

Will Churches Help Briggs Raise Cash?

Morris Kight, Los Angeles activist, has told B.A.R. that an effort to rally clergymen by a supporter of Prop. 6 in the Southland recently produced meager support. Of the 40 who appeared at the Sherman Oaks rally, only 20 signed pledge cards to continue to help the YES ON 6 effort. Kight believes that this is a further indication that Sen. John Briggs is not able to stir the clergy to action on this

Rev. Ray Batema, a Baptist minister from Pomona, helped set up the Sherman Oaks rally. He is moving across California to hopefully organize 6,000 ministers behind Prop. 6. Batema hopes that the initiative will become as hot as Howard Jarvis' Prop. 13 before the November election.

Briggs spent over \$850,000 to qualify the anti-Gay measure and is attempting to raise another \$1.5 million for November. One of his problems is that sympathetic Christian groups are using the initiative to raise funds - for themselves, not for Briggs' committee.

Briggs, who has been accused of mixing the funds of his various committees and causes, may be using funds from the Prop. 7 (extension of bolster Prop. 6 if the churches 'outreach" program to infiltrate are unable to muster funds for

Checkmate is one of many "born again" groups which distributes materials to emphasize that homosexuality is a sin and that Gay people are attempting to bring children into their lifestyle. It is published in Belmont, California (Box 593).

Ronald Reagan: "NO ON 6"

Ronald Reagan, former Governor of California, has given his position on Proposition 6 in a statement from his Citizens for the Republic organization:

I don't approve of teaching a so-called Gay lifestyle in our schools, but there is already adequate legal machinery to deal with such problems, if and when they

This measure has nothing to do with those special socalled Gay rights issues in Dade County, Florida, and elsewhere. Instead, it has the potential of infringing on basic rights of privacy and perhaps even constitutional

It is cumbersome and has potential for real mischief. For example, it would require that if a complaint is filed against a teacher a full public hearing must be held by the school board. What if an overwrought youngster, disappointed by bad grades, imagined it was the teacher's fault and struck out by accusing the teacher of advocating homosexuality? The school board, sitting - in effect as a court, would have to judge the matter in public. Innocent lives could be ruined. Under present law, such matters can be investigated first to see if they have any



Noble's obvious minus in the race was her public identification as a Lesbian. She was frequently referred to as "the Lesbian candidate" while her record as a state representative was ignored. Another woman candidate, Kathleen Alioto, who recently married millionaire Joseph Alioto (former mayor of San Francisco), spent an estimated \$150,000 to receive 19% of the total.



Elaine Noble takes 6% of Demo Primary

David Brill, political analyst of Boston's Gay Community News, told B.A.R. that Noble did not even approach the \$300,000 primary goal that she set for herself. She raised close to \$38,000. (In 1976, Noble raised \$23,000 in her state re-election bid.)

Noble, who ran for the U.S. Senate after being re-districted out of her comfortable Boston position, took only one city in the state of Massachusetts — Provincetown, a well-known Gay resort area, although she only received 156 out of the 480 votes cast there.

Brill believes that Noble's support within the Boston Gay community has eroded over the years to where she no longer has a strong Gay work force to help her in her campaigns. He credits this partly to a conservative trend in her voting record. Noble received 8,000 out of the 94,000 votes cast in Boston.

Discrimination O.K. Says Attorney General

State Attorney General Evelle Younger has told a group of reporters in San Diego, "I believe you should be able to discriminate, if that's the right word in this case, in hiring policemen. It's the same thing as if you were running a boys' summer camp, where the courts have upheld the right to exclude homosexual employees."

The candidate for Governor said he had fired a homosexual deputy attorney general who engaged in "improper conduct off the job" but was forced to rehire him by the courts.

When quizzed about hiring Gay police officers, Younger said that the courts should rule that discrimination against Gays is proper. He said he would prefer to keep female police officers out of patrol cars "where they may create an obvious problem."

Younger concluded, "If the non-homosexual had halitosis and wore dirty shorts and the homosexual didn't, I'd hire the homosexual — but everything else being equal, I'd appoint the non-homosexual . . . Discrimination against homosexuals should be lawful."

Phillips (who spent \$132,000 to garner 8% of the total vote) scheduled a Boston rally with Bryant as the star attraction. Originally, Noble said that she would hold a counter-rally with big name celebrities from Hollywood as a draw, but she later cancelled these plans and urged Gays not to demonstrate at the affair.

Phillips cancelled the rally because "militant homosexuals" had allegedly threatened to disrupt. Some Gay people decided to hold a demonstration anyway (drawing 2,000) with Noble refusing to participate. Brill believes that this action by Noble further hurt her support in the Gay community.

Incumbent Brooke only received 53% of the Republican vote in the primary after a scandal erupted in his divorce action. This harmed him in conservative Boston. Brooke and his Democratic opponent,

Tsongas, have both informed Gay Community News that they will support Gay rights if elected.

Noble's future is in doubt. One of her closest friends told B.A.R. the state representative still is in office until January, although "she could receive an appointment to a federal position."

During her campaign, Noble traveled across the country raising funds at receptions and establishing new friendships. She had fund-raisers in Los Angeles and San Francisco. B.A.R. has learned, however, that the rumor that Noble will be moving to San Francisco with her lover, Santa Fareri, has been denied.

Navy Gay Unit at Monterey?

Military officials deny it, but an admittedly "tremendously anti-Gay" 19-year-old Navy man believes it is so. Seaman Apprentice Edward Pollock told his story to Dick Alexander of the San Francisco Examiner.

Pollock is angry because he has been court-martialed for being AWOL for four days. During his hearing, he said that Navy men at the Defense Language Institute at Monterey were openly Gay — even wearing earrings and feminine apparel. He said that young men were solicited by the older

men. Pollock has asked Anita Bryant to investigate all of this. She had agreed.

