





With the promise of a giant billboard, Russell Alley will be making his own kind of stand for Gay rights during the July Democratic Convention. Disturbed by the reactions he believes people will have to the planned march and demonstration, Alley got Foster & Kleiser to donate a billboard across the street from the Hilton Hotel during the convention week for a message from the Gay community.

The message Alley will proclaim is aimed to have opposite effect from the demonstrations being planned. The copy reads, "Best Wishes for a successful convention from the Men and Women of San Francisco's Gay community." Russell Alley says he is trying to "put out a positive image" of San Francisco Gays.

Alley is well aware that his concept is in direct contrast to the planned demonstrations. To (Continued on page 11)

Governor George Deukmejian vetoed AB-1, the Gay job rights bill, on Tuesday afternoon after it had been passed by the state Assembly (42-35) and Senate (22-16). The measure had finally passed the legislature after an 8-year effort by its author, Assemblyman Art Agnos.

The governor gave three basic reasons for his veto:

No Need: He said no real need had been proven that homosexuals are discriminated against in employment. Cited were cities where there is such legislation but where few complaints have been filed. He also said only two complaints had been filed with the state personnel board, although there is an executive order barring discrimination in state employment. The governor said, "Homosexuals are widely represented and accepted throughout California's work force, even without any special laws."


Gay advocates agreed that it has been difficult to document cases of discrimination when so few homosexuals have come "out of the closet." In most cases of job discrimination the reason for the mistreatment is clouded in employee explanations that have no bearing on sexual orientation. Numerous cases of alleged individual Gay discrimination were paraded before legislative committees — but the hard statistics were not there.

Special Protection: AB-1 would have added "sexual orientation" to the long list of minorities and classes that can complain to the state if they are discriminated against. In effect, it barred such discrimination

thought it was wrong to include people in this "specially protected class" because of their sexual orientation. The implication is that Gay people would be given "special" consideration that is denied to others.

People Divided: Deukmejian urged that he had received over 90,000 letters and telephone calls and that "they reflect a strong difference of opinion." He emphasized that in one major Gay rights case the state Supreme Court had divided 4-3 and that the public had rejected an initiative in 1978 that would have barred Gay school teachers by a 53%-42% margin. His reasoning was that, by vetoing, he ended the division.

While any controversy divides people, the governor knew that his signing of AB-1 would create a special problem. Many of his supporters had announced that they would introduce a referendum to take AB-1 off the books in the November election if he signed. That would have continued the statewide debate through 1984

Assemblyman Agnos pledged to re-introduce AB-1 again in January 1985. He said, "I am heartbroken. This bill was defeated by a group of bigoted Bible-thumpers... I will continue to introduce this bill until it becomes the law of the land. This is not the end of the struggle for Gay civil rights. I have not given up on the governor. I believe he is a sincere and earnest man. Each of us recognizes when we come across an historic opportunity. I regret and feel sorry for the governor because he didn't take advantage of this."

The governor, conservative opponents, and Gay Rights advocates all knew what was more important than the specifics of the legislation. It was a symbolic message that homosexuals should be accepted and given equal treatment. It was significant that the major opposition group to AB-1 was "The Family Coalition" which emphasized that the traditional, nuclear family was threatened by such legislation. They were correct. Gay Rights legislation indirectly attempts to include Gay people within the concept of "fam-

# DA Indicts Gay Priest on Charges of 'Quack' Medicine

Homeopath Accused of Falsely Claiming Cures for AIDS, Herpes

An openly Gay Episcopal priest has been indicted by the San Francisco District Attorney on charges of practicing medicine without a license, the Bay Area Reporter learned last week.

The Rev. Richard Kerr, a practitioner and advocate of homeopathic healing, was accused of claiming that he had a cure for AIDS, herpes and other diseases that presently have no cure in conventional medicine.

Kerr was the central figure of a controversy last year over an emergency food-to-the-poor program at Trinity Church.

Homeopathy is a form of holistic health therapy that is based on the premise that a remedy can cure a disease if it bolsters the body's own natural healing powers, instead of the remedy itself arresting the disease, and without creating toxic side effects, according to author George Vithoulkas, a homeopathic practitioner.

According to the indictment, Kerr "advertised and held himself up as practicing a system of treating the sick without having a license to act as a physician or surgeon, nor having any license issued by the (state) Board of Medical Quality Assurance (BMQA)," in violation of Section 2052 of the state Business

# Governor Vetoes AB-1

The primary workers for AB-1 were a dedicated few aides to Senator David Roberti (who introduced the legislation in the Senate), Assemblyman Agnos, and several other legislators and longtime Gay rights politicl advocates across the state.

The whole of the Gay community did not get involved in the AB-1 struggle, although there were many attempts to involve the Gay public. This lack of interest was partly due to more general acceptance of Gay peo-ple and the fact that most Gay people remain private on the job about their sexual orientation.

The pro-AB-l effort was not concentrated in San Francisco, often portrayed as the Gay Capital of the World, where Gay people are generally accepted as a reality if not understood. The battle lines were in the other 57 California counties where homosexuals are not as accepted and the religious Right has stronger political ties. While most of the major city newspapers supported AB-1 (with four editorials for it in the Los Angeles Times) many small town newspapers were against it and carried the syndicated editorial commentaries of homophobic Senator H.L. Richardson.

### DISTORTIONS

Homophobic Senator H.L. Richardson stooped to bring AIDS into the controversy as he strongly implied that employers would be forced to hire homosexuals with AIDS and thus be exposed to the disease by touch. Alarmed Christians in some churches heard ministers talk of the coming Sodom and Gomorrah if AB-1 became law.

Some people were led to believe that there would be quotas set so employers would be forced to hire a specific percentage of Gay people. One employer told this reporter that he would close his business, employing 326 people, rather than be "forced" to hire homosexuals under AB-1.

The political Right and many religious conservatives distorted what the bill was all about. In reality, AB-1 was a very simple piece of legislation. The bill added "sexual orientation" to the state code that prohibits employment discrimination because of "race, religious creed, color, na-

tional origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, sex, or age." It explained that there were no hiring quotas or affirmative action "intended or required."

There were exceptions put in the proposed legislation to avoid some earlier attacks by business and religious groups. AB-1 ex-empted businesses with fewer than five employees plus schools, churches, and nonprofit businesses run by churches.

AB-1 put the burden of proof on the person making the com-plaint and established that the state Department of Fair Housing and Employment process

#### ART AGNOS

Agnos, a straight married man with two children, was more determined and dedicated to passing AB-1 than any Gay activist in the state. He spent long hours away from his family speaking in all parts of the state in an attempt to activate a relatively complacent Gay community. Agnos and his hardworking Gay and straight staff traveled from San Diego to Yreka and inland through the valley.

The lists of church leaders labor unions, business groups and elected politicians grew to where reluctant legislators began to pay closer attention. Telephone calls and personal visits to legislators by selected people who were chosen because of their expertise or friendship with the legislators. The orchestrating went on for months with Agnos in charge and keeping the legis-lative vote tally. When he had the votes on the floor, he called up

Gay Democratic activists across the state took an active role in passing in AB-1 with trips made to Sacramento to lobby legislators. Significant contacts with Republican legislators were made by the local Gay Concerned Republicans for Individual Rights and the Los Angelesbased Log Cabin Republicans. Two surprises surfaced when two unexpected GOP legislators supported the bill - Assemblyman William Filante in the Assembly and former LA Police Chief Ed Davis in the Senate.

The passage of AB-1, first introduced by the author in 1977 squeaked through the Assembly and the Senate. The same thing happened with Assemblyman Willie Brown's consensual sex bill when it finally won passage in 1975. However, Brown had Governor Jerry Brown. Agnos had Deukmejian.

#### GEORGE DEUKMEJIAN

The governor is a dedicated family man who believes strongly in the flag, motherhood and apple pie. He is an Armenian, scopalian, and proud that he pulled himself up "by the bootstraps." He is also very independent. For example, when his Bishop, Robert Rusack, called this week (at the request of Los Angeles activist Morris Kight) to urge him to sign AB-1, he thanked him for his input — and then vetoed the bill.

Deukmejian is also careful about important matters. Although he received over 3,000 telephone calls and 5,000 letters daily (overwhelmingly favoring a veto) he took his time deciding His staff was tied up with AB-1. feeding the governor reports and analyses from state cabinet members and lawyers. He listened to Agnos more than once, chatted with the perennial moralistic lobbyist Rev. W.B. Timberlake, and many others about the bill. The public may

# **Veto Protest Staged in Castro**

It could have been a replay of the big Gay protests of the late '70s, but it wasn't. The people weren't there.

At its height, the demonstration Tuesday night to protest the veto of the state Gay job rights bill attracted about 350 people to Castro Street. By the time the protesters had marched down Market and Polk Streets to Civic Center Plaza, the crowd had thinned to 250. There may have been more police than protesters surrounding the State Building, where

"I don't think a lot of people knew about it - many are still in the process of finding out, said quintessential protest marcher Howard Wallace, who has by his own estimation 'marched in hundreds of these things" over the past 15 years. "But the spirit is terrific," he

For a small crowd, it was indeed spirited, and the marchers made a noise bigger than their numbers would indicate. From Castro down Market to Van Ness, up Van Ness to Sacramento and back down Polk to Civic Center, they blew whistles and horns, shouted and sang, and chanted slogans such as "Gay Rights Now" and "Nuke the

It had all the classic features of a San Francisco Gay protest: Cleve Jones with a bullhorn shouting, "Out of the bars and into the streets;" the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence leading visors - Carol Ruth Silver and Bill Maher - showing up to address the rally, to a lukewarm response. But for the most part. the masses that might have made up the bulk of the demonstration stayed on the sidewalks, or got out of the streets and into the

Organizers decided at 4 p.m. to call a rally and protest - only three hours before the event was to begin. And all afternoon, rain squalls moved across the city, clearing at 6:15 p.m. At 6, Bill Camilo, Third

World Caucus Chair for the Alice B. Toklas Lesbian/Gay Democratic Club, stood at the corner of 18th and Castro in front of a hastily made poster, shouting, "Protest the Veto of AB-1 — Rally at Market and Castro, 7 p.m." Leaflets didn't arrive until 6:20, and five minutes later, Camilo finally got a bullhorn to broadcast his an-

never know if the governor's apparently endless search for the truth was real or whether he had made his decision earlier.

