

# CASTRO ST. FAIR

**Have WE Stayed Too** Long At The Fair?

PARTY. PARTY. The message spreads through the City weeks in advance as thousands anticipate the biggest street bash of the year. On Sunday, August 19th huge crowds descended on two small city blocks for the annual Castro Street Fair. This year the throng was fairly mellow. The weather was perfect, allowing plenty of people to display their tans and parade the results of their hard work at the gym. Skin fashions included an overwhelming number of newly pierced nipples.

Overall, it was a relaxed afternoon, blessed by the appearance of some new faces (including the ever popular Miss Piggy). The crowd seemed less intense than in past years. The music was just a bit more at Pleasure Island they were relaxed. The food was more given the opportunity to be as varied and interesting (espe-bad as they could possible be: varied and interesting (espe-

cially those strawberries dipped to eat as much candy as they in white chocolate). A good time was had by thousands, but not by all.

That night, and for several days after, quite a few residents of the core of the Castro spoke of a problem which has hit the neighborhood, causing frayed nerves. some apparently, the infamous "homosexual invasion" is not merely victimizing the suburbs, but ghetto gays as well. Within the past year the spirit of the Castro has become a national focus for gays. National media coverage has spotlighted the Castro as the place where it is all happening. The result has been a flooding of the neighborhood with people from outside the Castro who come to party with a vigor and fury they can't exhibit at home.

In some ways the scene becomes reminiscent of the excesses depicted in the Pleasure Island sequence from Walt Disney's PINOCCHIO. When all the little boys arrived

wanted (until they turned green from indigestion); until they slowly sprouted ears and tails, ending up as jackasses. Sometimes the scene at the Castro Street Fair was not much different. There were moments when someone tried dancing on top of a poorly supported neon sign, which could easily have collapsed and killed the people below. Candy (pills and booze) flowed freely. 

#### 'Riot' Witnesses Sought by Stanford

Gay witnesses to the May 21 demonstration in the Civic Center are being interviewed by the Stanford Research Institute. City officials, police officers, and others are also being contacted for their testimony as what happened on May 21.

Gay people and others showed their anger during the demostration over a mild sentence given former Supervisor Dan White, who murdered Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk. There was considerable damage to city

The SRI study was contracted by the S.F. Police Commission in an attempt to determine the conditions that existed on May 21, how citizens and police related during the demonstration, and to project how future "riots" might be avoided. SRI affirms that its study will be ballanced.


#### **Portland Police** Will Hire Gays

Portland Police Chief Bruce Baker invited members of the gay community to apply for positions with the Police Bureau. Chief Baker spoke at Portland Town Council's monthly dinner meeting on Wednesday, August 15 and stated that the Bureau does not discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation. Earlier this year the Chief included Portland Town Council in the minority-recruitment hiring campaign that the Bureau conducts every two years.

#### SUPERVISOR BRITT ANSWERS McCABE

Charles McCabe's recent series of columns, titled "Sex in the Streets," requires some comment.

The specific arguments used by Mr. McCabe are not really what is significant about the articles. What is significant is their general tone, which is all too recognizable to those familiar with past and present resistance to the attempts of blacks, women, and others to develop a new sense of pride in themselves.

It is sad to see that Mr. McCabe, once a crusader for some liberal causes, has lost the sense of vision and empathy which allows human beings to understand the struggles of others for human dignity

The fact is that for nearly all lesbians and gay men, the act of coming out of the closet is still a real act of courage. It is often frightening and lonely. Our sense of community here makes it less so. The ability to lead an open life, to be who we are, is the reason why thousands of us have

We are proud of San Francisco for providing this atmosphere. We live and work here, contributing to the city in incalculable ways.

It is no coincidence that the city which gives us our freedom is also one of the most progressive in the country, in terms of the death penalty, housing, the environment, and other social concerns. Support for the right to live one's life with some degree of peace and dignity underlies all of these positions.

Gay people know that the views of Mr. McCabe are not representative of our city, for tens of thousands of San Franciscans who are not gay increasingly understand us, support us, and believe in us. Those of us in politics see this every day. We know that what is happening politically and socially in San Francisco is that gay and non-gay people are learning to know and to work with one another as never before in human history.

