"The Best Way to Thank" **Mayor Feinstein**

So began full-page ads in the local Gay press in the closing days of the November 6 election. The question in many Gay minds remains: Thank her for what?

Ad admonition followed, "Don't throw your vote away." Obviously the warning wasn't heeded as 58% of the voters thought otherwise. Eighteen percent concluded that a protest vote wasn't a tactic from the past, and rather than wasting their votes, they humped the mayor's race into a run-off. The night of the count, the positive dynamics were suddenly all in the Quentin Kopp corner, and the Feinstein milk train found itself stalled and stale in the glum spaces of the Holiday Inn.

The Feinstein ad went on to remind the Gay community to be thankful for what Feinstein has said and promised the Gay community over the past ten years. No mention was made of what she has actually done in the past 12 months in office — which taken in toto has been something short of a plague upon the Gay house. And as to be expected no mention was made of what she has not done

A 13-POINT INDICTMENT AGAINST MAYOR FEINSTEIN

1. GAY CENTER

We are no nearer a Gay Community Center than we were 12 months ago. The center - despite her grandstanding - was not one of her priorities. True to form, her promises have proven to be lipservice and no

In her 12 months in City Hall, Feinstein has not made a single significant Gay appointment. In fact, she saw fit to fire the highly-qualified President of the Board of Permit Appeals, David Scott, for having the audacity of running against her. MY RECORD

I was the first attorney in San Francisco to successfully defend a Gay man who was being discriminated against by Federal Civil Service on account of his sexual orientation. This occurred in 1962, long before it was popularly accepted to defend Lesbians and Gay men in the courts. I am one of the few, and certainy one of the first, attorneys in San Francisco to sue successfully the San Francisco Police Department on behalf of a Gay client. In 1968 I won a lawsuit against the Police Department for a Gay man who was beaten up by a member of the San Francisco Police Department.

I have supported every law prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, sex or sexual preference. The Gay community rightfully seeks full participation in society without discrimination or harassment. This is the legitimate civil rights issue which is so often ignored by politicians who court the Gay community at election time, yet express concern that the Gay lifestyle "may be offen-sive" in Ladies Home Journal

I seek no debate on whether the Gay lifestyle is offensive or inoffensive. I firmly state that the right of Lesbians and Gay men to live free from discrimination and harassment is a basic individual right which cannot be compromised or

My concern for individual rights extends to the area of public policy and politics. Harvey Milk and I shared some difficult times together. I was the only elected Democratic official publicly to protest the removal of Harvey Milk from the Board of Permit Appeals when Harvey announced his

intention to run for the Assembly. I was also the only elected Democratic official to support Harvey when he thereafter ran for the Assembly in 1976.

The issue to me then was quite simple: no one should be blackballed out of politics because he or she happened to be Gay; or because he or she decided to buck the establishment. Harvey was Gay, and he bucked the establishment. I am proud that during a difficult time I strongly defended his basic right to seek elective

In addition to supporting legislation to end discrimination against Lesbians and Gay nen, I have supported issues which have a direct impact on a Gay person's civil rights and quality of life in San Francisco. I co-authored the Resolution that expanded the Human Rights Commission to specifically include Gay members. When asked to support the police recruitment program, I did so enthusiastically, and issued my comments to the press - long before my opponent made any statement for public consumption.

As I stated in a July 1979 press release concerning the Gay recruitment program, "I have always believed and stated that discrimination has no place in Civil Service. If we are to provide fairness and equity, then all persons, regardless of their sexual preference, should be accorded the right to compete equally to become police officers. It is my hope that the persons presently in the recruitment program will have the support of other

I have an open mind about the new chief. Unlike my opponent, I have not limited the selection process to include solely captains from within the department in order to obtain the endorsement of the Police Officers' Association. I want to keep the selection process open because I want to get the best person for the job.

In conclusion, I am pledged to making San Francisco work again. We have the talent within our City to solve our problems and to assure that government is fair and equitable. As mayor, I will continue to support individual rights and assure that the Gay community is fully represented in City gov-

Members of the Gay community must be equal participants in the rights and responsibilities of government. Only by assuring that the mayor's office is open and responsive can we work together to achieve this goal.