Richardson said recently that the governor had shown a concern about "the general view of California that is held by the business community outside of California" and predicted the governor would veto. Others predicted the veto, arguing that the governor would not alientate his natural constituency, the conser-

and Agnos himself believed that Deukmejian might, at the least, sit out the 12-day waiting period and let the bill become law without his signature. When the governor said he would not do that - but would do something earlier, he still waited until the 11th

The governor encouraged civil liberty and Gay rights advocates when he said that the jobs bill was "entirely different" than the earlier consensual sex bill. Deukmejian had led the floor fight against that bill in 1975 when he was in the Assembly, but he did not rescind Governor Brown's executive order giving job rights to state employees when he became governor. Deukmejian also met with numerous people who supported AB-1, including some Gay activists. He reportedly demonstrated considerable charm and asked a variety of questions. The

fact that he waited so long, rather than vetoing the bill earlier, was also encouraging.

#### REFERENDUM AVOIDED

The governor's veto avoided a possible referendum to take AB-1 off the books. Two senators, Richardson and John Doolittle (R-Citrus Heights), announced that they would garner over 500,000 signatures in 90 days to place the issue on the ballot in November. They would have been joined by "The Fam-, a recent Santa Monica group that had called AB-1 "an open attack on

**Concerned Citizens Business** Group had been formed in the Southland to get the signatures for the referendum if the governor signed. This reporter attended a press conference called by its founder, Don Bierman, in Los Angeles earlier this week. The organizer was in a nearpanic stage as he related how men would begin to dress as women on the job and how males would approach other males in employee rest rooms if AB-1 passed. Bierman nervously called AB-1 "Bill 81." He remained staunch while fifteen reporters and television camera operators openly laughed through much of his maniacal presentation. Bierman can now relax until next year when AB-1 will be again introduced.

# Building Dept. Won't Oust Castro Doctor

The San Francisco Planning Commission almost blasted a model Gay business right out of the water. Late last year they began the procedure to put dermatologist Stephen Baker out of his unique business location at Castro and 19th Streets.

With the help of Harry Britt, Louise Renne, and virtually the entire Board of Supervisors,

Dr. Baker's problems began last fall when San Francisco building inspectors posted a notice trying to close his business. The building inspectors saw what they thought was a problem when they viewed Baker's offices in what was formerly a residence. The offices were added by High Gear back in 1978 to compliment their Castro area location. Dr. Baker moved in to the offices in 1980 Only after four years, the building inspectors got around to looking. They told Baker he had

For Dr. Baker it wasn't that

simple. His efforts were the model of the business that finds a need and fills it. His business is treating diseases of the skin. There was no competition in the immediate area. Searching in vain for a regular doctor's office, he settled on the scenic location at Castro and 19th Street. Baker then began a regular advertising campaign in the Bay Area Reporter. He built up a respected and successful usiness in the Castro area.

On January 5 the City Planning Commission met and ruled against Dr. Baker. He then had until February 27 to mount a defense as his case moved to the Board of Supervisors.

Hollywood), announced last week his second Senate Rules Committee appointment to the AIDS Advisory Committee to the State Department of Health Services. His aide Stan Hadden was his choice.

The AIDS Advisory Committee was established by Roberti's Senate Bill910, which became law on January 1, 1984.

Appointee Stan Hadden has been bringing the concerns of AIDS-related agencies to the Legislature and to the Department of Health Services since early 1983. He is a member of the Board of Directors. Sacramento AIDS Foundation and has done extensive work with the Lesbian and Gay community organizations to share AIDS resources and informa-

Hadden assisted the Department of Health Services in rewriting a 1983 proposal so that agencies providing AIDS-related services could compete with county health departments in the state's AIDS grant funding process. He has been active in a number of Gay organizations in Sacramento since 1978. He serves on the staff of Roberti, who recommended him.

The advisory committee will work with the Department of Health Services until July 1, 1986. Appointments by the Speaker of the Assembly and by the Governor to the Committee have not yet been made.

# **Dutch Statesman Speaks on** the Sexuality of Children

"Children give consent or refuse to give consent all the time, about everything. They let you know if they do not like something or it is pleasing to them. There must always be consent before and during activity. The child must be completely respected.

The speaker was one of the Netherlands' most respected citizens, Dr. Edward Brongersma. He told the monthly meeting of the local North American Man/Boy Love Association (NAMBLA) that children can be very loving and very sexual with adults — an acceptable fact of life in the Netherlands. Seventy in attendance sat in rapt attention for the 90-minute presentation.

States have deliberately attempted to ignore NAMBLA and underage Gay people for fear they will be branded as "child molesters." Children are not recognized as being sexual in this society and the public (including Gay people) in this country severely condemns adult/child sex relations.

In one of its most dramatic political defeats in history, singer Anita Bryant successfully frightened Miami voters in 1977 by implying homosexuals were "child molesters." Her campaign was "Save Our Children." The Gay activists responded by insisting that few of them did have sex with children and that they also deplored such activity.

#### DR. BRONGERSMA

Brongersma has written numerous books and magazine articles on child/adult sex relations and is a recognized international authority on the subject. The doctor of law has taught in his country's universities and served in its national Senate for 19 years.

**BAPHR Mounts Weekend Health Fair**

Netherlands dropped its age of consent to 16 in 1971 with wide support from youth groups, socialists, attorneys, and the church itself. It passed the legislature 150-5. In 1980 a law was adopted which made it legal for children 12-16 to have sex with an adult if the child initiated the

The speaker said that the commander of the police vice squad in the Netherlands' second largest city, Rotterdam. testified during the hearings on law reform that he urged his officers to not arrest adults who have sex with children unless the parents request it. Brongersma said children are usually more traumatized by the discovery and resulting legal problems than they are by the acts.

The attitude in the Netherlands, the attorney said, is that sex is joyous and that whether it is woman/boy or man/boy relations it is "a very positive thing." He said that with girls it is a different situation but he did not

Brongersma said that it is wrong to believe that sex is evil, that sex is wrong. However, he emphasized, many other countries are not as liberal as the Netherlands. They believe children should be "protected" from sex. He said the United States had a reputation in Europe as being very restrictive about all

When asked about children's exposure to pornography, the attorney urged that it can be very useful as an educational tool. He said children are not damaged by seeing sexual acts portrayed or reading about them. Children, he said, accept or reject such material - depending on whether they find it interesting at the moment. (There are no restrictions on pornography in the Netherlands.)

Violation of Section 2052 is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$500, six months in the county jail, or both.

Nate James, the assistant district attorney handling the case, told the Bay Area Reporter that Kerr "claimed that he could cure diseases that conventional medicine cannot cure - particularly AIDS and herpes.

James, who works in the DA's consumer fraud unit, said that the District Attorney's office acted after receiving a lengthy report by an investigator for the BMQA.

In reviewing court records on the case, however, the Bay Area Reporter, was denied access to the BMQA investigator's report, on the grounds that it was going to be used as evidence against Kerr.

Moreover, the report contained Kerr's home address, which under state law must be kept confidential.

Kerr, who at press time did not have legal counsel, declined



Dana Ullman, a holistic practitioner in Berkeley. Ullman was also accused of practicing medicine without a license.

Ullman reached a settlement with Alameda County in which Ullman "Initiated a regular practice of contracting with clients in order to clarify the role of the non-medical practitioner," and then refers clients to "licensed physicians for the diagnosis and treatment of pathology," according to the settlement.

In an unpublished November 1983 letter to the editor of the Bay Area Reporter, Kerr states that his practice of homeopathy "is based on four years study with an M.D. in Livermore, and that "no remedy I use is of prescription strength.

Kerr made headlines last July when the San Francisco Examiner published two stories reporting that the vestry of Trinity Church was conducting an audit of its emergency food distribution project.

The Examiner said that up to 80% of \$138,545 in funds appropriated to the project by the city was spent on staff salaries including \$36,000 for Kerr's salary and \$18,000 for his lover's salary as "social service direc-

Cromey told the Bay Area Reporter that the Examiner articles were "filled with inaccuracies." Cromey, who was out of the country at the time the articles were published, said that while there was indeed an audit of the program, "there was no finding of any misappropriation of funds to the food program.

### A Duke Shrinks with a Veto

feel the same way today as I did the day Anita Bryant got the Dade County, Florida, Gay Rights bill overturned in 1977. Lousy.

In over 25 years of watching the shifting/sliding winds of California politics, I have never witnessed a high government official make such a retrogressive move as did Governor George Deukmejian this week. For the first time he reminded me of Governors Orville Faubus and George Wallace. In a sweep of his veto. Deukmeijan broadcast that civil rights progress for Gays was dead in the water for the next three

AB-1, some say, wasn't all that much, but as the days passed, it magnified into something much more. By last week it had swelled to a symbol of the advance or decline of minority rights. Its opponents were saying Gays shouldn't have it because we were - as a class - Godforsaken and diseased.

Deukmejian this Tuesday did more than veto a bill, he trumpeted the startling message that H.L. Richardson is now the most powerful, the most feared man in Sacramento. On the turn of AB-1, Richardson (avowed homophobe, bigot, theocrat) hung his career and future.

This sinister legislator belongs to the cast of historical travesties. He is the likes of Geneva's John Calvin in the 17th century who was well into setting up the City of God on earth. He is of the same stuffing as the Ayatollah Khomeini, who would have a nation, a state, a city run by the narrowly ordained ministers of a vengeful God. A leader who thinks nothing of throwing a half-million boys and young men into the yaws of war. Richardson is one more God-rattling reformist, a purifier, and all such beads of bleach eventually purify

Deukmeijan, to his sorrow, will discover that he has bought into his nemesis. For Richardson will be a plaque unto his administration's house. As Richardson's frontpiece, the new message goes to every minority, liberal, progressive, moderate, or constitutional conservative that George Deukmejian henceforth eats at the same trough as the bigots (who, turn their collar once, are but a thread away from fascists . . . who are a thread away from the death squads).

