

MAYOR ANSWERS GAY CRITICS

MOSCONE ANSWERS QUESTIONS FROM THE GAY COMMUNITY: A TRANSCRIPT

It was a night of miracles. Supervisor Harvey Milk joined the Alice B. Toklas Democratic Club and was embraced by its founder, Jim Foster. Foster, who had worked diligently for Milk's opponent, Rick Stokes, spoke to the Toklas gathering and urged the Gay community to unite behind Supervisor Milk.

The November meeting of Toklas at the Cali-fornia State Building auditorium in the Civic Center ended early and was followed by a Gay Community Forum with an honored guest, Mayor George Mos-cone. The mayor was aware of some constructive criticism of his policies from Chris Perry of the San Francisco Gay Democratic Club and others. He received a standing ovation as he entered the auditorium

The Gay Forum was sponsored by several Gay groups, including the following: GALA, Coalition for Human Rights, BPAC, Gay Democratic Club and Toklas.

This is the actual transcript of the mayor's response to questions and statements made during his presentation:

GAY ADVISORY BOARD

I have been reticent to appoint a Mayor's Gay Advisory Board because of something that I am very sensitive to and that you may be sensitive to also: That is, like any other community, when you select 5, 7, 9 or whatever there will be others that should have been appointed. The last thing that I want to do, is to do anything that would encourage any kind of competitive effort among people who need to work together and with this administration.

POLICE CHIEF CHARLES GAIN

I appreciate this resolution (from the Toklas Club) in support of Charles Gain. It is worth a great



deal. There is a reasonably concerted effort to disparage not just Chief Gain or myself but some of the things that I like to think that both of us stand for. It is of no surprise that the Gay community would recognize it rather quickly and take action to would recognize it rather quickly and take action to give support ... I am not weakening in my support of Chief Gain; Herb Caen, to the contrary, not withstanding. There has never been a discussion, thought or action by me to weaken the position of the police chief. He needs reinforcement from time to time, that there is a greater community out there that wants to see a decent city and a decent police department.

GAY CENTER ON GROVE STREET

I do not support the Center in its present locale 1 do not support the Center in its present locale ... or anything else at that location (330 Grove Street). The Center should continue there until the 11th hour, when that property is needed to be used. I believe that a Performing Arts Center is good for this city. I believe that it has the potential for adding much to this city, whether you come from the so-called "elite" or from any other place. (Note: 330 Grove Street is in a city Master Plan to become part of the Arts Center project and is temporarily loaned to the Pride Foundation rent-free.)

A FUTURE GAY CENTER

I am absolutely, unequivocally, 100% behind decent, sound, comprehensive facilities that can be called a Gay Community Center. I believe that this is clearly a major obligation of this city. I am happy to join in this effort. That city money, I believe, will eventually have to come out of the Community Development Program. We should provide facilities for this important segment of our community. I believe that you are helping the city by pursuing such a plan. I am going to make every effort to support that. The mayor's office is committed to this and we will need your help to get ratification from our legislative body, the Board of Supervisors.

LACK OF COMMUNICATION

you ever hear a snide remark about Gay ople or the Gay lifestyle from people over which have some control, I want to know about it. I do not have some control, I want to know about it. I do not want people in my administration who do not provide respect, no matter how much they may disagree with you on principle. You do not serve your community or me if you think that you are doing something wrong by reporting such incidents to me. I want to know about it ... Many times things go awry because I do not hear about what is happening.

DISTRICT ELECTIONS & HARVEY MILK

One of the reasons I supported District Elections is because the only way a person can be a 24-hour, 7-days-a-week ombudsman is for that person to represent a particular neighborhood and a partic-ular community ... The city is now privileged to have the representation of Harvey Milk. Such representatives can deliver concerns better than any "Gay Advisory Board" to the mayor.

TV EDITORIALS CRITICAL OF THE MAYOR

Channel 5 and Channel 7 have never elected anyone to public office. Nor have they ever pressured a resignation. I would hope that the day comes when Channel 7 would find the morality in their own operation that it demands of us.