★ I was hesitant about going to the candlelight march in memory of Harvey Milk. The memory of the violence on May 21st was still on my mind, and there seems to me to be a kind of hero worshop about Harvey going around I can't quite identify with. Saint Harvey. Wouldn't he have had a good laugh over that! At any rate, I ended up going anyhow, and I am

Harvey Milk had had a vision — that he would be shot because he was openly Gay. I think there are many Gay people who believe that Dan White killed Harvey Milk because Harvey was Gay. Harvey, however, had allegedly been instrumental in blocking White from getting back into political office. In White's murder confession, he said he had gone to ask Harvey why. In White's own words, "He (Harvey) just kind of smirked at me . . . and then I got flushed and hot and shot him."

Perhaps White would not have shot Harvey if Harvey had not been open about being Gay. I doubt it. White shot George Moscone too! I think if there is a motive to be found in this, it is not that Dan White shot Harvey Milk because he was Gay, but rather that Dan White felt, justly or unjustly, that neither Harvey Milk nor George Moscone had played it straight with him. I am reminded of some graffiti I read on a restroom wall in Berkeley recently: "Don't fuck with cowards. They'll kill you."

The memory of the violence on May 21st was still on my mind, and there seems to me to be a kind of hero worshop about Harvey going around I can't quite identify with. Saint Harvey. Wouldn't he have had a good laugh over that! At any rate, I ended up going anyhow, and I am

Harvey Milk had had a vision — that he would be shot because he was openly Gay. I think there are many Gay people who believe that Dan White kill Harvey Milk because Harvey was Gay. Harvey, however, had allegedly been instrumental in blocking White from getting back into political office. In White's murder confession, he said he had gone to ask Harvey why. In White's own words, "He (Harvey) just kind of smirked at me . . . and then I got flushed and hot and shot him "

Perhaps White would not have shot Harvey if Harvey had not been open about being Gay. I doubt it. White shot George Moscone too! I think if there is a motive to be found in this, it is not that Dan White shot Harvey Milk because he was Gay, but rather that Dan White felt, justly or unjustly, that neither Harvey Milk nor George Moscone had played it straight with him. I am reminded of some graffiti I read on a restroom wall in Berkeley recently: "Don't fuck with cowards. They'll kill you."

Harvey Milk had had a vision - that if he were murdered, that Gays across the country would come out of their closets. In terms of the Gay movement and Gay consciousness, the motive behind Harvey's murder becomes incidental. Harvey represents the ideal of the upfront Gay in our society, a vision that lives on in those of us he left behind.







Homophobic Scandal At The Opera House

FEINSTEIN PROTECT GAYS FROM **EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION?**

There used to be a saying in the theatre world that without the support of the Jewish and the Gay population, you could shut down every theater on Broadway. This month a young Jewish, Gay man is struggling to save his career. He is a talented professional in the field of arts management. He is also the victim of job discrimination because of sexual orientation in a city which professes "tolerance."

When Michael Raines ended up face to face with Dianne Feinstein at a fund-raiser for Supervisor Harry Britt, a very scared Mayor whispered, "You won't make this an issue, Michael, will you? I'm sure we can talk about it after the election is over." Michael Raines

November 29, 1979 May 21 Defendants Edge Toward Trial in Judge Wonder's Court

From November 27, 1978, a year has passed since the arrests of the May 21 Defendants and they are still possibly months away from a trial. The lawyers for the May 21 Defendants and the Police and D.A.'s office, however, have clashed in court a number of times before this. One side, the D.A.'s, seeks to have speedy trials of charges that are simple, concrete and specific. So-and-so so-and-so. All of these deeds are felonies and deserve prosecution. The Defense side, just as it was in the Dan White case, is focusing on the context of the May 21 events, rather than on the specific deeds their clients are charged with committing. So the delays, as might be expected, have come primarily rom the defense.

It's a burden," he said to lawyer Ryan, "on you and your counsel, but that's what's required." Then he delivered the bombshell at the end of the day's proceedings: "I find an insufficient statement of fact," Wonder. "to support the Motion for Discovery. The Motion is denied, without prejudice. Discovery is to be completed by December

The Defense had not expected this. They were thrown off by the implications of Judge Wonder's ruling. If they worked from their nucleus rather than delving deeply into records not available to them, they were going to confront Fifth Amendment problems within themselves. To which Judge Wonder replied, "I don't see your Fifth Amendment problem. I urge you not to get involved in jeopardizing any Fifth Amendment rights. I believe you can. I believe you can." Union City Library Display Of Gay Life

The role played by Lesbians Gay men and other sexual minorities in the development of human culture - past, present, and future — is depicted in an exhibit at the Union City Main Library, 34007 Alvarado-Niles Road, in that Southern Alameda County community. The display will continue through December 10.