Deukmejian initiates three years of strife with the Gay/Lesbian community of California. He has laid down the gauntlet, which is now ours to pick up. When confronted by an announced enemy the Gay/Lesbian community has never been more magnificent. In unity we have triumphed over an Anita Bryant, over a John Briggs



His leadership led to lowering of the age of consent for Gays at the same age as it already was for Straights, 15 years. It behooves the Gay/Lesbian Community of Northern California to warmly welcome a valuable friend to San Francisco on or around March 25.

Much that is viciously bigoted in the Christian Church would seem to originate from a thorough confusion over which Testament and which religion one is







#### The Sexual Differences

\* It is with consummate disgust that I consider the recent ploy by two women to discredit the male community by trying to prove that the Detour is discriminating against women. This action speaks of the lack of respect and courtesy for things discretely male that women always maintain, though not usually this overtly. It also implies, in keeping with the women's movement's track record of employing as many gross double standards as the "oppressors" they fight, that men having their own space equals discrimination whereas women having their own space equals justice. The message here is really that ultimately men are stronger than women and so don't deserve things like all male clubs. (If women weren't weaker than men how'd they get oppressed in the first place?) I, for one, have never felt men were stronger than women in the final analysis. I also don't feel women are more oppressed in the total life

If women were the underdogs in half as many deter mining instances as they declare, then things would be different. However, one need only look to the number of exclusively female establishments to see an indicative example of female double standards. I can't even reount all the stories I've heard, including those of my own lesbian sister, of the cruel treatment men have received at Maud's, Amelia's, Peg's Place, etc. And it's not like women are never present in gay bars either. Recently I had to leave The Bear becasue of the shrill houting and mega-decibel raucous laughter of two 'robust" lesbians watching The Wizard of Oz, of all things, on the video. Their noise level far exceeded that of the rest of the men there. Can you see two men behaving similarly in a women's bar? Of course, the poor dears being members of the "oppressed sex" deserve to have allowances made for them. Which is really the cogent point of this whole maneuver at the Detour — it strikes to the heart of the issue of Men's Liberation.

Just a few facts on the so-called advantaged life of perpetrated by women against boys; (2) male orphans are adopted less; (3) a woman convicted of first degree murder is a hundred times less likely to get the death penalty than a man; (4) most of the physically disabled are men; (5) most suicides are men; (6) men have the most stress-related diseases; (7) women inculcate in men a feeling that they're unclean, leaving them with debilitating attitudes toward their own bodies and that they have to defer to women for affection; (8) women monopolize relationship-building skills, emotional dynamics, and micro-social structures such as family, leaving men dependent on them for emotional life and security; (9) women have greater mastery of body language and verbal expressiveness — men's voices are more monotone and tight; (10) most people feel more pathos at the death of, or violence to, a woman than a man - male victims of violence being so common place; (11) women encourage male violence by conditioning men to fight for them and perform for them. Also, being disadvantaged in the realm of verbal and emotional maneuvering and manipulativeness and unable to respond as often with physical force, men take out most of their women-caused anger on other men.

# Castro/Polk/Police, All React to AB-1 News

Literally hundreds of San Francisco police were mobilized in the wake of Governor Deukmejian's announcement on Tuesday. Squads were brought into the Castro and the Civic Center area from all nine police stations in the city. "We were ready for anything," stated police Gay liaison

A command post was set up in the mayor's office at City Hall. Police by the score were located in parking lots and at Northern Station in the area which includes the State Building and the San Francisco office of the governor. In the Castro, police presence was everywhere. By early evening there were uniformed police stationed at Castro and Market. Market and unmarked police seemed to be everywhere.

Equally as present in the Castro were the television crews. As the six o'clock news went on the air, there were seven crews in the one block from Market to 18th on Castro Street. Hundreds of commuters spilling out of the Muni Metro station were targets for interviewers doing their person-on-the-street news shots.

In other parts of town the news was spreading. At the New Bell on Polk Street, Lyle Murdock was appalled. He said, "I

thought it would make it through. I think the man has committed political suicide. Murdock is the president of the San Francisco Municipal Court Clerks Association.

At Sukker's Liquors on Polk Street, plans had begun to change their infamous marquee. The management had a message which encouraged people to call nor to sign AB-1. With disgust, the clerk on duty said they were working on the tackiest sign they could create. The favorite as of the early evening was "Duke blows job bill."

At Kimo's, across the street, the bartender went pale when he heard the news. He had been one who had written to Sacramento. He could only say that he was "shocked and disgusted."

As camera crews worked the Castro area, they were finding

"It would be necessary under AB-l for me to build additional

bathrooms for Gay men and Gay women because straight persons would not want to share bathrooms with them . . . Gay women

would dress like men and Gay men would wear women's dresses. If I said 'No' they would yell discrimination . . . Let's say I hire

a very muscular, strong, masculine man. We are stacking 100-pound sacks, but he refuses because a Gay only has to lift 50 pounds. If I fired him he would claim discrimination."

"There are documents going back 400 years that say homosexuality is a sin. Religious groups have consistently opposed homosexuality and if this bill passes we will probably have an argument under the First Amendment, as people have a right to deny employment to homosexuals."

Police estimated the crowd that marched through the streets at about 500. Others offered estimates as low as 300. The march wound through the Castro, then down Market Street to Van Ness. Marching up Van Ness they circled back over Sacramento Street and down Polk Street to the State Building.

Cleve Jones, Gay aide to Assemblyman Art Agnes — the legislator who introduced AB-1 - said, "I am very disappoint ed. I have been working on this for many years with Agnos. It is so frustrating to get so far along and then be stopped by a veto. I am honestly surprised. I thought he would sign it."

Jones credited "extraordinary pressure from the fundamentalist Christians" for prompting the governor to veto the bill. "But we will persevere. We will reintroduce the bill and we will win," Jones said.

Sal Rosselli, president of the Alice B. Toklas Lesbian/Gay Democratic Club, said, "It's hard to express the disappointment I feel. But we came closer than we ever did before, and more of a variety of people sup-ported us than ever before."

Rosselli said, "Now we need to put all our energy into registering people to vote, so that this November, we can defeat the opponents of this bill and help reelect the supporters." Paul Boneberg, president of

the Stonewall Democratic Club, said, "Sure I was shocked" by the governor's veto. "I would have hoped that he was educated in the past ten years since he led the fight against the Consenting Adults bill. But apparently he

# Marine Gets Four Years for Murder/Mutilation of Gay Man

## Homosexual Panic Works for Georgia Athlete

Vista, CA - A 20-year-old Georgia marine was sentenced to four years in prison for voluntary manslaughter on February 10 in the bludgeoning death of a local Gay contruction executive, in what the prosecutor called "one of the bloodiest, most gruesome murders ever in San Diego

On April 3, 1983, Cpl. Dennis Craig Edenfield went to an ceanside motel with David G. Smith, 55, subsequent to their meeting in a tavern frequented by Camp Pendleton Marines. After twice leaving and returning to the room, the Marine in a fury battered Smith to death with a table. San Diego County deputy District Attorney Susan Biery claimed the brown-haired Georgian committed the slaying after engaging in "a consensu homosexual act" with his victim; however, Edenfield has given several accounts for his action. At his trial he claimed being frightened into self-protection when he awoke from a drunken stupor to find Smith naked and straddling his shirtless body.

After Oceanside Police traced Edenfield to being in the room, the Marine baker asked homicide detectives," Is this in regards to that faggot? Because if it is, I can save you a lot of time be-cause I did it."

The Marine corporal admitted, "I hit him. I hit him hard. I hit him with my hands. I hit him with my elbows. I hit him with the table. I hit him good."

Biery alleges the Jesup, GA, native knew his victim was Gay before they went to the Mira Mar Motel. Edenfield claimed Smith "promised" women would be in the room.

After recurrently bashing Smith with the table, Edenfield washed the bludgeoned man's blood from his hands and slender torso and left the goredrenched room believing his prey still alive. However, he did not seek medical treatment for the Gay man after delivering him a Marine-trained beating.

It is doubtful Smith was alive. Police photographs depict the personnel manager's head to be almost unrecognizable as that of a human being. Edenfield's death weapon caved in the middle-aged Gay man's skull and pulverized his nose. His face was twisted, off center, and disfigured. His eyes exploded. Blood covered three walls, the proud of for a small town." ceiling, bedding, and the carpet.

Detective Richard Trotter testified he had never seen a body that badly beaten.

Edenfield returned to Camp Pendleton where he told his mess-hall supervisor, Gunnery Sgt. Thomas Fredrickson he was going to get in trouble for beating up a queer." Fredrickson said, "I told him that in the State of California they're pretty strict on beating up queers.

Edenfield told his boss he went to the motel room because Smith was drunk and he "was afraid he (Smith) might get hurt." The handsome corporal admitted assaulting the Gay executive after returning from the bathroom to find the balding homosexual standing naked near a bed, said Fredrickson.

In defending Edenfield his two attorneys claimed "selfdefense" and "justifiable and ex-cusable homicide." Their claims partly succeeded with the jury. Originally jurors found the defendant guilty of second-degree murder, but their foreman, a retired Marine major, emerged

to tell Superior Court Judge Donald Martinson they had reached a verdict, but one or two of the jurors wanted to change their finding. Martinson said a verdict was not final until read in court. The voluntary manslaughter conviction came out of the second balloting of the

Biery has said their verdict would not have been changed if the victim was heterosexual

Edenfield has never expressed regret or sorrow for the murder.

But before jury deliberations began, Biery said, "You are not here to take a vote on how many of you like Marines and how many like homosexuals. If you tell this man it was okay to kill Dave Smith because Dave Smith was a homosexual, you might as well sign a death warrant for all

William Dougherty, Edenfield's Orange County attorney, told the jury, "We know what happened to Sodom and Gomorrah. That wasn't pretty either.'

