

CANADIAN POLL: 52% FAVOR GAY RIGHTS

TORONTO - A recent Gallup Poll showed that the majority of Canadian citizens questioned be-lieve that homosexuals should be protected under the proposed Canadian Human Rights Act. 52% agreed that Gay men and Lesbians should be protected from discrimination in employment and should have access to public services.

Considerably more of those under 30 years of age felt that Gays should be protected under the Act (61%) than did those 50 years of age

More women (56%) than men (48%) believed the proposed act should inude protection of Gays discrimination. Opposition to the idea was slightly higher among men (32%) than women (28%)/

The question asked of 1,056 adults throughout Canada was: "In the proposed Canadian Human Rights Act, there has been no provision made for protection of homosexuals from discrimination in employment and in access to public services. 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
### Interview: Vincent Price & Coral Browne

one of the grossest displays of broad caricature ever put on the screen. Jerry Reed is lowkey charming as Reynolds' cohort in crime, so if you enjoy hearing such deathless dialogue as "That's a 10-4, C.B. buddy!" and watching an endless barrage of police cars crash into each other, then rush right out to the Empire, St. Francis or Serramonte Drive-In. That's a 10-4.

I can think of no better way to start out any day than having lunch with Vincent Price and his actress wife, Coral Browne. Two erudite, charming people with an equally wicked sense of humor, they possess that vanishing quality known as aplomb. Contrary to belief, neither is English; Price is from Missouri, Mrs. Price from Australia. They both just happened to live in England a long time. And now they're in San Francisco while Price portrays Oscar Wilde at the Marines Memorial Theater in "Diversions & Delights."

Says Mr. Price - "When John Gay sent the play to me, I thought it was the first literate work I'd read in ages. And it's such fun being a company of one. It's about the dignity of the individual; because of Anita Bryant, it couldn't be more pertinent. And I think Mr. Wilde will certainly outlast Miss Bryant. Wilde came to the conclusion that his whole fame was being a good dinner guest. The whole thing with the Marquess of Queensbury was totally unnecessary. It was like he had a death wish ... Wilde defines morality as the attitude we adopt toward the people we dislike."

Vincent Price is one of a handful of actors whose career has steadily spanned several decades; he reflects upon the career of actor Price over the years - "I made my professional debut in 1935, '36, '37 and '38. It was a very long run... in "Victoria Regina." Early in my career I did a play with Sally Rand. I played Jesus Christ and one night a drunk kept yelling "Take it off!"... Then I was with the Mercury Theatre with Orson Welles... More and more, I find I'm a romantic because I think the business today is about as unromantic as it can be. The minute Brando and Dean came to Hollywood, all the stage actors who were trained to speak English went! There isn't any glamor in Hollywood any more. The secret of the arts in America is one word - survival."

Of his early work, "Dragonwyck" and "Laura" remain his favorites; then came the Dr. Phibes films and "Theatre of Blood," his horror favorites. Unlike Christopher Lee, Price does not flinch from his horror film image - "I don't put them down. It would be like John Wayne putting down westerns. And they've certainly helped me as far as demand is concerned. The villain is much more interesting to play than the hero. And I had the art collector's image, which didn't hurt. I've always kidded my image; I'm strictly a pussycat . . . They wanted me to do a musical called 'Dear Dracula'. When it comes to musicals, I'm not very bright. I have a pair of shoes marked R and L."

And then there is the other side of Vincent Price; the reknowned art collector, chef, lecturer and author - "On the Carson show, they get me to do the gags no one else will do. They got me to cook a fish in a dishwasher, full cycle. And do you know, it worked. It was delicious. Johnny is quite capable of spitting it right in my face and he ate the whole fish . . . I used to lecture in 60 cities in 65 days. I still do 30 in 32. When David Niven was about on a tour to publicize his book, he called me and said 'I hear you're the oldest living lecturer.' I said, 'Yes, since Eleanor Roosevelt died.' David asked if he should bring someone along with him to tour. I said, 'Who do you like well enough to spend 40 nights in a Holiday Inn with?' He said, 'No one!' Then he said, "Do they scream and tear your clothes off?' I told him, 'Only if you're very lucky."

Four years ago Price met someone he could spend 40 nights at a Holiday Inn with, actress Coral Browne, the screen's Vera Charles in "Auntie Mame," "Killing of Sister George" and the crippled gossip columnist of "Legend of Lylah Clare" ("that was certainly before its time, wasn't it?"). They met while filming "Theatre of Blood," in which Price murdered Browne as a mad actor wreaking revenge upon the critics who'd panned him. They both recall the first meeting vividly.

