# Harvey Speaks Out

B.A.R. is pleased to present excerpts from a taped speech by Supervisor-elect Harvey Milk. He spoke before the November meeting of the San Francisco Gay Democratic Club...

## VICTORY

I will never forget it. I cannot. I know where it comes from. I don't have any power or influence yet. It really doesn't take place until January 9.

I am just a figurehead, the one who happened to step out of the back room. I am the one who happens to have done it. It is your victory, and I do not mean just the ones who worked and voted for me...

The opponents threw everything against us -- innuendos, phoney endorsements, and all -- and we still won.

## WALKING FROM THE CASTRO

The swearing in will be at noon on Monday, Jan. 9. We will be walking from Castro Street.

I was elected to represent the City of San Francisco and the 5th District. I also have a responsibility of being a Gay leader. I hope the walk will include everyone.

In the 98 precincts in the district, we were first in 60 and second in 33. We worked all over the district and our victory was broad-based. I knew that it would be.

## WHAT THIS VICTORY MEANS

I ran three times before succeeding. Traditionally it is three strikes and you're "out," but I play by different rules.

When the mayor asked me a year ago what my motivation was, I told him that I remember what it was like to be 14 and Gay. I know that somewhere today there is a 14 year old child who discovers that he or she is Gay and learns that the family may throw that child out of the house. The police will harass that child. The state will say that the child is a criminal and that the intelligence of the Anita Bryants will be screaming at that child. Maybe that child read in the newspaper, "Homosexual Elected in San Francisco," and that child has two options: move to San Francisco or stay in San Antonio or Des Moines and fight. The child has hope.

## THE OBLIGATION OF GAY PEOPLE

Picture a country of hundreds of Gay clubs and organizations. National conventions with 8,000 people who are electing to national office friends of the Gay community. Maybe we never had it so good, compared with what went before, but the future can be greater.

We are now split: Republicans, Democrats, Socialists, Independents. Many people say, "I cannot get involved in politics and why should I? Who is going to bother us here?"

We must begin now to be involved so statespersons will go out and change the laws. It can still happen here as it did in Germany. The Briggs are the Hitlers. If the Briggs' win, they will not stop. They will taste victory...

It is vital that people join Gay groups even if they cannot attend the meetings. We must have members. The politicians want to know how many people are involved. Our protection is strength.

If we don't have the money, we must have numbers. We must register people to vote. Gay people have registered 5,000 voters in front of my camera store on Castro... When I first started the Castro Street Fair the city would not close the street for me. The next year I took them photos of the crowds that had been there and they closed the street.

## LEARNING & BUILDING GAY POWER

There were an incredible number of speeches made at the Democratic National Convention about rights, rights, rights -- but we could not get a Gay plank into the platform. This is so even though we make up 5-7% in a voting bloc. They walked away from us. My answer to that is that we shall never again go back. We must start to build toward the national convention so that we cannot be ignored... The Jewish vote is estimated at a 4% bloc vote. The Democratic convention was geared to get that Jewish vote.

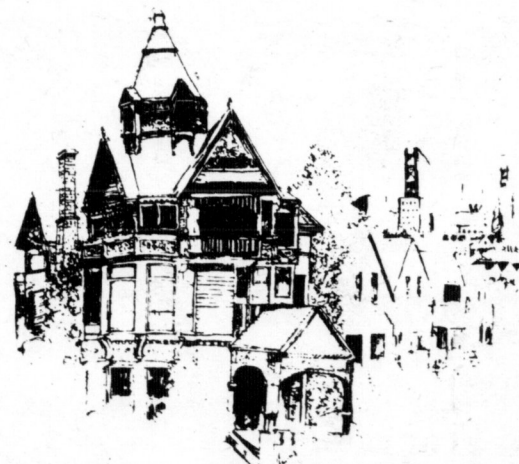
We have to start to learn what to do and what not to do. We must educate ourselves as the Black movement and the Jewish movement have done. Why have they been so successful and why have we been such a failure? We may not find the answers

immediately, but we will learn and we will make our presence felt.

When "push comes to shove," there are more of them than there are of us. We are going to need their support, and we had better start playing their games now. We must get into battles such as the International Hotel or whatever. We should work openly as Gay people so they know who is supporting them; so they will be there when we need their support.

Get involved in someone's campaign for the June primary elections. Let them know that you are Gay. If they don't want you, we will be finding out who is who.

#### A STRATEGY FOR GAY POWER

We must have a statewide caucus of Gay people, not just Gay Democrats, but also Gay Republicans, Socialists, Communists, Fascists and Independents. Then we must invite all of the candidates for state office to speak to us — not about the aerospace industry, but about their positions on Gay rights.

The time has come to embarrass our friends. We must ask ourselves some questions now that will have to be asked sooner or later. We can sit in the back of the bus where we may get shoved out when it is unpopular to have us around. We might as well find out now who our real friends are. If it embarrasses certain candidates, so be it. I am embarrassed by some of them.

#### NATIONAL STRENGTH

We must begin now to put together a statewide movement and learn from our mistakes in doing that. Maybe in three years we can have our own nationwide convention and invite the national candidates to find out where they are. If neither presidential candidate shows up, there may be a third candidate. There is no reason why we should vote Democratic or Republican just because we are ourselves Republican or Democratic.

What good is a nation which is economically healthy, that is beautifully run, if you are in jail because you are Gay. We must learn from history that the time for riding in the back of the bus is over; that we must ride up front or ride by ourselves. We must make that decision — not just for ourselves but for that young person in Altoona, Pennsylvania.

#### SUPPORT FOR CHIEF GAIN

Chief of Police Charles Gain is not the greatest person in the world. He is not the greatest friend in the world. But he is the best Chief of Police that any Gay community in this country has ever had.

The mayor has said that he, Chief Gain, will "stay in power as long as I am mayor." There is not a person in this room who doesn't know where I am with the mayor. We are not very close. I have

written to the mayor reminding him of his promise. We must all write those letters to the mayor. The dismissal of Gain would be a disaster. It would be a victory for the political Right.

#### THE BOARD PRESIDENCY

Five of the ten on the coming Board want to be President, and they are very nice to me. Eventually, I will vote for one of them. Then I will have the other four to worry about.

The freshmen on the new Board may get together and share their thoughts. I have had two meetings with Supervisor-elect Dan White, who is thought of as for Mother, God and Apple Pie. He seemed comfortable at the Oyster House on Castro.

There are many issues: speculation, rent control, etc. I believe that we will have the votes on the new Board on Upper Market Street. I would like to see the new Gay ordinance (expanding Gay employment rights citywide) considered by the new Board so we can see how they vote.

#### QUENTIN KOPP

Quentin and I disagree on issue after issue, but we do communicate with each other. Quentin supported me when I ran for the Assembly. However, I will never vote for or against a person because they were for or against me. I appreciated his support, but he also knows that it carries nothing more than appreciation. I am not now supporting anyone for the presidency of the Board at this moment. I am leaning.

#### JOHN BARBAGELATA

I never made any deals with Supervisor John Barbagelata. The rumors were not true. I found him detestable.

Three years ago he said to me, "Harvey, you are different than the rest." I know that I could never have any relationship with the gentleman, if you wish to call him that.

If we ever have another MacDonald Hamburger establishment in this city, I would like to have it right across the street from his house in St. Francis Woods.

#### RELATIONSHIP WITH THE MAYOR

I went in to see the mayor when I was elected this time. I told him, "When I criticize you, you will hear it first in this office. It is only if there is no satisfaction that they will start to hear it outside. There are certain things that the Gay community wants and needs. I will be lobbying and watching. . . . As soon as I decide who I personally think should be the next mayor, I will come and tell you. You will be the first to hear it."

#### THE MAYORS RACE

If Mayor Moscone, who made promises to us a couple weeks ago (in a published transcript in B.A.R.), does not live up to them, look for the next candidate. He knows that he made some promises and we can no longer just sit back and let promises be enough. We must have our share — no more, but no less. He has two years.

We must get involved in the mayor's race. If the mayor does not live up to his promises, then we will be involved in finding another candidate. He knows that. You are going to make the difference. Not me.

Last time I said early, "With five major candidates for mayor and two possible in the run-off, we can wait until close to the election and then say, 'We offer you enough votes to put you in the run-off and this is what we want. . . .'" Many "leaders" in the Gay community who were desirous to retain their token positions let this slip out of our hands. They stopped the Gay community from making a major move at that point. Let us never let that happen again.

#### WORKING TOGETHER

We must stop fighting among ourselves because someone is not liberal enough or someone is not conservative enough or someone doesn't have the right personality. We must stop fighting and work together. Even if we can't stand each other, we have to work together. . . . There are also lots of people still "coming out" and you know what they are going through. Some are petrified about their careers. They need us to help them in their coming out.

#### FOCUS ON THE GAY ISSUE

It is not that the Gay issue is more important or that the other issues do not count, but we must focus on the Gay issue. There is no reason why other groups cannot discuss Gay issues. We cannot allow them off the hook.

I understand the problems of Women, Blacks, Chicanos and others, but I don't want to give them a way out. We are the only group discriminated against by law. I would like to see support for us on this one issue.

I don't think that we should fall into the trap of trying to accomplish too much and allow others to say, "We are for human rights and thank you very much." I have heard that too often. . . . I don't see other movements speaking out against Briggs.

I want to say to the governor, "We know where you stand on employing women. We read it in the papers. How many Gay people do you employ?" I don't see Governor Brown dumping some orange juice and announcing, "Enough of Anita Bryant."

#### MY COMMITMENT

I have already scheduled meetings in the Haight area. There are about 15 District 5 neighborhood and association meetings a month. Either one of my two aides (Note: see news article on his appointments in this issue) or myself will be at those meetings. I will also be available and accessible to the broader community and the Gay community.