The defense lawyer further claimed that Edenfield had the right to defend himself from "an attempt to commit a forcible and atrocious crime. The table was the only weapon to keep this man off him."

Martinson disagreed in passing sentence. The judge said the murder was "a very brutal and senseless killing" which indicated "a high degree of cruelty and viciousness." He further found, This matter could have ended easily by simply having the de-fendant withdraw." Martinson could have sentenced Edenfield to six years in prison.

Martinson received a letter from the sheriff in Edenfield's hometown. Sheriff Jim Poindexter wrote, "If there is any way possible, I would like to help this young man . . . If by any chance that it could be worked out, and he (Edenfield) is sentenced to serve jail time, I would take the responsibility of keeping him in my jail to serve his time . . . We have facilities that I'm right

The judge rejected the backwoods sheriff's request. He also rejected probation for the requested by his San Diego attorney, Dan Mogin, Mogin claimed if released on probation his client could seek treatment for alcoholism, a bleeding ulcer, and suicidal tendencies which developed after the murder.

Martinson received 56 letters from friends and family of Edenfield in Georgia. The Atlanta Gay Task Force (AGTF) also sent a letter asking for the maximum sentence and San Diego Gay organizations were present

Citizens of Jesup rallied to the defense of their hometown high school baseball hero. A car was raffled to pay legal fees and bail. Jesup churches passed the offer ing plate for the young Marine and his family. "Blatant homophobic hatred ran rampant in lesup for over a year. If an open Gay man would have gone to that town, he would have been clubbed to death," said a Gay former resident now living in

Freshman Democratic U.S. Rep. Lindsay Thomas wrote Martinson, "Dennis's hometown is Jesup, a small south Georgia community rural and stable in its population and one in which there is no known homosexuality, which is considered abhorrent and offensive . . .

"The entire community has felt a shockwave of anger and concern over the legal troubles of Dennis . . . There is a sense of disappointment at the verdict in this case," said Thomas.

Thomas, a member of the House Armed Services Committee, wrote a constituent, "I have been working with the Marines to see that Dennis and his family are receiving any support that the Marines can offer." It has been charged by a person close to the case that Thomas has "leaned on Marine officials" to assure Edenfield "of preferential treatment." It is "extremely rare" for the Marine Corps to become involved in a civil criminal case said the prosecutor's office, but they helped seek bail reduction for the indicted-recruit.

Biery said after the Marine was released on bail, he was arrested for shoplifting from a PX, drunk driving, and assaulting a superior officer at Camp Pendleton, but the Marine Corps has not brought charges against

A spokesperson for Marine Commandant P.X. Kelley would not discuss or comment on the case. Edenfield's future with the Corps is unknown.

U.S. Reps. Sala Burton (D-CA), Gerry Studds, (D-MA). and several other congresspersons are investigating the possibility Edenfield received special treatment and to encourage the Marine Corps to court-martial the convicted Gay murderer for violations of military justice after release from state prison.

AGTF wrote Martinson. "Edenfield was raised in Jesup, Georgia. A town known for its homophobic and bigoted attitudes. The residents there provided the funds for Edenfield's defense, not because of his standing in the community, but according to a deputy sheriff to tell 'them California fruits it's okay to kill them damn queers.' The people of Jesup might consider it all right to kill Gay people, but that is perverted justice. Do not let San Diego County's justice become morally polluted like red-neck Jesup's. Racism, bigotry and homophobia are bred into Jesup children. A majority of Georgians condemn the act of Dennis Edenfield.

AGTF wrote, "Some persons are raised to believe 'fagbashing' is permitted. It simply is not, and as a judge you must deliver that message. We have the right to expect our violators to be prosecuted to the full extent of the law."

The Atlanta group encourages people to write the Commanding General, Camp Pendleton, CA 92055, to insist the Gay slayer be prosecuted on violations of military justice after being released from state prison and/or give him a dishonorable discharge.

# Atlas S&L Has Big \$ Year

Public protests are not Russ Alley's style. He says, "Demonstrations for the sake of demonstrating are passe." He seriously questions their effectiveness. He believes he is not alone.

Earlier this month he and some friends came up with the idea of a billboard. Alley went to Rich Vikencio, the manager of the posting department at Foster & Kleiser. The company agreed to donate the space for the billboard. The site allocated is on Taylor Street across the street from the West entrance to the ring a distremental legisebance.

Hilton Hotel, the headquarters of the Democratic Party. It is almost impossible to exit the hotel or drive up Taylor Street without seeing the billboard.

Alley acknowledges people's

right to demonstrate but makes a strong point that he also has the right to "put in his two cents worth." Alley says that the country will be misled about the city's Gay community if all they focus upon are "nuns and crazies who want to demonstrate." "They aren't all crazy," he says, "but they don't represent me." He became incensed at the suggestion that those planning the demonstration represented the whole Gay community. He said, "How dare those people say they represent me!'

Alley, 26, believes his generation of Gays will not be the core hipped to death, said a Gar togned, weight ack, hims, hannot of those demonstrating. He de scribed the planned march at the convention as a "generic Gay march." To counter what he believes will be a negative reaction to the demonstrators, he says he wants to offer the television cameras a more positive note. "Demonstrations are not our operating procedure," he says.

He points to growing support since word of the billboard got out, Following a newspaper announcement last week, he said he received over fifty phone calls in a 24-hour period. He has had donations of talent, and he claims he has received substantial support from people who he describes as basically nonpolitical.

While Russ Alley pursues his efforts, the demonstrators are also hard at work. To date they have garnered endorsements from every Gay Democratic political club in San Francisco, the Gay Labor Alliance, Black & White Men Together, and the powerful National Gay Task Force. Friday night they will hold their first fundraiser, a cocktail party at the home of Sutro Baths owner Bill Jones.

Similarly, the impact of bill boards has not been lost on the marchers. They, too, were planning their own visual splash.


Tuesday the media committee of the Convention March put out a call inviting artists "to create a logo and other artwork to be used in publicizing the march on billboards and posters."

# '84 Will Test Gay Clout and Community

In the Movement

by Larry Bush

This is the final segment on what to expect in the Gay movement through the rest of 1984.

he top story of the year may be the emergence of a noticeable Gay Republican effort. Reagan-Bush campaign officials have asked for Gay participation in Washington, D.C., California Republicans such as former Los Angeles Police Chief Ed Davis are making a sincere effort to open discussions with Gay activists and Gay Republicans, the Houston Gay Political Caucus may well stop short of a presidential endorsement this year in deference to its Republican members (who likely will be an active caucus on their own in Texas Republican circles), and individual Gay Republicans in Pennsylvania and New York are becoming bolder about publicly raising Gay issues within the Republican Party.

An extra incentive in one area will be the re-election campaign of Rep. Bill Green (R-NY), the Manhattan Gay rights bill cosponsor who serves on the appropriations committee where he has pushed AIDS funding, and who will face a strong Democratic challenge from a Gay rights supporter. Green plans to be at the Republican National Convention in Dallas raising issues such as the ERA, and Gay Republicans at the convention surely will seek him out as an ally. In 1980, Green's district gave Reagan the lowest vote of any district which elected a Republican to Congress, and it's clear Reagan's feelings won't affect Green's chances - unless Reagan makes some gestures toward Gays which help Green.

Among Gay Democrats, expect the effort to be primarily local, with little sense that there is one national voice for Gay Democrats. While Gay Democrats nominally formed a National Association of Lesbian and Gay Democratic Clubs, only about a dozen of the 100 or so eligible clubs have joined, and its Board of Directors has done little to meet its fundraising commitment. Director Tom Chorlton is credited by Gays in some states, such as North Carolina, with being a prime mover in helping get them organized, and while he is talking with most of the national campaigns, there are too many powerful Gay Democrats who want to keep their own hand in to allow any one person to be Mr. Gay Democrat. Look for a mostly tape-and-paste work here, with an effective national alliance still some distance away. A major ingredient still lacking, for examability to simply document the participation of Gay Democrats at the local level, where successes are often remarkable. In 1982, when the group was just being launched, that was perhaps too much to expect, but by 1984, with a presidential election, it would be valuable to have handy information on each club, its past record at raising money and putting campaign workers out, and the precincts it has identi-

Among national Gay civil rights groups, the National Gay Task Force has regained the drive and innovative approach to problem-solving that put it in the spotlight under the direction of Bruce Voeller, later joined by Jean O'Leary. New director Virginia Apuzzo is now 19 months into the job and has solidified such programs as the Violence Reporting Project, which uses local groups to collect data on

anti-Gay incidents that had previously been merely anecdotal; inaugurated an AIDS hotline and trained federal employees on how to handle calls on their AIDS hotline; re-established contacts with Washington and put in place there Jeff Levi, an effective rep able to deal with the Reagan Administration; and announced a job opening for a media director, the first since the days of Voeller and O'Leary, when Ginny Vida did an outstanding job and Ron Gold provided outstanding analysis of media opportunities. The Task Force in the coming year can be expected to keep a focus on the national political arena, including lobbying such groups as the U.S. Conference of Mayors (which may vote to endorse a Gay rights resolution at its June meeting). The Task Force also is expected to take an active role lobbying congressional committees which provide oversight on the Administration programs where NGTF is lobbying. AIDS is the most important example.

The Gay Rights National

Lobby still has a staff working in Washington, D.C., and a major resource in its field coordinators who are committed to opening doors in Congress through their local representative. The Board. however, is at a virtual standstill in resolving the problems that led to the departure of Steve Endean. Various board committees have backed off any serious examination of how Gay interests are represented in Washington. how Congress works and how Gays should aim their lobbying efforts (is building the number of co-sponsors of a federal Gay rights bill more effective than

building relationships with in dividual committees overseeing programs that might be amended to include Gays now?), or even how the group itself meshes with other Gay organizations. Some GRNL board members have sought to dismiss those issues as simply a code phrase for a merger with the National Gay Task Force, and have leapt to the conclusion that a merger inevitably means a take-over; comparisons with mergers in the newspaper field, for example, where morning and afternoon papers share the same production and advertising staffs, but have different news and editorial staffs, completely fall outside the discussions they have been willing to make public.