Vincent Price - "Diana Rigg told me we must all take down everything she says because she's so brilliant. I made the mistake of telling her this, and she didn't say a word for three days. I thought, This is a dull broad! until she opened her mouth."

Price - "That was the scene where I killed her. I said to Diana Rigg, 'I understand it's Miss Browne's birthday. What could I get her?' And Diana said, 'Well, I know what she wants. You!'"

A second marriage for both, when both are comfortably ensconced in their middle years, Coral Browne smiles wryly and with devastating droll says, "We've been married three years. I'll never make the golden. I get wood and paper. I wonder what rotten things are coming up next? Between us, we've had every experience in the world. Here, look at this. (She takes off her engagement ring and hands it to me.) It's the smallest diamond in the world." The ring actually is quite delicate with two tiny diamonds set in it; they both laugh and Price informs her, "I don't want you to get secure."

Coral Browne's face is a dream for any woman much younger than she. With clear, smooth skin and wrinkle-free, I inquire as to her secret. "None. I was 418 pounds of condemned veal when I was young. But I've always looked chic all my life. I young. But I've always looked chic all my life. I think more marriages have come to ruin by ladies working on their faces. I think the whole of a woman's character shows under her eyes. I find the beauty thing an awful bore. Now massage, that's different. I have a man who comes every day and beats me to death (Price - "If I did that, you'd divorce me.") I don't cook. I'm sort of Vincent's sounding board because he's never sure of himself. Vincent really loves to cook. To him, it's great relaxation. To me, it's quite the opposite. Disgusting, filthy beast. I go on a different diet every week. Of course, when you work the Mark Taper Forum (in L.A. where she appeared last season) you have to diet. They pay you so little.

"I spend a lot of my time out of work deliberately because I don't want to do anything unless driven by admiration. I don't do tripe. I've been lucky because when I do work they've been successful and have long runs. Film has never worked out well. I never photographed well. My interests have always been varied. I went into the theater as a designer. I fell into acting. I never intended to become an actress."

But become an actress she did at 16 in Australia, even played "Hedda Gabler" at 18, and

then her acting teacher advised her parents to send her on to England because there was nothing left for him to teach her. For her 21st birthday, Coral Browne arrived in London. "I got a job 3 days after arrival as understudy; the actress fell ill opening night, I went on the second night and got all the press. But then I had to establish myself properly. Then it gradually happened. The war came and I read plays professionally. I advised them to do 'The Man Who Came to Dinner' with Bob Morley and I played Maggie. They wanted a tax loss and they made a lot of money with 'Dinner' so they did 'Arsenic and Old Lace' which made even more. Eventually, Guthrie invited me to the Old Vic with no training in the classics. He said, 'You've paid your dues and either you can act or you can't." No one has ever disputed Coral Browne can act, even Laurence Olivier when he feuded with her for refusing to appear in "Coriolanus" at the Old Vic. "Nobody's been any good in that part since Sarah Siddons!"

Coral Browne is a lady who speaks her mind; she has a dry wit that reduces me to a howling banshee. Fortunately, I notice Vincent Price is also howling. They're a marvelous couple together - urbane, sophisticated and totally honest. While Price performs, Mrs. Price is back at the hotel watching TV and writing letters ("I'm free until 9 tonight, when I watch 'Barney Miller.") Price tells her director Joe Hardy has mentioned giving Wilde a lisp; she retorts, "Well, that will bugger up the evening!"

Mrs. Price loves San Francisco - "Every day I go out and buy something. The shops are so marvelous. I do hope the play is a success. I don't want to go back to California." I mention this is California. "Not to me. This is another world."

And with that, Vincent Price and Coral Browne sweep out of the St. Francis to attend an art gallery with a bit of shopping on the side. They make it as far as three steps out the front door before they are surrounded by a small cluster of fans wishing them well very politely. Price is gracious and enthusiastic; Mrs. Price is casting covetous glances at Macy's windows.

While this first article is mostly biographical, I will address important issues in our community and will offer my opinions and views as a Christian minister.

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THE POOP ON POPPERS

There is a scene in the popular movie classic, Dinner at Eight, that never fails to generate titters in a certain segment of the audience. Lionel Barrymore, pressured by a failing business, has had a spell, and he orders the nurse to bring him some amyl nitrate.