"Lesbians and Gay men been instrumental throughout history in all fields endeavor," said John Dupree, educational director for the Pacific Center, a Berkeley-based mental health and social services agency which is sponsoring the display. "We want library users to know that many of the books and recordings that they check out of their libraries contain significant contributions of Gay

One of the features of this display is an on-site log journal for library users to write down their reactions to the display.

"In the past, we have received some valuable feedback from people through this journal," according to Kristen Loomis, a Lesbian bibliographer working on the project. "If non-Gay people don't know what's bothering Gay people and vice versa, then we're never going to be able to really understand each other. And it's important that we see each other without the stereotypes - since we're all just people doing our jobs and living our lives.

The display includes books, newspapers. magazines. records, artwork, photographs, and three-dimensional objects from such diverse areas as medicine, music, law, athletics, the military, the church, plumbing and gardening, all of which include 10-15 percent sexual minority people.

"It's essential that people get beyond sexual and racial stereotyping of each other," Dupree said. "And this needs to happen not only in San Francisco and Berkeley, but also in places like Union City and Daly City. This is, hopeone step in that

DIRTY LINEN

BRITISH AMERICAN REPERTORY COMPANY SERVES FIRST COURSE OF A STOPPARD BANQUET

The British American Repertory Company (BARC) has arrived in San Francisco with a quartet of Tom Stoppard plays, and that means good news for intelligent theatergoers. The company, under the direction of founder Ed Bergman, opened their first of two sets with DIRTY LINEN and NEW-FOUND-LAND which have been running four years in London. For those who have not yet tasted Stoppard's linguistic delicacies, this pair should serve as an excellent introduction. To those whose palates have been primed by the likes of TRAVESTIES, ROSENCRANTZ AND GUILDENSTERN ARE DEAD and other Stoppard pieces de resistance, this duo may seem merely an hors d'oeuvre tasty, but hardly filling.

DIRTY LINEN concerns a select committee of members of Britain's House of Commons and their investigation of sexual indiscretions by their peers in the midst of their own philanderings with their bountifully attractive secretary/clerk. Hypocrisy runs rampant, and so do the puns, ententres, alliterations and other Stoppard staples.

NEW-FOUND-LAND, more aptly labeled two monologues than a play, is inserted into DIRTY LINEN during a break in the committee's proceedings. The piece was written by Stoppard to commemorate Ed Berman's attainment of British citizenship and contains a long, brilliant speech in which a young Englishman describes a train journey across America with an endless flow of images from films, literature, and legend that are as amusing as they are accurate.

BARC, composed of equal parts of American and British actors, play Stoppard well. The sense of rhythm so necessary to the dialogue is there, as is the precise diction required to carry the intricate entanglements of Stoppard's words across the footlights.

Stoppard's plays may be too rich for some people, especially those whose theatrical tastes avoid an intellectual bent, but as director Berman has said, those people are not the audience BARC is seeking. For those who like their theater

Film: The Europeans FOR FANS OF HENRY JAMES

Translating a Henry James novel to the screen can be a perilous undertaking. All those footlong sentences and stilted dialogues can be as irksome as the basic Jamesian drawing room politics can be static on the screen. THE EUROPEANS is as fine a transition from book to screen as could be desired. While it occasionally bogs down in some talky passages, for the most part this is an utterly engaging film intelligently directed by James Ivory and written by Ruth Prawer Jhab-

The stifling Victorian atmosphere and attitudes are portrayed with a suitable, suffocating fervor. Our heroine, Charlotte Wentworth (Lisa Eichhorn) at one point wants to just scream in frustration, and when she runs to her bedroom and does so, we want to join

The story revolves around a clash of alien cultures. The religious, Puritan moral code of the Wentworths are challenged - although not directly - by the somewhat looser more open stance of the Europeans, a pair of distant cousins who have come to stay in America after being raised in Europe. Lee Remick is Eugenia, a Baroness whose marriage is being annulled, and comes to America to find some roots to grasp among her relatives.

