EDITORIAL

Love Is a Private Affair

IN AN APPEAL IN THE CASE OF A LOS ANGELES WOMAN JAILED UNDER THE CITY'S "RESORTING" LAW BECAUSE SHE HAD GONE FROM "HER LIVING ROOM TO BEDROOM WITH A MAN NOT HER HUSBAND", THE STATE SUPREME COURT RULED THAT THE LEGISLATURE, WHICH HAS SET SANCTIONS AGAINST SUCH SEXUAL OFFENSES AS PROSTITUTION, DELIBERATELY AVOIDED SETTING PENALTIES FOR SIMPLE FORNICATION.

THE COURT SAID: "NEITHER SIMPLE FORNICATION NOR ADULTERY ALONE NOR LIVING IN A STATE OF COHABITATION HAS BEEN MADE A CRIME IN THIS STATE."

OF COURSE THE QUESTION IS FAR FROM CLOSED. THE LOS ANGELES LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ARE AGITATING FOR THE 1962 LEGISLATURE TO TIGHTEN THE SEX LAWS OF THE STATE AGAINST THESE "OUTRAGES UPON PUBLIC DECENCY AND MORALS."

IT WOULD SEEM TO US THAT, RATHER THAN TIGHTEN THE SEX LAWS, THE CALIFORNIA LEGISLATORS MIGHT BETTER SPEND THEIR TIME IN RE-EVAL-UATING THE SEX LAWS NOW ON THE BOOKS IN LIGHT OF MODERN PSYCHOLOGY AND SOCIOLOGICAL STUDIES; SUCH AS THE KINSEY REPORTS, THE SEXUAL DEVIATION RESEARCH STUDIES CONDUCTED IN SAN FRANCISCO BY THE LANGLEY PORTER CLINIC UNDER THE DIRECTION OF DR. KARL BOWMAN, THE WOLFENDEN REPORT FROM ENGLAND, THE MODEL PENAL CODE AS DRAWN UP BY THE AMERICAN LAW INSTITUTE - AND MORE RECENTLY THE COMPLETELY REVISED PENAL CODE WHICH WENT INTO EFFECT IN ILLINOIS THE FIRST OF THIS YEAR.

ACCORDING TO THE CHICAGO SUN-TIMES OF DECEMBER 21, ILLINOIS IS THE FIRST STATE TO REVISE LAWS WHEREBY SEXUAL ACTS BETWEEN CONSENTING ADULTS IN PRIVATE ARE NO LONGER CONSIDERED A CRIME. SEX OFFENSES WHICH DO APPEAR IN THE NEW CODE, HOWEVER, INCLUDE: ANY PERSON 17 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER WHO SOLICITS A CHILD UNDER 13 TO PERFORM A SEXUALLY INDECENT ACT CAN BE ARRESTED AND RECEIVE A MAXIMUM PENALTY OF \$500 FINE OR 6 MONTHS IMPRISONMENT OR BOTH; AGGRAVATED BATTERY INCLUDING "PHYSICAL CONTACT OF AN INSULTING NATURE"; AND "RECKLESS CONDUCT" WHICH CAUSES BODILY HARM OR ENDANGERS THE SAFETY OF OTHERS.

IT IS TIME THAT THOSE CALIFORNIANS WHO ENACT THE LAWS AND THOSE WHO ENFORCE THEM LEARN THAT SEXUAL BEHAVIOR CANNOT BE REGULATED BY LAW, AND THAT THERE IS A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WHAT IS DISAPPROVED AND WHAT SHOULD BE REGULATED BY LAW. THE FORMER SHOULD BE TAKEN CARE OF OR DEALT WITH THROUGH EDUCATION, FAMILY TRAINING AND SOCIAL INFLUENCES (INCLUDING RELIGIOUS GUIDANCE).