We have to keep pushing. The mayor was right when he said, "The supervisors would have closed Polk Street for Halloween if there had been 70,000 head of cattle down there." How far do we push?

We must be strong and be heard. We must push as hard as they push and then push a little stronger.

Since I speak as a Gay person, I am very much aware of the responsibility that I have. I will make mistakes, and when I do, my aides will remind me of them. I hope that the mistakes will not be too serious.

#### "Yes" To Gay Teachers

SANTA BARBARA  
The Santa Barbara Board of Education has unanimously passed (5-0) a resolution which adds "sexual preference" to its job non-discrimination clause. This permits openly Gay persons to apply for positions as teachers and administrators and to retain such positions.

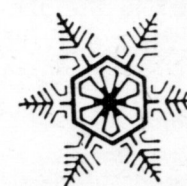

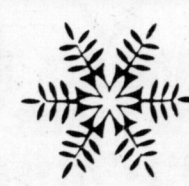

**"New Briggs Summary Is More Accurate" ... Hardman**

Paul Hardman, Pride Foundation official, is pleased with a re-written summary on the new petitions being circulated by Senator John Briggs, "California Save Our Children" group. He believes that the earlier summary, which had the title "School Teachers - Homosexual Acts or Conduct," was too limiting and that the new title, "School Employees - Homosexuality," is more fairly descriptive of what the measure is about.

Pride was asked to submit its own definition for the summary after the organization had successfully challenged, on a minor technicality, the

**News Summary — Briggs Initiative**

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure. This will appear on the petitions now being circulated by the "California Save Our Children" organization. The differences between this summary and the one on the earlier petitions is discussed in a separate article.

\* \* \* \* \*

**SCHOOL EMPLOYEES - HOMOSEXUALITY INITIATIVE STATUTE**

Provides for filing charges against school teachers, teachers aides, school administrators or counselors who advocate, solicit, impose, encourage or promote private or public sexual acts defined in section 286(a) and 288(a) of the penal code between persons of same sex in a manner likely to come to the attention of other employees or students; or publicly and indiscretely engages in said acts. Prohibits hiring and requires dismissal of such persons if School Board determines unfitness of service after considering enumerated guidelines. In dismissal cases only, provides for two stage hearings, written findings, judicial review. Financial impact: UNKNOWN, but potentially substantial local cost to school districts depending on the number of cases which receive an administrative hearing.

wording of the first petition. CSOC had printed 800,000 petitions which had to be withdrawn. Many Gay activists question whether Briggs can rebuild the momentum he began with the circulation of the first petition.

Attorneys John Wahl and Donald Knutson were instrumental in writing a suggested summary at the request of the State Attorney General, which was considered in the writing of the new summary.

The new wording, printed elsewhere in this issue of B.A.R., emphasizes that the petition "provides for filing charges" as against the earlier definition which emphasized "prohibits hiring, and requires dismissal." Either way, Hardman believes that "the initiative is highly questionable on constitutional grounds. It is redundant by repeating constitutional protections already in current law. It calls attention to Gay people as a special class, as if we alone could commit the acts or deeds suggested." He says, however, that the new description more clearly explains the guidelines and better states that acts or deeds are subject to review.

If Briggs can now accumulate 312,000 valid signatures in 150 days, his measure will qualify for the November ballot. This would require an estimated 450,000 names, allowing for the usual 20-25% disqualification of invalid signatures. Only four out of 152 attempts to qualify initiatives have been successful in California history.

**New Age Boycott: Coors**

New Age, a relatively new professional Gay rights organization in Los Angeles, has initiated as a major project the expansion of the Gay boycott against the Coors Com-

pany of Golden, Colorado. The gaycott began in 1977 when Howard Wallace and Bay Area Gay Liberation (BAGL) alerted Gay people to the use of a lie detector test at Coors for prospective employees and talked of the Right Wing politics of Coors officials, detrimental to the Gay rights cause.

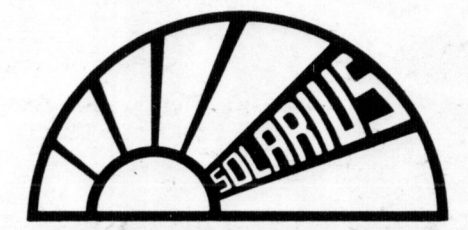
The New Age campaign began in November with the mailing of its Newsletter to 8,000 Gay activists, urging that they boycott Coors. The group also mailed letters to every bar, bath and community center in Southern California, urging that they discontinue the use of Coors beer. In addition, New Age is announcing its boycott through a speakers bureau. It is placing advertisements in a number of Gay publications urging the boycott.

In its announcement, New Age calls attention to President Joseph Coors' continuing support of Phyllis Schlafly and the John Birch Society, both openly anti-homosexual, support by the Coors family of Congressperson Larry McDonald who authored the successful amendment which took Gay people out of the free legal aid program and its support of the political Right which is openly opposed to the Gay and women's rights movements. Emphasis was also placed on the company's long history of being anti-union and its very limited hiring of Chicanos, Blacks and women. The company's use of a polygraph (lie detector) test to screen out prospective employees with divergent lifestyles was also a factor in the move by New Age.

The Brewery Workers #366 strike continues at Coors, although many of the 1,400 workers who went on strike in April of this year have either returned to work or sought employment elsewhere. The callous company has hired hundreds of non-union workers ("scabs") in order to destroy the

union's bargaining effort. The LOS ANGELES TIMES analyzed the strike and boycott in a November 21 article. It stressed

that Coors sales have continued to slump with a reported decline in California of 20% in sales and a decline of 15% in Texas.

TIMES writer Larry Pryor said, "Coors' volume this year is expected to be considerably below projections."

Wallace, a Gay activist and Teamster driver, is quoted in the TIMES feature: "The Gay bar to the Gay community is what the Black church is to the Black community. It is a social center, a place to meet, and beers sell big. It is a lucrative market." He expressed pleasure that almost all Gay bars in Northern California now boycott Coors and expressed concern that the use of the polygraph test is intimidating to potential Gay employees.

The TIMES says the "toughest issues, the ones that may determine the effectiveness of the boycott, deal with whether the company has discriminated against women, homosexuals or minority groups... Adolph Coors Co. officials have been telling interest groups that it takes no position for or against controversial issues such as Gays, abortion and the Equal

Rights Amendment ... What individual members of the Coors family contribute to is something else, although they claim that as their right."

In answer to continuing charges that he is attempting to break unions and is anti-human rights, President Joseph Coors told the TIMES: "All we're trying to do is maintain the same opportunities for the next generation that I have had during my lifetime. We (the Coors family) feel very definitely there are strong forces that are trying to destroy them."

Concerned about the growing gaycott, Co-presidents Bill and Joseph Coors have attempted to explain their position in THE ADVOCATE newspaper and have toured the Western States to refute the anti-Gay argument against them. They have spent thousands of dollars on full-page advertisements to deny charges, but neither man has personally given any money to any Gay group.

Twenty Gay groups recently met with Coors officials at a San Francisco meeting called by Coors. The officials were told, the TIMES article explains, "that Gays would consider calling off the boycott - when Coors agrees to put into its contract that it will not discriminate on the basis of

sexual orientation, call off the lie detector tests and stop the heavy underwriting of leading anti-Gay groups." There has been no response from the Adolph Coors Co. at Golden, Colorado.

Dan Fortune, labor writer of the SF EX-AMINER, concluded, "Gay community leaders show no signs of ending their boycott against Coors beer, despite a drive by Coors to get its brew back into San Francisco bars that cater to homosexuals." Coors held meetings with Gay leaders in Los Angeles, Orange County, Concord, San Jose and San Francisco but were unsuccessful. Among those Bay Area groups supporting the gaycott, Fortune reports, are Lesbian Resistance, Alice B. Toklas Democratic Club, Golden Gate Business Association, San Francisco Gay Democratic Club and Coalition for Human Rights. This listing includes both women and men as well as groups considered politically diverse.

## The Campaign Against Gain

Almost a year ago I wrote a column in support of Police Chief Gain. right-wing Police Officers Ass'n has renewed their semi-annual "get rid of Charlie Gain" campaign and show no signs of letting up.

The latest attack came after the Chief was photographed at the recent Hookers' Ball. I personally see nothing wrong with the Chief going to the Ball or even being photographed there, but if might have been a mistake in public relations on the Chief's part - I don't know. Last year the POA caused a similar flap over the fact that the Chief asked that the American flag be removed from his inner office. Again, a possible lapse in judgement on the part of the Chief. In fact, if I can see one fault at all with Charles Gain, it might be just that - mistakes when it comes to public relations. But then, that is not what he was hired to do - worry about his public image. I hardly think being photographed at the Hookers' Ball hurt the public image of the Police Department, as the POA claims. I think, too, that he might have quietly moved the flag from his office and no one would have been the wiser. But Charlie Gain didn't take time to stop and wonder what his critics would think.

The guy has been a damned good cop - probably the best top cop we've had for a long time. As Gays, Charles Gain has been the best friend we could have in the Police Department; he hates any type of bigotry and will not tolerate it from his men, whether it be against Gays or straights. I have talked with Chief Gain on several occasions and I am convinced of his sincerity.

The Police Officers Ass'n certainly is not sympathetic to Gays, although some individual cops might be. The POA President, Gerald Crowley, will not let up on his effort to torpedo Gain. The pressure on the Mayor is increasing all of the time - even Herb Caen, who claims to be a liberal, has sided with the POA and the right-wing cops.