With her is Felix, a bohemian gentleman who wanders from one artistic pursuit to another. He and Eugenia enjoy life. The Wentworths clearly do not, savoring only the joys of being uptight. Except for Gertrude who longs to escape the narrowminded world in which her family has imprisoned her.

her cubs. She called her opponent vain, insensitive, wily, deceitful via a rhetorical litany that rose to a cheering crescendo. She accused her chalenger of wrecking her most cherished dreams, her most conscientious efforts. The crowd roared its approval.

The second show-stopper appearance was the following Tuesday before the San Francisco Tavern Guild. Weeks before a debate had been arranged; the date coincided with the anniversary of Harvey Milk's assassination. The speakers were specifically asked not to traffic on the memories of the day but to words. speak to the issues.

Dianne arrived late - her eyes glistening, fragile, vulnerable. With a sigh, she called off the debate, moments before she was introduced. The moderator was thrown into disarray. She reluctantly took the microphone and told the packed bar she was too overcome with emotion to debate, and she stumbled on for ten more minutes on how it had all been too much for her to bear

. . . "It just isn't in me," she pleaded to the crowd. Hearts rushed to her rescue as she took her seat in respectful

Her opponent rose to his feet - catching the flavor of the hour as it had now been established. He talked about crimes The night was hers and hers against Gays and how he would bring Gays into the mainstream of civic life. The applause was significant.

> After her challenger's remarks, Guild president Wayne Friday attempted to close the meeting. But ground had been lost - territory had to be recovered. Feinstein abruptly interjected, saying she just wanted to say a few more

She took the microphone a second time, eyes brimming with tears. She said again she was overcome with the "fragility of life." She told how she had shared wine with the Moscone family in her office earlier in the day. "I found myself having to go back and close the door" to an outer office. "It's almost impossible to go through a day like this because I remember another door I opened where Harvey was and finding his body."

"So I hope you don't think this is any kind of wanting to avoid discussion. It's just a day where my human frailty shows." Sensing she was touching paydirt, she dug deeper into the rich Milk ore. The MC's initial request not to capitalize on the memory were the very areas that were paying off. Her mood changed with a smile and she discussed Milk in more detail, recalling his ability to address crowds and his playfulness. Then suddenly she turned solemn again. "Could we say a brief prayer?" she asked - her face turned red and her eyes shown with tears in the glare of the television lights. Several persons in the crush cried silently . . . the star

When she finished the prayer, the crowd cheered - they had been touched by a resplendent handmaid of the Lord. "We love you, Dianne," a voice

New Life for the **Golden Gate**

Carol Shorenstein and James Nederlander (operators of the Best of Broadway series at the Curran Theatre) have announced the re-opening of the Golden Gate Theatre on December 27 with the national company of A CHORUS LINE. When the curtain goes up, the lobby and auditorium areas will have been restored to their former beauty. Extensive renovation has been done to bring the backstage areas up to modern standards. The theater had operated for a while as a double mini-movie house.

Nederlander's first season includes Dick Van Dyke in a revival of THE MUSIC MAN, Alexis Smith in the touring company of THE BEST LITTLE WHOREHOUSE IN TEXAS, Richard Burton as King Arthur in CAMELOT and Rex Harrison repeating his original characterization of Henry Higgins in MY FAIR

Shorenstein stressed the

desire to bring "quality" enter-tainment to San Francisco. There is some hope that spare dates in the Golden Gate's booking calendar will be filled by visiting arts troupes and organizations which have been unable to come to San Francisco in recent years due to the unavailability of the War Memorial Opera House. Nederlander stressed that the Golden Gate is open to booking events. Hopes were expressed by some people attending the press conference that Nederlander might bring the New York City Ballet under George Balanchine's direction, or the New York City Opera under the direction of Beverly Sills. Nederlander operates the New York State Theatre in Lincoln Center during the summer months. Both companies are regular tenants in that theater. The New York City Opera performs in Los Angeles in December with a markedly different repertoire than the San Francisco Opera could

San Francisco Opera and could conceivably book dates in San Francisco following its yearly Los Angeles engagement.

