

Gay Restaurants

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"Who cares what the food is like as long as the waiters are cute?" This is one philosophy of running a Gay restaurant that more often than not seems to prevail. Or that the patrons are only old queens who don't know any better, could care less what is placed in front of them as long as they get a handful of the waiter's crotch. Or fill them up with so many double martinis that no one knows what's passing.

There was the time when one went primarily to a Gay restaurant over a "straight" one because the prices were much, much less and the atmosphere congenial. Today, the prices at Gay restaurants are equal to, if not higher than, comparable spots and the ambiance at more and more places around town is receptive and relaxed and hospitable. Someone wiggling their box in your face seems less important these days when diners are out for a good meal.

Another complaint one hears around town is why bother with a Gay restaurant — the quality is too erratic. One night it's passable, another a disaster. There are too many other places that care about good food and an ongoing reputation. And the party is not held at the bar for 45 minutes with disco churning up the digestive tract and blasting the eardrums. eardrums.

If the Gay restauranteurs are wondering where have all the faggots gone, they might look again into their part of the relationship. One goes to a Gay restaurant in 1978 because one wants to -- not because one has to. And the question asked more often than before is -- Why?

One gets out of a Gay restaurant these days less and less except for about \$20 a throw. If one is only interested in feasting the eyes that's five trips to the baths where there's more to see and a snack bar if one is forced to feed one's face.

First Major Address -

That city, OUR city --San Francisco -- now has broken the last major dam of prejudice in this country, and in so doing has done what no other city has done before.

How does one thank a city? I hope, with all my heart, that I can do the job that I have been charged to do and do it so well that the questions raised by my election will be buried once and forbe buried once and for-ever -- and that other cities will follow San Francisco's lead.


I understand that my election was not alone a question of my gayness but a question of what I represent. In a very real sense, Harvey Milk represense, the spirit of the neighborhoods of San Francisco. For the past few years, my fight to make the voice of the neighborhoods of this city be heard was not unlike the fight to make the voice of the cities themselves be heard.

The American Dream starts with the neighbor-hoods. If we wish to rebuild our cities, we must first rebuild our neighborhoods. And to do that, we must understand that, we must understand that the quality of life is more important than the standard of living. To sit on the front steps — whether it's a veranda in a small town or a concrete stoop in a big city — and talk to our neighbors is infinitely more important than to huddle on the living room lounger and living room lounger and watch a make-believe a make-believe world in not-quite living color.

Interview:

Trills, Chills and Lotsa Sills



When Sills tackled Donizetti's LUCREZIA BORGIA she was cast opposite Henry Price, a young, very handsome tenor who played her son, Gennaro. It was a fiery performance which led some in the audience to wonder if Lucrezia was just this nice poisonous lady who always appeared in the nick of time to save her son's scalp or whether there was an incestuous relationship in the opera. in the opera.

Halloween night in San Francisco was also the dress rehearsal of I PURITANI, and things were not going well. The third act had already had several false starts. Finally the time came for Elvira's entrance (one of her few sane moments in the opera). Out popped Beverly Sills carrying a brightly lit Jack-O-Lantern.

The lady loves to laugh, even at her own expense. Several weeks prior in New York she had joked about her diet. "I've got to get into those THAIS costumes. It's just a body stocking and right now there's lots of body and not so much stocking. You can't even sew any more beads on it, there's no room left!!"



When Beverly first sang the role of Marie, the performance took place in the Tufts University Gynmasium under the baton of Sarah Caldwell. Sills made her entrance from the men's locker room behind the basketball hoop. When she sang DAUGHTER OF THE REGIMENT in San Francisco, she was six weeks postoperative. She told the press at the time: "I didn't want people to think I was dead!"

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We got together in San Francisco the day after Sills had put Muffy on the plane back to New York. "You should see what she went home with," Sills beamed with maternal pride. "She's an incredible little girl. We had such a good Mama-daughter weekend, and it did us both a lot of good. I had begun to feel terribly isolated out here. So to have her sitting there doing her homework, everything seemed kind of normal. The TV was going, she was drinking her Tab; it was all very nice." drinking her Tab; it was all very nice.'