There is a move going on at this moment of which we are not even made aware; there are pressures from important people urging the Mayor to dump Charlie Gain. If you think what you read in the press and hear on TV is heavy, that is only a part of it.

I know Quentin Kopp and have always had an admiration of sorts for him, but when he ran with the Hookers' Ball incident, I began to wonder if Quentin Kopp wants to be Mayor so damned bad that even a man like Charlie Gain has to pay the price.

Herb Caen's relentless attacks upon Gain are easier to understand. Caen has many friends on the force who have come up through the ranks. Many of them he knew long before Gain came to San Francisco. Caen's cop friends obviously have his ear, and he is only mouth-piecing their alibis. Crowley and the POA brass have no concern for Gays - none whatsoever.

For every bit of pressure there is on the other side to urge Moscone to replace Gain, we must apply even more pressure to keep him here. I urge everyone to contact the Mayor, backing him in his defense of Gain. George Moscone is trying to do a good job as Mayor, but in the final analysis he is still a politician. And who knows, if the pressure gets too heavy, he might just give in. Write to the Mayor, call his office, or better yet, if possible, speak to him in person.

### Wanted: One Symbol

Recently when I was reading the Sunday newspaper, I came to an article that occupied a whole page and contained only one picture. Since the picture showed us Anita Bryant with her mouth open, my attention was immediately captured. I simply couldn't turn the page without finding out why Anita's picture was there. But I had to read almost the whole article before I found out that Anita was mentioned only in passing in the second half of one sentence. The article dealt with another subject entirely, and a lot of other well-known people were also mentioned. Why, then, was Anita's picture so prominently displayed?

The answer, of course, is that Anita is an attention-getter. Newspaper editors know that they can get us to read about almost anything if we are led to believe that somehow has a connection with Anita. The plain fact is that she has managed to make herself a symbol for the subject of homosexuality. No matter whether a person is Gay or straight, prohomosexual or antihomosexual, he is going to recognize at once, when he sees Anita's picture, that the subject of homosexuality is close at hand. And even if it isn't the actual subject at hand, interest is aroused. As the newspapers themselves have demonstrated in the last couple of years, everybody is interested in homosexuality.

But isn't this a strange phenomenon? Why should a person who is ANTI-homosexual become a symbol for homosexuality? When the newspapers talk about the black civil rights movement, they show us pictures of black people, not racists. When they talk about the women's liberation movement, they show us pictures of women, not men. It begins to look as if the subject isn't really homosexuality at all, but what Anita stands for - antihomosexuality. Considering what the newspapers usually report, that may well be the case. If so, then I suggest that it is time for us to do something about it.

It is time, I think, to find a Gay person - man or woman - who will become a symbol for the Gay movement. An individual Gay person still has a lot to lose by stepping forward and becoming a spokesperson and a symbol. If will take sacrifice and courage. But if Gay rights are to be obtained, I think it is absolutely necessary. Some Gay person must emerge as a counter-symbol to Anita.

To get some idea of what kind of Gay person would fit the bill, we might ask what Anita has that most of the rest of us don't have. She has, first of all, constant exposure on television and radio as well as in the newspapers. Second, she is a person who has already been accepted as a public figure by the media. Third, she has a following that is made up of people who are swayed by emotion instead of by reason - in her case, an organized religion.

We need, therefore, somebody who is already known and accepted by society in general, somebody already in the public view. It should be somebody with a certain amount of influence in another sphere, somebody who commands respect. And it should be somebody who either has an established following or who is capable of leading large groups of people at the emotional as well as at the rational level. It would be an added advantage if the person selected had more status in all of these areas than Anita has.

Who? The obvious choice would be a movie or television star or perhaps a sports figure. Only a person in these fields meets all of the requirements. It wouldn't make any difference whether it was a man or a woman, but the person chosen would have to be willing to risk everything he/she is and has. Ay, there's the rub. Dare we ask of anybody what might well turn out to be a total sacrifice of career, financial stability, and life aspirations?

And yet this is exactly what we need. We already have leaders in the Gay movement, of course, who have been willing to take this risk, and we are grateful for what they have done. But for the most part they have become known only to others in the Gay movement. Their names aren't recognized in the straight world, and consequently their voices aren't persuasive. We need somebody who has already arrived, somebody who can speak from the heights.

Are there any volunteers? Is there any well-known Gay person who believes enough in the cause to dedicate his/her life to it at whatever cost? We desperately need somebody whose picture can replace Anita's. We need a Gay person who is willing to become a symbol.

### Agnos Announces Student Aid Program

SACRAMENTO - Assemblyman Art Agnos announced recently that applications for the State Graduate Fellowship Program for 1978-79 are now available.

This Fellowship Program is a state-aid program designed to provide financial assistance on a competitive basis to graduate or professional students.

## Lesbians And Gay Men Struggling Together

It has not been easy, but it is more honest and personally rewarding for Gay men to recognize women as equals. Every facet of the media and educational system is geared to teach men that they are superior to women.

It has not been easy in our male chauvinist society for this writer to become aware that oppression that comes

posed to be like. As we grow up we are taught that as men we are aggressive, unemotional and logical, while women are passive, emotional and illogical. If you are a male and you break the mold by contrary conduct, you could be dubbed a "sissy" by a chauvinist society because you are just like a woman.

What happened at Houston was more revolutionary than we may realize. Women not only demanded to be themselves, but Gay women demanded equality. The equality for Gay women, if and when it is achieved, will bring equality to the Gay male. That is why Houston was so amazing. In reality, Gay women - and all women who were supportive - were opening up new avenues for the oppressed Gay male. And all of this happened - and is happening - incidental to the fact that few Gay men have any real interest in the women's rights movement.

Lesbians are rightfully being separatist in some ways in order to establish clearly their own needs. The slang word "Gay" usually means "Gay male" to the general public and words are vitally important in establishing attitudes. To those of us who still struggle with semantics, it is important that we realize that a woman is not a "girl" when she reaches her mid-teens any more than a grown adult male is a "boy." Gay men and straight women, some of whom still prefer to be called "girls" in order to preserve another myth - eternal youth - are hopefully beginning to realize what damage is done to the psyche when we play phoney roles created by a screwed up educational system and self-serving Madison Avenue advertisers.

Ginny Apuzzo, a really amazing official of the National Gay Rights Lobby, stated recently, "We come into the Gay movement with an intellectual and emotional perspective that comes out of the feminist movement. There is a real problem with many Lesbian feminists when men choose to live and die with Gay rights alone. It's an uphill struggle for the women to be heard."

They are heard, however, in the Adair Films production "Word is Out" (now at the Gateway Theater) where 26 women and men talk about their experiences as Gay persons. See the film and

listen closely to Sally Gearhart and the male feminist Tede Mathews. From different worlds in many ways, they express the same emotions - the same intellect. They say that you can be yourself and that you can be fulfilled in every way by being yourself in spite of the pressures of our society. They are also saying that we have an obligation to let the world know that individuality will no longer be stifled and that we all know the source of our oppression and will tolerate it no longer.

## New York Gays Emerge: New Political Strength



NEW YORK CITY - "New York City's homosexual population, which only a few years ago began to come out of the closet and into the street, has developed markedly in recent months into a cohesive, open and organized force. Despite national setbacks, such as a recent unfavorable ruling by the United States Supreme Court on the dismissals of homosexual teachers, gains by homosexuals in New York and elsewhere have been enormous." This is the conclusion of writer Grace Lichtenstein in a recent NEW YORK TIMES article. Her analysis made several conclusions in describing changes in New York City, which are also being experienced in San Francisco.

When he returned to New York City in 1975 he discovered that "it is an entirely different city. It is now very much openly Gay, more willing to seek out Gay professional people, Gay clients, Gay customers, more conducive to 'coming out'."

New York City is experiencing a Gay business phenomenon that has existed in San Francisco for several years - Gay rap sessions, switchboards, newspapers, magazines, religious groups, radio programs, travel agencies, clothing stores, book stores, and so on.

The entrance of the Gay professional and business person into Gay politics since the Miami setback has been noted repeatedly in the straight press in Gotham. Gay power at the polls has been recognized recently by Democratic mayoral candidates who were appealing directly to the Gay community with promises of support for a city council non-discrimination ordinance which has failed six times since 1975.

A Gay Political Action Council registered 12,500 new voters in a three-week drive last June. This enthusiasm, the TIMES suggests, comes from the fact that an increasingly tolerant attitude toward the growing self-awareness of homosexuals here in recent years. People who never before thought of living

their lives openly, people in important positions, are now being sanctified by the liberals.

Buying Gay products and services from Gay people has increased in New York City and the TIMES concludes that more people are coming out, although there is still "a huge reservoir of closeted Gays," men and women who still will not write out a check to an organization with 'Gay' in the title, who insist that Gay publications be sent in plain brown wrappers, or who simply feel that disclosing their sexual preference to the general public will endanger their jobs, home and family.

One group which the TIMES calls "militant" is Gay Activist Alliance which has held over a dozen public demonstrations recently to protest injustices. The group marched against the portrayal of Gays on the TV series "Soap," an anti-Gay sign in Geordie's bar, and against President Carter for now publicly including Gay people in his "human rights" demands. These events bring considerable press coverage and caused some closeted Gays to retreat even further into the closet. A GAA official explains, "When all the polite tactics fail, we have to do the more confrontational things to show people who offend the Gay community that they can't get away with it."

Gay political activists in Gotham are encouraged by the recent defeat of

Councilperson Matthew Troy who was the most vehement opponent of the "Gay rights" ordinance being proposed again soon. The election of Mayor Koch, who enthusiastically supports the new ordinance, is also considered an asset.