Most San Franciscans, I am convinced, do not fear this, and do not hate and fear gay people. They know that all people gain something when one group becomes more free. They, like us, are proud that our city is once again in the vanguard of progressive social change.

I would hope that they would not remain silent while others speak for them.

★ I just went through what some will never go through; others have, and I will go through it again if I

No, not Death, but TAXES: Yes! Your money and mine and single heterosexuals'.

I did not lose a lover but a father, which helped me, but next time I may be losing my lover.

I just turned 35, but I have had a will since I was 18 and have been aware from early years of many strange things in the way of taxes. I am single, live in San Francisco, and am a federal employee who lives in Glen Park and owns a home. I am not a hetero sexual with a wife and children living in a well-to-do neighborhood with lots of money. When you have committed yourselves to one relationship and discuss things such as wills and funeral arrangements (yes! You could get hit by a bus or die in your sleep at your age, young or older) then you should do so. Make arrangements for your passing and forget it.

If your lover were of the opposite sex and you were married, or you're heterosexual and living together without marriage, you would be allowed \$60,000 of your inheritance tax-free. But since you are the same sex, you will only be allowed a tax break of \$300 regardless if you paid for most of the things or nothing because they are not your legal spouse

Yes, a whopping \$58,700 difference between heterosexuals who are married and homosexuals or single heterosexuals. That difference is overpowering and makes me mad as hell. The state is taking us for a ride on this. After I sweat and labor to make our house a home, to be taxed because I am not considered to be married to the opposite sex, not a blood relative, or am classified as a non-related friend, I could just kill when I still have to pay more compared to the "married" heterosexual

If you are able to take the time to prove with cancelled checks, etc., that what you are being taxed on you have paid for; if not, then you will have to pay for it whether you like it or not. That is on everything - your bank accounts, stocks, bonds, property. All

Do not be afraid to go to a lawyer. Save the money if you cannot afford it and then go. Make a sacrifice to

Put ownership in Joint Tenancy, not one name; or make a corporation, incorporate, form a company. But a MUST is to TALK TO A LAWYER NOW to see what is best for you both. Be sure to see a lawyer who deals with Gay matters.

Do not forget the safe deposit boxes and your car to lessen the burden later when the time comes to be excessively taxed when you or yours passes on. It is not the time to be tied up with red tape by the govern-

Don't forget to see a lawyer. Do not do it yourself because out of your ignorance you could make it

You may have problems with relatives, businesses, etc., but they can be minimized by pre-planning.



Federal investigators seized a file containing the names and "homosexual proclivities" of Pentagon employees when they arrested a Navy enlisted man of espionage charges last

Military investigators are now checking the names to determine whether there has been any breach of Pentagon security by homosexuals who might be susceptible to blackmail threats, the sources said.

Lee Eugene Madsen, 24, a Pentagon office run by a The B.A.R., San Francis-Central Intelligence Agency official, was charged last Tuesday, a few days after he co's oldest Gay newspaper.

Now in its 10th year.

allegedly stuffed a "top secret" document down his pants and walked past Pentagon security guards and handed the report to an undercover FBI agent.

Madsen, a yeoman third class, is accused of taking \$700 from FBI undercover agent William Chapin and from another man, Richard Grant Noble, who first alerted authorities Madsen was willing to steal

Sources said Madsen is a homosexual, a disclosure that concerned Pentagon officials because Defense Department policy is to discharge known homosexuals from the military

It could not be learned how many names were on the files in Madsen's possession or whether any of the individuals were in jobs as sensitive as his.

A Pentagon spokesmen declined to comment on the Madsen case, but said it is still policy to discharge homosexual members of the military because their "presence in a military unit would seriously impair discipline, good order,

The CIA, FBI and other intelligence agencies traditionally have disqualified homosexuals as job applicants or them when discovered because of the possibility a foreign agent could blackmail them into giving up national secrets.

#### Cruising — Film **Under Attack**

A Statement Of The Lesbian And Gay Male Caucuses Of The U.S. Alternative Conference

We are a group of Gay Film-makers, technicians, distributors, exhibitors, and critics from across the United States. We feel great urgency in addressing the controversy concerning CRUISING while the film is still in production.