Expect that the issues which have been nagging GRNL this past year will continue, resulting in major difficulty finding a suitable replacement for Endean.

#### CONCLUSION

ome wild cards remain that could substantially affect the fortunes of Gays in 1984. Clearly the most compelling concern is AIDS. It remains equally possible for the AIDS issue to turn into a more political and ugly issue than it has been, or for some breakthrough in the disease itself.

The U.S. Supreme Court, which now has taken a Gay loitering case under advisement, could also spring a major surprise. The decision on that case s due by June, and could come even earlier. An outside chance exists that the Court could make a major pronouncement on whether Gays have constitutionally protected privacy rights at all. The U.S. Supreme Court also now has been petitioned to hear arguments on the anti-Gay immigration exclusion. Another major opinion is possible. Lower court rulings on military discharges also are expected this

n 1983 the American Bar Association narrowly defeated a proposal in the House of Delegates to endorse Gay civil rights protections. Supporters have pledged to bring the issue to the floor again this year, sometime in July. Among those backing the proposal publicly is the American Bar Association president, who also happens to be a conservative Republican supporting Reagan.

The major wild cards. however, are what they have been from year to year - the unexpected episodes of discrimination or - perhaps increasingly - an end to discrimination by some cities. Police crackdowns, pitches to hate during campaigns, employers who feel threatened when an employee omes out, Lesbian forced to stop everything in their lives simply to fight to be part of the life of the child they brought into the world. Any of those episodes, predictable in general terms, could erupt onto the national scene under the right cir-

More importantly, the resoluteness of Gay people to continue to work to make life fairer for themselves and the people they love, the drive to connect with each other and form a community of shared concerns and shared goals, also has the potential to erupt into a major story. Much of the decade and more since Stonewall has been the story of individuals whose heroism was in saying simply that human dignity insisted that they stand firm for themselves. Such specific events in 1984 can't be predicted; but they can't be said to be a surprise when they occur,



# The Ascorbate Strategy

#### Part II: Ascorbate Treatment Protocol for AIDS Patients

by Robert F. Cathcart, III

The following protocol is recommended for AIDS and AIDS related conditions including lymphadenopathy, idiopathic thrombocytopenia purpura, and Pneumocystis carinii pneumonia.

s predicted, AIDS patients are usually capable of ingesting large doses of ascorbate. It is desirable that the amount of ascorbate taken orally be maximized. Patients are titrated to A desirable that the amount of ascorbate taken orany be maximized. A balanced ascorbate bowel tolerance (the amount that almost, but not quite, causes diarrhea). A balanced ascorbate mixture is utilized which is made up of a mixture of approximately 25% buffered ascorbate salts (calcium, magnesium, and potassium ascorbate) and 75% ascorbic acid. The mixture is dissolved in a small amount of water and taken at least every hour. The purpose of the frequent doses and this balanced mixture is to maximize the amount of ascorbate tolerated without producing diarrhea. Patients are permitted to vary the percentage of ascorbate salts to straight ascorbic acid according to taste. The usual amount tolerated initially is between 40 and 100 grams per 24 hours. Doses in excess of 100 grams per 24 hours may be necessary with secondary bacterial and viral infections. As the patient's condition improves, bowel tolerance will decrease.

When intravenous ascorbate is found necessary because the toxicity of the condition exceeds the ability of the patient to take adequate amounts of ascorbate to scavenge all of the free radicals created by the primary AIDS infection and the various secondary infections, the following intravenous solutions should be utilized. Sodium ascorbate buffered to a pH 7.4 and without preservatives is added to sterile water in a concentration of 60 grams per 500 cc. This concentration is twice the concentration I have recommended before because it is well tolerated in young males with large veins. Patients with small veins may be best treated with solutions of 60

grams per liter. The time of the infusions should be over at least a 3-hour period, preferably longer. As much as daily administration of 3 bottles, 180 grams per 24 hours, may be necessary in acutely ill patients, e.g. Pneumocystis carinii pneumonia, disseminated herpes, disseminated cytomegalovirus, and atypical pneumonia. Enough ascorbate should be administered to detoxify the patient regardless of the amount needed. Additionally, oral doses of ascorbate should be taken simultaneously with the intravenous ascorbate. Do not let the patients become lazy and discontinue bowel tolerance doses of ascorbate while the intravenous ascorbate is being administered.

treated for them. There is a very high percentage of male homosexuals infected with intestinal parasites. These intestinal parasites are themselves very immunosuppressive. The prognosis for an AIDS patient is greatly enhanced by proper treatment of these parasites. Entamoeba histolytica, especially, and Giardia lamblia must be treated. Intestinal parasites, ordinarily considered non-pathogens, should be treated. If negative, repeated stool examinations for ova and parasites should be taken if there is the slightest clinical sign of intestinal parasite infection. Samples should be fresh, not over /2-hour old. Laxatives may increase chances of discovering the parasites. Additional samples may have to be taken through a sigmoidoscope if other specimens are negative for ova and parasites. With treatment, Herxheimer's reactions should be expected frequently. Symptoms.

#### Candida Albicans

Sugar and processed foods, foods with chemicals, recreational drugs, cigarettes, alcohol, etc. should be avoided. Obvious nutritional deficits should be sought and corrected.

All sharing of body fluids and fecal material should stop. Repeated exposures, not only to possible AIDS infection, but to the secondary infections, especially intestinal parasites and Candida should be avoided.

#### Helper/Suppressor Cell Ratio

With this protocol, it may be anticipated that a large percentage of patients will slowly go into an extended clinical remission. Patients must be on guard to sense any impending infection, colds, etc. The patient should begin the additional large frequent doses of ascorbate within minutes. At the dose levels that have been possible under circumstances imposed, a slow improvement of the total number of T-lymphocytes may occur but helper/suppressor cell ratios may remain suppressed. It appears that ascorbate may assist the immune system, but that in addition, there are mechanisms whereby ascorbate acts against pathogens, especially viruses and bacteria by mechanisms which do not depend on the Tcells. For this reason, I would suggest using the ascorbate por-tion of this protocol on children who have to be permanently iso-lated from the slightest exposure to infections (bubble babies).

#### Ascorbate and the Possible Prevention of AIDS

Morishige has demonstrated the effectiveness of ascorbate in preventing hepatitis B from blood transfusions. A similarity exists between AIDS and hepatitis B. It has been my experience that patients treated with large doses of ascorbate during the

acute phase of hepatitis will not develop chronic hepatitis. My experience with herpes simplex has been the same. Although ascorbate is helpful to a degree with chronic viral infections, it is in the treatment of acute viral diseases that it is most effective.

It is on this basis alone that I recommend that all persons who fear exposure to AIDS and certainly anyone receiving blood transfusions or other blood products which could in the most remote way have been obtained from an AIDS carrier, be put on bowel tolerance doses of ascor-

**Controlled Studies of Other Substances Contaminated** With Ascorbate

s a result of publications in A periodicals concerned about the AID syndrome, a rapidly increasing number of AIDS patients in the San Francisco Bay Area are taking large doses of ascorbate. The same practice is starting in New York and elsewhere. I would suggest that physicians conducting controlled experiments on interferon, and shortly with interleukin 2, be

patients in California and other parts of the world are taking massive doses of ascorbate. Mos of these patients are hiding this fact from their oncologist.

#### Broader Problems

The AID syndrome has not only become a major threat to the special groups ordinarily affected but threatens to spread at least to some extent into other groups. The increasingly large numbers of persons infected by the disease increases the possibility of mutations which could alter the routes of infection. Even without this possibility occurring, the large population of immune suppressed persons comprises a major health hazard because of the large pools of secondary infectious diseases generated. The large, growing pool of intestinal parasites, heretofore present in the western world in only small numbers, is one example of that problem.

#### Possible Elimination of the **AID Syndrome**

If there is not a complete elimination of the basic AIDS process, bowel tolerance doses of ascorbate and the rest of the described protocol will probably have to be maintained for life

My experience and experience of other researchers is that acute self-limiting viral diseases can be reliably cured with massive doses of ascorbate. Viral diseases that have become chronic seem to involve pathologic processes which are not quite as susceptible to ascorbate but which nevertheless are ameliorated, sometimes seemingly cured. It is hoped that funds will be made available for such a project.

Ascorbate does not ameliorate the AID syndrome to a significant degree. The use of ascorbate is increasing in the male homosexual population of the San Francisco Bay Area and spreading across the United States. Its use is contaminating otherwise thought to be controlled studies of other therapeutic measures. Other considerations plus the potential application of ascorbate as part of the treatment of all infectious diseases, makes the clarification of the usefulness of ascorbate to the medical profession essential.







# Hart, Mondale Win in 'Super Tuesday' Vote

Both Colorado's Gary Hart and Walter Mondale claimed victory this week as a result of Tuesday's primaries. Voters in Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island sent a mixed message to political analysts, but Gary Hart clearly remained the man to beat for the Democratic ation as he scored impressive wins in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Florida. Hart was expected to win the New England states, but Mondale had been expected to win Florida until the Hart surge took off three weeks ago. Mondale showed his candidacy is still alive and doing reasonably well with an expected win in Alabama and a close victory in Georgia.

After this week's votes Gary Hart might not be seen as the invincible political wonder that he seemed after upsetting the former vice president in Maine and New Hampshire, but clearly, Hart has become the frontrunner in the race to the San Francisco nomination. As a result of voting in the five major states Tuesday, Hart picked up 154 delegates, Mondale won 137, Jesse Jackson captured 25, and

John Glenn earned 13 delegates. In Florida, the name of former Governor Reuben Askew, no longer in the race, was still on the ballot and he picked up 24 of that state's delegates. However, most of those 24 delegates will likely go to Gary Hart, who won the popular vote there convinc-

As a result of his poor showing in Massachusetts, George McGovern withdrew from the

race down to four remaining candidates. Ohio's John Glenn had hoped to do well in the southern states but finished no better than third in Alabama. and in fact came in fourth in both Georgia and Florida. In Democratic caucuses in other states Tuesday, Gary Hart won Nevada, Washington, and was running even with Mondale in Oklahoma. In Hawaii, the "uncommitted" slate won, sending that state's delegates to the San Francisco convention free to vote as they wish.