Politicians across the country are now watching New York City as they once did San Francisco for indications of pro or anti-Gay trends. Rowland Evans and Robert Novak, in a recently syndicated column, commented on the "Gays emerging as a political force in New York." They conclude that the new presence of Gay people "threatens the perception of New York by its middle-class as a place where traditional values can be preserved. . . . Politicians here now talk about the organized homosexual vote. In fact, it may only be 5% of the population, but image is more important than reality."

## L.A. Crackdown: Davis Wants Vice Increase

LOS ANGELES - The passage of a liberal "bingo" game ordinance here has prompted Police Chief Ed Davis to request 42 additional vice squad officers from the Police Commission. Last year the commission dropped 47 officers from this detail after hearing continued complaints about

police harassment in Gay bars and at Gay events. Police Commander Stephen Downing says that there will be a considerable increase in "vice activities" by the granting of licenses to non-church groups to hold bingo games. Two commissioners, James Fisk and Salvador Montenegro, have publicly supported the vice increase which would cost the city an additional \$753,000 a year.

The Gay community here is concerned because Davis is publicly anti-homosexual and has used vice officers extensively in Gay bars and on the streets. In the 1976 Gay Freedom Day Parade, many were beaten by officers on Hollywood Blvd. who attempted to keep spectators from joining in the parade. The 42 additional vice officers would not be assigned specifically to police the bingo operation.

A general "crackdown" on male and female prostitution in Hollywood through the use of plainclothes and uniformed officers has virtually halted prostitution. The three month drive by the Hollywood police station brought many arrests and has made a "ghost town" out of Selma Avenue, formerly known as a pickup area for male prostitutes.

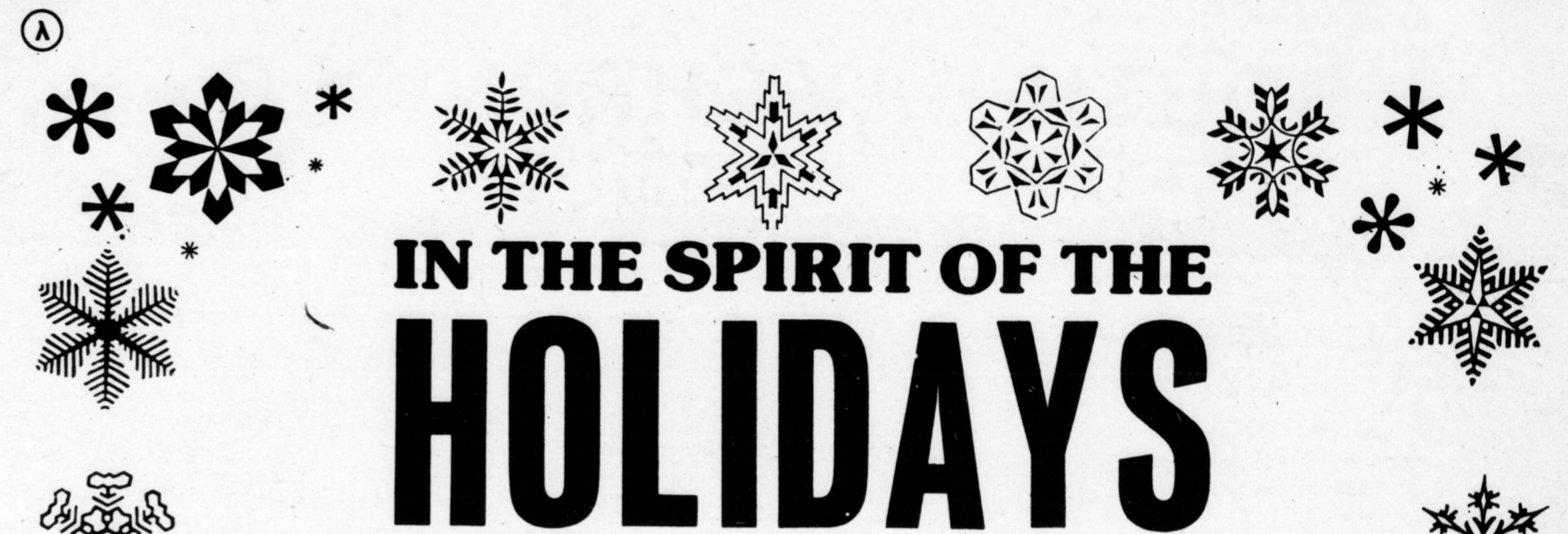

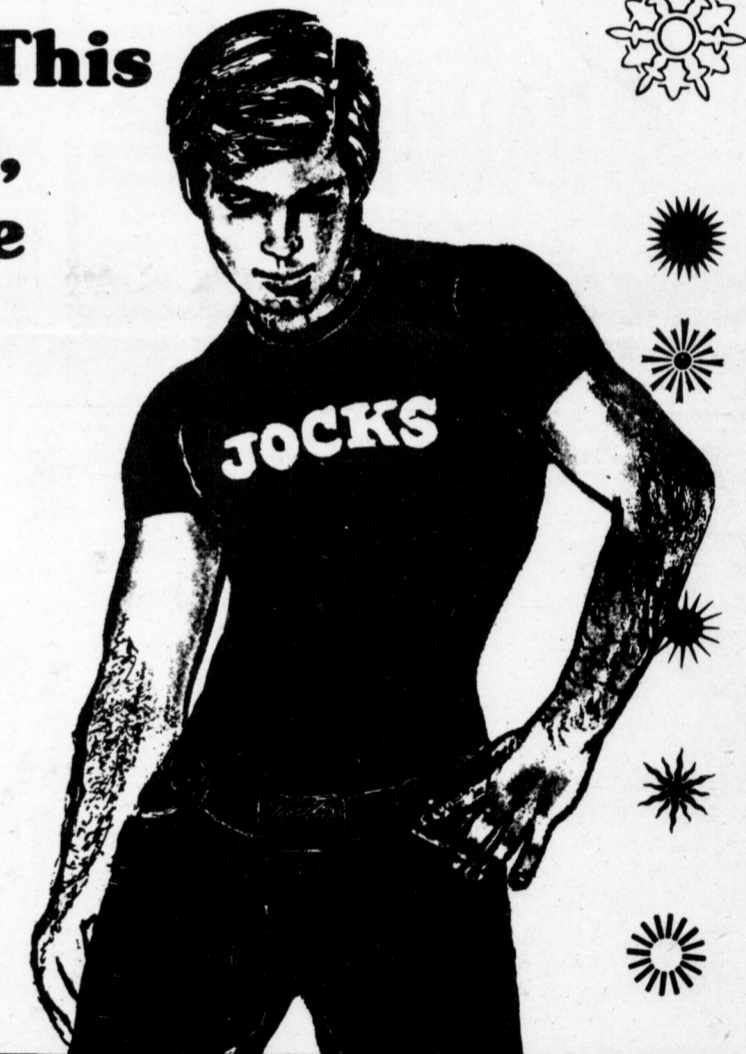

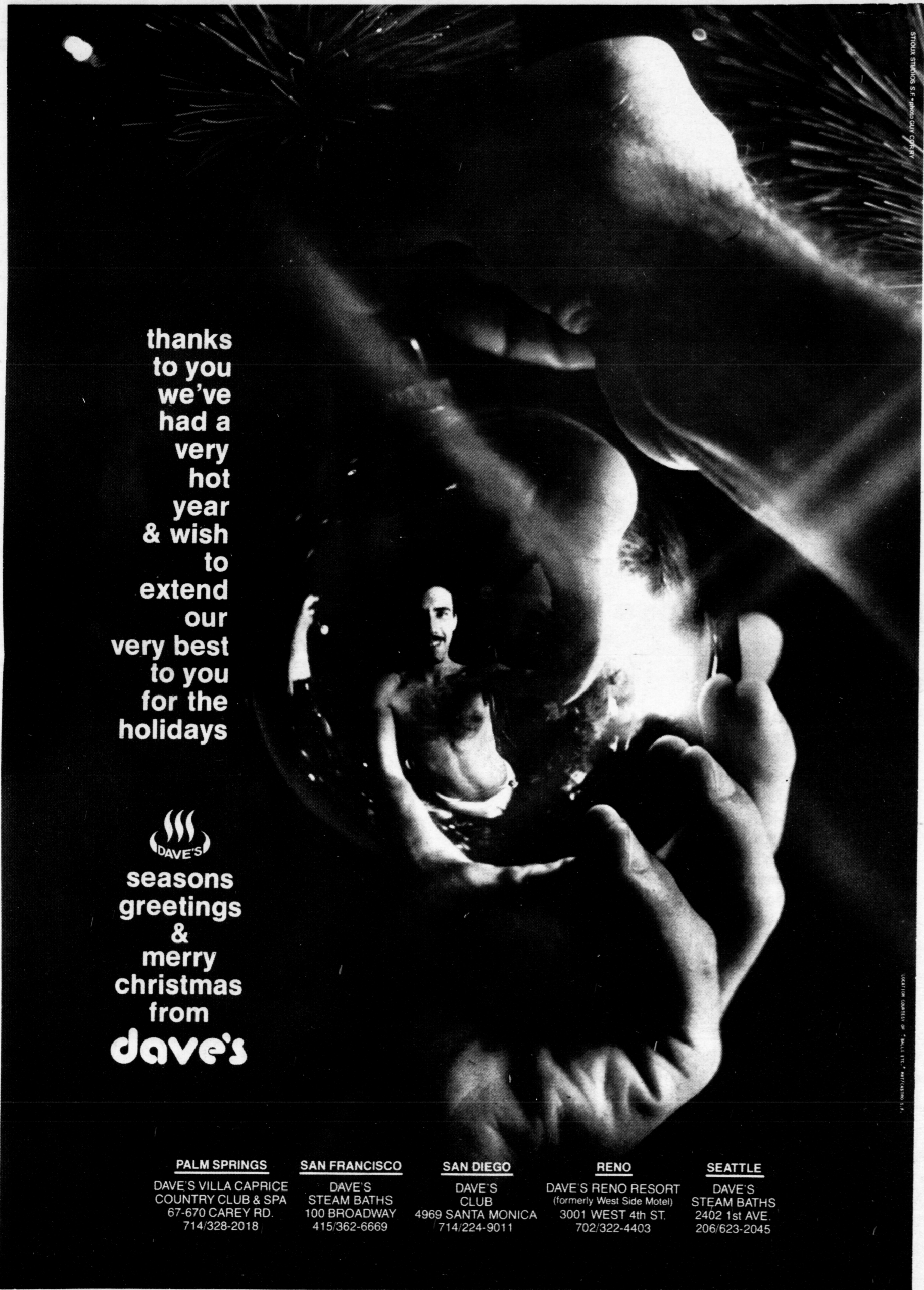

"Word Is Out" "The Circle" Has Reached "The Turning Point" — Or: From "Salò" To "Shenandoah"