It should be apparent to all that we have the right under the First Amendment to protest the making of this film. Our rights include encouraging others to withdraw support from this film which depicts the systematic stabbing and castration of Gay men.

Because Gays have been subject for so long to an informal system of censorship, we are surprised at the sudden concern about this issue. Producing a Gay film, promoting a resonable Gay film image, or acting as an openly Gay crew member has been a difficult enterprise. Movie-going for American Gays has been a view of exclusion, humiliation, and violence.

And it is violence that is such a fearful fact of life for most Gays, the frequent and vicious attacks against Gay men and women throughout the U.S. are largely unrecognized by most non-Gays.

We believe the film CRUISING will provide an impetus for continued violence, a blueprint for more murders. We fear for our own lives and the lives of Gay men and women across the country.

Jerry Weintraub's cynicism in rejoicing at publicity for his exploitation film is appalling. What responsibility will he feel if one of us is murdered in imitation of his movie? The others involved, including the heads of United Artists—the film's distributor—should consider this same question.

We believe the film to be a clear and present danger to our well-being and to our lives. The protests against the filming are acts of selfdefense, not censorship.

We challange all filmmakers, not only Hollywood, to end the censorship against Gays. And we ask Gay and non-Gay people in the film industry to join in our protest.

I people, women are treated dif-

ferently from the moment of birth, and denied many opportunities because of their status as women. As lesbians, we are as concerned as gay men are that discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation be outlawed, and although we have rarely been arrested for soliciting or engaging in sodomy or oral sex, we want those laws repealed in the 28 states where they are still on the books. But since we rarely engage in public sexual acts, we do not wish to be engulfed in backlash inspired by the excesses of a few gay men. And that is, I think, what inspired Sally to write the paragraph that is most disturbing to many gay men in this city. Although I might have phrased it differently, I agree that lesbians are weary of "explaining to Middle America that lesbians do not worry about venereal disease, do not have sex in public bathrooms, do not seduce small boys, do not go to the baths for flings, do not regularly cruise Castro Street, and do not want to go to the barri-cades fighting for the lowering of the age of consent for sexual acts." Every time one of the gay papers in this country runs an article on the glories of man-boy love, most lesbians cringe and cry, filled with compassion for the children who will be violated because of this implicit permission. It is the same argument as the one about child pornography.

I am disturbed when some gay men ask, as I speak of incestuous assault and other sexual violations of children. "but what if he is seventeen?" Because if seventeen is okay, then what about sixteen, and fifteen, and fourteen, and where does the bottom line go? Yes, I know, many gay men went looking for older men to have sex with when they were fifteen or so. But at least one has told me many times of his being molested by his father, another told me of being raped by his father's best friend in a men's club swimming pool, another was raped by a neighbor when he accepted a ride. another was raped by a the child was consenting.

I know that men who have sex with young boys are an extremely tiny minority of the gay male population, if indeed they can be called gay. The juvenile prostitutes are the same people who patronize all prostitutes, white, middleclass, middle-aged businesstherefore presumably hetero sexual. A significant proportion of those men who are arrested for child molestation turn out to have abused both girls and boys, so they cannot really be

I also know that the men who stand for hours on the meatrack on Castro Street are a minority of the gay male population. Many of them are new to the city, and are basking in the new freedom, an understandable phenomenon. Many could not hang out in high school for fear of being found of my first women's dance,

But these are the signs and symbols of homosexuality that apologize for such behavior. I

do not think I am responsible for anyone's behavior except my own, and I think that people who make assumptions about homosexuality based on that behavior are wrong, especially when they refuse to see that the behavior they object to is no different than the havior of some straight men. It is like the criticism of prostitute women because they are so overtly sexual, the critics rarely complain about such

straight men. The double sexual standard that penalizes women has in this instance been extended to gay men.

But for lesbians, who are prominent in the struggle to get straight men to change the way they relate to women, to have to defend the same behavior when it is done by gay men is uncomfortable. We want our gay brothers to work toward some of our goals. We thank behavior when it is done by and appreciate those who do.