Plans for the Golden Gate's second season are not yet finalized, but Nederlander admitted al tour of SWEENEY TODD. If one checks out the tenants of Mr. Nederlander's theaters in New York, likely candidates to round out the second year's series would be PETER PAN with Sandy Duncan, 1940's RADIO HOUR, and perhaps a revival of WEST SIDE STORY being prepared by the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

"Half A Man" is a truck driver's lament at played everything there is to play, including all the Queens Shakespeare and the Greeks ever wrote, as the witty script by Joe Masteroff pointed out: "I'd rather play a Queen, no matter how small a role, than a commoner, no matter how large." She appeared in KLUTE, and is now to be seen regularly on daytime TV in 'Search for Tomorrow." Her show was no mere listing of triumphs, but an introspective searching for identity and her many facets. She dealt candidly and wisely with racial issues. and yet didn't go far enough. She said her father was a famous man, yet didn't tell us who he was, and though she made it apparent that her life has been marked by a quest for personal identity, she conducted the whole evening in the third person. It frequently seemed she was introducing

someone yet to appear. Still, her stage savvy was enviable, and her choice of songs ophisticated and telling. Kurt Weill's infrequently heard 'That's Him" positively and Sondheim's Him" glowed. naughty "I Never Do Anything Twice" received its definitive, naughtiest reading. Aznavour's yearning "There Is A Time" and Weill's fierce "Pirate Jenny" were memorable, and "God Bless the Child," that much-abused song, emerged fresh and triumphant. Kander and Ebb's "I Am My Own Best Friend" became an anthem, although their "My Own Space," despite its gorgeous melody and rich midsection, revealed again how banal its lyric is.

The lack of dates or liner notes makes this all thoroughly confusing, but the music is amongst the most riveting and exultant to emerge from the UK this decade. Wander Lust

I Go Yugoslavia

by A. Marc Leventhal

I wandered along the pol-ished streets of the old walled city of Dubrovnik. The main street - Placa - glistening in the full moon, is filled with Yugoslav men standing around chatting and drinking thick coffee in the small coffee shops. The side streets are lit by the lanterns hanging over the entrances to restaurants and shops. I enjoy walking amids the crowd, not having to worry about cars that are banned here (except for early morning

I had only just arrived in Dubrovnik that afternoon after a nondescript flight on Yugo-slavia Airlines, JAT, from New York. JAT has efficient nononsense service, and the flight was rather painless. There were no problems with customs, or the quick glance at my passport. A visa is all that is required, which is easily obtained free in San Francisco at the Yugoslavia Consulate at their new office on Sutter

Being an eastern European Socialist Republic, I expected to find I was in a military state. This is far from the case. I rarely saw anyone in military uniform, and just as few police.

The world-famous Dubrovnik Festival is held during July and August, and the city is packed for both the sun, and concerts and plays that use the walled city as a theater.

First a little background so you will know where, and what, the country is. It is composed of six republics, five nationalities, four religions, three languages, two alpha-bets, and one Tito. Lying along the Adriatic Sea, Yugoslavia is bordered on the north by Italy and Austria, along the east by Hungary, Rumania and Bulgaria, and on the south by Greece and Albania.

The republics are Serbia,

Croatia, Slovenia, Macedonia, Montenegro, and Bosnia-Hercegovina - all names that conjure up middle European/ Baltic. The nationalities: Serbi-Croatian, Slovenian, Macedonian, and Montenegran. The religions: Orthodox, Roman Catholic, Moslem and Jewish. The languages, Serbo-Croat, Slovenian, and Macedonian, are complicated by the use of two alphabets. Traveling along the coast out-of-season is a problem since many hotels close up. There are accommodations for any price range in Dubrovnik, most of which will be outside the walled old town. 





ATTACK REPORTS **BRING ACTION**

Most people in the Gay community are aware of the frequent attacks on Lesbians and Gay men. Unfortunately, the knowledge of attacks does little practical good unless put into the form of statistics. Governmental agencies, from the Mayor's office to the Police, express interest in the problem, but require evidence in the form of reports.

Because of a sharp increase in reported attacks in the area North of Alamo Square (14 assaults reported in 3 weeks),

police resources were redirected to deal with the newly recognized problem. No doubt there were far more than 14 incidents, but the increase in reports brought action.

Halloween at Castro Street is an excellent example of a large number of attacks going unreported. In reviewing reports on file with the SFPD for the night of October 31-November 1, 1979, only eight reports appeared to be of anti-Gay attacks from the narrative. personally know of far more, and hope that the people involved will still report the incidents.