GAYS IN CITY GOVERNMENT

Our staff includes at least three upfront Gay people -- at least they are known to me. There may be others who I do not know about, as I don't think it is my business to check on the personal lives of others

I hope that the Gay community is not saying, "Give us a Gay on the Police Commission, on the Board of Permit Appeals, and on the Planning Commission because they are votes that we can count on." I hope they are saying, "Here is someone who is sensitive to our needs and who shares that with the other commissioners, who will talk publicly and privately about the needs of our community." and privately about the needs of our commu

I have never sent the Gay people who work for me out into the community to be my "Gay" representatives. They are not hired for that reason. They were hired because they were the most capable people in a special sphere. They only happen to be part of an important segment of this community. I believe that it is my job to be the liaison with the



accepted his appointment with the knowledge of where my political head is. (Note: Boas determines where the city hotel tax funds go in the funding of special events. He has refused thus far to fund the annual Gay Parade, calling it a "political" activity.) I am able to discuss rationally with Mr. Boas the

The Gay community has found it to be terribly important to have a parade to exhibit the kind of progress that it has made in this very progressive city. It is an honest endeavor that gives publicity to the city. It is an event that has considerable self-enforcement in difficult times. I can talk with Mr. Boas, allowing him to make an independent judgment about giving financial aid to the Gay Parade. I do believe that my reasoning will prevail, but if it does not, he will have another year's experience before that matter comes up again. I believe that support of this event is a proper expenditure, for providing a little happiness in this city for a very well enforced

GAY ON POLICE COMMISSION

It is very proper to have minority people on the Police Commission for the reason that they have particular concerns about the sensitiveness or lack of it by the police department.

I will not appoint a Gay to the present vacancy. I shall appoint another Black person to that appoint-ment to replace the Black who is leaving.

There will be a Gay on the Police Commission before I leave the position of Mayor.

HOUSING

I support a proposed city ordinance which would make it illegal to discriminate against Gay people in housing.

CITY AWARD MONEY USED TO APPREHEND MURDERERS

City award money is not used capriciously. The money is offered when the Police Department determines that a financial incentive is needed to apprehend the wanted person. They let me know when such an award would be appropriate. We follow Chief Gain's advice on such matters.

POLICE HARASSMENT ON POLK STREET?

We met with merchants and other citizens -Gay and straight - from Polk Street. They unani-mously commended Northern Police Station for being so considerate, sensitive and responsible in dealing with the problems in that area ... I need complaints with specific details if you have any in regard to alleged police harassment of citizens. We will follow up will follow up

GAY ON MANPOWER COMMISSION

There is a current vacancy on the 28-person Manpower Commission and it is slotted for a Veteran. I am open to possible appointment of a Gay Veteran. Please give me the names of Gay Veterans who want to serve, and I will make that appointment forthwith.

GAY UNITY

There are probably a lot of broken hearts and broken feelings from the race in District 5 where two Gay people opposed each other. (Note: A reference to Harvey Milk and Rick Stokes.) It is very difficult to mend that. However, there must be great dispatch in putting aside feelings that were evident in the campaign and unite behind the winner. "I believe our broad-

There should not be squabbling among one another. When the chips are down, you must put aside the petty politics and fight for the city and the life of your community. That is what I ask of every minority community. On certain basic issues you must speak with one voice, without the squabbling. That is the greatest service you can be to yourselves and to this administration.

FUTURE PUBLIC FORUMS

I hope that tonight is only one of many meetings that I hope will take place between me and my office and the community at large so that we can always be upfront about the problems that plague our city and those problems that particularly beset you. You are certainly part of the greater commu-nity. I am sure that you agree with that.

Local TV Opens To Gays

SAN FRANCISCO - Offi-cials of (UHF) TV station Channel 38 (a religious broadcasting outlet here) have decided to give Gay activists a chance to ex-plain their views on the

Last June, the San Francisco-based Council on Religion and the Homosexual had com-plained to the Federal Communications Commission that Channel 38, part of the Glendale-based Faith Broadcasting Network, would not give them equal time to rebut the homophobic views of Anita Bryant. Federal regulations insist that "controversial issues" be fairly handled or the station faces a non-renewal of its license.

Bryant had appeared on three hours of program-ming aired by Channel 38 prior to the June 7 repeal of a Dade County, Fla.,

"I believe our broadcasting voice in the San Francisco Bay Area must go on record as recogniz-ing the intrinsic value of the rights and person of the so-called 'Gay' com-munity," the network's president, Dr. Gene Scott, said in a letter released by his attorney.

STATEWIDE ANTI-BRIGGS SESSION IN L.A.

Gay activists from across the state will be meeting at the University of Southern Cali-fornia in Los Angeles, December 9-11. The three-day session will be a broadly-based rally and planning session to unite the Gay community behind the fight against the anti-Gay teacher initiative proposed by State Senator John Briggs.

The U.S.C. conference is open to all Gay people. It begins Friday evening with regis-tration and socializing. Saturday will be a day of workshops. Sunday will feature a general business session. A ten-person state-wide planning group set up the conference, which follows a preliminary meeting that was recently held in Sacramento with 200 Gay activists participating. activists participating.

