the Supreme Court upheld Virginia's sodomy laws, thereby permitting individual states to maintain sexually repressive legislation. Describing that decision as a federal precedent that will adversely affect the lives of Gay people for years to come, the Coalition chose Saturday, May 21, to mark with outrage the first anniversary of the Court's ruling.

One starves for a goal; as a "comer" one has a valid role to play. San Francisco, like Venice, is endeared to the world's gentler sentiments. therapists settle to clerk in neighborhood gift shops; landscape architects find a non-future in selling plants. Literature majors can serve coffee in bookstores; artists swell the market making candles and macrame. Few industries originate in or center themselves in San Francisco. Products are designed elsewhere, manufactured elsewhere. The city has little to do with conception or completion; instead it is used more often as a showplace. To sell these products on the road, one has to play the very game he has come to San Francisco to escape. The day of peddling computer parts, wearing flowers in your hair, has never even materialized.

Writers, dancers, singers, actors, musicians tend to ply their trades part-time - in some neighborhood center for the arts. The big time is about as big as the number of agents one can find in the Yellow Pages. But the "artist" can always take to the streets to fiddle for the tourists storm-trooping the holiday circuit.

When the cash runs out, it's no longer a question of what he'd like to do, nor what he was trained to do, but whatever he can get. Any short-order trivia will suffice.

Some enroll in any kind of school (if it will bring a check in the mail) to take up the slack. Others find interim work in hospitals, in convalescent homes, doing typing, driving a cab. There is much demand for para-professionals and volunteers, but at little or no pay. An enterprising few rent their services as housecleaners and houseboys (the "fringe benefits" might be a bit galling, but it's something). Others find that, hidden behind a switchboard or dressing windows, being stoned or half-loaded is difficult to detect, and the tedium is made more

The majority find a halfway house in tourism as bellboys or desk or reservation clerks. The demand for dishwashers and cook's helpers seems constant. for dishwashers and cook's helpers seems constant. For the "groovier" there's the temporary burlesque of busboys, waiters, maitre d's, bartenders. A deck in constant need of reshuffling. The essential requirement is, not the quality of their service, but their attractiveness and possible availability. They serve to chum the Gay waters and draw in the bigfish spenders. These jobs seldom lead to "better things;" regardless of the young men's hopes, they trade their twenties and early thirties for jobs they never really wanted in the first place.

Hustling - be it anywhere from stalking the corners of Powell and Geary Streets, to dial-a-trick, to home-visit massage - is always an alternative, a

to home-visit massage - is always an alternative, a solution. Perhaps the final solution.

For all the flak about the happy hooker, some people eat arsenic and ground glass and live to tell the tale. If one can maintain his base-line dignity, a minimum sense of self-value, knowing he serves the public like some sort of disposable diaper or a day-old tampax, so be it.

Excerpts from "Save Our Children" advertisement in the Miami Herald, March 20, 1977:

"Homosexuality is nothing new. Cultures throughout history, moreover, have dealt with homosexuals almost universally with disdain, abhorance, disgust—even death.

While times certainly have changed, and American society largely has developed an attitude of tolerance, that tolerance toward homosexuality is based on the understanding that homosexuals will keep their deviate activity to themselves, will not flaunt their lifestyles, will not be allowed to preach their sexual standards to, or otherwise influence, impressionable young people.

That attitude of tolerance, most unfortunately, recently was destroyed in this community by the Metropolitan Dade County Commission, which voted, in effect, to legitimize homosexuals' presence in our society—by forcing our private and religious schools to accept them as teachers, by forcing property owners and employers to open their doors to homosexuals no matter how how blatant their perverted lives may be.

Homosexual acts are illegal under Florida law and the laws of most states. The Metro Commission, nevertheless, chose to ignore the spirit of our laws and caved in to a small, vocal group of "gays."

Despite the obvious fact that homosexual acts are illegal—and, in the eyes of most people, immoral—some nonhomosexual supporters of the homosexuals' point of view contend that the issue is one of "civil rights."

"Unless repealed, the ordinance will allow homosexuals, as one leader has promissed, to provide "role models" for the impressionable—that is, the right to tell all society, expecially our youth, that homosexuality isn't wrong, just different ... and of course, "gay."

"This recruitment of our children is absolutely necessary for the survival and growth of homosexuality—for since homosexuals cannot reproduce, they must freshen their ranks. And who qualifies as a likely recruit: a 35-year-old father or mother of two . . . or a teenage boy or girl who is surging with sexual awareness?"

"The breadth and depth of Save Our Children, Inc., became apparent several days ago when the organization presented more than 60,000 citizen's names on petitions to the Metro Commission—believed to be the most signatures ever collected by petition in Metro history in such a short time (three weeks), and 50,000 signatures more than were needed to put the ordinance on the ballot for repeal. The Commission subsequently put the issue of repeal on the ballot for a special countywide election to be conducted Tuesday, June 7.

What is needed now is for you to peak out.

Save Our Children, Inc., urges you and your family and friends to write Dade County newspaper editors and other members of local news media (radio and TV) with your opinion on the subject of the homosexual recruitment ordinance. Likewise, you are urged to contact your friends and family to urge them to vote for repeal of the ordinance June 7."

"It is imperative that the Metro ordinance be repealed June 7. The entire nation... The Normal Majority... will be watching the results of this campaign and the election. Yet, even if the ordinance is repealed, the battle of parents to protect their children from homosexuality has not ended, for, at this moment, in the Congress of the United States, 25 misguided congressman are pushing a bill (H.R. 2998) which would impose on the entire nation the same dangers found in Metro's law."