WE BELIEVE THAT PRACTICAL SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM IS TO JUDGE SEX ACTIVITY ON THE GROUNDS OF WHETHER OR NOT SOCIETY IS HARMED. SEXUAL ACTIVITY BETWEEN CONSENTING ADULTS IN PRIVATE IS NOT HARMFUL TO SOCIETY. HOWEVER, AS DEMONSTRATED IN THE NEW ILLINOIS LAWS, THERE MUST NECESSARILY BE PROTECTION GIVEN THE PUBLIC AGAINST OFFENDERS WHERE ASSAULT, FORCE OR VIOLENCE IS INVOLVED; IN THE CASES WHERE CHILDREN ARE MOLESTED; AND AGAINST INDECENT PUBLIC BEHAVIOR.

BEYOND THESE BOUNDS, LOVE IS A PRIVATE AFFAIR. AND NO AMOUNT OF POLITICAL PRESSURE OR HOLY HYSTERIA WILL ALTER THE SEX HABITS OF THE AMERICAN POPULACE.

Lesbian Literature - 1981

If one hundred years from now someone attempts to write a history of the Lesbian in literature - she will have a monumental task.

In 1954, Dr. Jeannette Howard Foster completed the manuscript of her book, Sex Variant Women in Literature, which subsequently was published by Vantage Press in late 1956. At that time (1954) Dr. Foster had amassed data on 300 works in the strictly fiction fields (novels, poetry, drama) and perhaps 200 supplementary items (bioggaphy, essay). Whithin two years after that book's appearance, Marion Zimmer Bradley and myself had located over 200 items which pre-dated Foster, and publishers were eagerly filling the newsstands and bookstores with current items. Each year subsequently has unearthed a few more older titles and each year has brought a new high in current titles. In round numbers today there exists in the English language fiction, poetry and drama approximately 800 titles on Lesbianism - with the addition of supplementary biographical works this figure becomes nearer 1200 titles, and when one adds the untranslated foreign titles nearly 1500 works concerning Lesbianism (at least in part) exist. All of this excludes the hundreds of technical works on the subject.

Certain largely defined trends are currently obvious many novelists toss in a Lesbian character or two as
spice in a mediocre novel - just as thirty years ago
they added a prostitute to show how worldly they were.
Certain serious novelists sincerely add as a propaganda
motif a Lesbian under duress and use this as a symbol
to point up injustice or unfair censorship. Still others
manage to include intentionally and yet subtlely a Lesbian relationship in a novel not directly dealing with
Lesbianism - in a manner which clearly shows our "group"
relationship to other people.

The year 1961 has added over 80 titles to the ever increasing total. As I predicted last year, this new year has brought an extremely high quantity of quality hard-

back fiction. Many of these are worthy of special attention. Susan Sherman's adolescent tale of the fascination of youth for a worldly older woman, Give Me Myself, ranks high among Lesbian first novels. The witty American, Peter DeVries, gave us Through the Fields of Clover and his superior British mentor, Noel Coward, included quite major Lesbianism in Pomp and Circumstance. Merle Miller's, A Gay and Melancholy Sound; Harold Robbin's, The Carpetbaggers; Edward Hyan's, Tillotson; Elizabeth Mayor's, The Temple of Flora; and Tereska Torres', The Only Reason, all deserve mention. But beyond all these there were two Lesbian novels that deserve a special accolade - the first, The Tree and the Vine by Dola De-Jong, an excellent wholly Lesbian novel and the second, and by far the best novel on Lesbianism to appear in over ten years, May Sarton's haunting, The Small Room. This last novel is all the more remarkable because it is in no sense a "problem novel".

The special book of the year for most LADDER readers is Lady Una Troubridge's, The Life and Death of Radclyffe Hall, London, Hammond, 1961.

The quality in paperbacks was poor - even worse than last year, although the quantity was overwhelming. Among the paperback originals such novels as Twilight Girl by Della Martin, Guerrilla Girls by Harry Whittington, The Unfortunate Flesh by Randy Salem, The Evil That Men Do by Ben Simcoe, The Savage Salome by Carter Brown, Bucks County Report by Stuart James, The Twisted Ones by Andrew Shaw, The Jealous and the Free by March Hastings, These Curious Pleasures by Sloane M. Britain, Gay Interlude by Carol Clanton, The Love Survey by Morton Cooper all provide interesting sympathetic studies. The two outstanding paperbacks of the year were from the same pen, Paula Christian's Another Kind of Love and Love Is Where You Find It.

