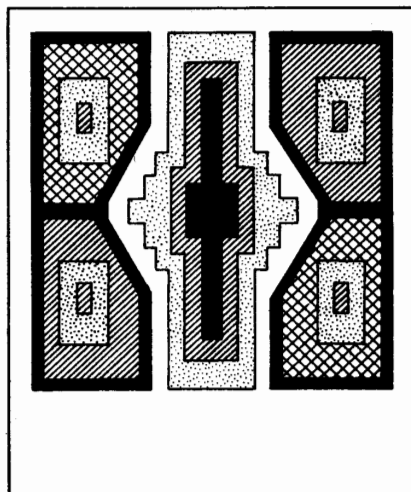

It is well to remember ... that in all science theoretical generalizations are transient. They die, in time, or are modified beyond recognition, or perhaps persist but only with new weighing and altered significance. The one thing that is permanent in archaeology, as in the other sciences, is the gradually accumulating body of organized and relational facts, which is the product of no one worker, but of an indefinite number of collaborators striving toward the same ends.