### Show Biz in Review

#### Stage: The Circle

The American Conservatory Theatre can let Tiny Tim go to the Dickens, I'll take "The Circle" for my Christmas treat. As with the five "Nutcrackers" currently available in the Bay Area, A.C.T. gives us once again their trenchant, mordant production of "A Christmas Carol" this month; is Tim Tiny, does Bob Scratchit? Frankly, my dear, I don't give a damn; I'll still take "The Circle" for grand holiday entertainment.

W. Somerset Maugham's 1920 comedy has been given a very stylish treatment indeed by director Stephen Porter, costumer Robert Fletcher and set designer Robert Blackman, and it features some of the best ensemble acting we've had from the A.C.T. company in ages.

Into a chic English drawing room, a young, disgruntled wife of three short years has invited her husband's long run-off mother to return for a visit with her paramour, while her abandoned husband is also on the premises. Enter Mother, flaming red hair and wise-cracking mouth, full of airs and pretensions, with sturdy lover grumpily in tow. Father gleefully manipulates one quarrel

after another from the sidelines, reeking revenge for Mother running off and leaving husband, child and hearth to those many years ago. To complicate matters, young wife has a young would-be lover visiting who wants her to abandon her dreary, stuffy political husband. Will the wife desert hubby for true love, repeating history, or stay with stolid husband and learn from Mother's mistakes? It hardly seems a fair choice, but as the curtain lowers, all three of the oldsters are jumping for joy, each thinking his side has won.

The play still crackles with wonderful Maugham repartee, taking sly pokes at politicians, social snobbery and love in general. Porter has kept the play deftly flowing in the arch 20's style, yet mining the deeper underlying humanity as well.

"The Circle" gives Marrian Walters an actor's feast as the aging harridan mother, and Walters grabs every line and gesture with the sure stroke of a master. She's totally captivating, with strong aid from William Paterson as the Husband and Sydney Walker as the Lover. The three veteran actors carry the evening with urbane skill, relishing every zinger and tender

moment. Their young counterparts are played by Deborah May, in one of her finest, most layered performances to date as the Wife, James B. Winker as the Husband and David Hudson as the Lover.

"The Circle" offers nothing more than Maugham at his best, a play that withstands the test of time, presented under prize conditions; it's one of A.C.T.'s most sterling achievements . . . on every level.

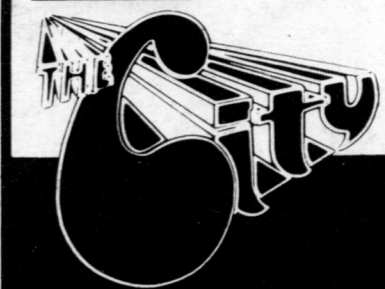

the orchestra pit in a fit of pique. It also appears Tamara Boumdiyeva and Ida Neversayneva are feuding backstage this evening, throwing each other venomous looks as they try to outdance each other.

In the second half, Tamara "en travesti"

(meaning dancing in male attire) and Ida team up for the Bluebird pas de deux, Olga Plushinskaya offers a blistering tribute to Isadora Duncan and Betsy Ross, there is a blah duet that could be dropped with no pain following and The Dying Swan with molting feathers all over the stage that wears thin quickly. But the best is saved for last. Entitled "Yes, Virginia, Another Piano Ballet," it takes off on Jerome Robbins and all those simple ballets danced to one lone piano on stage. Madame Olga Tchikaboumskaya returns only to be hurled into the piano by a vicious Ida, three dancers walk slowly across the stage glaring at the pianist who forgot to come in on cue, the pianist starts before the lead dancer is ready and all to the standard Chopin music of every recital ever dredged up. It's side-splitting, and although the jokes wear thin after awhile, Les Ballets Trockadero know whereof they dance, and they satirize it brilliantly. I can't remember when I've found myself stamping my feet and howling with delight so often. When they come back to Zellerbach or Flint Center next year, rush to the nearest BART station or mug a car owner, they're worth it.

up her children to live with her Lesbian lover. Actress Pat Bond is surely the most entertaining, as she illustrates the posturings of the butch dyke and the Lesbianism rampant in the WAC's. But she also offers a gritty realistic outlook, tinged with cynicism, and beneath the humor she emerges a bright sensitive woman who's fought to come to grips with herself. The Gay woman perhaps gets better attention and articulation in the film; certainly Sally Gerheart and 79 year old poetess Elsa Gidlow are proud examples of Lesbian dignity.

### Film: Word Is Out

Continuing with the good news this issue, Mariposa Film Group has made the definitive Gay documentary to date, "Word is Out," which can and should be seen by everyone, Gay or straight, at the Gateway Cinema.

Out of 200 interviews, slighted. Michael Mintz and Dennis Chiu represent people from all aspects of the ultimate minorities, Gay life to give their being Gay and Black/stories. Familiar local faces abound, such as Rick Stokes, George Mendenhall and Sally Gerhart, and every contribution is valid and interesting. Most of the couple are touching in their simplistic inability to verbalize feelings, but "Word is Out" doesn't just relate facts, it delves into the background, the coping and the hopes for the future... and it does so all with humor often and sometimes moving moments, such as Pam Jackson, who had to give everyone faces.

"Word is Out" is too long in length and could withstand at least 20 minutes of cutting, but what it says with simple power and finally brings us to the realization that the only difference between Gay and straight is sexual, the problems are universal. It should be required viewing for everyone who seeks a better understanding. It is a film long overdue whose time has come, and Mariposa Film Group can only be heaped with congratulations and gratitude.

### Film: Salo, Or The 120 Days Of Sodom

I've racked my brain, but I cannot come up with an even close contender. Pier Paolo Pasolini's last film, "Salo," wins hands down as the most poisonous two hours I've ever spent in a theater.

The film is loosely based upon the notorious novel by the Marquis de Sade. And while golden shower queens, shit-fanciers and S&M fans may find momentary joys in this film, I suspect it will ultimately prove too much even for them.

An allegory supposedly of Italy's Fascist regime under Mussolini, the film graphically illustrates the horrors awaiting 10 young boys and 10 young girls who are captured by Salo's top-ranking four Fascists, and held imprisoned inside a castle while four madames daintily relate their most bizarre sexual adventures. First the boys and girls are sodomized, forced to swallow nails, urinated upon, forced to wallow in and eat their own feces and then the ultimate sexual thrill, torture by various gruesome methods (filmed in bloody color with lingering closeups as a girl is scalped alive) while two baby-faced guards dance with each other, impervious to the horrors outside. It makes its point about

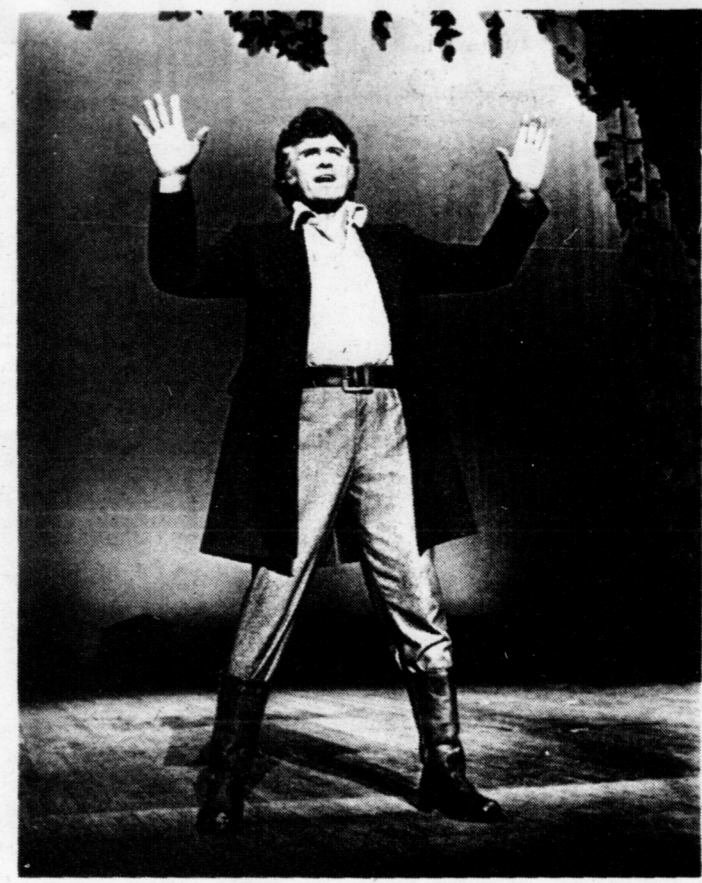
Fascism, and Pasolini's artistic sense is obvious in every frame, but the film becomes an endurance contest to see if you can make it to the bitter end without vomiting.