As is true each year, the quality is varied - ranging from illiterate filth to lyric poetry. An unusual note is a number of novels with basically unsympathetic treatments so well done as to merit attention for their literary worth alone.

This points up an unwelcome (to some) fact that the

best literature is seldom written about the most mundane people. Nonentities, however happy they may be, are not as a general rule interesting as fiction.

Here and There

The problem of homosexuality in women is increasing, Dr. Charles Socarides, a New York analyst, said at a meeting of the American Psychoanalytic Association.

The New York Times reports that acknowledgement of the extent of the problem was indicated by the fact that the Association held its first symposium on overt female homosexuality before its annual session ended.

Part of the rise in female homosexuality may be accounted for, Dr. Socarides said, in the increase of the problem among men. Although figures are scanty in the field, he said that the fact that male homosexuality had risen some 600% in England since World War II indicated the possibility of some compensating drive in women. Also, he observed, such aberration is often a consequence of a disordered and confused society.

The problem of child-rearing plays a distinct role in female homosexuality, according to Dr. Judith S. Kestenberg of Sands Point, L.I. The homosexual woman "wastes nothing except, of course, her motherliness," she said. In the homosexual relationship, women "play out the mother-child relationship," she said.

There is no better description of these women, she said, than that of the poet Sappho, whom she quoted as saying "I shall remain eternally maiden." All homosexual women, Dr. Kestenberg said, "are young virginal girls at heart." They play, she said, with "life dolls."

She, too, commented on the role that society played in the kind of permissive attitude toward this form of sexual deviation. "We adults," she said, "look upon them with indulgence, pity and amused smilings."

VARIETY reports that MGM has purchased the screen and video rights to novelist Claire Morgan's book The Price of Salt. The book has sold over 500,000 copies since it was published in 1952.

From the Dec. 9, 1961 issue of Justice Weekly, Canadian tabloid:

"The British film 'Victim', which deals candidly with the problem of homosexuality, has been refused the Production Code Administration's seal of approval for showing in American cinemas. It was found "thematically objectionable".

"Mr. Budd Rogers, head of the Pathe-American Distributing Company, said he would appeal against the decision and release the film in February regardless of the outcome. Many films have been shown successfully at American Cinemas without the seal, part of the industry's self-censoring machinery."

Three men of 38 arrested in a roundup of alleged homosexuals were convicted early in January in Tallahassee, Florida, according to Associated Press reports. Fourteen others pleaded guilty; several received mandatory jail sentences in addition to fines.

Three of the men were connected with Florids State University. Lucian C. Reed, social welfare instructor, was freed by a directed verdict of acquittal. John Jacob Heise, research assistant, pleaded no contest and was adjudged guilty. And 73-year-old Volney H. Wells,

To My Valentine

It was not easy to comprehend something I was not a part of. To think that a love other than that between a man and a woman could be beautiful, pure and right was at one time a disgusting thought for me. And now - as I reminisce and remember the great compassion and warmth which radiated between these two women - I, a normal person, admit that this type of Lesbian love can be, for those involved, an extremely rewarding and fulfilling experience. This romance is so vivid and colorful that it appears to be from a storybook. Yet - it is true.

I had no idea that Robbie was gay. She was an individual apart from our regular crowd. She appeared to be a complete extrovert, and my fellow teen-agers called her an oddball or beatnick. She would do things impulsively and become entangled in unbelievable situations. She believed in the saying "Live and let live", was open, blunt and accepted anyone who accepted her as she was. Yet, few could understand her - and no one could become close.