Cmdr. Dayton Dersham, an

official at the school, said Pollock claims that homosexuality was "rampant" there, but that at the time of his dismissal there were only five men under investigation out of 200 enrolled. He said, "I don't consider that rampant. I consider it slight."

U.S. Rep. Leon Panetta (D-Monterey) investigated the school. He said that Dersham informed him that in the last 18 months 38 individuals attached to the Naval Security Group Detachment at Monterey have been investigated for homosexuality; 32 were declared ineligible for access to sensitive information; three were discharged, and three cases were dismissed because of insufficient evidence.

A friend of Pollock's who is now out of the Navy told Alexander, "There are people on duty wearing earrings. The Gays were openly expressing how great it was to be queer." He said that when he complained he was given a psychiatric examination and asked, "Don't you know you're from a Gay unit?"

The reports of homosexuality at the language school remain confused, but Cmdr. Dersham admits, "I don't think we've weeded it our completely."



Hero Moves Privacy Suit to State Court

Oliver Sipple, who says whether he is Gay or not is nobody's business, has moved his suit against several newspapers and SF Chronicle columnist Herb Caen to the State Supreme Court. Sipple claims: that after he deflected a gun being fired at former President Ford in 1975, newspapers printed that he was a Gay person without a knowledge of whether this was true or not.

Some newspapers stated that Sipple was associated with a former Emperor of San Fran-

cisco (a popular title in the Gay community) and he was alleged to have been a bartender in a Gay bar. Assuming, evidently, that Sipple was Gay, he was called the "Gay Hero" when he deflected the gun of Sara Jane Moore outside of the St.

Two years ago, Superior Court Judge John Benson stopped Sipple from serving summonses to out-of-state newspapers. A state Court of Appeal agreed with this ruling. Rhw \$15 million invasion of privacy suit asks the High Court to bring the out-of-state newspapers back into the

The initiative would effectively legalize firing homosexual teachers and any heterosexual colleagues who support or tolerate homosexuality.


It opens the door to character assassination and invasion of privacy. Teachers should be hired and fired based on ability to teach, not on private habits.



Younger's Secret Position on Homosexual **Teachers Revealed**

Bay Area Reporter has obained the confidential inneroffice memo by Attorney General Evelle Younger, G.O.P. candidate for Governor, on the anti-Gay Proposition 6. The position paper. Attempts to obtain the statement through regular press and political contacts in the Younger campaign had failed, although B.A.R. knew of the statement's exist-

Handbook Rebuttals

Healdsburg Teacher Used by Briggs in Handbook Rebuttal

State Senator John Briggs has used the "coming out" of a Gay teacher in Healdsburg as an example of why people should vote YES to ban Gay school employees. His argument will appear in the Voters Handbook, distributed to voters as a rebuttal to the NO argument appearing in the handbook. (Both arguments appeared in full in the last issue of B.A.R.)



Larry Brenner, for five years a teacher in Sonoma, came out recently and has been the center of controversy over the Prop. 6 initiative. Three families have pulled their children out of Brenner's school, but 30 staff members have asserted their support of Brenner. The local school board supported Briggs, 4-1. The full story about Brenner appeared first in B.A.R. (Vol. 8, No. 11) in an article by Bruce Pettit.

This is Briggs rebuttal to the Anti-6 position. It is signed by the senator; Dr. Ray Batema, Central Baptist Church; and F. LaGard Smith, a professor of law. This is what voters will read in the voters handbook as the Briggs rebuttal:

> The homosexuals and their supporters tell us the present law is just fine.

> Well, let them tell that to the citizens of Healdsburg, California. They know better.

This quiet little town in the Sonoma wine country has been fighting unsuccessfully to remove a second grade teacher who has openly admitted his homosexuality and has campaigned publicly to keep homosexual teachers in our public schools.

School officials tell parents their hands are tied; the existing law leaves them powerless to deal with the problem.

In desperation, twelve families have removed their children from the school rather than expose them to the example of an openly homosexual teacher.

Four of the five members of the Healdsburg school board have voted to support Proposition 6. They see it as the last hope for restoring to parents the freedom to control their own schools.







Berkeley **Ordinance** Tops Them All

BERKELEY - The new ordinance granting equalit1/2v

ordinance granting equality to Gay people adopted here last week is the most extensive in the United States. It includes \$200-\$400 penalties for those who discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation.

The legislation was adopted unanimously by the city council. It forbids mistreatment of Gays in employment, education, public accommodations, and housing (except for 2-unit, owner-occupied dwellings)

Matt Coles, Gay Rights Advocates, is the attorney who authored the measure. He was assisted in its passage by Berkeley Gay activists who formed the Committee for the Berkeley Human Rights Ordinance for Gay People. The Berkeley Human Rights Commission held six months of hearings before the final draft was approved.

Jane Niehaus, who helped lobby for the ordinance, told B.A.R. that considerable effort was made to rally public support for the legislation to stave off a possible repeal effort. She said that the committee went to great care to consider the objections of commission members and council members in order to form a united front of support.

Niehaus was joined in the effort by many concerned citizens including committee members Rock Eckel, Robert Brokl, Gayle Davis and Carol

She advises others who are considering ordinances to "take the time and build support by educating the public. Berkeley is not as liberal as people think it is. It has not been easy. We have our homophobes too . . . By taking our time, we are happy that we were able to sensitize many that would not have considered the rights of Gays otherwise."

Performing, visual and literary artists besides meeting income and residency requirements must also possess a demonstrated interest in community arts, a significant ability in any arts discipline and show the potential to become gainfully employed as an artist.