Yes, we should all cross the street in a careful and legal manner, but we need to watch for attackers using cars as weapons as well:

Employees unions endorsed 7/27/79, 18th & Castro Streets, 11:20PM. Two Gay men, Black man driving car. As the Gay men crossed 18th Street, a car ran the light, striking and seriously injuring one

of them. The driver had his headlights off, and did not stop despite several Gay people pounding on the car as they gave chase. As the injured man was helped by a paramedic from the crowd, flares were placed in the street, and CUAV members on the scene assembled six witnesses and gathered information from them. While victim and witnesses were present, a SFPD squadcar arrived. When approached with all necessary data and witness accounts, the police stated directly that they were not interested and immediately drove off!

#### **POLICE ATTACKS**

Whatever the motive, we continue to receive reports of attacks on Lesbians and Gay men by SFPD officers. Polk Street seems to be a particular target, with younger members of our community bearing the brunt of the assaults. An excessive police presence, with an apparent purpose of intimidation and arrest on any pretext seems to have caused the fol-

Polk & Pine Streets, 3:00 AM - three Gay men, nine San Francisco police officers. Victims initially accused of being drunk after one officer noticed them walking arm in When the two victims holding each other inquired into the reason for the detention, the officer called back-up units, including several cars, a paddy wagon, and eight addiofficers to handle the three Gay men. The victims were separated, handcuffed to the point of injury, and one was thrown around the back of the paddy wagon while bound. Anti-Gay insults, and mocking "limp wrist" gestures were made throughout the incident. Medical attention was denied, one victim had request to remove contact lenses refused.





#### N.Y. Lambda Seek Aid

San Francisco Mayor Dianne Feinstein announced that she will convene an all-day conference on housing September 20 at the San Franciscan Hotel.

Participants will include builders, developers, financial experts, city, state, and federal officials and members of the general public.

"Adequate and afforable housing in San Francisco is one of our major problem area," Mayor Feinstein said. "This symposium will be action oriented. We're going to bring together builders and planners, labor, developers and financial institutions, city, state and federal officials who deal with housing, and members of the general public who are concerned about the lack of it in San Francisco.'

"We are calling this symposium: 'Strategies to Build,' and what we hope to find out is exactly what must be done to provide decent housing in the City at prices people can afford

"My own belief is that we need more housing for families in San Francisco, and that's the kind of result I would like to

Three panels will attempt to define the problems of San Francisco's Housing from the viewpoint of regulations, financing and rehabilitation. They will meet separately and in a plenary session.

There will be afternoon workshops dealing with problem solving on the issues that have been identified and, finally, recommendation will be made for follow-through strategies for both the public and private sectors that will result in an expanded and more affordable housing market.







The story is complex and provocative. In MacMillan's eagerness to shock the audience, he breaks the sound barriers of ballet when the voice of Katherina Schratt (played by Floretta Voldovini) sails forth into the auditorium in a display of German lieder. Mme. Voldovini entered looking like the Statue of Liberty. I'm sure her fans will agree that an Irving Berlin lyric, "When I'm with a pistol, I sparkle like a crystal" would have been far more appropriate to the

proceedings.

Although Wayne Eagling's characterization of Crown Prince Roudolf showed a disturbed man, it wasn't until David Wall took on the role at night that the audience saw the portrait of a loney, genuinely psychotic madman. Wall brought a feeling of premeditated cruelty and abandon to his dancing. He was matched by Leslie Collier's manic mistres. depiction of the Baroness Mary Vetsera (his exhibitionistic mistress who delights in wearing peek-a-boo numbers from Frederick's of Hollywood under her royal robes). Wendy Ellis imbued the rejected wife, Princess Stephanie with a sad, desperate innocence in both performances. The erotic pas de deux at the end of Act I for Stephanie and Rudolf was a tour de force; a highly sadomasochistic duet, choreographed with brazen strokes. If danced improperly, the Royal would suffer a heavy death toll among its dancers. It is not for the more squeamish member of the audience.