Stanley Weigel, federal district judge in San Fran-cisco, has ruled that Anita Bryant, Bob Greene, Mike Thompson and Save Our Children, Inc. in Florida are out of his jurisdiction in a suit filed by Pride. Pride is suing these parties and State Senator John Briggs in a \$5 million court action which alleges that the defendants cre-ated a climate which led to the murder of Robert Hillsborough. Weigel con-tends that there was not ample direct involvement ample direct involvement in California by the Bryant forces in Florida.

The court action is be-ing brought by the Pride Foundation on behalf of Mrs. Helen Hillsborough, mother of the victim, under a statute which makes it illegal to deprive persons of their civil rights out of prejudice.

Attorney John Baissey, who recently flew to Florida and obtained a deposition from singer/ activist Anita Bryant, says that Pride will contest the judge's ruling. Senator Briggs has also given a deposition in the case.



For Gay Teachers

The recent refusal of the U.S. Supreme Court to review the case of James Gaylord, a former teacher in the Tacoma, Washing-ton, public school system who was fired simply for being Gay and honestly admitting it to school officials when he was asked, has rightfully caused outrage among asked, caused caused outrage among Gay people throughout the country. The case should be seen in perspective, however, and not taken as the end of the road for the assertion of equal rights by Gay teachers or Gay public employees generally.

The Supreme Court's action has only the effect of letting stand the deci-sion of the Washington State Supreme Court which upheld Gaylord's firing. Further, the firing was by a local school board in a city in Wash-ington State which had no ordinance protocting Gauss ordinance protecting Gays from employment dis-crimination, and so the result would doubtless be different even in Washing-ton State had the city involved been Seattle, for example, which has a Gay rights ordinance.







Gay Synagogue



Dollar Help For Insulating Your Home

With preference to the elderly and handicapped, the San Francisco Economic Opportunity Coun-cil is still authorizing the expenditure of Federal funds for insulating

These monies are avail-able under a Labor-HEW supplemental appropri-ation added by Congress to the Emergency Energy Conservation program Conservation program. Insulating the home can be an important step in cutting energy use and the cost of heating.

Eligibility for the funds is based on a maximum annual household income of \$3713 for individuals, \$4913 for couples, and \$7313 for families of four.

Applicants for these funds must appear in person at the nearest office of the San Francisco Economic Oppor-tunity Council. Office locations are listed in the phone book under ECO-NOMIC OPPORTUNITY COUNCIL OF SAN FRANCISCO, INC.

Better Business Bureau Shopping Tips

We are convinced from past experience that if you are smart, your Christmas shopping can be happy, satisfying and profitable. If not, you might experience the disappointments, heartaches and after Christmas complaints so often reported to the Better Business Bureau.

REMEMBER:

1. Trade only with concerns known to be reliable or with those whose reputation can be established by intelligent inquiry.

2. Unless there is a written or provable agree-ment otherwise, all sales are final - and the matter of a refund or exchange is dependent on the policy of the seller.

3. Decide definitely what you want before you buy so as to avoid difficulty or delay in take-back, exchange or refund.

5. It would be best to examine Christmas purchases before Christmas so that any claim for defect or damages may be made immediately rather than after Christmas.

6. Don't expect that you can bring back to a store after Christmas an article bought before Christmas and get full refund or credit for it if that article has already been marked down -- unless the store wants to do so.

7. Don't try to get cash refunds on Christmas gifts given to you. The fact that you don't like the gift or that you received two or more alike is no reason why any merchant should give you a refund.

8. Don't contract to purchase anything beyond your capacity to pay.

9. If you pay an advance deposit on the "lay away plan" or otherwise, be sure that you can and will go through with the deal -- otherwise, you may sacrifice your deposit.

10. Never let yourself be rushed into buying anything by high pressure sales talk; or claim that it is your last chance — take your time and make up your own mind carefully.

11. Read all papers you are asked to sign and keep a copy.

12. If you want delivery by Christmas, be sure you deal with concerns that have the facilities to fulfill their promises.

13. If you find the article you receive is not as ordered -- do not use it. Notify the seller

immediately and give him an opportunity to adjust

14. Don't buy from advertisers who attempt to discourage you from buying attractively advertised goods but who instead try to high pressure you into something else. That's "bait" advertising.


15. If you do business by mail order -- First make sure you are dealing with a reliable company; allow plenty of time for delivery and write very plainly -- printing or typing is best.

16. No one can continually sell retail at whole-sale prices, so an appeal "Buy Wholesale" is general-ly wholesale bunk.

17. Transient vendors, sidewalk hawkers and peddlers are not around after Christmas to listen to complaints.

18. A guarantee should be specific and in writing.