In Washington Tuesday night former vice president Walter Mondale called Tuesday's vote the "beginning of a marathon to the nomination and claimed that his two primary victories had slowed the Hart bandwagon, but political analysts across the country were claiming that the Hart movement had truly caught on with voters in the South as well as the New England states and most called Hart

After "Super Tuesday's" vote, Mondale still led in the actual delegate count with 320 committed votes, Hart has 184, Jackson has 39, and Glenn with 29. The number of delegates needed to win the nomination in July is 1,967. Jesse Jackson claimed this week that he had won some kind of "moral victory" and pledged that he would stay in the race "all the way to the end and beyond," a remark many political watchers take to mean he plans to run as an independent in the November election. In fact, most political strategists now expect both Jackson and Glenn to stay in the race until the convention, both hoping to play some kind of powerbroker role in San Francisco with what delegates they might have, since the race now appears to be a dead heat between Mondale and Hart, a fight that could go all the way to the convention.



# National AIDS Study Wants You

UC Scientists Study Healthy Men for Early Symptoms

University of California scientists this month will begin a threeyear study of 1,200 apparently healthy men — both homosexual and heterosexual - in an effort to detect the early stages of AIDS before the symptoms become obvious.

The scientists hope to learn more about the physiological changes that occur in men before they get AIDS, the effect that lifestyle may have on catching the disease, what types of individuals are most susceptible, and perhaps even the cause of the disease

Dr. Warren Winkelstein, a professor of epidemiology at the University of California, Berkeley, and James Wiley, the assistant director of Berkeley's Survey Research Center, will supervise the research team in its three-year, \$3 million study.

Beginning in late March, the team will contact unmarried men living in the Castro and Polk/Pacific Heights districts of San Francisco and ask them to participate in the study. The 1980 census information on households in the Castro and Polk/Pacific Heights areas will be used as a base for randomly selecting participants, since the majority of the 406 San Franciscans diagnosed with AIDS were found to be living in those

The Berkeley scientists expect to contact more than 4,000 households in order to obtain a study group of 1,000 homosexual and 200 heterosexual men who are willing to participate. To be eligible, the men must be 25 to 54 years old, healthy, unmarried, and willing to answer questions about their lifestyles, as well as give blood samples and undergo physical examinations

Of the 1,200 participants, the scientists expect that 30 to 60 men will contract AIDS during the course of the study. Physical examinations will take place at Children's Hospital in San Francisco and men diagnosed with

AIDS will be referred to their private physicians for care.

On the average, two new AIDS cases are diagnosed in San Francisco every day. According to the March 2 records at the San Francisco Bureau of Disease Control, 517 Bay Area men have contracted AIDS since June 1981, and 416 of those lived in San Francisco. Of the 517, 185 known deaths have occurred, 151 of which were in San Fran-

This University of California study will be unique in two ways.

It will be one of the first "prospective" studies conducted on AIDS, meaning that it will study healthy men before they get AIDS instead of delving into the backgrounds of men after they are diagnosed with the disease.

In addition, because of the size and density of San Francisco's Gay community, it will be the only study to date where scientists can select participants from the general public instead of recruiting volunteers to come forth on their own.

Four other prospective studies are currently beginning elsewhere in the United States. Those studies will take place at the University of California, Los Angeles; Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore; the University of Pittsburgh in Pennsylvania; and the Howard Brown Memorial Clinic in affiliation with Northwestern University in

The total cost for these studies amounts to more than \$15 million and is financed by federal grants. All the studies are geared towards finding out what causes AIDS and what AIDS-related conditions arise in men before they are struck with full-fledged

"What we see now is like the tip of an iceberg," said James Wiley, a medical sociologist who has done extensive research on the progression of cancer and heart disease. "We see the cases of Kaposi's sarcoma or Pneumocystis carinii pneumonia, but we don't see people who will get AIDS in the future."

In this study Wiley hopes to see the people below the surface. 'We want to see what the distribution of AIDS-related conditions is in the community," he said. "Things like swollen lymph glands, unexpected weight loss, and persistent coughing. We're asking 'What is the progression towards AIDS?""

At the present, very little is

gresses. Scientists now think AIDS may be caused by a virus, but they have yet to isolate it in man or to guess its identity.

The Berkeley researchers will be looking for clues to the cause of AIDS in the blood taken from the 1,200 participants. In particular, they will be watching for changes in "helper T-cells," special white blood cells which help the body's immune system in killing off diseased or mutant

AIDS patients have normal or greater amounts of antibodies their bodies, but have abnormally few helper T-cells. The Center for Disease Control in Atlanta reports evidence that helper Tcells might be infected with human T-cell leukemia virus, a virus that weakens T-cells and has been associated with the development of cancer.

In addition to looking at helper T-cells and their counterparts, suppressor T-cells, the total white blood cell count, plus hormones, proteins, and other blood factors which complement the body's immune system.

In the end the researchers hope they can develop a test which will detect AIDS in its early stages, thus opening the door to creating preventative measures which can control this deadly epidemic.

At this time there is no specific lab test available to detect AIDS. The CDC in Atlanta only knows that certain people are high risk candidates and that the disease seems to be transmitted via blood or semen.

The scientists hope their prospective studies will shed a lot of light on the mechanisms which cause and control AIDS. It is only unfortunate that many more men will contract the disease before it is controlled.

Police investigators are piecing together evidence they say suggests an anti-Gay pattern of violence and robbery at the approaches to two downtown bars over past months. Police identification on three suspect descriptions is being sought on a Black the ages of 19 and 25.

saults, on February 29, caught two Berkeley men unaware as they walked around the block from where their car was to the Bench & Bar on Eleventh Street. An evening of dinner and Theatre Rhino ended for the two at Providence and Highland Hospitals. Both were treated for stab younds and one of the men underwent emergency surgery for internal bleeding.

According to police investigator Dave Politzer, Cabel's Reef on San Pablo also has been the site listed on numerous robbery reports. Some of these have involved patrons victimizing each other a la the motion picture Cruising. No homicides have been associated with either Gay bar, say police.

On the surface, it seems predictable that bars in this area would be having problems. That is what owners of both bars presuppose. "The only thing," Politzer emphasized, "is that there are other bars that could be hit just as easily. But they are occurring (in one case) right near the Bench & Bar. And we don't

According to Politzer, many assaults have occurred right in the parking lot beside the Bench & Bar. Theft and auto commandeering have been cited. In an isolated case, one victim's auto was reported in the commission of a second burglary and shooting up in Oakland's Montclair

"It could be," Politzer suggested, "that people are looking for what they see as a 'weak' victim." Victims in five of six cases have been Gay. Under scrutiny, Politzer still maintained the assault cases could be Gay related, "unless," he added carefully, "they see it as an easier place to operate. We'd be quick to advise people to be careful if they're going into that area. Don't put yourself into a position where you can be victimized.'

Cautioned Bench & Bar owner John Drab, "If you see something that doesn't look right, or looks like it's not for you, you should avoid it. Just don't walk where you don't know where you're going or what's going on there. When we see a problem, we usually have people go outside and see what's happening.'

Both the Bench & Bar and Cabel's Reef are cooperating with police, who have not closed the file because, Politzer explained, "This latest incident is completely different, but the ones prior to this seem to involve the same people."

In the meantime, bar personnel are checking identification on people they don't recognize, and who may fit the description of the assailant. Police think the suspects may be casing these bars before they act.

Cabel's Reef owner Jack Everhart says police efforts have

# **Strangulation Kills Former**

The body of former Turf Club employee Lewis Alderdyce was found prostrate and partially clad in the blue Chevy van where he lived. We can assume Alderdyce had his pants pulled down. He was brought to Alameda County's Coroner's office with a rope around his neck and a gag and ball in his mouth. Deputy

W. "A" Street in Hayward, not far from the Turf Club. The body was not found until Thursday, February 16.

Coroner Vieira called his death sexual asphyxiation.'

"Essentially, he was attempting to get sexual gratification through masturbation/strangulation and he cut off his airway," Vieira explained.

Alderdyce had not been employed by the Turf Club for about a year and a half before the February 14 death. Alder-dyce had his van parked at 910 death "once or twice" each year. The decreased circulation to the brain caused by tightening the rope around the neck heightens and prolongs the experience of orgasm. When failing, the rope can be tightened so as to cut off all oxygen supply as well.

A full coroner's report on the incident is not expected to be completed for another three weeks. Alderdyce was 34.

# **Dutch Lawmaker Defends Sex Between Adults and Children**

Informed Consent Not the Same as Molestation


Pedophilia — sexual relations between adults and children is acceptable and should be permitted by law, provided the child consents to such a relationship Edward Brongersma, a lawyer from the Netherlands, told predominantly male audience of 50 people at Stanford University

The meeting was sponsored by the Gay and Lesbian Alliance at Stanford and the Stanford Gay and Lesbian Law Students' Association.

Brongersma, who had served as a member of the Dutch National Parliament for 22 years and who once had been imprisoned for ten months because of a relationship he had with a boy of 16, said that the love relation ship between an adult and a child can bring happiness to both individuals, provided there is no violence or abuse of authority and the child is not made to feel uneasy or unhappy.

Brongersma defined pedophilia as primarily sexual relations between a man and a boy, which "has always had special importance," but said the term also includes homosexual and heterosexual relations between any adult and child. Incest is included in his definition, but he said that is a "special category, and subject more to fear of authority than other forms of

Support for the concept is increasing in the Netherlands, he said, citing legislation in 1971 which lowered the age of consent from 21 to 16 and reduced sentences for those convicted of the

"Seventy percent of the cases are not prosecuted anymore," he said, suggesting the police should not "waste their time" on consensual sex, but rather concentrate on child molestation.