In the early Forties, when the movie was made, amyl nitrate was used as a strong smelling salts. Even though it's primary pharmacologic action is not that of a stimulant, a brief whiff seemed to revive (perhaps by shocking) a person who had suffered an attack of the "vapors". For this reason, it was kept in first aid stations and even funeral homes. It could be bought without a prescription in a drug store, but it was rarely

It's only real medicinal value was for relief of angina pectoris, the chest pain that results when the blood supply to the muscular wall of the heart becomes insufficient. It has been used as a short acting vasodilator for this condition for over a hundred years and has the advantage of affording quick relief. After inhalation, it is absorbed into the blood stream from the lungs and its "rush" is felt in seconds

Like its chemical cousin. nitroglycerin, amyl belongs to a group of drugs known as nitrites, which have the pharmacologic effect of relaxing smooth muscle (muscle over which there is no voluntary control). Smooth muscles are found in most organs of the body, but the smooth muscles most affected by the nitrates are those in the walls of the blood vessels.

This vasodilating effect is esponsible for amyl's gaining a reputation as a sexual stimulant. produces a dramatic flushing of the skin of the face, neck and upper shoulders (the blush zone). As small vessels relax throughout the body, the blood pressure falls. Trying to compensate for this, the heart beats rapidly but the strokes are not strong enough to insure adequate circulation. The blood flow to the brain becomes inadequate and the resulting anoxia produces a lightheaded-

A flushed face a racing heart and a giddy sensation give the feeling of heightened sexuality. Amyl nitrate fans claim that 'poppers" serve the dual purpose of putting them more out of t and at the same time putting them more into it. Perhaps the relaxation of smooth muscles is reflected in reduced tension throughout the body.

But the trip on amyl is not always good. Especially in people with hypertension, the fall in blood pressure may be so precipitous and the circulation in the brain so compromised that the person faints. If he is standing, he may even fall and hurt himself. However, this is rare; intolerance of sensitivity to amyl nitrate is more likely to result in nausea, vomiting, cold sweat and weakness.

It is also possible that the compensatory tachycardia (fast heart rate) can confuse the heart's natural pace-maker, causing palpitations and irregularities in rhythm that can last for more than half an hour.

A more frequent unpleasant effect of amyl nitrate is headache. This probably results from dilation of the blood vessels in the sheath that covers the brain. The headache, usually not noticed until the rush is over, may require aspirin or other pain relievers before it abates. Since the amount of blood circulating in the brain is reduced, there is no reason to believe the rumor that poppers burst capillaries in the cerebral

The vessels in the retina of the eye are also dilated along with the cerebral anoxia, and that may explain some of the repor- petence. ted visual effects. It has also been postulated, but not proved, that amyl can aggravate glaucoma, a disorder due to increased pressure in the eyeball.

A risk that has a strong psychological factor is the possibility of bodily harm. Under the influence of amyl nitrate, a person can become so carried away in his wanton abandonment that he does or permits done to him things that later on he realizes have been painful or

A final undesirable side effect is the loss of or difficulty in maintaining an erection. This does not happen to everyone and may vary from time to time with the same individual. This could be the result of the loss of smooth muscle tone in the penis or a drainage of the blood from the erectile tissues as the body adjusts to lowered blood pressure. Such an experience does not enhance the reputation of poppers as a sexual

Who uses poppers and how are used influences the risk. One or two inhalations by a healthy person right before orgasm is much less likely to cause problems than someone with hypertension or a cardiac irregularity maintaining a high for an evening of fun and games in the bedroom or living room. (Poppers are reported to be good for giggles as well as sex.)

Not only the length of time amyl nitrate is used, but also the frequency of its use can be a danger. People can develop a popper habit. This may have psychological as well as physical repercussions. Having sex without a popper becomes increasingly difficult, often to the point of undermining a partner's feeling of sexual com-

But for most people, the popper experience is a temporary fad. They are fun for a while, but after a few exciting sexual experiences without them, they are used only for an occasional kick.. Many others do not get beyond the first whiff or two. They dislike or fear the physical changes they experience.

But what about those who like an occasional popper? If the risk/benefit ratio is so low, why are poppers available only on prescription? The answer lies somewhere in the convoluted relationship between governmental policies and social


But as the profits increased, so did the guilt of the manufacturers. Finally, the FDA became persuaded that amyl nitrate was being abused; that is, used for purposes (probably pleasurable) other than its specific scientific indication. Amyl nitrate was declared a prescription drug. So if your doctor refuses to write you an Rx for poppers, try to understand he is not rejecting you,

he is simply respecting the law. The fact that the danger of amyl nitrate is minimal is suphypothetical. 
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


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