THE NEXT THREE YEARS

THE NEXT THREE YEARS Sills has a cheerful word for everyone, including the hotel switchboard operators: "Maybe you could leave me alone for a while without all this hoo-ha?" This was her last season singing with the San Francisco Opera. In a rare move, she has set a target date for her retirement from the stage. "I'm booked through the end of '80, so to contemplate called me this morning asking for extra perform-ances. WHERE? There isn't a week, not one week. I have July and August off, that's my vacation, but the rest is solidly booked. I cannot find ANYTHING! Look at this," she says, thumbing through her five-

I'd like to do another Verdi; I've done so little. I had agreed to do MACBETH with Tito in San Diego, but that was before we got involved with JUANA LA LOCA."

Last April she was scheduled to do her first SONNAMBULA with the Boston Opera. Sills changed her plans and in-stead sang Gilda in RIGO-LETTO. "Sarah and I have LETTO. "Sarah and I have two more years to go," she chuckles. "I've changed my mind 46 times on the SONNAMBULA. She keeps putting it in; I keep avoiding it and com-ing up with something else. It must be some-thing psychological!"

The Gilda was a success, and she is now scheduled to sing several performances in New York in the Spring of '79. Does she plan any more? "I hope not," she groans, and then cackles, "I'm not even cheerful about the ones at the Met!! I've always felt peculiar about

Houston Opera had wanted to commission a work for her based on the life of Lola Montez, but Beverly is trying to talk them out of it. "First of Beverly is trying to talk them out of it. First of all," she says, "enough world premieres, already. How many can I do and learn? When I read what they had prepared, I felt I was too old to play it. The opera starts with her too young. The third new piece is finished and she is working on it. This will be a one-act, one-woman opera by Pasatieri for television, based on Eugene O"Neill's play BEFORE BREAKFAST. "It's very pretty music, and it's just me," she whispers. "Just me!"

Not only has she performed a one-woman blitz on the media to bring opera into the homes of Ameri-cans; but she has been building an awesome library of videotaped live performances. She hasn't seen any yet, and is planning to examine them when she retires and has time to relax at her home in Martha's Vineyard with her family's new Betamax. This fall PRS aired her MANON and for the

Vineyard with her family's new Betamax. This fall PBS aired her MANON, and for the first time subtitles accompanied the videotape. "I pushed for that," she says, shaking her fist. "I wanted it for THE BARBER OF SEVILLE, too, and I'm going to insist on it from now on. The Live From Lincoln Center series sort of gives me carte blanche. I think we might get the DON PASQUALE on next year. 

According to Jack Babuscio, director of FRIEND, a British homosexual counseling service, "passing for straight is the most effective means available of destroying group cohesion among homo-sexuals." (This is probably why Senator John Briggs wants Gays to stay in the closet - keep us frightened and divided.) Gay counseling centers are springing up like crabgrass across the Western world. The British experience is most like our own, only more quaint in some ways. For example, when English homosexuals cruise the Johns the practice is known as "cottaging."

Babuscio has written of his adventures in talking with Gays in a new book (We Speak For Ourselves: Experiences in Homosexual Counseling, Fortress Press, \$4.95). He succeeds in avoiding the dry, academic, textbook approach by allowing his clients to speak for themselves.

As an advisor to homophiles, Babuscio finds that married Gays present the really complex challenge. This is the price of passing to please friends and relatives. But people do manage to survive. Witness the story told by a homophile named Lawrence:

You don't hear many Gay fathers tell their stories, do you? Until I joined a group of Gay fathers about a year ago, I had no contact with others in my situation. I had no idea about how they managed to deal with the question of their children. . .

The questions can be tricky. But really, if you're honest with your kid, they're not difficult to answer. Let me give just one example. A few weeks ago Kit, my daughter, was dropped off at the flat by her mother. John, my lover, was in the kitchen, in his pyjamas, putting together a late breakfast.

We had been expecting Kit, but John was a bit anxious. He has never met Kit before, though he had heard me talk about her a great deal. . .

After Kit had tucked away an egg, an orange drink, and three slices of toast, she looked over at John for a long, long minute. Then, turning towards me, she asked: "Who do you love the most in the world, Mom or John?"

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I said that I loved them both in different ways. I loved her mother with one kind of love which I wasn't able to give to John or to anybody else; and that I loved John with another kind of love which belonged to him and him alone.