The Countess Larisch is a pivotal role in MAYERLING. At the matinee Sandra Conley walked through the role, technically perfect, but devoid of emotional involvement. Since much of the plot's action revolves around the Countess's meddling (and her prior relationship with Rudolf as his mistress), Conley's coldness was a definite drawback. Alfreda Thorogood danced the role of the Countess in the evening, having appeared as Mary Vetsera at the matinee performance. Thorogood is one of the Royal's best character dancers. To watch her was a revelation. As Vetsera, she was a woman possessed with kinkiness and defiant exhibitionism. As the Countess she brought a poignant delight to the role of a former lover, sparkling with that special, wistful involvement that comes from getting your kicks vicari-





We better get used to it: earthquakes eight times a week through mid-October with epicenters on Geary Street. AIN'T MISBEHAVIN's in town, with enough energy and drive to blow the roof right off the Curran Theatre. On a Richter scale this musical tribute to Fats Waller could, by itself, register a 7.0; on an entertainment scale, it's a full-tilt 10.

Waller's tunes, those he wrote or just recorded, are extraordinary. They capture the sexuality, the sadness, and, most of all, the swing of 1930's Harlem. They evoke the culture that bred the likes of Billie Holliday, Cab Calloway, Pearl Bailey and, of course, Waller himself: larger than life entertainers who transcended the confines of color to bring their music to the world.





Productions pop up only when an impresario manages to get his richest patron into an unrelenting hammerlock. Even the most devout opera queens are hard-pressed to having seen some of these lulus.



regional opera in America, more chances have arisen to examine works from this repertoire. In some instances they show strong merit. In other cases it is obvious why the opera has disappeared from the active repertoire. Some of these operas are tedious bores. Some are impossible to cast today. Some place unbearable financial demands on a company's resources. And some just can't cut the mustard in terms of today's theatrical de-

Bellini's I CAPULETI ED I MONTECCHI has been making the rounds from Dallas to Boston in recent years. This vear there was a concert performance in New York. caught the Washington Opera's production at the Kennedy Center. Immediately one jar ring problem with the production was evident: the scenic and costume design by Paul Steinberg. The opera's libretto often varies from the Shakepearean version of ROMEO & JULIET familiar to audiences. The idea behind this production was to shift the action to the time when Bellini wrote the opera, thus adding a heavy touch of Napoleonic decor to the surroundings. It was a disastrous miscalculation.

The unit set, resembling the Arc de Triomphe, presents the udience with a formidable cultural shock. They must try to suspend belief and remember hat the story takes place in Verona rather than revolutionary Paris. The multi-leveled set was steeply raked. One performer stumbled and was injured during the performance I saw as he attempted a treacherous exit into the wings.

The production failure was more than compensated for by the musical direction under the baton of Joseph Rescigno. The opera calls for pure bel canto line, although it cannot claim to tried to offer sympathy as La Donald Gramm, and Shirley have the most thrilling music Bellini ever wrote. As the two lovers, Tatiana Troyanos and Linda Zoghby turned in splendid performances. Zoghby's rich voice is aided by her frail physical beauty. Troyanos lled another pants role with her usual dramatic intensity and outstanding vocal prowess solid musicianship and a job

The New York City Opera's new double bill of DIDO AND AENEAS and LE BOUR-GEOIS GENTILHOMME was an exercise in patience. DIDO AND AENEAS is not exactly thrilling. Frank Corsaro pumped every bit of excitement into the production he could possibly muster. The stark scenic values were offset by Rouben Ter-Arutunian's costumes which varied from somewhat believable, to a cape for the Queen of Carthage that was shower curtain chic at its tackiest. Vocally, the cast did well with the work, particularly Nelda Nelson as Dido and Jane Shaulis as a Sorceress. Alan Titus saved the evening. Whether he is singing or just walking onstage in a tunic, at least Titus' legs can keep you awake when Purcell's music gets to be a bit too monoton-

The companion piece, LE

BOURGEOIS HOMME was choreographed by George Balanchine and Jerome Robbins. The box office appeal of Rudolf Nureyev as Cleonte was what sold the evening. Rudy can still sell tickets. Otherwise people would not be rushing in droves to see DIDO AND AENEAS. The City Opera was careful to add some box office insurance to the program

As set against Richard Strauss' music, LE BOUR-GEOIS GENTILHOMME is a pleasant piece of fluff, made more enjoyable by the delightful mime work of Jean-Pierre Bonnefous as the social climbing M. Jourdain. Nureyev depended more on his charisma than his technique and served the character demands well. Special interest centered on Boston where Sarah Caldwell was presenting a double bill of works by Manuel de Falla with the opportunity to see Victoria de los Angeles in a rare stage appearance. Unfortunately, the legendary soprano was ill and cancelled out of the per-formance I attended. Her understudy, Elizabeth Phinney, did a creditable job as Salud, the heroine of LA VIDA BREVE. The opera is similar in Abuela, the Mamma Lucia figure in the opera.

