The Daughters seem to be branching out into the celebrity world. Our TV debut which was scheduled for Channel 4's, "Assignment Four", has been rescheduled. It has been expanded to a 90 minute special to be telecast on KRON-TV, Channel 4, sometime in late, late Sept. or Oct. This is the one where Bob Anderson and crew came down to the DOB office and filmed and interviewed members of the organization. This we can't miss.

Also we are on radio. Sun. Oct. 4 at 10FM on KGO on "Churchmen Face the Issues" the Rev. Canon Robert W. Cromey will interview a member of DOB. Rev. Canon Cromey was one of the guests at our recent Gab' N' Java on religion and the homosexual.

The DOB has been asked to provide a speaker for a conference being held by the Methodists on "The Young Adult in the Metropolis." The conference is to be held on Oct. 5-9 and we will speak at the session on sexual identification.

At the Sept. Gab' N' Java the revision of the aims and purposes of DOB was put to group discussion. Following is the revised aims and purposes agreed upon that night. This is not, however, the final draft accepted by the organization but the popular choice of members and guests present at the GAb' NJava.

PURPOSE OF THE DAUGHTERS OF BILITIS? INC.

A WOMEN'S ORGANIZATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROMOTING THE INTEGRATION OF THE LESBIAN INTO SOCIETY BY:

1. Education of the Lesbian, enabling her to understand herself and to make her adjustment to society in all its social, civic, and economic implications-by establishing and maintaining a library of both fiction and non-fiction literature on the sex deviant theme; by sponsoring public meetings on pertinent subjects to be conducted by leading members of the legal, psychiatric, religious, and other professions; by providing the Lesbian a forum for the interchange of ideas within her own group.

2. Education of the public, developing an understanding and acceptance of the Lesbian as an individual, leading to an eventful breakdown of erroneous taboos and prejudices-by publis discussion meetings and by dissemination of educational literature on the Lesbian theme.

3. Encouragement of and participation in responsible research dealing with homosexuality.
4. Investigation of the penal code as it pertains to the homosexual, proposing and promoting changes to provide an equitable handling of cases involving this minority group through due process of law in the state legislatures.

Anyone is welcome to submit suggestions of their own, either in whole or in part, and remit to the Chapter office or to an officer.