I tried for a year and a half to make friends with her, but she seemed to avoid female company. Both males and females were drawn in by a magnetizing fascination which surrounded her. She dated constantly...but rarely with the same boy. I admired what seemed to be her never-ending strength and determination. She was self-centered and said so herself. But she also claimed everyone else was too and that she was just honest enough to say it. Her clothes consisted of well-fitted pants and button-down shirts which accentuated her feminine figure. After about a year and a half I penetrated her great barrier, which later I was to find out was mistrust of other people.

As I came to know the real Robbie, I was shocked by the seriousness of her nature, her well hidden introverted attitude, and her amazing awareness of what surrounded her. Approximately two years after I first met her (six months after we had become good friends) she sat down and calmly told me she was a Lesbian.

Nothing she said could have upset me, but I had slept with this girl (she hadn't made a pass - ever) and so I didn't believe her. She gave me a few books on the subject and told me to read them. From that day on, our relationship was much stronger than it had ever been. I accepted her totally and never questioned her about her activities. However, she told me everything - her dreams, her desires, and what she had been through because of her love for a straight girl who had known she was gay. I was close to her when she started to break into the gay life and away from normal people, when she slept with her first woman, when she decided she was definitely butch, when all the million and one things that happen to a young girl occurred in her life.

On the other hand, she took the greatest interest in my personal life - my boyfriends, my marriage and now my child. I will always appreciate her attitude and respect for the normal way of life. From her example, I do not think that most Lesbians are looking for new recruits, but will do everything possible to help people to live the life they are happiest in.

We graduated from high school together. I decided to go into newspaper work, and Robbie decided that she wanted to be a novelist. Fearful of being discovered and disgracing her parents because of a small town's attitude toward homosexuals, she left her luxurious home after high school. This is where the story of her love really begins.

The letters and poems that follow were from a side of Robbie I had never seen - an openly tender side, and yet a very cynical side. She said to me that "the difference between childhood and adulthood is the split second in which you realize you are in love."

Robbie left for a big city with \$300 in her pocket and a phone number. The phone number belonged to Sandy. Robbie met her on the first day she arrived. She fell in love when she opened the door and found a striking, well dressed woman, ten years her senior, who smiled and said, "Hello. I'm Sandy."

This handsome creature who stood before Robbie was wearing tailored slacks, a tailored shirt, and her black hair

was short. "She's butch," Robbie thought. "Butch."

During the months that followed Robbie and Sandy became good friends - more so than lovers. Sandy was living with another woman, and so Robbie took an apartment by herself and got a job in the commercial writing field. They made a beautiful couple - Robbie, for the first time in her life, playing the feminine counterpart. Slowly but surely, Sandy began to mold this strong child's inquisitive mind into that of an adult. Although she encouraged Robbie to think and make decisions for herself, Sandy's influence was nevertheless great. In one letter Robbie said, "I am like clay in her hands, and who can but help to fall in love with one's sculptor."

Sandy was clever, quick thinking, aggressive, and the only person Robbie had ever met who was stronger than she was. Her pride of being a butch was being manifested into the pride of being a woman.

I saw Robbie when she returned home to visit her parents. What a change. Was the young sophisticated, well dressed young lady who stood before me in a sheath and heels the same strong-willed, stubborn young girl who had left home in a shirt and pants? Her eyes were glowing, and I could see Sandy's reflection in them.

And yet, Robbie admitted, that while she had an uncontrolable love for this girl, she also had an uncontrollable hate for her. She was torn between trying to break the rock who had guided her, or basking in the sun of its comfort. She wanted to obsess Sandy - to possess Sandy, and yet she could not.

Two Women Married

THE NEW YORK GERMAN NEWSPAPER, AUFBAU, CARRIED IN 178 OCTOBER 13, 1961 EDITION THIS FOLLOW-UP TO A STORY WHICH ORIGINALLY WAS TRANSLATED FOR THE SEPTEMBER, 1961 ISSUE OF THE LADDER.