Caldwell's staging (with the aid of mime Claude Kipnis) of MASTER PETER'S PUPPET SHOW. I had never even heard of this piece. I was thoroughly enchanted by its ingenuous staging. Through the use of backlighting techniques, the opera was staged as a picture-book fantasy. Three singers narrated the story from the pit, filling the roles of the Narrator, Master Peter, and Don Quixote. Dina Kipnis' immaculate execution of the scenery and costumes was fascinating, providing an excess of imagination. This was the kind of work that Caldwell's company is noted for. MASTER PETER'S PUPPET SHOW was a rare triumph in operatic experimentation. The use of mime onstage, completely separated from the voice, and including a mimed conductor for the overture, made the puppet show a special delight. transformed the mighty depths of the Savoy Theatre into an intimate dreamland of poetic adventure.

The following week the Met plotzed into Hines Auditorium on its tour. Hines Auditorium is Boston's convention hall and also plays host to the boat show, various conventions, and other dreary affairs. The acoustics and awful sight lines once again plagued the company. There is hope that Boston's Music Hall will be restored for future use by the Metropolitan. But in the meantime, I hope Bostonians pour their money and support into Sarah Caldwell's company. It is long overdue.

Sarah's new theater, by the way, is a gem. For those crystal freaks, the Savov has chandeliers for days. Acoustics and sight lines are excellent. Now that she has finally found a home for her company, I wish Caldwell the very best. For 20 years she has fought for support from a lackadaisical Boston public. Now they are finally coming around to her side. 

After seeing these rare operas one wonders: Was it worth staging them? Well, of course, it's always a fascinating chance to examine part of the literature that has passed from popularity. Some works never make it into the mainstream of the repertoire. That does not mean they are total losses. I often find I will learn more by watching a work which may be an incomplete success rather than revisiting an old standard with plenty of box office insurance. By watching which parts of an opera work onstage and which fail, one gets to learn what makes opera tick. One sees what makes musical theater come alive, and which pitfalls and mistakes to avoid. Don't forget: MADAMA BUT-TERFLY bombed on its opening night! We all learn from our mistakes.



Harbison has several things to fix before WINTER'S TALE will be ready for final presentation. The work was performed by members of the Merola Opera Program who did their best, despite some servere handicaps. Mostly, the handicaps come from the composer's approach to writing for the voice. Harbison seems to be joining the ranks of modern composers who want to write an opera, but do not take the voice into consideration when doing so. His attempt to have Leonites (a bass-baritone) sing half of his role in falsetto shows a marked ignorance of the toll such work takes on a singer's voice, and the impracticality of the idea. It is a gimmick; a bad one, and it should be dropped immediatelv. Harbison also tends to overpower his singers with heavy orchestral work, leading one to wonder if he is interested in his singers at all. There are some strong orchestral passages which will be fine for symphonic and electronic recordings. But much of the "opera" seems to be way off base from what will work on a stage with a live cast.

Lewis provides a sweeping survey of the female scene today. She writes in a compelling manner but reveals little that is new to many of those who are already hardened

One arresting idea Lewis develops is that many gays are trapped in a delayed adolescence created by sexual repression. They are forced to flex their erotic muscules in their twenties rather than earlier. But this observation can also apply to straight teenagers, both male

She writes a detailed account of the political pressures brought about by the extreme elements who resort to censorship as a means of keeping "unenlightened" lesbians in line. This trend is already dangerous to further progress. Many an important meeting has been destroyed by the power struggles which turn the men and women against each other. But thought control can never be the answer to any social issue.

There are challenging array of issues found in SUNDAY'S WOMEN and both men and women readers will be endlessly stimulated by Lewis's probing questions and ideas.

Ms. Lewis has produced extensive articles for the ADVOCATE and she is now branching out. At the time she left the ADVOCATE she was preparing articles on Gays and Mormonism. I've always hoped this unpublished material will manage to see the light of day in the future.