"Salo" was first shown in 1975, shortly before Pasolini was murdered by a 17 year old for alleged homosexual advances. It was immediately banned in Italy and only now has shown up in America. I give the Italians credit for their good taste; for those with none, the film is on view at the Lumiere Theatre off Polk.

### Stage: Shenandoah

You might describe "Shenandoah," the first offering of the new Best of Broadway series at the Curran Theatre, as "old-fashioned," "folksy," "homespun humor," "American as apple pie;" you might also follow that with "dreary," "dull," "totally lacking in creativity" and maybe even a heartfelt "boorring!"

In 1965, James Lee Barrett wrote a film entitled "Shenandoah" for James Stewart, Doug McClure and the immortal Glenn Corbett. The film concerned a Virginia farmer and his five sons during the early days of the Civil War. Determined not to take sides, the family finds themselves thrust into the war despite their good intentions; a son and his wife are murdered, another one is kidnapped by Yankees

This basically cheery little epic was not your big box office sensation of '65, yet Peter Udell and Gary Gold, composers, and Philip Rose, director/writer/producer, decided it merited the addition of a totally unmemorable score to thrust it onto the Broadway stage. Well, thrust it has been, and not

much out of dialogue like, "If I wasn't like me, I'd be like you" or such tootap-ping hummables as "The Pickers Are Comin'" and "Violets and Silverbells," but Lord, the cast at the Curran do try.

Heading the roster is John Raitt as Charlie Anderson, stern widower father. Raitt still possesses a ringing tenor voice and a genial stage presence; he was never much of an actor and the situation remains unchanged. He's nice, amiable and pleasant company. And he will even sign your souvenir program in the lobby immediately following the show, which proves he's a nice guy. But a strong, commanding patriarch... hardly.

Fortunately, the older sons are uniformly excellent. Paul Myrvold, Dean Russell, Robert Quigley, Robert Johanson and David Russell all make the most out of limited roles and provide the bulk of the interest in the proceedings, aided also by the shining performances of Suzie Brabeau and Gordon Halliday as Anderson's only daughter and her bashful soldier/suitor, Jana Schneider as the Actor's Equity who nicely oldest son's wife has a powerful voice but is a family-style entertainer, there, of course, are the obligatory win-son children to steal our hearts (one wonders what happened to the obligatory adorable dog usually attached to said moppet's family). Lest it sound that I am Un-American and hate apple pie, let me hasten to reassure you that I love Shirley Temple movies and still get a chill when a Sousa march is struck up but "Shenandoah" is not even a good old-fashioned musical comedy; it lacks wit, solid musical numbers and sparkle. It's a plodding attempt at bringing one more tear to the eye (with absolutely no finish at all; it just sort of peters out and everybody bows).

If you like Tiffany lamps and Ivor Novello waltzes, then possibly "Shenandoah" will divert you for a couple of hours. I found it like being buried alive under Hallmark greeting cards!

### THE MASKED BALL

A friend tipped me off before I attended our new production of UN BALLO EN MASCHERA. "Keep your eyes on Patricia Payne when she gets up out of Ulrica's chair," he said, "it looks just like the tree growing in the first act of NUTCRACKER!" He was right. Indeed, her talent stands almost as tall as she does. Having made her SFO debut earlier this season as Erda in DAS RHEINGOLD, Payne attacked the role of Ulrica with a dramatic and vocal intensity that had little competition during the evening.

This is not to say that it wasn't an evening of vocal splendor. There were many stunning moments, but not where you would normally expect them. Jose Carreras as Riccardo, and Katia Riccia-

relli as Amelia certainly have some glorious music to sing. Their voices can do justice to Verdi's music, but they are often uneven performers. There

will be isolated moments of beauty in their singing and long patches of music where both performers coast along toward a more carefully prepared moment in the score. Both also tend to rely on stock operatic gestures (Carreras particularly plays into the footlights).

Far more interesting were the San Francisco debuts of Yuri Mazurok, a fabulous Russian baritone, as Renato, and pint-sized Kathleen Battle as the

pressive physically. The real stroke of genius shows in the last scene, placed inside the Stockholm Opera House. Sonja Frisell, the director, achieved a balance between the music and stage action that was remarkable. Her use of the Commedia Dell'Arte players running through the masked crowd added that extra touch of grotesque charade to the final death scene. If much of the evening's best music lacked any dramatic

urgency, it was due to the tendency of Carreras and Ricciarelli to play to the prompter's box, rather than to each other.

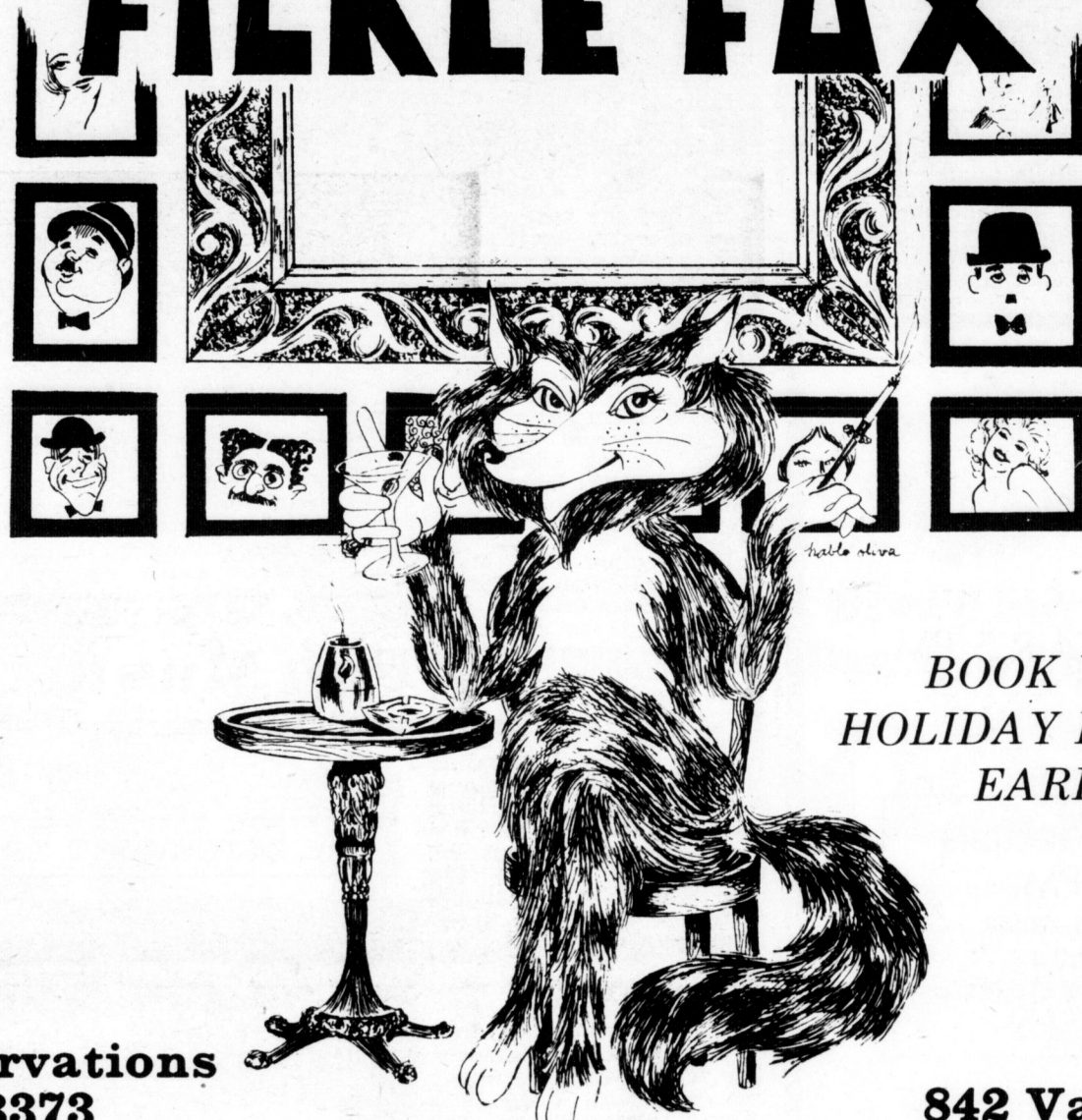
**AIDA**  
The season's performances of AIDA were another story. There were two casts. In the first string of AIDAS, things were noticeably out of whack. Most of the cast was not in good voice. James McCracken's voice was badly frayed, and his use of a falsetto was painfully unpleasant. Gianandrea Gavazzeni's conducting was erratic. At times the performers were

page, Oscar. Ms. Battle has a bright future ahead of her filling the shoes of all those child-bride operatic virgins (Gilda, Lucia, Juliette, etc.). She is a delightful actress, and possesses a voice which shines with promise. Her first act curtain calls next to Patricia Payne looked a bit like a Mutt & Jeff team, but in this case the supporting players were a far better show than the leads.

Kurt Herbert Adler's conducting was surprisingly alive, not dragging as it has in previous years. The new production, designed by John Conklin, is im-

jumping on cues like cats trying to catch a mouse. It seemed like a game of who could beat whom to the music. Gavazzeni would also suddenly change tempo in distressing ways. He must hold the record for the fastest triumphal march in years: the supers couldn't even run fast enough to catch up with him.