"Tenderness, affection and love (toward a child) is not indecent anymore," he said.

Public opinion often has an mage of pedophilia beyond reality, Brongersma said. "Three- or four-year-old girls being raped by their fathers is not what I am talking about."

But he acknowledged that a sexual relationship between a

30-year-old man and a sevenyear-old boy can be fine. "If we see sex and lust as a good thing, I don't see why we should separate it as a category apart from other things."

He said many boys when they grow up are happy about the early sexual experiences they once had, but admitted that 'most girls are negative about incest when they grow up.'

One psychia ist in the audience said he sees children who are loved and then dumped. "I work with a lot of kids who are really screwed up because of the

Brongersma responded that rejection can hurt anyone very

When asked how he defined informed consent, and whether seven-year-olds really have the ability to consent, Brongersma said people make decisions all the time without having full information about the consequences. "In marriage we don't know all the consequences that will occur. Why should we dedon't demand anyplace else?

"If a child wants to be touched in a certain way, if the child wants it, then it is fine, but the child must have the liberty to stop it at any point. But you

Brongersma said he had been asked by one judge in the Netherlands whether such an experience could traumatize a child; the judge had had a report from psychiatrists that said a child could be severely traumatized.

"I told the judge that if you were to call a hospital and ask whether having the flu is dangerous, the hospital would tell you that they have had several people die from the flu.

When questioned whether an adult could place demands on a child that are too difficult to cope with, Brongersma said he thought it was quite possible.

## Pulp as History

Ann Bannon's 50's Potboilers Finding A New Generation

Odd Girl Out; I Am a Woman; Women in the Shadows; Journey to a Woman; Beebo Brinker

ver read a Harlequin Ro-mance? Not many people like to admit to it, but thousands upon thousands of Harlequin type books are bought, and presumably read, every year. But does this pulp have any intrinsic value, other than the slight titillation it provides the

> There just aren't that many chronicles of Lesbians in the Village or elsewhere for us to thumb our noses at this type of The books read as if they are

Well, I don't know about

Harlequins, having never suc-cumbed to whatever it is that



The series follows a woman named Laura from her first Lesbian relationship in college through her coming out in the Village to her marriage to a fellow homosexual and the bearing and raising of his child by insemination. The fourth book tells the story of what happened to Laura's first love and her journey to New York to find Laura and take up where they left off all those years ago. The last book is a sort of prequel, going back before Laura appeared on the Village scene to tell the story of Jack, Laura's future husband, and Beebo, one of her future lovers.


True to the time in which the books were written, the love scenes are antiseptic - no one ever has genitals and rarely even have breasts. The characters also almost all fit into either a butch or fem stereotype. Beebo,



for example, could be a candidate for a sex change operation Laura remains a sort of shy and retiring damsel in distress throughout the series, although she does grow up enough to be able to speak her mind when confronted by Beth, her college romance. Bannon takes great care to illustrate the gentlemanlady relationship between Laura and Beth in the first book of the series, Odd Girl Out.

Also, Bannon tends to play cat and mouse with her reader for the first few pages of each book, as she slowly lets go of the fact that this is a book about a homosexual romance, not the usual kind. In the front of each book is a disclaimer that reads in part, "The books as they stand have 50's flaws. They are, in effect, the offspring of their

special era, with its biases." You see, when these books were first published in the 50's, it was under the guise of any other potboiler or pulp book — some-thing that has been synonymous



with the name Harlequin in the

last decade. Bannon had both

In other words, Bannon does not paint a very pretty picture of Gay life in the Village. Almost every character drinks to excess, although drugs are never mentioned, and suicide attempts and self-mutilation are an overhanging spectre. depict all men as rapists or sadists. Bannons' male characters are by no means saints, but Jack is a true-blue friend, and other male characters are depicted as individuals, not stereotypes. The series ends abruptly, with

Beth and Beebo staring rapturously into each other's eyes, and for good reason. The last book in the six-part series inexplicably was not re-published by Naid. But Naid's re-release of the first five books was a worthwhile venture. Whether you want to discover some of your more recent antecedents or want to indalge in nostalgia about the badold-days before Stonewall, these books are well worth reading. I only wish Bannon, purportedly alive and well and teaching English at a college in California, would write more pulp.

## Torchia's Torture As If After Sex

As If After Sex by Joseph Torchia Holt, Rinehart & Winston; \$13.95, hardcover

eading Joseph Torchia's As If After Sex is like having a long nightmare or a bad acid trip: you are trapped in a falling elevator with a brilliant lunatic who tries to unravel the riddle of Gay existence as you both plummet through space. How else can one describe the dark psychodrama this novel explores or the claustrophobic intimacy it seeks to establish with the reader? How else define the urgent speculations and tortuous verbal acrobatics which it per forms?

The story is told through one inescapable voice, that of the narrator-protagonist Robert. Even when other characters speak, their words and concerns seem to be his. As a writer telling his own story he epitomizes the artist as exemplary sufferer. His burden is to convince the reader that for two years he succumbed to "an acceptable mad ness — at least for San Francisco" - an overwhelming and unrequited passion for a beautiful hustler named Julian. Robert exults in that passion because for one fleeting moment it seemed to provide an escape from the prison of his own selfhood.

Yet his passion is a paradox. Physical possession of his muscular trophy seems to take him out of himself, but after sex (or without Julian) Robert's sense of isolation becomes a more pain-

ful feeling of abandonment. In this way sex revives the trauma of birth. After sex, what was briefly and passionately one, be-comes two. Sex between two men involves the further possibility that selfhood is never transcended. When man embraces man is it only the self embracing itself?

Variations on this conundrum are strewn hecticly throughout As If After Sex. And Torchia churns out images to match them. Mirrors and metaphors abound. The subjunctive "as if" echoes with maddening frequency through the book to underscore a concern for possibilities rather than safe conclusions. The tone is obsessive and sometimes tinged with hysteria as Robert struggles to distinguish Self from Other, truth from illusion, and reality from fantasy.

But as in a dream, nothing is ever certain about what actually happens in this book. The real action is the drama of a consciousness seeking to escape its own solipsistic predicament. Only Robert's painful effort to thing that is not himself is made persistently vivid.

When the narrative does focus on external reality at much length it becomes unconvincing. even banal. Robert and Julian take a Mexican holiday together during which they befriend two

women whose presence lends a suspect cheeriness to the story. As the foursome cavorts on the beach in a nonsexual way, the men begin to enjoy a new sense of freedom. They like passing for straight until one night at a disco they forget themselves and start dancing together. The social embarrassment which ensues is somehow supposed to be on a level with the inner psychlogical drama already presented. It does not work.

If you have a taste for solving intellectual puzzles about sex while listening to a voice that becomes as desperate and pite-ous as a wailing child, you should love this book. Reading it three times in as many weeks nearly drove me crazy. \* \* \*



he third and best Cinderella ballet to be seen in the Bay Area this season is the San Francisco Ballet's version, with choreography by Michael Smuin and Lew Christensen. More lavish than the Oakland Ballet's The Crystal Slipper (choreography by Carlos Carva-jal) and more unified and entertaining than the Baryshnikov-Anastos Cinderella performed two weeks ago by American Ballet Theatre, the San Francisco Ballet's full-length ballet satisfies both dramatically and choreographically. As Cinderella wanders

through her smoke-clouded kitchen, the other members of her family are present but frozen in time, gradually coming to life as she moves among them. The fantasy element and Cinderella's relative isolation in her home thus established, the plot unfolds according to tradition. In typical San Francisco Ballet style, every occasion of magic gives rise to production gim-micks. At one point during Act I there was actually so much smoke billowing from the stage that the front fifteen rows of the audience could be seen furiously fanning their programs trying to clear the air. A mechanical mouse — Cinderella's pet, we come to see - has a major entrance from stage right which momentarily stops the show; the hag's transformation into the Fairy Godmother occurs in an explosion of fireworks; a curtain of steam lends added illusion to the disappearance of the kitchen and the entrances of the seasonal fairies who outfit Cinderella for

divertissements. There are solos for each of the four seasonal fairies and the Fairy Godmother, followed by lovely corps dances for sixteen girls and twelve children from the San Francisco Ballet school. The ball scene contrives to expand the male dancing in the ballet by assigning solos to a court jester (Julian Montaner) and two companions to the Prince (Ricardo Bustamante and Andre Reyes). Along

## **Americans Buffaloed**

y companion at the muchanticipated opening of Al Pacino in American Buffalo was so much more than the Perfect Accoutrement. Soothing to the eye as well as good company; he also summed up the evening by stating, "Somewhere under all that glitz there's a

He was right, for David Mamet's slice-of-life play is a short, nearly slight character sketch which the intimacy and focus of TV would serve well. Director Arvin Brown and star Pacino, on the other hand, have twisted the play to their purposes, producing a product which resembles not the nearly extinct, lumbering, confused buffalo, but the musical comedy,

Broadway hoopla of Cats: this Buffalo is all production number.

The slim plot concerns three small-time operators who func-tion amidst the refuse of a Chicago pawnshop. It's down a flight from the sidewalk, and that's the easiest sign of their impending extinction. Like all Americans, the men want to get ahead. But lack of smarts stvmies them, and they get nowhere as frustration builds to overflow.

Mamet has told the story in language which is persuasively real, nearly poetic. The present company buries the words perhaps the play's sole reason for celebrity, since its tale is oft-told and its characters cliche beneath an avalanche of mannerism, method and methedrine. Rhythms and beauty of speech

are bulldozed; intimacy of relationship is relied on a Hello, Dolly level and the climax is hung upon physical hysterics instead of plot and revelation. Pacino is the worst offender, offering his young hood on speed performance to a script far more subtle and well-wrought. If you're dying to see him live, don't worry about balcony seats this blow-up characterization could be seen from the Geary next door.

I spent an hour after the show peeling away the layers of performance, mannerism and overdirection, like leaves from an artichoke, before arriving at a heart I decided was a good play. Wish I'd seen the intimate Berkeley Rep production — I might have agreed with critics and award-givers who have lavished praise on the play. Pacino and company lavish personality





# Strangers Kiss

Stranger 'n' Friction

Strangers Kiss was obviousmade by film buffs for film ouffs; there are not enough commercial ingredients to attract any other kind of audience.