* * * *

PARIS, OCTOBER 1961

AS RECENTLY REPORTED IN THE AUFBAU, A COURT OF JUSTICE IN VERSAILLES SENTENCED GINETTE FERRONI AND BERNADETTE INVOIS TO ONE YEAR IN PRISON TERMS EACH. THE GIRLS HAD MARRIED EACH OTHER IN CHURCH AS WELL AS IN CITY HALL, EQUIPPED WITH ALL THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS. THERE IS NO LAW PRCHIBITING TWO WOMEN MARRYING - THE LEGISLATORS CAN HARDLY THINK OF EVERYTHING - BUT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN ALL THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS, THE TWO GIRLS HAD COMMITTED ALTOGETHER ELEVEN OFFENSES. IN PARTICULAR, THEY HAD EMBEZZLED THE BIRTH CERTIFICATE OF A CERTAIN PHILIPPE MARKERT, WHICH ENABLED GINETTE TO POSE AS A MALE. FURTHERMORE, GINETTE-PHILIPPE HAD ALSO PRODUCED A MARITAL CAPABILITY CERTIFICATE WITHOUT EVER HAVING VISITED A PHYSICIAN. NEITHER WOMAN HAD DAWAGED ANYONE, BUT BECAUSE OF FORGERY THEY WERE SENTENCED TO PRISON TERMS. THEY DID NOT SERVE THE PENALTY IN THE SAME PRISON CELL - BUT FOR GOOD BEHAVIOR THEY WERE BOTH RELEASED AFTER A FEW MONTHS.

THIS IS THE PRELUDE WHICH CAUSED QUITE A SENSATION AT THAT TIME, BECAUSE NOBODY HAD EVER HEARD OF - AN EVEN ULTRA-MASCULINE GIRL - MARRYING ANOTHER GIRL LEGALLY AND WITH THE CONSENT OF THE PARENTS. NATURALLY THIS MARRIAGE WAS NOT VALID. BUT WHAT HAPPENED WHEN GINETTE (EX-PHILIPPE) AND BERNADETTE WERE DISCHARGED FROM PRISON?

GINETTE WENT TO A SURGEON WHO - SUCH THINGS ARE SAID TO BE RATHER EASY IF CONDITIONS ARE FAVORABLE - TRANSFORMED HER INTO A MAN.

SHE, RESPECTIVELY HE, IS CALLED GEORGE NOW. BUT IF ANYONE THINKS LOVE IS ETERNAL THEY WILL BE DISAPPOINTED. BECAUSE GEORGE, FOR-MERLY GINETTE, DID NOT GO BACK TO BERNADETTE. EVEN BEFCRE HER TRANSFORMATION, SHE/HE HAD CHANGED HIS MIND. YES, GEORGE, 42,

WANTS TO MARRY, BUT NOT BERNADETTE. THE NEW LUCKY GIRL HAS ALSO BEEN AN INMATE IN THE WOMEN'S PRISON OF VERSAILLES; THAT'S WHERE THE TWO MET.

"DO NOT LEAVE ME" WROTE BERNADETTE MANY TIMES TO GINETTE-GEORGE.
IT WAS IN VAIN. THAT WHICH SEEMED RIGHT TO GINETTE NO LONGER
APPEARS DESIRABLE TO GEORGE. HE WILL MARRY THE OTHER ONE.

"ALAS, MEN ARE FICKLE; FOR EXAMPLE, MY FRANK IS NOW CALLED JIM" WAS A VICTORIAN KITCHEN JOKE OF OUR GRANDFATHERS. IN OUR TIMES, IN WHICH ONE CAN EVEN CHANGE ONE'S SEX, IT IS FAR WORSE. GINETTE, ONCE PHILIPPE, IS CALLED GEORGE NOW, BUT THIS DOES NOT HELP BERNADETTE ANY MORE.

VERY COMPLICATED, AS ALREADY STATED ABOVE. A PIECE OF CORRECTED NATURE, COMPLETE WITH TEMPERAMENT; WE COULD ADD THAT YEARS AGO, LONG BEFORE HER MARRIAGE TO BERNADETTE, GINETTE-GEORGE HAD ALREADY BEEN MARRIED TO A MAN, BUT THEN NOBODY WILL UNDERSTAND ANY-THING ANY MORE.