Making her SFO debut as Aida was an Italian soprano, Maria Parazzini, who brought a distinctly unprofessional attitude with her. Her voice is large, though often unfocused. At times she did some nice things with the role, but needs time to develop her concept of Aida. When not singing,

she could sometimes be seen talking at McCracken as he was trying to sing. When facing upstage during the triumphal scene, she was often grimacing at the chorus. She refused to take curtain calls with the other principals on two nights, creating an atmosphere of discordance that might cause excitement and set the clacquers in a provincial Italian house drooling. Here it simply antagonized the audience and her colleagues.

If thrown slightly off balance, AIDA falls squarely into the hands of Amneris, and she becomes the dramatic focus of the evening. With much of the cast missing cues, unable to keep up with the

conductor and the production generally falling apart at the seams, a miracle happened.

Fiorenza Cossotto has been around a long time and was making her long overdue SFO debut as Amneris. Cossotto possesses a huge and powerful voice and knows the role like the palm of her hand. She proceeded to mop up the stage with the rest of the cast, not deliberately, merely by default. She opened up her lungs like a 747 on takeoff and peeled the paint off the Opera House. Her Judgment Scene had the kind of old-time operatic excitement that makes you just scream with ecstasy. At one point Gavazzeni suddenly slowed his tempo, and Cossotto looked into the pit as if to say, "Listen, you, I've got lungs by Bethlehem Steel and I can match you beat for beat." She did, and deserved the huge ovations she received at each performance.

The second cast hit a better balance. Gianfranco Cecchele in his SFO debut as Radames had a much more pleasing sound than McCracken's strangled singing. If he could not cut over the orchestra with as much force, it was certainly more tolerable. The new Aida, Eva Marton, proved to be a hot find. She has a huge voice and must be the angriest Aida I have ever seen. Her phrasing is different from the stock interpretation, but exciting. Bonaldo Giaiotti (the saving grace in this year's PURITANI production) brought a solid dignity to the role of Ramfis. The man's voice is strong and powerful. He is a remarkable musician and has been one of those pillars of the Metropolitan for a decade.

Aida had a fascinating rival in the Amneris of Tatiana Troyanos. Although she, too, had trouble making herself heard over the orchestra, Troyanos has apparently developed a singular por-

trayal of the Egyptian princess. Her Judgment Scene is a character study of the feline bitch thrashing about in the wake of the man that got away. No crowns, no royal armor, just her long, shiny black hair, an aura of jealousy, and a heart on fire. Both ladies brought interpretations to their roles which were far from the norm, throwing the rivalry between Aida and Amneris into a much more human perspective.

Aida's father, of course, has some gorgeous music and both casts were blessed with sturdy Amonasros. Norman Mittelman and Ingvar Wixell were both superb and provided some stability to an otherwise often rocky evening.

This AIDA production is borrowed from the Metropolitan. It is a concise unit set, extremely well designed. If it lacks miles of stairs, it does let you concentrate on the singers. The carpeting all over the set soaked up a great deal of sound and gave the chorus trouble. Yet it also enabled them

to produce some of their holiest sounds in the first act Temple Scene. The costumes by Peter J. Hall are stunning. The design of the production brings out the colors of Egypt more than any other I have seen; there are the desert sands and the wealth of gold. AIDA is not an easy opera to pull off -- the traffic problems alone are hair-raising. Backstage during the Triumphal March was apparently managed with the precision and immediacy of a warfront hospital.

One sour note this season is the tendency for performers to break character and steal a bow after an aria. In the AIDA it reached a new low, with special solo spots provided for bows. I am strongly against this. Let the audiences scream their guts out, (I assure you, I'm screaming along with the best of them) but let's keep the singers in character. Opera is still musical drama, not a circus.

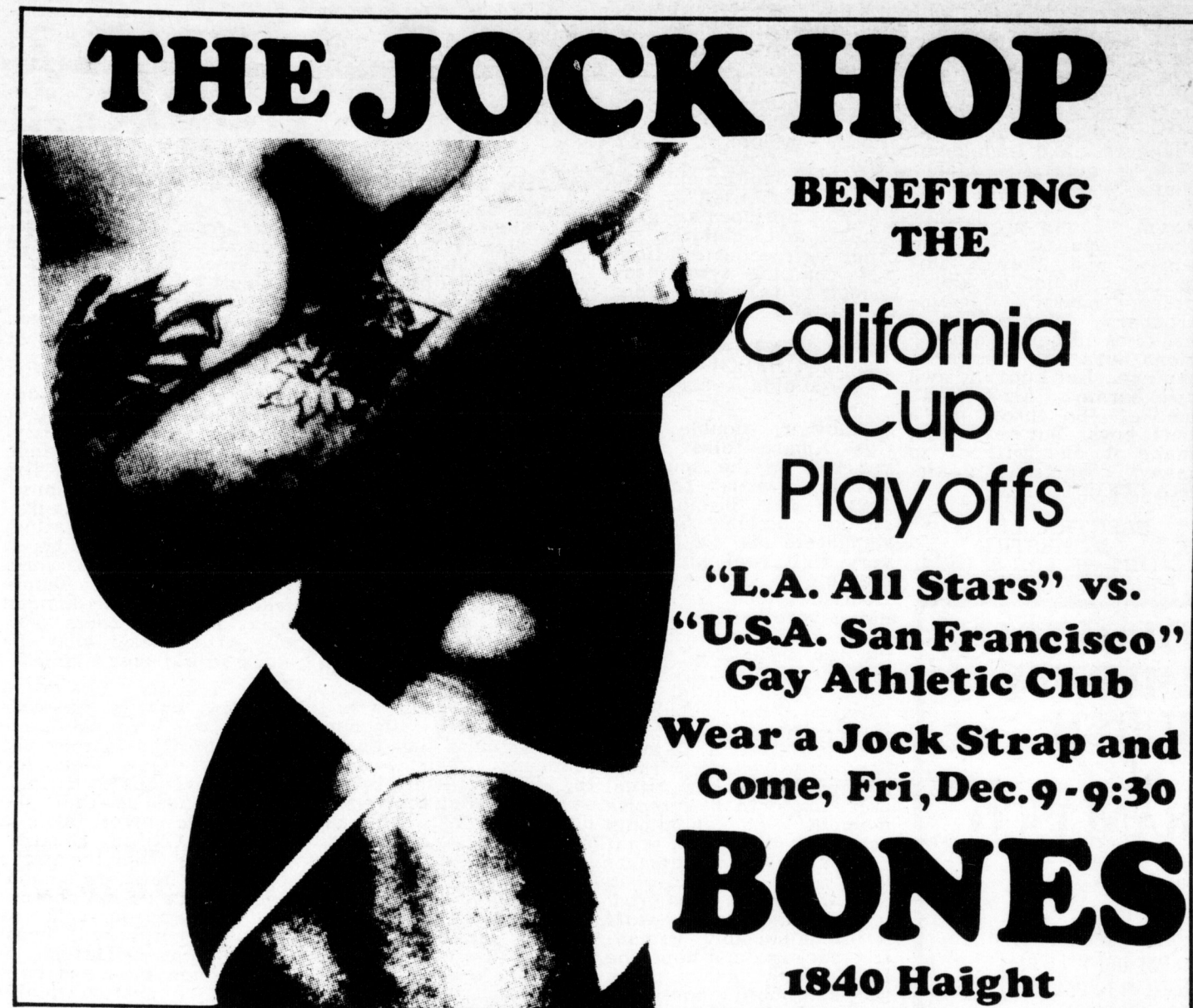

**Gay Intellectuals Have Their Say**

Louie Crew, an associate professor of English at Ft. Valley State College in Georgia, is a delightful chap who believes intellectual freedom means a lot more than merely a label you wear on your sleeve. He has broken through the barricade more than once. Any man who lives openly in the heart of "red-neck" Georgia with a black lover (Ernest Clay) must have balls made of iron. He's also the founder of INTEGRITY, an organization of Gay Episcopalians. He has shot more bullets under the seat of the God-fearing than any other professor I have ever met.

In 1975 Louie sent out a detailed questionnaire and inquired from major English departments as to whether they discriminated against Gay English teachers. The world of the ivory tower is still shaking. He received replies such as, "Tell me, Louie, are you a daisy?" "Your questionnaire has been posted on our department bulletin board and has been treated as a joke." Louie's droll account of his research serves as lead article in a highly individualized bundle of writing known as the "Gay Academic," edited by Louie Crew. (Etc. Publications, P.O. Drawer 1627-A, Palm Springs, CA 92262, \$15.00)

Some quick highlights: Edgar Friedenberg declares himself for a life of specific non-sexuality. He quotes Anatole France who wrote "Chastity, The Rarest of Perversions." He enlarges on this ultimate heresy by stating, "There seems to be a great need in this world for affectionate people who try not to demand what their partners cannot afford, and who remain stable over time."

Dr. Louis Crompton provides what is the most compulsively readable account of Gay history yet written, "Gay Genocide From Leviticus to Hitler." He reminds us that the Inquisition never takes a holiday. Chilling illustrations leap from the pages of history that are seldom seen by the casual observer. Crompton tells us that, "a 'witch hunt' (was) carried out in Holland in 1730 when men and boys were systematically burned, hanged, beheaded, garrotted, and even judiciously drowned as homosexuals. Astonishingly, this drama took place in what has been generally regarded as the most liberal country in Europe during the 'Age of Reason'."

Mark Freedman's "Towards A Gay Psychology" tells us that homosexual men and women, according to psychological research, are better able to express emotions that lie outside the range of conventional sex roles. They show more freedom to act either masculine or feminine according to their feelings. Tradition does not dictate emotion.