A backhanded tribute to Staney Kubrick, it recalls his second and perhaps worst feature, Killer's Kiss, made in 1955. In Strangers Kiss an obsessive young director (Peter Coyote) and his sycophantic producer (Dan Shor) are — also in 1955 - making a film not unlike Kubrick's.

Leading lady Victoria Tennant (a young actress to watch) wonders whether the director and producer live together. Her co-star, Blaine Novak, replies that the director doesn't live at all, except in relation to his films.

Tennant lives with shady, violent Richard Romanus, who is bankrolling the movie. "Our director is so manipulative," she says, not knowing the half of it: Their director is engineering a love affair between his inexperienced stars because it's the only way to get them to show emotion. It's all fairly predictable except for the final twists after Romanus finds out what's

Director Matthew Chapman, who co-scripted with Novak,

comes up with some novel angles, camera- and otherwise, to lend flashes of interest to a number of scenes. The interviews with shirtless actors at the beginning have that Chorus Line, happy/sad, showbiz quality; and the filming of the first kiss of the lovers-to-be is realistically filled with tensionbreaking laughter.

With a pseudo-experimental quality that could have yielded another disaster like Union City, Strangers Kiss instead seems destined for a permanent second place on everybody's "films I want to see" list.

There's not much you can call Blaine Novak that he won't call himself first. "I'm a sick, powerhungry idiot," he admits between stories of Hollywood wheeling and dealing. It's obvious that, unlike most creative

Novak played a role.

April 6 is a big day for Novak. That's when Strangers Kiss opens in New York and London. Stanley Kubrick ("We love Stanley and wanted to do an omaggio") will be at the first show in London, Novak says. "We hope he'll try something. It'll be great publicity. He's probably sitting at his computer now trying to figure out what he can do.

On the same day Novak opens across America in another movie, Up the Creek, which he calls "the most embarrassing thing I've ever done in my life. Co-starring with Tim Matheson in this comedy about white water rafting, Novak plays a 23-year-old West Point cadet. "I kept telling them there's not enough makeup in the world to make me

"It's the most sexist film . . . The only use of women is throwing them out of trailers without

"That's all off the record but go ahead and print it. I'm in deep shit as it is."

He's in deep shit with Orion Pictures, distributors of Up the Creek, because he's been critical of the way their Classics division has handled Strangers Kiss.







## Hard to Swallow

The last article, which included the first perfect attendance listing for our league, drew a lot of flack from a few bowlers who felt they had been slighted by not having their names appear on the list. In an attempt to soothe their bruised egos, the following is the criterion that was used to determine whose name would be included in the premier PA list.

As you know, some teams have six members. Therefore, if two members of one of these sixmember teams are absent on the same night, this leaves four bowlers present, and the rules state that there must be five. This circumstance necessitates that the Team Captain select the name and average (-10) of one of the two absent bowlers with which to fill in the vacant position (bringing the team strength to five as is required). The bowler whose name and average (-10) is used that night is recorded on the bowling establishment records and the league records as absent, while the attendance record of the absent bowler whose name was not utilized that evening remains unaffected. (This forms a good case for alternating the absentee names whenever reasonable in order to be as fair as possible with regard to the attendance records. Of

course, consideration must be given to the average that offers the team the best chance of winning, but that, once again, is the Team Captain's decision.)

If you find this possibility uncomfortable, there are two ways to get around it: one is to not miss an evening of bowling; the other is to request your Team average if you and another team member are absent on the same evening. Either solution portends its own distinct problem; but, to my knowledge, they provide the only alternatives to having the word "absent" written on your record.

Only 12 bowlers actually were present all 20 evenings and bowled all 60 games. However, a total of 53, as stated in the cited article, did bowl every evening on which they were scheduled. Both of these accomplishments are equally impressive and justly deserve the immense pride their achievers must feel. On the other hand, if some bowlers reap sour grapes from the contents of their attendance records, I suggest they attempt to consume this bitter harvest with the same pride that 53 of their fellow bowlers exhibited this past Winter Season in regard to attendance.

# Fitness in the Eighties: Chuck Norman

Keeping Fit, Keeping Busy, Keeping On the Move

his week's Fitness 80's person is Chuck Norman, a supervisor at San Francisco Adult Probation Department.

Norman keeps himself in shape by working out on Mon-days, Wednesdays and Fridays at the International Center, 50 Oak Street, near Van Ness and Market. In addition, he walks the distance between the gym and his Noe Valley apartment. Add to that a strict low-cholesterol diet and avoiding alcohol (except for a glass of wine with dinner), drugs and cigarettes. Norman loves to travel and maintains a mellow attitude. It's understandable he's in good shape. Chuck was born in Corinth

Mississippi, on July 22, 1943. After high school he moved to Carbondale, Illinois, to attend college. Then he returned to Corinth to teach high school English, "mainly to please my parents." It did not please Chuck, however, and he moved to St. Louis to give that city a try. He was there for two months without finding some sort of fulfillment, and in July of 1967 he entered the Peace Corps. He was sent to the Claremont Coleges near San Bernardino, California, and then trained for a month in Mexico to become a 'community organizer." This, too, was not to Chuck's liking; prior to being transported to Columbia, he went to Chicago, registered, and was drafted.

Chuck was trained to become medic and expected to find nimself before long in Vietnam; out as fate, and the Army, would have it, he was stationed in San Francisco. His job description, psychiatric social worker." The wo years he spent here were the 'time of protest," and as Chuck says, "Here I was in the Army and marching in peace demonstrations." n 1975, while traveling in

Western Europe, Chuck discovered that after two months of carrying around a twenty-two pound shoulder bag his weight had fallen from 180 to 150 pounds. He was also working out. He decided to participate in a study conducted by the National Health Institute, a comprehensive study of "healthy people." It was discovered that he had a higher than average cholesterol level - 250, when the average is 190. He was placed on a low cholesterol diet and adheres to it to this day. Notably, it's no red meat, or greasy foods, and instead baked chicken and fish, sandwich lunches (often tuna) non-fat or low-fat milk, etc. Two years after he began the diet, his cholesterol level was down to 135.

The International Center, he says, is an old gymnasium, once a school gym, but Chuck enjoys it and continues there in deference to newer, trendier spas. "I've been going for so long, I've grown to know and like the people. It's a good cross-section. There's a pool, but for some reason. I don't use it." He pointed out that Gay people are very

Beside weight training and walking, Chuck's only other form of exercise is a night of dancing, possibly once every other month at the I-Beam.

# Arrest in June Murder of Gay Man

New PD Print Computer Fingers Suspect



The SFPD made an arrest this week of a murder suspect in the death of a 28-year-old Gay man on June 13, 1983.

In the hours after midnight that Monday, James West, a cashier for Yellow Cab, was repeatedly stabbed in his Bush Street studio apartment. At the time, the police inspector described the scene as "a gory death." It was a brutal murder and police were reluctant to disclose any details save that West had been stabbed and slashed in the chest and throat.

This week SFPD revealed that the murderer left a bloody fingerprint. It was fed into the department's new fingerprint computer. The computer connected the print to Steven Lamerson, 20, an apprentice sheetmetal worker. Monday police picked up Lamerson outside his apartment at 1728 Hyde

That Sunday afternoon, June 12, West had gone for a few drinks at the Endup. Later that evening he and friends went to a Ioni Mitchell concert at the Concord Pavilion.

When he returned home he told his friend Jim Williamson that he was horny and wanted to go out "prowling." Williamson had known West for six years.

West lived in a studio apartment near Bush and Hyde Streets. Working the graveyard shift at Yellow Cab gave him many cab driver friends. In his free time he liked to paint and had developed a large number of straight, as well as Gay friends.

He was also attracted to Gay Latino men. Esta Noche, the popular Gay Latino bar, was one of his favorite spots. He also spent time at other Latino bars in the Mission and enjoyed such places as Buzzby's on Polk

At the time PD Inspector Jim Crowley reported that they knew West had a motorcycle which he parked down the street from his apartment. Witnesses reported he was seen leaving his apartment a few minutes after mid

midnight and 4 a.m.

custody without any trouble, refused to speak with investigators. He is being held for investigation or murder in lieu of \$250,000 bail. He was arraigned on Tuesday morning.

Lamerson has denied being Gay and more than likely will call upon the Public Defender's office to defend him. In turn, that office will no doubt employ the "homosexual panic" defense which says the killer didn't know what he was doing, once thrown into a panic over the advances of a pervert.

The S.F. Chronicle reported that the SFPD videotaped the murder scene, the first time such evidence was recorded in that fashion. This way the prosecution could show the jury a video-tape providing them with a vivid picture of the crime. Police said the apartment was drenched in

# Gay Pickets Pocket Major Media at GOP Convention

Governor Avoids Persistent Press Questions Local Activists Present Gay Rights Plank Demands to State Party

Thirty Lesbians and Gay men picketed the state Republican convention in San Mateo County Saturday as a reaction to the governor's veto last week of the Gay job rights bill, AB-1. The protesters captured the statewide media with almost every television station and newspaper cover-

The protest was to remind Governor George Deukmejian "that we are not going away" according to its organizer, Gerry Parker, a local Gay activist. Parker said the governor will now face similar demonstrations as part of a new "Operation Duke Watch." Inside the convention a somewhat leery Concerned Republicans for Individual Rights activist, Duke Armstrong, presented a possible Gay Rights plank to the convention.

The noisy demonstrators shouted "Duke has got to go" and "Gay Rights Now" and carried placards as they marched in a circle at the Marriott Hotel entrance in Santa Clara. The placards ad a variety of messages: "God Loves ALL People," "Curb Your Dogma," "End Bigotry" and a disturbing "Puke on Duke." The two-hour effort was frequently interrupted by enthusiastic, interviewing reporters looking for a break in the relatively quiet proceedings inside.
