The Society welcomes student research papers of high quality.

The Papers are published annually. Subscription is by membership in the Kroeber Anthropological Society. Annual dues for student members are \$12.00; for non-student members \$15.00; and for institutional members \$18.00. GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

- (1) Paper excluding references should not exceed 30 typewritten, double-spaced pages.
- (2) The original plus one copy of the manuscript should be submitted.
- (3) Tables and illustrations must be photo-ready black on white drawings or glossy prints. All figures must be numbered consecutively and captioned.
- (4) Bibliography/endnote format follows American Anthropologist.
- (5) A half-page abstract or summary of the paper is preferable.

Papers not meeting the first two criteria will not be considered for publication. Authors will receive one complimentary copy of the journal. When notified of acceptance of their manuscripts, authors may order additional copies of the journal at extra charge.