Other writings of vigorous dissent include Barbara Giddings' "Combatting Lies in the Libraries," James E. Brogan's "Teaching Gay Literature in San Francisco," Ellen Barrett's "Gay People and Moral Theology," and Clinton Jones' "Christopher Isherwood and the Religious Quest."

If you feel like rocking the boat at your local college or university, toss a copy of the "Gay Academic" into the fireworks. Intellectual freedom will surely be put to the test.

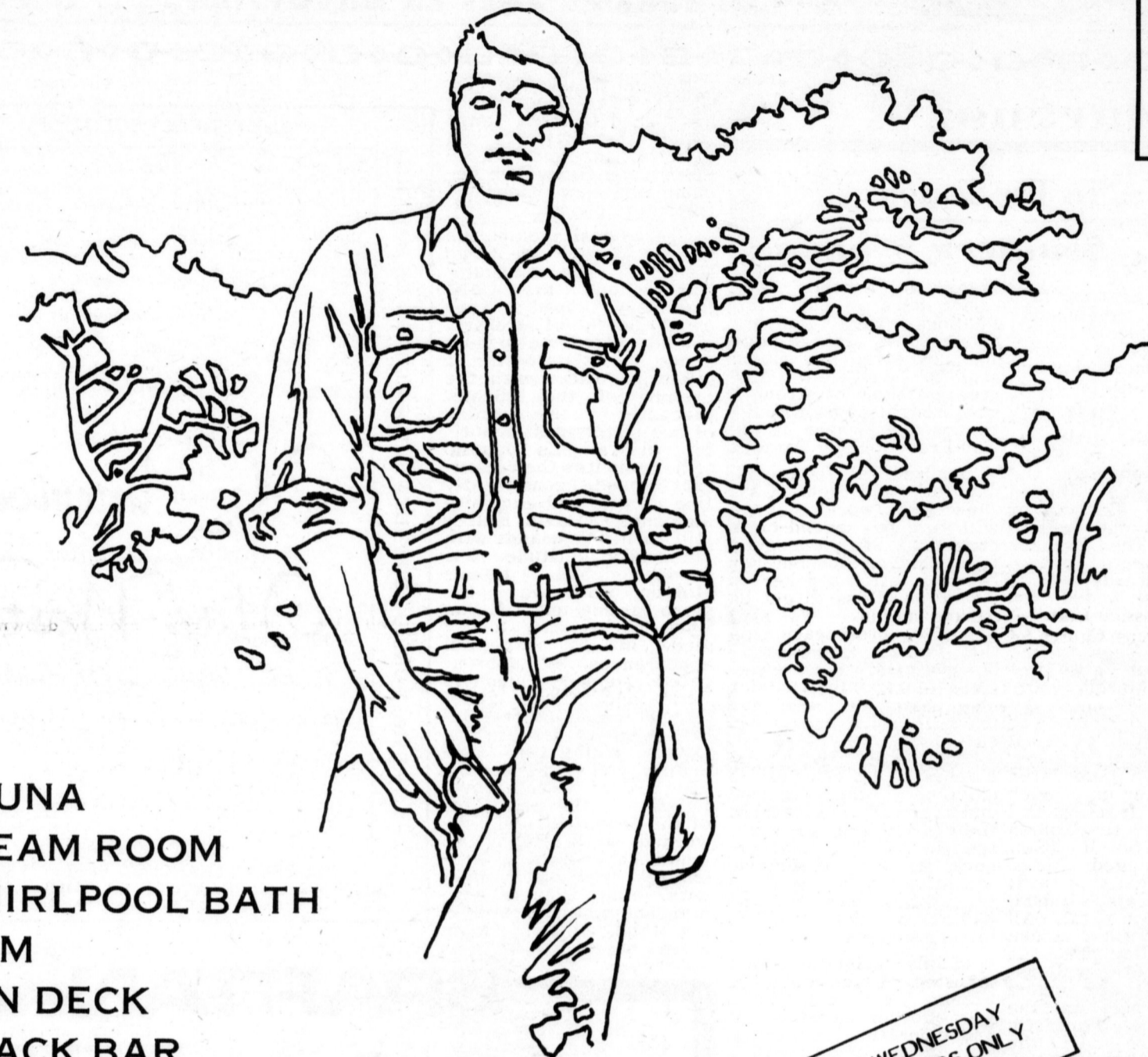

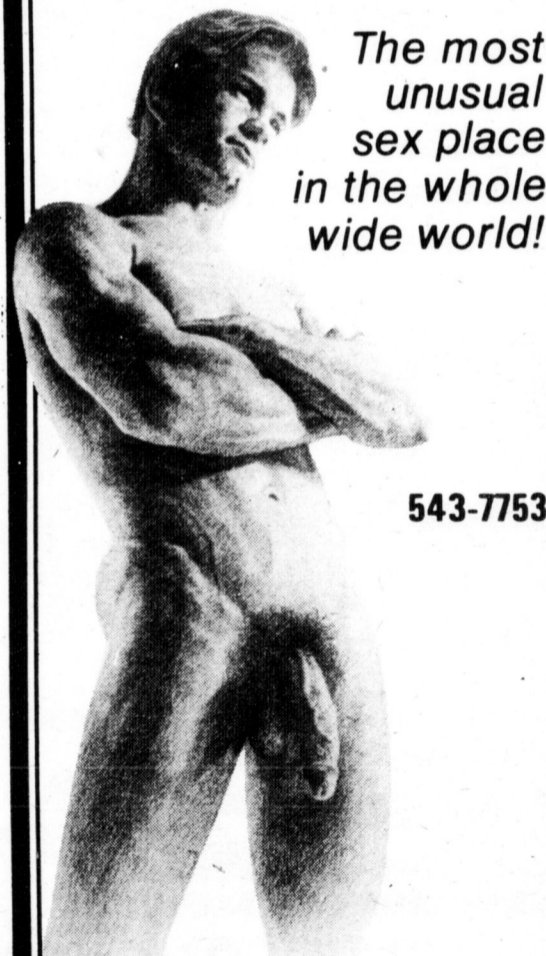

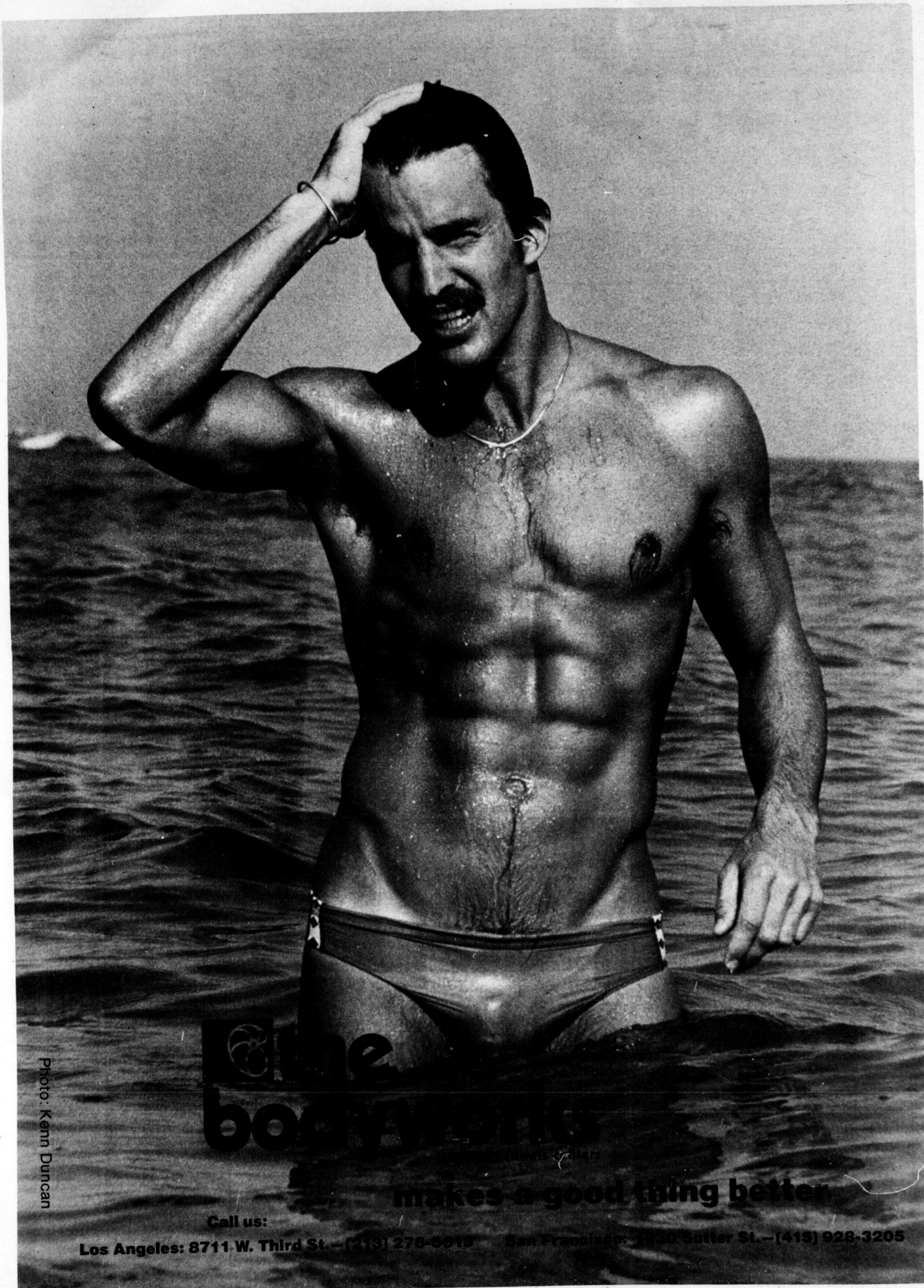