Quentin Kopp on Gay Rights



The Kopp for Mayor committee has released the following fact sheet on Kopp's record in Gay rights positions:

Quentin Kopp co-authored the Resolution that expanded the Human Rights Commission to specifically include Gay members.

Quentin Kopp consistently supported the ending of criminal penalties against consenting adults.

Quentin Kopp opposed Proposition 6 — the Briggs

Quentin Kopp supported the ordinance prohibiting employment discrimination based on sexual orientation.

Quentin Kopp publicly supported the Gay police recruitment program, and called for city officials to support Gay recruits both during their training program and thereafter as police officers.

Quentin Kopp supported the Resolution to end discrimination against Gays who wish to visit the United States.

Quentin Kopp was the only elected Democratic official to publicly protest the removal of Harvey Milk from the Board of Permit Appeals when Harvey Milk decided to run for the Assembly. He was also the only elected Democratic official to support Harvey Milk in his 1976 Assembly race.

City of Davis May Ban Bias **Against Gays**

The Davis City Council, on a 3-2 vote, has directed the city attorney to draft a proposed ordinance prohibiting discrimination against homosexuals in employment, housing and public services.

The action last week followed a two-hour hearing in which both sides on the Gay rights measure cited the equal protection provisions of the U.S. Constitution in their arguments. An overflow crowd of about 250 attended the hearing.

The proposed ordinance will be the subject of public hearings next month.



Syphilis, because of its similarity to other, less dangerous diseases, is often overlooked by its victims. Gonorrhea, essentially without symptoms in the throat and rectal areas, is especially problematic for the Gay population.

After reading stacks of exotic materials through the years, one can get a bit jaded, especially when wading through the backwaters of love through the ages. But even here, unexpected nuggets continue to surprise

Vern Bullough, professor of history at Long Beach State University, a tireless researcher in Gay history, has provided both the expected and the surprising. We find here the usual chronology of dates and facts about Oscar Wilde and boy love in ancient Greece.

We learn the agonizing tale of how knowledge about the homoerotic impulse has been viciously suppressed through the centuries. The common herd has been protected from many wondrous things.

In the legal profession, for example, massive difficulty arose in defining what sexual activities were forbidden between males because no one could bear to describe any overt acts in detail. In discussing anal intercourse the law givers fell back on the church fathers, who uttered the dark phrase, peccaturn, illud horrible, inter Christiani non nominandum. At other times the tiresome adjective "infamous crimes against nature" was employed. As Bullough points out, it was not until almost the turn of our own century that judges began to

accumulated between the pages of textbooks when analyzing the fall of Rome. Norman F. Cantor in Medieval History: The Life and Death of A Civilization (Macmillan, 1963) informs the student of history that:

The civilization of the Roman empire was vitiated by homosexuality from its earliest days. A question, uncomfortable to our contemhomosexuality a fundamental dethe individual? It is worth consider-Arabic, where homosexuality was also widespread, similarly underwent a sudden malaise and breakdown. Is there some moral physiosocial effects of homosexuality that has been ignored?





Concert: Manhattan **Transfer**

The mellow sounds of Manhattan Transfer will return to San Francisco after a two-year absence in concerts on December 7 and 8 at the Masonic Auditorium on California Street. The four-member group has promised a show that will be a lot different from their previous performances.

"We've expanded a lot," said Transferite Alan Paul in a recent phone interview. 'There's more theatrics in our staging." The new show boasts three production numbers and new costumes by Jean-Paul Gaultier that "reek of German Expressionism." But it's not all theater, Paul told me. "Sometimes we just sit and sing."

The shows will run about two hours and twenty minutes, "maybe with, maybe without an intermission," Paul said. Some of the material will be the Transfer's old standards and some will be new songs which they haven't recorded. Most of their new album, Extensions, will be part of the show including vocal interpretations of Weather Report's "Birdland," "Body and Soul," a cocaine piece called "Wacky Dust," and a song based on "The Twi-light Zone Theme" called "Twilight Tone.

Paul said the group was expanding beyond their big band sound into contemporary jazz. "We've got a real hot 6-piece band," he said proudly. In addition, the group has gotten into electronic synthesizers.

Manhattan Transfer has always attracted a Gay audience. "Our first audiences were Gay, back in New York in 1973-74, when we played Trude Helby's, Reno Sweeney's and Max's Kansas City," Paul told me. "Now the audiences vary, but in certain cities we still get a heavy Gay ollowing'


